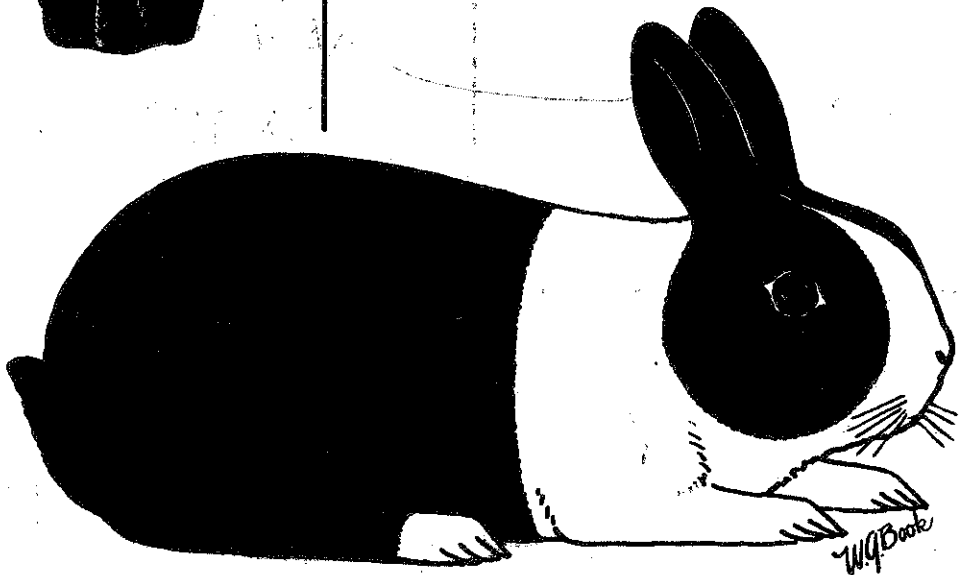



The long hot months are now with us that annually take a terrific toll of our DUTCH. Not only are they "killer months", but many youngsters that do survive are sapped of their vitality and fail to develop into what otherwise may be a good fall show specimen. We can however greatly minimize the damage from extreme heat by exercising a little extra effort in taking all precautions possible to make our stock more comfortable during the extreme hot weather. We should provide them, at all times, with plenty of fresh clean water; guard against overcrowding, especially Does and their litters; provide ample natural shade wherever possible, or hand made shade, shelters or hand made shade shelters and insure a good circulation of air in and around the Rabbitry. The use of the water hose or sprinklers on the roof and area surrounding the hutches will add much to the herd's comfort during an extremely hot day--and last, but certainly not least, is extra cleanliness. Let me say from past experience the extra effort put forth in providing comfort for your DUTCH from not until Fall will certainly pay you dividends.

I am thoroughly convinced that among the many contributing factors to the great popularity our DUTCH are enjoying today, one that has been most gratifying, is our State and Local DUTCH Clubs now in existence. The good they have done is immeasurable but their efforts certainly have been very conspicuous wherever State Clubs are very active, I believe that every DUTCH breeder who lives in a locality where there is a State Dutch Club should become a member and join hands with other DUTCH breeders in promoting our breed to the utmost. Those of you that live in a State that does not sponsor a Dutch Club--why not get together with your fellow breeders and organize one. You will find it most interesting and educational. 1955-1960 AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB'S GUIDE BOOK

Progress on our new Guide Book is good. We are very fortunate in having an excellent Committee. As far as the Committee's work is concerned, it is practically done. Right now they are waiting for some other material vitally important to the Guide Book, and this is coming from the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, which is now preparing revisions for voting by members, and picking up resolutions, and accepted motions from meetings held since the 1950-55 edition, which will go into our present Constitution and By-Laws.

I was pleased to see Herbert W. Nitzsche, Chmn. of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, at the Ohio State Dutch Club's recent show held June 19th. in Van Wert, Ohio. Mr. Nitzsche has fully recovered from his recent illness, and looks just great. This Committee's work is nearing completion.

A most important factor is that we have fallen just a bit short of publishing funds, though I do believe we have made remarkable progress in such a short period. Mr. Settle, Chmn. of the Guide Book Committee, has asked me to notify the members that he will accept ads right up until the Guide Book goes to press--but as this date may come up unexpectedly, do not wait any longer to send your ad. Too, the Guide Book Committee MUST know how much money is available for publishing funds, in order to know just what material they can prepare to have published. In other words, as Mr. Settle explained to me, give him all the money he would like to have and he can put out an issue that really would be something to behold. There are various articles that members would like to have published; however in order to have extra articles, etc. published, there must be enough money over and above the amount required for publishing the usual Standard, glossary, membership list, the subscribed ads, etc. If, at the time the issue is ready for the press, there is extra money in the Fund, then there will be several articles printed that otherwise will have to be omitted IF we members do not get our ads to the Committee. Meanwhile, if the money flows in, the Committee will be justified in editing and preparing these articles. So, we can make the work a little easier and be assured of an excellent and large issue, if we do get these ads in to Mr. Settle immediately.

It is remarkable that one or perhaps more of our members have required only a small ad, BUT they chose to send along some extra money above the price of the ad, and advised Mr. Settle to use it for the publication.

Now, please, let's do not take advantage of the generosity of this Guide Book Committee. These are very busy men; they are anxious to do a good job for us, and to meet the one big wish of all of us - to have the Dutch Guide Book by Convention time.

If your ad is in, then will you try to convince some of our other Club members whom you may meet who have not sent an ad that we need their support? If you let this June 30th. deadline go by without sending your ad, then sit right down now, and mail your check and ad to Mr. Settle.

Mr. Settle has also pointed out to me that the price of paper and labor is not getting cheaper. There has been a raise in these costs since he first received quotations on printing. He is most anxious to take advantage of every break he can get on costs, and this is another very good reason we should get this printing done as soon as possible.

Do the very best you can on supporting this 1955-1960 Guide Book. If you wish a big ad, then take one. If you wish or can only afford a small ad, then take one of the small ads. You will find an ad to fit the needs and purse of every one of the Club members. The important thing is -----DO ALL YOU CAN DO. See the ad for details-----AND HURRY.

FROM YOUR SECRETARY

This month of July is "voting" month. We are Nominating for offices of the President and Vice-President for 1956; and for offices of three Directors for 1956-57.

I hope every member down to the last man has voted in the Nomination, and will vote in the election when the time comes in September. We have gone all out on the future election of Officers, inasmuch as ballots will be printed, and sent First Class Mail. This costs the Club considerable money. The estimate on the expense of the Nomination and Election of Officers is roughly \$100.00. If our Club members will only cast their ballots, the expense will be forgotten, as this is the whole purpose. So, PLEASE vote.

Now, I am going to do a little back-tracking and explain some of the why-fors on the motions at Norwalk, Ohio, National Dutch Show April 22-24, 1955. I received ONLY one inquiry regarding some of the actions. I believe as long as there is ONE Club member who does not completely understand my writing there may be others. So, here goes:

(1) There will be mats of cuts (not cuts) available within a few weeks for use by State Dutch Clubs who wish them for their show catalogs, etc. One State Club wanted to use one of the ADRC cuts for show ribbons some time back, and this privilege was denied them. If any Dutch Club wishes to purchase their show ribbons at the same company who supplies our Club, this can be done by writing your ADRC Sec'y for permission, and we will put you in touch with this ribbon company. We have ONE CUT only for ribbons, and this is a special cut which costs quite a bit of money. The mats of cuts used by the ADRC costs us only 10¢ each. The Board, and members at the above meeting could see no reason why our State Dutch Clubs should not be allowed to use these cuts....other than the expense involved in the extra cuts. So we hit upon the idea of having mats made, and these mats will serve the purpose, and the mailing costs are negligible, and they do not have to be returned, as they can be used only one time.

(11) I thought this subject of the raise in sanction fees was sufficient. The reason for the raise on sanction fees was mainly because the Club was losing money at the old fee. There was a general complaint that we did not obtain information as to who the winners of Best Dutch and Best Opposite Dutch in the Sweepstake shows, when other Specialty Clubs gave a ribbon, etc. and some published this information. We cannot expect the local Clubs to supply us with this information without the ADRC giving a ribbon or rosette to the winners. The sanction costs (to the Club) were figured from all angles, and if we provided a small rosette the lowest figure which could be arrived at was \$5.00. I am happy to report that every Club who applied for a sanction with the old fee, returned the extra \$3.00 without comment - except one or two Clubs, and these were Fair shows where every penny is seemingly allocated months in advance.

(13) This member thought \$1.50 was insufficient amount for postage for two of our Committee Chairmen, and I agree with him, and in fact I believe the entire Board would agree to this....But, these Committee Chairmen were advised to present a bill of expense, or if they ran into difficulty on "postage money", to let us know. Likewise, I believe the Committee members know that if they should run into difficulty on "postage expense, out of pocket" they could apply to the Board, and I am speaking off the record now, but I think they would get help. No complaints have come in, so we assume every committee member has postage money.

(16) The rubber stamp worded "Compliments of the American Dutch Rabbit Club" to be purchased by the Secretary had nothing to do with the "judges being supplied with Guide Books, providing they bought an ad. This WAS confusing. It is my understanding that the usual procedure is when one purchases an ad in any publication, a copy is automatically given to the advertiser. This rubber stamp in question will be used on complimentary issues of THE DUTCH REPORTER, or any other reason or cause the Secretary receives constitutionally to use it. We make no practice of giving away Club property, such as Guide Books unless authorized.

(19) This question was on the subject of the American Dutch Rabbit Club asking the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. for a clearance from our Club before future chartering of any Dutch Club, local, state or otherwise. Now, this is NOT a "touchy, or delicate" subject. I do not like to write in the negative....but the purpose was NOT to cause or prevent the organizing of future State or local Dutch Clubs. Your Officers and Club members....all of us would delight in seeing a State

Dutch Club in all forty-eight states and the District of Columbia. We would like to see Dutch Clubs in each county of each state for that matter; or in each village or town; however, when there is this amount of organization within an organization, sometimes there are difficulties as to districting. This screening is just a precaution. The Specialty Clubs are in a good position to be of assistance to the American Rabbit Breeders Association in these matters. I assure you that there is no cause for any alarm, as all our State Dutch Clubs are doing just what they were organized for, and doing it well....they are promoting Dutch, and the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

The subject of the ARBA chartering of the Iowa State Dutch Club, was brought to the attention of the ADRC Board of Directors. In less than one week from the time this inquiry went out to the Board, every member had reported back. Our Board voted unanimously to recommend that the Iowa State Dutch Club be granted their ARBA charter. I would like very much to reprint the letters sent by some of the Board member along with their vote, on the subject of State Dutch Clubs, however space does not permit this. It was pointed out that the State Dutch Clubs, are in a position to do more to promote our rabbit than any other means of promotion we have found yet; and that in the past few years' during which several State Clubs have really been active, the interest in the breed has boomed. I have no accurate way of checking this statement here in the office, but I believe it is safe to say that there are more Dutch Specialty clubs than any other breed Specialty Clubs. We now have organizations in California, Colorado, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Ohio, Oklahoma, Texas, Wisconsin, Easter, and the Canadian breeders have their Club, Dutch Rabbit Fanciers of Canada, of which 10 are members of the ADRC. The DRF of C supports every activity and endeavor of the ADRC and we like to think fondly of them as being ONE of OUR Dutch Specialty Clubs.

I am happy to report that we now have forty-seven (47) ARBA Judges on our membership list. Let's all make it a point to invite the judges, as well as the breeders, to join our Club. Remember, we have to keep plugging our product and the organization if we get to that well-known TOP we often mention. If you need membership application forms, write to your Secretary.

THINGS TO REMEMBER.....

A.O.C. Dutch are no longer recognized by the ADRC and the ARBA. Dutch Sweepstake sanctions are now \$5.00. No advertising required on One Day Sweepstake Shows. Ac-

vertising IS required on shows longer than one day. Write for Rules on both shows. A rosette for Best Dutch and a rosette for Best Opposite Dutch will be given ADRC member-winners on both Sweepstake shows for shows held on and after June 25th. You can expect to see some catalogs that will not have rosettes in their Dutch Sweepstake Ribbon Offer, as these catalogs went to press before this new rule was made...especially true on Fair Shows...so bear in mind, this rule still applies on all shows held after June 25th.

Some local clubs never seem to get the required Dutch Special into their catalogs, but are quite ready to admit their errors, and go ahead and pay these Specials. It takes a lot of patience sometimes. True, these shows could be disqualified, but who would be penalized in the end? Our Club members who exhibit at these shows. One southern Club noted a typographical error in their catalog and ran off a mimeographed supplement, and attached it to the cover. This is really being conscientious, and all of us could use a little more of this.

Remember...this is the last, LAST, L A S T call for Dutch SPECIALS FOR THE 1955 ARBA Convention in Columbus, Ohio October 22-26.....Ray Hickok, Breed Chairman for Dutch, asks you kindly to send your Specials to him NOW. He must have these Specials in his hands to present to the Catalog Committee on August 1st. There were forms in recent issues for your convenience.

Remember.....by any means, remember, to send your ad to Mr. Settle for the new Guide Book. Remember, also, that your Secretary is grateful to you and the members of the Board for the wonderful cooperation being received. Thank you, very much.
