The American Dutch Rabbit Club recently enjoyed another FIRST when the 1957 National Dutch Show was held at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. At that time the Honorable Governor, Raymond Gary honored the event with an Official Proclamation that will be cherished by the A.D.R.C. for future generations. The document, the only one of it's kind to our knowledge, ever attained by any Specialty Club read as follows, "STATE OF OKLAHOMA, EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, PROCLAMATION: WHEREAS, the American Dutch Rabbit Club, a National organization is holding it's National Convention in Oklahoma City; and WHEREAS, an outstanding Dutch Rabbit Show will be held at the State Fairgrounds during the Convention; and WHEREAS, Oklahoma will thereby have an opportunity to see the results of careful breeding in the Rabbit Industry; NOW, THEREFORE, I, Raymond Gary, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, Do hereby proclaim April 8-14 American Dutch Rabbit week in Oklahoma and urge our citizens to avail themselves of the opportunity to attend the American Dutch Rabbit Showings at the Fairgrounds."

One hundred fifty fine Dutch, representing the six recognized varieties reached the Judging tables starting at 10:00 A. M. and the awards were placed in good time by Judges; Burke, Beamer and Leisenring. MINUTES - ANNUAL MEETING A. R. B. A. CONVENTION

St. Paul, Minnesota - October 14, 1956

Meeting called to order by Pres. G. Bayliss at 4:15 P. M.

Officers present: Pres. Bayliss; Vice-Pres. G. C. Leisenring; Sec'y-Treas. M. Grables; Directors, Wm. Stedman, Tom Shufflebotham, E. C. Bickley and J. C. Lowit. Excused, James Blyth; Absent, L. E. Settle.

Minutes of the previous meeting held during the 1956 National Dutch Show, Logansport, Indiana, were read and accepted as read.

Treasurer's report accepted as read.

Ways and Means Committee report by J. C. Lowit, Chmn. Mr. Lowit submitted several suggestions on enlarging the Club's Treasury.

1. Raffle trio of Dutch rabbits.
2. 25¢ extra entry fee.
3. Registration system of the ADRC.
4. Raise ADRC dues 50¢.
5. State Dutch Clubs hold benefit shows.
6. Sale of Easter Bunnies.

Mr. Bayliss asked Mr. Lowit to bring these ideas up again under new business.

Publicity Director's Report: Mr. Leisenring's report was read and accepted on motion by Mr. Stedman, supported by Mr. Wilkie.

Board of Directors: The subject of shortening the duration of the National Dutch Show was brought up for discussion at the request made by the Directors at the Logansport, Indiana meeting. After considerable discussion, Mr. Stedman moved the next National Dutch Show be held for two days, with judging to start on Saturday. Mr. Bickley supported the motion, which was accepted unanimously.

Auditing Committee Report was read by Mrs. Weinhardt and accepted.

Election Committee Report was read by Mrs. Weinhardt and accepted.

New Business: Pres. Bayliss asked Mr. Lowit to come to the front, and assist on presenting the Ways and Means Committee report to the membership for their discussion and consideration.

After some discussion, Mr. Shufflebotham introduced the idea of a "Selling Class" at the National Dutch Show. To be no entry fee - all stock to be sold via auction, with 25% of sales price going back to the donor; class to be judged like regular class of Dutch.

Mr. Lowit moved that the ADRC originate a "Seller's Class" for the National Dutch Show, with a trophy given for Best in this class, with stock to be sold, and 25% of sales price going back to donor. Support by Mr. Bickley. Motion carried.

2. Mr. Gentner raised a question of whether or not extra 25¢ would effect local club's entry. Al Meier stated he thought there would be some members always carrying the load, as now. Mr. Bickley spoke against the idea, as he thought this would be taking out of one pocket, puttin into another.
3. The Committee asked to withdraw suggestion of ADRC registration system.
4. Raise dues 50¢ per year.

Pres. Bayliss asked for comments from the members, and asked them to think about and discuss the subject carefully. Al Emery brought up discussion of a Combination membership, husband-wife membership at \$5.00; and also a single membership fee of \$3.00 per year.

Fred Wilkie said he liked the idea of having feed compaies collect a few cents extra per bag of feed from the members. Mr. Bayliss asked Mr. Wilkie to hold up his idea until the suggestion now on the floor had been discussed, and settled.

Mr. Weinhardt suggested to the members that if we believe our ADRC membership is worth more than \$2.00 per year, then we should present a proposal to the entire membership in the form of a ballot to raise the dues.

Mr. Bickley then moved that we submit a ballot to the members by mail, proposing that the ADRC dues shall be \$3.00 per year for a single membership, \$5.00 per year for a husband-wife Combination membership, providing the husband-wife membership application be made at the same time. Support by Clinton Dennis, carried.

5. State Dutch Clubs hold benefit shows.

Mr. Bickley thought this would be unfair to State Clubs, as they need all their funds to stay alive. Mr. Stedman pointed out some States do not have State Dutch Clubs. This idea was brought to a vote, and defeated.

6. Easter bunnies---voted out.

7. Mr. Wilkie thought some system could be worked out with the Rabbit Feed Companies to benefit the Club; various companies collecting few cents extra per bay of feed, for the ADRC, from its members. Don Morgan spoke against the subject, and stated some local Clubs are already doing this, and we would be taking away their funds. Voted out.

8. Tom Shufflebotham and Al Meier together explained an ADRC-United Kingdom Dutch Rabbit Club membership exchange. They believed such an arrangement would benefit both groups of Club members, and make a good relationship between the Clubs. (a). ADRC Secretary to make role of ADRC members wishing to pay for a U. N. D.R.C.'s membership in the ADRC. (b). An ADRC member would pay the membership fee to the ADRC for a UKDRC member's membership in the ADRC; the ADRC Secretary would send card and Guide Book to this English member; the UKDRC member would then pay dues in the UKDRC for the ADRC member, and the UKDRC Secretary would then mail their card and Guide Book to the ADRC member. There was no opposition to this and the members who wished to participate in this good will were advised to give their names to the Secretary.

Education Committee Report: Mr. Shufflebotham, Chmn. reported it seemed that no one wants an educational program, that he had received no letters inquiring for information. The subject turned to the Dutch Reporter, and Mr. Bayliss spoke about the original purpose of the Dutch Reporter, and that is to give out information, and assist the breeders of Dutch rabbits who are Club members, and that it seems to be nothing short of a continuous Show Report. Mr. Bickley contended we should keep on publishing show reports that many like to read them. Mr. Bayliss expressed his opinion that we should have more articles and information on Dutch breeding. Mrs. Weinhardt suggested any question raised could be brought to Mr. Shufflebotham's attention, and his reply could be printed, along with the question, in the Dutch Reporter; that in case the inquirer is not a member of the Club, then he should be mailed a copy of this issue of the Dutch Reporter containing the reply to his question, thereby setting up a Question-Answer Box, thus making another incentive for outsiders to join the Club. Don Guthrie suggested keeping a record of those submitting articles.

At this time Mr. Dennis reminded the members time was at hand to prepare for dinner, and he moved to recess until the following morning.

Meeting recessed at 5:45.

ADRC Meeting, October 15, 1956.

The second meeting was called to order at 11:50 A. M. by Pres. Bayliss, with the following Officers in attendance: Pres. Bayliss, V. P. Leisenring; Sec'y-Treas. Grables; Directors, Stedman, Bickley, Shufflebotham, Lowit and Blyth. Absent, L. E. Settle.

Mr. Bickley moved to include in the Sweepstake Show rules the regular procedure used at the National Dutch Shows in judging the varieties of Dutch, that is, to first judge the Black Dutch, then Blue, Chocolate, Tortoise, Steel Gray, last Gray, with the following procedure of classes: Senior Buck, Senior Doe, Junior Buck, Jr. Doe. Supported by Mr. Stedman, Carried.

Standard Committee Report: Mr. Bickley reporting, asked the judges to reconsider their decision in disqualifying the Gray Dutch in this convention show, that he could not find grounds for their decision. This opened quite a discussion on the Gray Dutch, some of the comments were: the rabbit does not conform to the color Standard: Mr. Shufflebotham pointed out regardless of inconformity of several breeds regarding their color being inconsistent, e.g. Sandy Flemish, these rabbits have all been placed, and if this method were applied to all breeds, probably every rabbit in the show could be kicked out, or its placing at least jeopardized.

Pres. Bayliss gave a resume of Gray color description being discussed at length

for a period of years. He stated sooner or later this color description MUST be decided upon; that the Gray color description must be set up in the Standards of Perfection, and the rabbit must move toward this description. Mrs. Grables asked Mr. Guthrie, one of the judges of Dutch at the Convention, where he found in the Standards a disqualification applicable to color in the Gray color description. Judge Guthrie opinioned we have a good standard, but no Grays for the Standard; Don Reid suggested the ADRC obtaining a color plate of the Gray Dutch the breeders want; Mr. Shufflebotham spoke of lack of comments on Gray Dutch from the breeders while the color standard was being revised; Mrs. Bayliss thought we had not had enough time to breed the brassy color out of the Grays, and that we need more than one year. Al Meier suggested perhaps we are trying to do the impossible in attempting to get a clear Gray color free from a rusty tinge.

Al Meier moved that the Gray color description be re-worded and submitted to the ARBA Standards Committee for their approval. Don Morgan supported the motion. James Blyth talked against the motion, inasmuch as he does not like Sandy Gray Dutch, and thought maybe we should allow more time to clear up the color. Mr. Bickley talked along the same line of Mr. Blyth, and asked that the Gray breeders be allowed more time to clear up the color. Motion was defeated.

Don Reid then brought in a Sandy Flenish, and a Light Gray Flemish for color comparison. Jessie Weinhardt proposed a motion to get expert geneticist to answer whether or not it is possible to breed a clear Gray Dutch. Al Meier thought it advisable to contact one experienced rabbit geneticist. Motion died for lack of support.

Mr. Reid stated he did not care if we have Sandy Gray Dutch, or even Gray Dutch, but he wanted the Standard clarified so that he could judge intelligently. Mr. Bayliss thought probably in spite of further re-wording we might still have arguments pro and con. Mr. Weinhardt suggested no one but Gray breeders should be allowed in on this discussion. Mr. Lowit said his Grays have shown no improvement in color, and thinks we should have Standard to fit present Gray, by re-writing color description. Mr. Guthrie stated he had gone to every end to try to improve the color on his Gray Dutch, and had failed to improve it any. After considerable more discussion and repetition, Mr. Lowit moved we should have the present Standard as a Working Standard and call this Light Gray, and rewrite color standards to fit the Gray we have now, and call it Brown Gray. Roger Eich supported the motion which was carried. The Gray breeders were asked to write their opinions to Mr. Bickley, Chmn. of the ADRC Standard Committee. Mr. Bickley stated that the Standard Committee could not function without these comments from the Gray breeders. He asked how the present Gray color compared with the Brown Gray of the United Kingdom D.R.C., and what will happen to the Gray Dutch while this proposed new description is being composed. Don Guthrie stated every breeder must cooperate, and he thought the judges should be lenient until the new description has been adopted. Mr. Bickley stated that the ADRC's Standards Comm. is just a clearing house for ideas, and it is not the duty of this committee to "write" a new description; it is their duty to compose it from suggestions from the breeders. Mr. James Kells thought this too abrupt a change; he believed it is the breeders, and not the Dutch at fault; that out of 40 Red New Zealands one probably could detect 40 different shades of Red color.

Clinton Dennis asked for support of the 1957 National Dutch Show, and invited everyone to come to Oklahoma City and attend; he stated it is not often our Specialty Club receives an invitation from the Governor of the State, the Mayor, to visit the city. Mr. Dennis, and the Dutch Specialty Club of Oklahoma was complimented upon the manner in which they have gone out to prepare for the coming National Dutch Show.

Mr. Lowit would like to go on record to ask the ARBA judges to be tolerant on Gray Dutch while these new Standards are writtin, and to suggest to Mr. Parker, Chmn. of the ARBA Standards Committee, and Pres.-Elect of the ARBA, to ask the judges to be as lenient as possible for the time being, until the new Standards description of Gray Dutch are complete.

Good of the Order: Mr. Shufflebotham introduced Clinton Dennis as the possible

Dutch Breed Chairman of the next ARBA Convention which will be held in Little Rock Arkansas, in October 1957. Jimmy Sinclair told of various specials he has already obtained on Dutch for the next National Show.

Mr. Lowit suggested since it is practically established that Mr. Bickley has won the \$80.00 pot for Best 4 Dutch, points to count at this Convention, that he be appointed to collect next year's pot. Mr. Bickley thought this Convention Pot should be allowed to remain in the control of the Ways and Means Committee.

Pres. Bayliss complimented the members on the manner in which they conducted themselves during this meeting.

After a vote of thanks to the Committee of the Convention, Mr. Stedman moved we adjourn.

Meeting adjourned at 1:30 P. M.


