Our President, George Boyliss, is the "top man" this month, and although not a 100% rabbit man, George has had much experience with rabbits. He has a 300-hole

rabbitry at Hayward, California, 60% of them being Dutch.

George is now going into 8 years of serving as our President, and he feels that the Club is "tops" among the Specialty Clubs. He gives credit for this to our excellent Board of Directors' aid and inspiration. He also is a life member of the American Poultry Ass'n., and the National Pigeon Ass'n. In 1958 George was presented a certificate honoring his 20 years' service as a director of the Alameda County Fair, by Louis Merrill, General Manager of the Western Fairs Ass'n. George has headed the poultry, pigeon, and rabbit department for all those years. He also has been superintendent of those divisions at the California State Fair since 1947.

Since the early 30's George has belonged to the A.R.B.A., and has been a licensed judge since 1936. He has judged at many Convention shows, also National Dutch Shows. Also he has been a director of the American Himalayan Assin., and is active in state

and local rabbit clubs.

To give a little early background, George was born March 6, 1900 in Birmingham, England. While in school there, he showed Dutch rabbits in English shows, such as Leads, Bradford, and Crystal Palace Gardens. He migrated to Canada with his parents in time to serve with the Canadian Forces (Princess Pats) in World War I in France and Belgium. At the end of the war he entered the service of the Hudson Bay Co. of Canada, and worked out of the company's trading posts in the Yukon and Alaska. He left the Hudson Bay Campany to take up ranching in California. Here he again turned to raising rabbits, and purchased some New Zealand Whites from Ed. Stahl, Steel Dutch from Reb. Rosemurgy, Blacks and Chocalates from Chas. O. Lewis, also a trio of Blacks from England. This was all in the late 20's.

George has been a member of the A.D.R.C. since its early conception (card No. 46) and is a real Dutch booster. He has retired from ranching, but continues to work with the rabbits. His habites, aside from Dutch rabbits, are model railroading, stamp collecting, and BEAUTIFUL VOMEN!!!

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

CHANGE THE WEIGHT STANDARD?

I herewith express my opinions on the matter of altering the weights of the standard on Dutch. First be assured that I express these views without consultation, promptings, rebuttal, revenge or otherwise, instead I do this with thought of having the best interests of the Dutch Rabbit and the fanciers that raise them.

We, as fanciers frequently apply the term "good Dutch type" to diminutiveness of Dutch rabbits, thereby resurrecting the terminology, "Tov Dutch", which is a deterioration of our beautiful Dutch. Fanciers, erroneously, proudly exhibit these off-standard Dutch and thereafter may judges have been guilty of bestowing top laurels on these specimens, which factually, are of a character that ultimately destroys the progress of the Dutch rabbit fancy.

Any fancier who has had the experience of reproducing a quantity of Dutch rabbits must have the knowledge that a doe that weighs between 4 pounds and 4 ounces to 4 pounds and 12 ounces will reproduce more litters for a greater period of time, and they will be healthier than those from does that will weigh less than 4 pounds at maturity.

It has been my experience to have more than a fair share of misfortune with these "toy" Dutch. Since they are a contradiction to the nature of Dutch, they are highly susceptible to sterility, restricted conception, small litters or kindling complications.

If we as fanciers, become swayed by the "Toy" Dutch, we will have to start selecting the runts from our litters (the runts being so because they aren't naturally healthy) or take measures to restrict the normality of growth.

The Dutch, by Standard, has certain requirements to neet to retain its beauty of type, color, markings, shadings and peppering. The weight should be so kept to protect its health and reproduction.

We can take a lesson from numerous other would-be popular breeds that could have prospered, if reproduction had been safegaurded. Lets not be guilty of hampering the reproduction of the Dutch. To retain the minimum weight of the standard at $3\frac{1}{2}$ pounds is safegaurding the existence of the Dutch rabbit.

I have a profound fondness for the "Toy" Dutch, but this admiration shrinks with the realization that "Toy" Dutch are more destructive than constructive.

In keeping the ideal weight at $4\frac{1}{2}$ pounds we are able to make a greater choice and have abailable to the new-comer, far more individuals.

No minimum weigh change is necessary. I am certain that many of the Dutch fanciers realize this too, and will be opposed to any alterations.

UNITED WE STAND -- DIVIDED WE FALL

Where are we going and where are we going to stop? These are two vital questions that I will try to answer in regards to lowering the Dutch Standard to 3 pounds to suit those who are trying to do so. The lowering of the weight of Dutch to 3 pounds was discussed in 1947 and again in 1949, and was pushed by the breeders of Dutch who were more concerned for themselves than for the benefit of the standard we had at that time.

Back in 1944 a member of the Dutch Club made a big name for himself by winning with the Polish-type Dutch — with the assistance of some of our judges at that time who knew no more about the standard of Dutch than the beginner himself. Since 1944, until the present time, we still have some of these breeders and the same so-called judges that have not learned that the ideal weight of senior does and bucks over 6 months of age should be 4½ pounds. Registration weight of senior bucks and does over 6 months of age is 3½ pounds to 5½ pounds. So why all the fuss over a 3 pound Dutch?

The answer to the question, "should we lower the weight limit?", is that some of our breeders have 25 to 30 breeding Dutch does that weigh 3 pounds to 3 3/4 pounds, and who have made a name for themselves by winning at many of our shows with the help of a judge — a judge who knows the breeder but knows very little about the standard of the Dutch robbit.

Therefore, we have no one to blame but some of our judges. I have been a Dutch breeder all of my life (more than 60 years) and I am still trying to produce that "perfect" Dutch. I have produced many winners with the ideal standard we have at the present and I have never hinted to a judge how to judge to my liking. Judges who know the standard know enough to look for the correct weight.

Some time ago a good friend of mine gave me a 3 pound Dutch doe, and I was open minded in experimenting with it since my own does were getting a little big in size and were all producing big litters of young. Some had as many as 10 or 12 young and that is bound to make them lose their type. Although I have sold bred does to other breeders, they have told me that they were having the same results. But back to the 3 pound doe — it was 7 months old when I mated her to a $4\frac{1}{2}$ pound buck. This doe had 5 young, 4 of them born dead. I took the one youngster from her after she had nursed it for 5 days. I then let her rest and again mated her to a $4\frac{1}{2}$ pound buck. The second litter she had, she produced 5 young and again 4 were born dead. The 2 young I did get from here were small at birth and both were bucks. I kept one of these for five months and by that time he weighed 2 pounds. I killed him for a meal — I thought that I would have a fryer but by the time it was fried all that was left were the bones. Lucky we had a dog — it was a change for him.

Well, being dissappointed in this experiment with 3 pound Dutch, but not discouraged, I told my friend what had happened and he gave me a 3½ pound Dutch buck to mate with my 4 3/4 pound does. That was 6 weeks ago and I am still trying to get my does bred. I have given up hope but the experiment has been worth while. It took time to prove to myself that it is more profitable to have a 5 pound doe producing 8 to 10 young in a litter, than a 3 pound doe producing nothing much more than feed bills. They both eat the same. With a 5 pound doe you can have meat on the table

but with a 3 pound doe you get only hones for the dog. There is also more beauty in the 5 pound doe by comparison. The markings and color seem better, too. I say to you who are true Dutch breeders to please remember my experiment and keep the weight standard in the Dutch.

My congratulations to J. D. Collins of Florida for a fine article. If you heed his advice and mine, our motto will be "You Can't Peat The Dutch"; if you disregard this advice our motto may become, "you have murdered the beauty of our Dutch with a 3 pound weight minumum and produce only dead-born young."

A LITTLE OF THIS & THAT & AN INVITATION

I am writing this in hopes that it might help some of the breeders in disposing of their fryers. I keep about twenty five does in production and keep my fryers all moved out - in fact I could sell twice as many as I do. This has been my experience: For several years I tried butchering them and selling them directly to the consumer. It is true I managed to get rid of most of them that way, but it wasn't very satisfactory. If I waited until someone wanted them, to dress them out, they were sure to want them right when I had something else to do. If I dressed them out as they came on, they were in the way in our refrigerator. Then I tried selling them dressed, to first one store and then another. This wasn't satisfactory either. I would sell them to a store and they would move out real good. This would give the manager the big eye and he would stock up on larger fryers from another breeder, thinking he would make more on a larger fryer. The catch to that was that people in this section of the country just won't pay for a rabbit what a 31 pound dressed rabbit will cost at .69 cents a pound. The result would be, the store manager would be stuck with a tunch of these larger fryers on his hands that he couldn't move. Then he was off rabbits and wanted no more. I had to then look for another store. After this had happened several times, believing as I did in a small fryer, I went to a store manager with the proposition that I place my rabbits with him and he agree to handle no else's rabbits and I would sell to no one else. I proposed that any of mine that did not sell, I would pick pu. This was over two years ago and I haven't had to pick up a single one yet. It is true I don't get rich at it, but it enables me to keep all of my culls moved out, and keep only the very best to sell as breeders or show animals. I manage to make my ment rabbits pay the expenses so when I do sell a good one, it is just that much clear profit.

While I am at it I would like to say that I am sure glad to see some of our outstanding breeders opposing this idea of lowering the standard on weight. I think it is just fine as it is. I have no way of knowing how long those who want the weight lowered have been breeding Dutch, but I will venture to say that most of them began when the standard was just like it is and just because they happen to get a well-marked rabbit or two that was small, they want the standard changed to fit those rabbits. They are like some youngsters who, after they have learned to drive a car, find out that the car would run 100 miles an hour, so would like to see the speed limit raised so that they could drive that fast. I have this one request to make of the standard committee: If and when this is put to a vote of the membership that it be a mailed ballot because only a small percentage of us get to attend a National meeting and such a vote at a N tional meeting would not be a representative vote of the club.

This brings up another matter - I am afraid that certain circumstances are going to make it impossible for me to attend the forth-coming Convention, close as it is, and as much as I would like to go, so I would like to take this opportunity to invite all of my friends, many of whom I have corresponded with, but never met, or any others who might be interested and will be passing through, or near, Norman, Oklahoma enroute, to stop and see my rabbitry. I have recently changed my hutches to some of my own design which have many advantages over any that I ever used before. Among these advantages is that I don't have to worry about dogs tearing into them. When I leave home I don't have to worry about the neighbors kids getting in and accidently leaving the doors open. When they are all completed, which will be in just a few weeks,

I will have 43 hutches, 30 x 36 inches and any one of them can be changed in just a minute, to make two hutches 18 x 30 inches. You may all have seen better rabbits than I have, but I don't believe you will have seen a better outdoor rabbitry than mine. I will close with the same old song that never grows old as long as rabbits are raised. "You Can't Beat The Dutch."
