The Wilmington, Delaware show and meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club may not go into the record book as the show with the largest entry, but it will go down in Club history as one of the best. The prize and trophy list were outstanding and the housing of the show was fine. The banquet and business meeting were among the best ever held -- and it was really a great pleasure to meet the Eastern Fanciers and share a bit of their enthusiasm and good fellowship. I dare not mention names for it is so easy to over-look just one or two -- but I can say that Glen Sturgis and his committees deserve the heartfelt thanks of the ADRC for a job well done.

The financial report of the Publicity Committee was presented at this meeting and will, I trust, appear elsewhere in this issue of the Reporter as it was given to the secretary for filing. It may not come as a great shock to you to hear that the Publicity Committee is presently functioning with a near deficit balance -- a balance that will be wiped out with present commitments to the Tampa ARBA Convention Committees. The Eastern Fanciers, when advised of this, dug into their pockets and made generous contributions. Not only did they freely donate, but they bought supplies to the tune of \$32.75. As I said before, those easterners are among the best.

The area publicity representative have been asked by Bill Summers, who is advertising chairman of the new Guide Book committee, to assist in soliciting ads for the Guide Book. As general chairman of the Publicity Committee, I urge each and everyone of you to place your ads for this Guide Book now. Many times in the past, the ADRC has led the specialty clubs in new adventures, and again, with the promised Guide Book, they will be far in the lead. The upcoming edition will be something for the fancy to shoot at -- and your ad in this book will be worth much more than the few dollars it is going to cost. At our home, as in many others, all past editions of the ADRC Guide Books hold a very special place on our shelves and are referred to time and time again.

While in Wilmington, I was given a copy of the Lehigh Valley Rabbit and Cavy Breeders News Letter which impressed me very favorably. On reading Fred Applegate's column in current rabbit journals, I find this bulleting cited by him for its excellence. I do not know how many members the Lehigh Valley Club has, but I do know that their dues are only \$2.00 annually -- with associate memberships at \$1.50 which include the News Letter as a club service.

Virginia Pierce of Pueblo sent in an interesting letter, reporting a two-day show sponsored by the Dutch Club of Colorado which was held the week-end prior to our national show. This show was held in the National Guard Armory where the 1961 Dutch convention and show was held.

Virginia reports also, that three boys whom she had started as members of the Southern Colorado RBA, had worked to purchase their Dutch rabbits and were looking forward to showing juniors and acting as carriers at the Colorado Springs show. With greater anticipation, they were looking forward to the Colorado State Fair Show when they hoped to show both junior and senior stock and again serve as carriers.

At the present time my stock of publicity items is growing smaller and smaller -- and it seems that with funds available it will be necessary to order in small quantities. This may necessitate a small increase in sales costs. Meanwhile may I urge that such supplies as you need should be ordered through your area representatives? I am trying to plan for the Dutch Club booth at National show time in Tampa -- and have been promised an oil painting for auction at that show.

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

Our President and Publicity Director seem to have used up most of the superlatives available with regard to the recent National Dutch Show at Wilmington, Delaware, and left your poor secretary practically without words for describing the wonderful time we all had while in Wilmington. Perhaps a few little side-lights will suffice. One comment I would like to make is that I don't believe I ever so many rabbits changing hands as I did in the show room. If anyone took only their original show string home with them, intact, it was the exception, not the rule. There was selling and swapping going on all over the place. Even your truly lost the Best Tortoise in a trade on the night before judging, but managed to come up with the Best Opposite Chocolate and a nice little black buck in like deals. This certainly speaks well for the immediate future of our Club as many of these good rabbits went to new breeders just joining the ADRC. A lively resurgence of interest should very soon be apparent along the Eastern Seaboard as far as Dutch rabbits are concerned.

One little item that was brought to my attention, which I surmise could be a very outstanding "first", if not for the ADRC, at least for one of our members -- Jack Boughton informed me that his Black Buck which went Best Dutch had also been Best Dutch at the Louisville Convention Show last October and his sire had been Best Dutch at both the Colorado Springs NDS and the Ft. Worth ARBA Convention! How about that? This proves to me that Jack not only knows what he is doing, but that a good herd sire is worth his weight in gold.

Wilmington, Delaware will long hold a warm spot in my heart, and stored away with my fondest memories will be those of friendships made and friendships deepened during my visit there. I wish, personally to thank all of those who helped make this trip such a memorable one.

Periodically it is brought to my attention that some breeders are being a bit careless in selecting their entries for the show table and many animals are appearing in the shows with colds, ear canker and even vent disease. We all know that these conditions are contagious and those who bring these rabbits to a show might very well be the very first to complain if someone else exposed their choicest rabbits to such hazards. I know it is possible to have anyone of these ailments crop up where it is least expected and be found on a show table, as much a surprise to the breeder as to the judge, but when rabbit after rabbit from the same herd has one of these conditions it shows either extreme carelessness in checking over stock before making an entry, or and this seems hard to believe, an attitude of "I don't care", or "maybe it will get past this judge this time". Whatever the reason may be, it seems to me that the majority of exhibitors can ill-afford to take the chance of wasting his entry fee on the long shot that it will get by the judge. It is very poor advertising for a breeder to have it said that he took a first, or maybe even a best of breed with a rabbit that had such a disqualification -- and believe me, there is always one or two other exhibitors who will spot the ailment even if it should get by the judge. For your own good, make it a policy to make out your entry for the next show by going over each rabbit individually, not from the coop cards of the previous show.

At this late date we still do not have a Breed Chairman for Dutch for the Tampa Convention show. The deadline is barely two weeks away and only \$5.00 has been paid in for specials. This is not only going to prove a very poor incentive for getting good Dutch into the Convention Show, but certainly speaks very poorly for the second largest specialty club in the American. You can always send your specials to me -- they may not come in time for the catalog, but such offerings will be listed in the Dutch Reporter.

You will again this month, find a slip sheet in your Dutch Reporter for advertising for the new Guide Book and one will appear in each issue of the next several, for your use in mailing copy for your advertisement to Bill Summers. We all know that this new Guide Book is not going to come cheaply, either from a financial viewpoint or workmanship. The committee is outdoing itself to try to make this the greatest Guide Book ever presented by any specialty club, but it takes the cooperation of every single member to make it the real success that we will all be proud to say "I had a hand in that -- see there is my ad on page ____." We have enough members so

that if each one of us placed only a minimum ad, we could be over the top and have our new Guide Book ready for the printer in practically no time. Don't say as I have heard so many times before, "But I have no stock for sale now". You may have in the future and this book will be going out to all new members for several years to come. If that doesn't appeal to you, then just think of an ad as a contribution to the promotion of Dutch Rabbits all over the United States and whatever profits the general good of the Club is bound to profit you as an individual. The more members we have the more Dutch we will see in the shows, the greater the competition will be, the more important a winning will become and the sooner some one of the many may come up with that "perfect" one that we all are hoping will be in our next nest.

I would like to call your attention to an article in this issue by Bob Scott on the subject of showing very small Dutch. As he says this was the source of much lively discussion at Wilmington. I had not realized that we had such a problem as the occasions are rather rare in this area when an eight to ten week Dutch is placed in junior competition. It is my personal belief that this is usually the act of the over-anxious beginner who just can't wait for the next show to see how good a baby really is. He doesn't realize just how much he may be risking in the too-early exposure of such a promising baby to the hazards of show room competition. A long trip in a hot car may bring the poor little thing to the show with a bad case of diarrhea already present, then a change in feed and the excitement of all of the extra handling quickly finish the job. I say lets leave these babies home with their mamas until the develop the stamina to take the rugged experience of the show table. My personal vote is for no "Nest Box" classes for Dutch.

DUTCH PRE JUNIOR CLASS?

A discussion about the baby Dutch, 6 to 12 weeks old now appearing in large numbers at our shows, was one of the principal topics of discussion at our American Dutch Rabbit Club meeting.

Most breeders present did not favor showing the youngsters under 3 months but some think since they pay their entrance fee, the youngster should have the same consideration as the larger ones. Some of our New England breeders cited a show in their section in which a baby Dutch was placed Best in Show over some well marked seniors.

The opinion of most breeders is to have a Pre Junior class and they should not be eligible to compete out of their class for other specials. In other words this class should have the same privileges as other pre juniors.

It is my opinion that a baby could not compete with the top size juniors as he would have too much to lose due to lack of development. Baby coat does not have the color depth and fur, or a sharp definition of markings, and how can anyone say a baby is good type when so much is left for development. A nice type baby could weigh 6 lbs. when it grows up, and be way out of proportion. I am in favor of a pre junior class and think it would be real competitive. Since every Dutch breeder and Judge should have their say, let us hear from all of you, in regards to your opinion of the showing of baby Dutch.

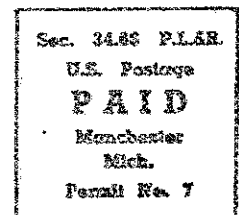
