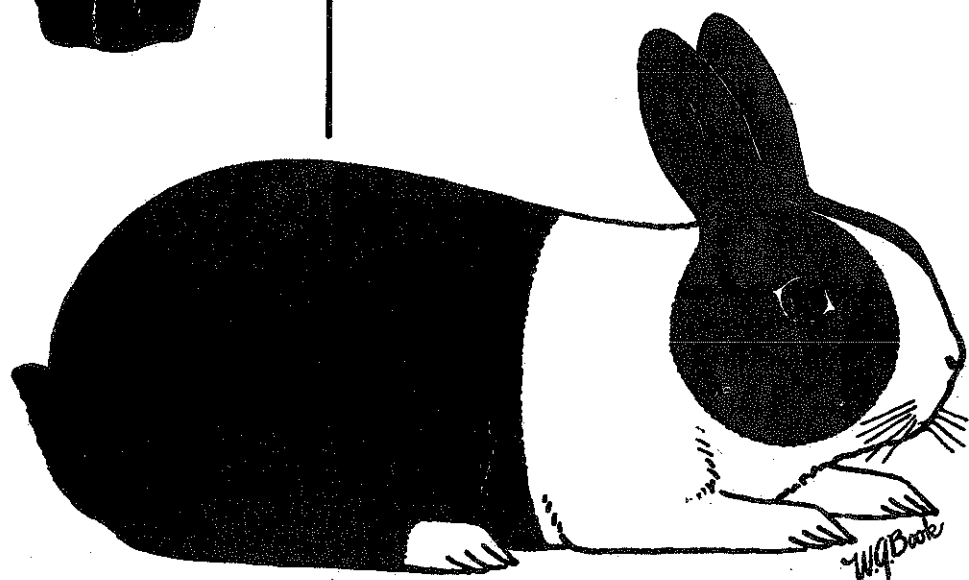

FURTHER REMARKS FROM UNITED KINGDOME DUTCH BREEDERS

COLOUR BREEDING IN DUTCH: In "Fur and Feather" of May 5 a Mr. H. W. Leigh advised Dutch breeders not to cross black with blue.

If, however you want that lovely black shade the answer is blend with a touch of blye by mating a good black with a blue doe. The doe should have been bred through two generations of black at least, more if possible, then you will not have to keep a blue stud. Just mate your blue does up.

It is policy to keep a few black studs, as all does in an established rabbitry can act, when kindling, in a remarkable way and not always to one's advantage.

When a breeder can find out why a doe will throw a nicely balanced litter to one buck and not to another, althought the latter is carrying blood of the combined stud, then and then only, will progress be made in the small stock world.

As regards specked eyes the answer is elimination. Never mind how well marked the youngster is, if you do breed from it, generations may pass, but you can be sure to breed one to beat the band in markings, colour and type and with a pretty eye of two colours! Chas. Youngman.

BLACK/BLUE DUTCH BREEDING: I cannot let Mr. H. W. Leigh's remarks about black and blue breeding the Dutch Rabbit pass without comment. He states, "Don't believe the black/blue game."

I am afraid Mr. Leigh has put the proverbial oat among the pigeons, for I am sure his statements will cause a stir among Dutch breeders, especially those of us who

specialize in the b/b breeding.

Mr. Leigh tells the novice not to mate black to blue as he will get specked eyes. From my own experience (and I have been a Dutch breeder for 35 years) I can truthfully say I have not had a single rabbit with a specked eye and I have used both black and blue parents.

STEEL DUTCH: It gives me great pleasure to be invited to write a few lines on the above subject. From being a very young boy I have made the breeding of Dutch my hobby. In my opinion the breeding of the marked varieties of rabbits are the best from the novice's point of view. I believe in the old saying that the exhibition rabbit is the "working man's racehorse". I first bred Tortoise Dutch with stock from Owen Martin, of Kettering, and J. W. Potter of Otley.

I well remember being amongst the winners at a Dutch Club Show at Rugby in those days. I have bred winners in ALL colours, but this time I must write a few lines on STEEL DUTCH, my specialist colour. My late friend Geo. Exelby, of York told me that many years ago when he was a young man, he formed a stud of Steels by mating a very well marked black doe to a wild rabbit buck. Therefore, one can see where the brown-grey gets its top and undercolour from. The aim of all is to get that desired dark shade of steel, with body colour and back legs to the stops to match an evenly ticked back and ears. This shade is the most difficult colour in Dutch Fancy to produce. Many darks are found to be solid in ears and to have an almost black stripe in the middle of the back. This dark shade with solid ears sometimes breed successfully to Brown or Pale Greys. Too much brown-grey can infuse the golden brown colour oft times found on the legs of Steels. To be blending the colours successfully one should see Brown-Greys, Pale Greys, Blacks, Mid-Steels and Steels turning up in their litters. A Double Steel bred Black is also a very valuable colour to breed in, as it tends to keep your Steels dark. In the show pen one finds the "Medium Steel" predominates, a colour better explained as a shade between Dark Steel and Brown-Gray, and always having a good colour on back and ears. I advise anyone not to use a buck of the Blue-Grey color or with blue eyes; it is asking for eye trouble. Do not breed that pull of the cheek in. Keep stops short and straight, trying always to have your saddle and undercut without any breaks in it, and with cheek markings as near to the whiskers as it is possible. Remember that the Dutch is a coloured rabbit with white markings. Colour and type are as important as markings in the make-up of any winner. A little advice to the beginner: Buy your foundation stock from a fancier who breeds his own winners. To the old fancier I appeal to help along the novice of to-day, as tomorrow he may turn out to be the expert of the rabbit world. I ask all Dutch fanciers to join the Club. by John J. BREEDING FOR MARKINGS

I was asked to write an article on breeding for markings and I do not know why. I have a long hard job to offer anyone reading this as there is no easy way. There are several things that would help. They are: a crystal ball, a lucky horseshoe, a foresight as good as our hindsight, and a little more cooperation from the buck and doe. Of course most of you know that it takes two to tango.

There are some very important things that should be given a great amount of consideration. I would first and foremost entreat the beginner to purchase all of his foundation stock from the same breeder, a reliable source of course. I would also go so far as to suggest that he get related stock by all means, and inject no strangers into the strain for at least four generations. It goes without saying that one should start with one color and stick to it, endeavoring to only improve color by selection. Type is important; and the breeder from which your start is obtained should be one that uses only correct type in his breeding program. Since we have gone over this part several times before I was asked to confuse you, let us proceed.

Markings -- putting the color where it belongs; how I wish I could use my brushes as I could do a better job than nature, some of the time.

I think that there are a few important points here that are basic in my methods. (There are those of you who will oppose me in my theory, so feel free to do so. I want to learn also, as I have room for improvement.) I like to think that I am using the best marked buck I can get from my own breeding and stock (strain if you wish). He must have good cheeks and stops; these are of the greatest importance. I, of course would like to have a perfect one. If his saddle is on the poor side, I use this buck on does that have low cheeks, very short stops, and a good saddle. She must be of the same bloodlines. Whether she is a litter-mate or distantly related is of no serious importance. I know that there is a smirk on your face now as to why a man who has some 60 breeding does would be using does that are so mis-marked in his breeding. Did you ever try to get 60 does that were well marked and good colored, well typed animals? It is possible, but you would have every would-be purchaser mad at you, and you might have the best looking herd in the country but very few friends and little competition in your community. There is another thing that discourages me in this as I once had a Grand Champion Buck which was related to a Grand Champion Doe. I bred these two together and I received a very large litter that contained 9 rabbits and not a good Dutch in the whole litter.

It could be summed up in a few words. Line breed within a known show producing strain. Get them from the same breeder and stick with them. You might luck a winner on the first try, and it may take four generations to do a job of it. The best show animals usually do have a mother that had a winning on the show table. For example, I had a black doe, a litter-mate to a Grand Champion buck. She had stops on her front feet, no stops on her hind feet, a saddle that looked like a horse collar about an inch wide, and a blaze that was just wide enough to be called a blaze because it was white and the rest of her was black. From this doe I raised some seven youngsters that later on became Grand Champions. Lucky? Maybe, but I do not think so as I kept within the strain I started with. I did do some wandering from one to another and picked up a stranger now and then. I also got a lot of headaches from them and in the end I dumped the stuff and returned to normal. So in conclusion -- LINE BREED -- LINE BREED -- LINE BREED -- LINE BREED -- LINE BREED.

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

I guess we are having a summer that is trying to make up in a few short weeks, for all of the wicked cold we had last winter. WOW! Is it hot and dry in this part of the country. It is really hard on the rabbits. It seems practically impossible to keep the bunnies in any kind of condition and even our prolific Dutch are making a hard job of raising litters. I have had more litters scattered about the pens in the past couple of weeks than I had all last winter. A couple in the litter seem to stay put and get most of the mother's milk and the rest, no matter how many times they are put back in the nest corner, wander away in search of a cool spot and miss out at chow time. These gradually drop off one by one, until the doe finally winds up raising me two or three out of an original litter of seven or eight. Well, I guess those are the breaks of the game -- maybe it will be a bit cooler next week, I hope!

All of the nomination ballots have now been mailed out -- well ahead of the June 30th. deadline so you should have gotten yours. These were carefully checked to make sure that all members whose dues were not due before June 1st. were sent ballots. Of course, as with anything done by human hands, errors are possible, so if you did not receive your ballot please notify THIS OFFICE of the fact. It will do no good to just tell your neighbor about it, or write to any of the other officers about it, but if you let me know, I will immediately see that one is put in the mail for you and the original number assigned to you is disqualified and the Election Chairman is notified to that effect.

Now a few words as to the voting procedure. I am sure you are all familiar with the system of naming candidates for the various offices. Be sure to check the membership list in the June Dutch Reporter so that you do not waste your vote on someone who is no longer a member of the ADRC. When naming candidates for judges, please check the membership list also, as only judges who are members of the ADRC are

elegible for this assignment. Remember that this year we are using a slightly different procedure in selecting these judges as we are merely nominating candidates at this time and the six of these nominees receiving the most qualifying votes will have their names listed on the final ballot for a more effective choice than we have had in the past.

On the two amendments -- bear in mind that on No. 1 a "Yes" vote will mean that our Publicity Department will be provided with adequate funds to operate to the best advantage to you and your Club. A "No" vote will mean continuing to limp along as they have had to do in the past few months, begging and borrowing funds at every turn. On amendment No. 2 a "Yes" vote will mean a return to a complete reporting of all shows showing each class to fifth place with a discontinuing of the listing of Best Opposite of each variety. A "No" vote will mean that we go on as we have since about the first of the year with a listing of only the main winnings (Best Dutch, Best Opposite Dutch, Best and Best Opposite of each variety) and a listing of the names of the exhibitors in each variety and their sweepstake points.

Now just a word as to the mechanics of voting: Write in your selections of candidates; Vote "Yes" or "No" on the amendments and place your completed ballot in the envelope marked "American Dutch Rabbit Club -- Secret Ballot Envelope". You will probably have to fold this envelope in order to place it inside the numbered envelope which is already addressed to the Election Chairman. Be sure to use these envelopes as instructed: any ballot not so enclosed will be disqualified. The prescribed procedure for the election committee is to open these numbered envelopes and destroy THEM ALL BEFORE OPENING THE "Secret Ballot" envelopes, so you need have no fear of anyone being able to check up to see how you voted. The numbers on the envelopes are recorded in THIS OFFICE ONLY, for the purpose of ascertaining that all members were mailed ballots and as I never see the ballots again, no one can ever know how any member voted. I hope I have made myself clear enough that everyone's vote will be duly counted. DO NOT ENCLOSE ANY OTHER CORRESPONDENCE WITH YOUR BALLOT. MAIL IT OUT EARLY, SO AS NOT TO FORGET TO VOTE! It is immaterial HOW you vote, just VOTE!

I am receiving almost daily questions as to where our new Guide Book is. All I can say is that these were promised shortly after the National Dutch Show and any further enquiries must be addressed to the committee chairman as I have no information and you are only wasting postage in writing to this office. I promise you that I will begin mailing them out JUST AS SOON AS I GET THEM!
