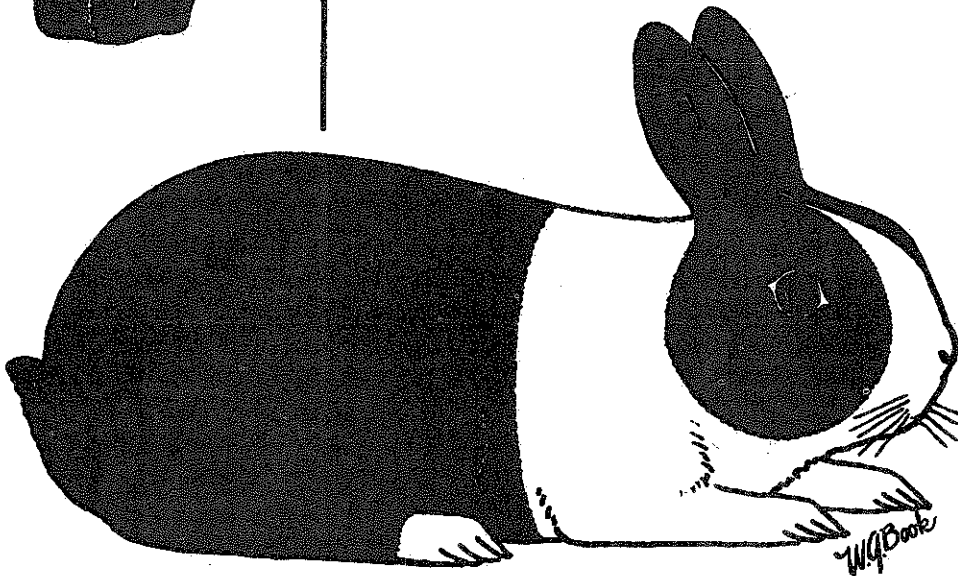
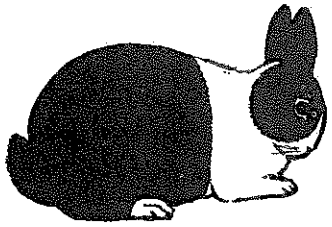


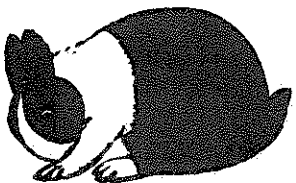

For us who knew him, our memories of Bob will live in our hearts for a long, long time. For Bob Scott was a man who lived in deeds, no years; in thoughts, not breaths; in feelings, not in figures on a dial.

May I take this time to express to his family, the American Dutch Rabbit Club's deepest sympathy and also to thank you for sharing him with us over the years. His work and loyal devotion can be summed up in two words, "Well done, Bob Scott, well done."

Even though death has taken a member away from us so unexpectedly and found us unprepared this Club will still go on. Our President, Bill Summers has appointed Don Guthrie to fill the vacancy on the Board of Directors and complete Bob Scott's term of office. I personally feel that this appointment was a very wise choice. I wish Mr. Guthrie the best of luck in this office and I know that he will live up to the wishes of the membership as Mr. Scott did.

I received a nice letter from another of our directors, Clint Dennis and he informs me that they show their Dutch at night when it is cooler in Oklahoma. Not a bad idea. Sure wish they would do that in New England.

I should have the Dutch Stamps in a few days so those who wanted them before can now reorder.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

TIPS ON CULLING

To most Dutch breeders, culling is the sorting of a litter of rabbits at birth and again at weaning time, but at the Boughton Rabbitry, it is a four stage program that starts the day the youngsters are born and continues until they are about a year old. I will try to outline my program below, in hopes that it will help a beginner or fellow fancier.

The first culling of course takes place the day the litter is born. As my ideal type brood doe is long in barrel and weighs $4\frac{1}{2}$ - 5- pounds, they will kindle an average of 8 youngsters (it is not unusual for them to kindle 10 or 12). This culling is quite simple, the litter is cut to 5 or 6, emphasis being placed on cheeks, blaze and saddle, this is also the time to dispose of those extra large babies, unless they are very well marked.

The next culling is from 6 to 8 weeks, depending on development of the litter. As a general rule, I try to breed the doe back at 6 weeks, the youngsters are left with her for a few days after breeding. To me, this is the most important culling and time should be taken to weigh the qualities and faults of each rabbit. At this time, you should be able to tell what the fur and type of the animal is going to be. Fur is one of the most important things in a Dutch rabbit. As a general rule, if you have good fur, you will have good color and you must have good fur to show off the markings of a Dutch. At this time, dispose of those animals with those long shaggy coats (there are breeders who pluck those long guard hairs from the saddle to sharpen it up, this of course, is not right and as a general rule the judge can spot this work as those long guard hairs protrude over the rest of the body). In culling your does at this time, don't hesitate keeping animals that are a little long in body, if they have good depth. These will be good future brood animals. Don't be too severe on your does with full cheeks but avoid keeping does with high cheeks. At this time, I might mention that it is best to keep animals that are full in markings. If possible, keep does that have good saddles but don't worry too much if they are a litte off and tie to one of the front legs. Stops of course should be as good as possible but don't hesitate about keeping one that is split. If possible, never keep a youngster that has the same fault as a parent.

This is a very important stage in culling your bucks, they must have cobby type and short fur. Cheeks could be as close to the ideal as possible. Saddle, stops and undercut in that order. This is also the age to check those ears, they should be well furred, length to balance body. Eye color is another item to check at this time.

The next stage in culling is about 4 months. At this time, the rabbit should be well out of it's baby fur and if it is going to have scattered white hairs, it should be apparrant at this time. If it has more than a very few, destroy it. Check for grizzled ears or white hairs in the ears at this time. Double check on the type and fur of your future breeders.

The final culling comes when the rabbits are about one year old. After the does have produced two or three litters and the bucks sired a few. If the have continuously produced youngsters with the same serious fault or failed to produce a few keepers, destroy them.

I cannot agree with breeders that suggest "a brood doe must have type and color but forget about the markings". As most of you know, I have been fortunate in producing a few outstanding Dutch in the past few years and not one of them has come from an ideal type doe but they have had good markings. BUT my herd bucks have always had excellent type.

In closing, I might suggest that the beginner use the following plan for selection of his brood stock. The most important item being listed first.

SOMETHING NEW HAS BEEN ADDED!

an ALL BLUE RIBBON RABBIT & CAVY DISPLAY

This year we will have the judging tables for the Bethlehem Fair RABBIT & CAVY SHOW set up in the basement of the barn in which the ART EXHIBIT is housed.

There will be three or four judges, depending on the size of the entry. Judging will be on Saturday starting at eleven AM. As each breed is judged, the BLUE RIBBON WINNERS ONLY, will be transported to the DISPLAY TENT. Those that do not win blue ribbons, will be cooped in the judging area until the owners call for them. The owners of rabbits or cavies that did not win first place, may remove them from the show any time they wish, after they have been judged.

This arrangement has been suggested in the hope that it will accomplish the following:

Exhibitors from a distance can pool their transportation facilities, making it possible for some of them to return home after their animals have been judged.

We will have only our BEST up for display.

Because there will only be about 85 to 100 to display, it will be possible to set up in such a way as to have plenty of aisle room in the tent.

The rabbits displayed will be the six best in each variety of the large breeds and four in the small. Blue ribbon winners in both open classes and junior division displayed.

We think this may be an attractive way to show our hobby to the public. We hope you will think so too. (See the list of Sanctioned Shows on another page for information.)

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

This is the time of year when interest in rabbits is at its very lowest ebb. The spring shows are over -- many breeders are resting their does through the hot months, and for the most part the fair shows do not begin until August. About all there is to do is to keep the bunnies fed, clean and as cool as possible. Of course there is always a certain amount of checking and culling to be done, but with shows so far in the future vacation time at hand, even these activities slow down. One problem that is ever-present with most of us at this time of year is that surplus of youngsters "not quite good enough to keep" that always seems to be over abundant. I thought perhaps some of you had grown a bit tired of eating the same old fried, baked or barbecued rabbit and might relish something different for a change. I think nearly every housewife in a "rabbit family" has concocted one or more recipes, perhaps out of sheer boredom with the ordinary, that has met with great appeal to her family and friends. I thought you might like to share some of mine.

One of my family's favorites is, what shall I call it, perhaps "Swiss" Rabbit? Anyway, I arrived at that name because I fix it very much as you would Swiss Steak. I roll the pieces of a young rabbit in flour and seasoning and brown it in my electric skillet (be sure to fix plenty as it is lip-smacking good). When all of the pieces have been browned return it to the skillet and add a cup of canned tomatoes, a half cup each of diced celery, green pepper and onion. Season it to suit your family's taste -- we like a dash (and I mean JUST a dash) of garlic salt and a pinch of orageno. Also add about a cup of water and simmer until the rabbit is tender. More water may be needed from time to time. For a variation of this you might try your favorite meatless spangetti sauce.

If you have an old doe that has outlived her usefulness and has put on that "middle-aged" spread, you might like this idea: Put the cut up pieces (without removing the excess fat) on a bed of saur kraut and cook it slowly for several hours. The longer it cooks the better it is -- we like it so well done that it falls off the bones.

A couple of old bucks will vanish in a hurry if prepared this way: Brown the cut up pieces in a skillet and arrange in a roaster. Slice a fairly large onion very thinly and spread it over the rabbit. Pour a cup of soured cream over the whole lot, add seasonings and bake slowly until done -- this too may need extra liquid from time to time. The gravy is out of this world and the meat is even better after it is cold.

Well, enough for the gourmets in our club, let's get down to a few more serious items. I do wish that our members would insist that the show secretaries of their local clubs would get their applications for sweepstake sanctions earlier. It is not fair to other Dutch breeders when your show is not fully covered by the listings in the Dutch Reporter. Many of our members set up their show schedules from this listing so even if they happen to get your club's catalog and your show has not been listed, they have their plans all made and your show has lost an exhibitor. Under our rules some of these sanctions come in so late that I would be perfectly within my rights to deny sanction, but I hate to do this as for the most part, the catalogs are already out listing the show as a Dutch Sweepstake and it is questionable as to which would make the more people unhappy, those who believed the catalog and then found the show did not have a sanction, or those who missed it because it was not listed with the other shows.

The deadline is past for copy for the A.R.B.A. Convention catalog and I know that when our membership receives theirs they will wonder "What happened to the Dutch?" Most of you know that every year in the month of October there is an A.R.B.A. Convention show and that IF there are to be any specials on Dutch they must come from among our members. Did you send your bit in? If you didn't, that is "what happened to the Dutch!" I will still accept any and all contributions and credit will be given to the donors in the pages of the Dutch Reporter and all late specials will be listed in the Convention show room.

The A.D.R.C. Nomination ballots went into the mail on July 1st. PLEASE give them your special attention and return them to the election committee before you forget about it. Be sure to check the membership list in the June Dutch Reporter as nearly every year some members waste their nominating vote by voting for someone who is not

a member. Also, bear in mind that for a member to be eligible to be a candidate for office he or she must have been a member in good standing for two or more years as of the date of certification of the results of the election, October 20, 1964.

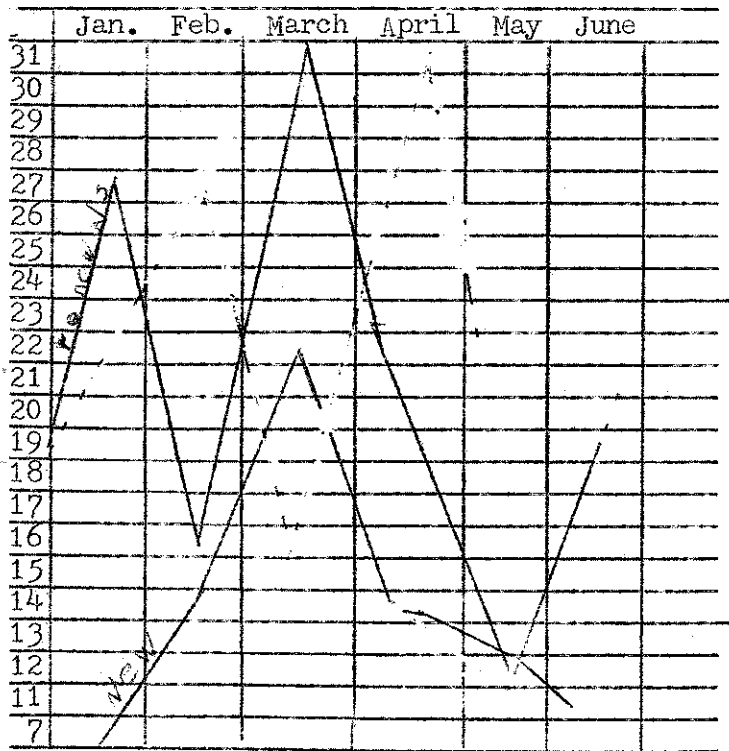
