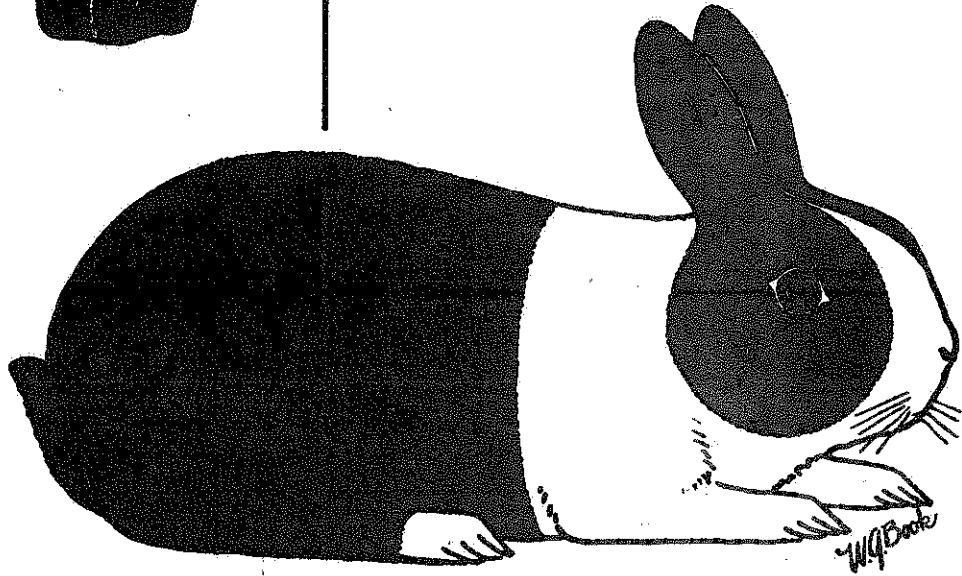

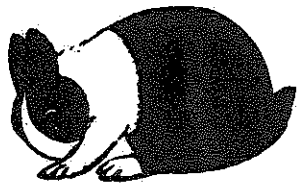

SOME INTROSPECTION

Don Guthrie had a very well written article in the June Reporter about our National Show at Atlanta, but I cannot agree with him in the change of funds (even a little bit) to the Convention show.

In the first place, a local or State club puts on the National Dutch Show. They need all the help they can get to put on a good show. Especially if everyone else does as I do -- waits until it is too late to donate something.

Secondly, the Convention comes the last part of October when, in this part of the

country at least, a lot of our rabbits have completed their molt and are in fine show shape. As I live in Ohio, so-called Mid-West, it may be different in New England, the south, or the west coast.

Here again the ARBA has the advantage by having picked the very best time of year for a national show, so the All Dutch Show had to be held on the other side of the clock or approximately 6 months later as an equalizer.

If the condition of fur, and color of my Dutch were any indication of the national trend at that time there would be very few there.

I'd like, at this time, to apologize to our friends at Atlanta for not being there. An unexpected opportunity was afforded us, at the last minute, to take a trip west in early April and we couldn't turn it down. However, our Dutch were not in show shape when we returned. I doubt if they would have been even if I'd been home.

We had intended to drop in on several of Dutch-breeder friends and some of you who are just names in the Reporter so far. One of our party became ill, causing a hurried return home without seeing Bill Summers and ex-Buckeye, Ernie Parks among others. We spent most of our time in New Mexico.

To get back to our issue -- in October when your rabbits are in condition for showing, you don't need that extra incentive to show them. In April the extra money helps to bring them out.

How anyone can say that the National Dutch show is regional and the Convention is not is beyond my sense of comprehension. It is only natural that the locality which sponsors either show will have the largest percentage in the show. Each of us have personal problems to overcome in attending the show. Employment and distance make a lot of difference. I have no doubt that a late catalog cut the Ann Arbor attendance immensely and in this case this fine group were not at fault over the delay.

Another item that is being overlooked in bringing in numbers in any show is the lack of prize money on displays. Points to count on color displays depend on 40 or more rabbits. Overall displays on 6 or more. How many would put in a couple more just to have the opportunity of winning a Display prize? Why leave it to the boys from California or Arizona or Stohrer and Dan Dee (Miller) from Indiana to load the shows? Should a show break down just because they aren't there? Help yourself.

Maybe your kind of judge is judging the show. We could use a lot of help from the judges themselves. There is an amazing lack of uniformity in judging. Did it ever occur to our judges that possibly we, the breeders, often judge you, the judge, and stay away from shows you judge because we feel that you hadn't done an impartial job in the past? Too many judges judge by their personal likes and not by considering the allocation of points in the various categories.

Many of you are like I am, familiar with the judges in our locality and we wonder how the name judge from another area will treat us in a show. We are reluctant to risk our good "local" reputation until we know more about them. I pay little attention to remarks on the cards if I am attending the show. I judge the judge as he is judging the rabbits. Probably most of you do the same, however, I wonder just how good he is when a variety of remarks are sent from a show that I have been unable to attend and sent my rabbits with a friend.

I believe that our greatest mistake is in not insisting that our judges and show officials see to it that the writers have time to completely do their job. The writers are in charge of the judges and should not hesitate to slow them down when they can't keep up with them.

I think that the Atlanta people missed a bet in not informing everyone of how low rates to expect in that area on Motels. We paid almost twice as high on our Western jaunt. Ann Arbor was not too high -- about \$1.00 higher than Atlanta.

Another way of getting more rabbits in a show is to spread the money -- maybe to 10th. place. The first place rabbit wins the most. Then more on Best of color or Best Opp. Take off some of that top money and spread it around. They will get the trophies anyhow (BOB - BOS). We should have 6 Best of Breeds! The New Zealand people have 3 and they have no markings problem. Just simply a solid color.

A lot of thought went into our Standard and our By-Laws. They just didn't happen overnight. Any change in either should be thoroughly discussed and only changed if approved by the membership, not a committee and especially not the few who are able to

attend a National meeting at one of our national shows. In the past some of them were in no condition to decide anything.

Stan has me blushing! Really I don't deserve all of that! In the first place, much of the ground work was laid before I was stricken. Anybody can lie in bed and talk on the telephone. My husband handled all of the running around, inspection and most of the negotiations after the original discovery. Anyway, it is good to be appreciated. Thank you, Stan.

Along with the article received from our good member, Thatcher, was a little note telling me that on June 14th, he was burning trash in his yard and the wind changed causing his home to catch fire. It burned and they were unable to save a thing from the second floor. His desk burned with all of his rabbit pedigrees and old Guide Books. He was most unhappy about losing his copy of the Dutch Reporter for June 1951 which contained the National Dutch show report from Eaton, Ohio showing some very fine winnings for his rabbits. If any of you should happen to have a copy of that issue I feel sure he would be more than grateful to receive it. He also tells me that they lost most of their antiques, about \$2,000 worth and ALL of his wife's clothes which were on the second floor. That's kind of an expensive way to get a new wardrobe, I'd say.

Another letter raises some questions that I think are deserving of an open reply. I will quote the letter; "I thought to be listed in the sweepstake Standings, you had to pay your dues under the name you show under."

"I noticed 7 names not listed in the membership list that were in the Sweepstake Standings as for Cranston Hgts. Rabbitry, Del. I see that we jump from Conn. to Florida. As for the others and maybe even this one may be typing errors. They are Cooper's H. C. Rabbitry, Mich. Robert's R. R. (Rabbit Ranch) Kansas, Clipforts Rabbitry Calif., Miller Bros., I know they are listed as C. Jay and John W. Twin Valley Rabbitry (the Donley's) N.Y. and Bunny Knoll Rabbitry, Ohio"

"I'm NOT trying to find fault with the DR I'm just wanting to know the TRUE facts. You DON'T have to take time to answer me personally but as I said before many people may have the same idea I had."

"I did find most of their ads and I know who they are so there is no question about that. I think when we have a question we shouldn't ask other members and get them to guess like we have. I think YOU KNOW the answer and can explain SWEEPSTAKE STANDINGS BETTER THAN ANYONE ELSE."

Perhaps one clue to the answer lies in that last paragraph -- IF all of those members who are in the top twenty in the sweepstakes would take an ad in The Dutch Reporter it just might be of benefit to them in more ways than one.

At the present time I have a card file containing almost a hundred rabbitry names which do not include the surname of the member. All application blanks contain a line for listing such assumed, or rabbitry name and when a membership application comes in

information on it is received a double filing is made -- one under the member's name and one under his rabbitry name so that a cross check can be made when either appears on a show report. Some memberships are paid in the rabbitry name as is the one for Cranston Hgts. Rabbitry (Mr. & Mrs. G. C. Sturgis, Sr. -- double membership). The omission of Mr. & Mrs. Sturgis' names from the membership list was an error on my part as their renewal had been received at the time of cutting the stencils for last month's Dutch Reporter, but had not been processed at that time. Cooper's Hillcrest Rabbitry, Mich. should be perfectly simple to locate as it contains a last name and Mrs. Lynn Cooper is the only Cooper listed in Michigan. Clipfort Rabbitry should be fairly familiar as original membership of Judge Dave Holland of California dates back to 1949 and his mother showed under that name before him. One thing I would like to make clear is that Miller Bros. Rabbitry does NOT embrace C. Jay and John W. Miller as your president Bill Summers pointed out in the Nov. 1964 issue of the Dutch Reporter. C. Jay sometimes show as J & D Rabbitry (his wife's name being Dinah), but John Miller has been listed as Miller Bros. at least since 1953. Bunny Knoll Rabbitry & Caviary is Don Weeks of Highland, Ohio. The other one listed in the sweepstake standings which the writer failed to question was Frank Miller's Dan Dee Rabbitry from Indiana. In some families we have as many as four members in one family with paid up memberships and at some shows they will show under the rabbitry name and in certain fair shows where the regulations are real strict they will show under their individual names, but I have instructed to cred all winnings to the rabbitry name no matter which member is listed on the show report. There is nothing about this which is against the rules any more than when two members show together as a partnership. What I cannot do is list a partnership name (such as Smith & Jones) where only ONE of the partners is a member of the Dutch Club as non-members are not entitled to benefits of this club.

It had never occurred to me that this method of listing had created any problem as most of those with good enough breeding stock to maintain a standing in the top-twenty are usually pretty well known throughout the country. Once in a while I get a card from someone asking me for the address of one or another rabbitry, but this is very seldom. The phase of the situation which causes the most trouble to me is when someone joins the club under the name Pete Johnson with no rabbitry name listed on his application and I begin to find winners in the shows credited to Peter's Rabbits. I check my file and find no such listing in the rabbitries -- then I check my membership file to see if there is someone by the name of "Peters" within logical distance of the place of the show and find nothing! This listing is treated as a non-member with no credit for sweepstake points and no special ribbons sent out. A few weeks or months later I get a letter from Pete Johnson wanting to know why he didn't get his ribbons from such and such a show. Sometimes (more often than not) all he will give me is the town in which the show was held and for a date "Spring show". I keep a cross-file of these shows -- one by date (and I mean EXACT date) and one by sanction number. If I had half hour to spare I could probably find the show he is talking about, but I don't, usually, so I drop him a note asking him to send me more specific information. After a couple of weeks or so we finally get it straightened out and I get him properly entered in my files so that this cannot happen again, but a lot of time has been wasted and sometimes feelings hurt, all of which could be avoided. There are times when I really wish I were a mind reader.

I guess I have taken up enough space for this month, so write me some more questions this makes the job of producing a column much simpler.

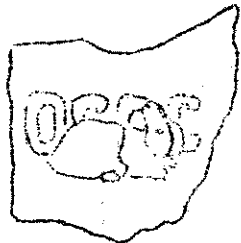
