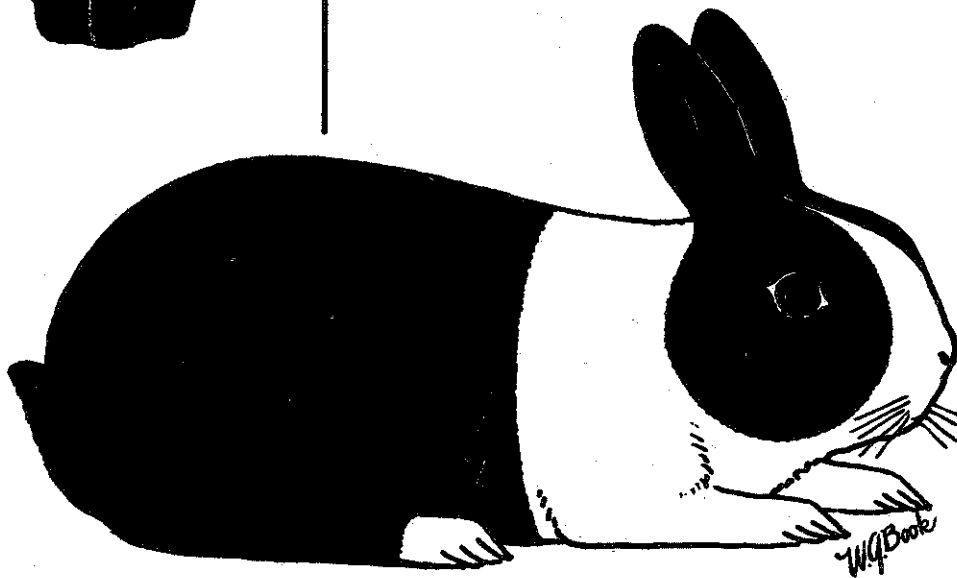

SECRETARY'S CHIT CHAT

Our Michigan Fair shows started off with the Lenawee County Fair at Adrian, then with a week's rest we went into the Calhoun County Fair at Marshall and before that closed our big Michigan State Fair in Detroit. Our rabbits are still there. Carldon Gaddis judged both of the first two fairs and Marvin Kroening of Wisconsin handled the Dutch at the State Fair. They had their hands full at all three shows as the entries for the fair shows are way up this year. I had a note from Mrs. Bess Franklin of Hudson, Mass. telling me that her husband, Fred had passed away on July 2nd. and then found the following nice tribute to him in the pages of the "American Rabbit Journal":

"Frederick Franklin of 324 Central St., Hudson, Mass., who was an active member of the American Rabbit Breeders Ass'n passed away on July 2, 1966. He was the founder of the Middlesex Rabbit Breeders Ass'n and was a life member of this association. He was an ardent Dutch fancier and a great cavy fancier as well.

"Mr. Franklin joined the Association on April 1, 1958, granted a registrar's license Jan. 1, 1963 and a Cavy judges license 1963, as well as being an exclusive Dutch rabbit judge (the only one). He fancied only covies and Dutch rabbits and was an expert on them both.

"While he was confined to a wheelchair and was unable to walk, he attended most all of the shows in his area and with his devoted wife were owners of the Town Line Pet Shop in Hudson. Regardless of his handicap he was always on hand at any show he could attend and was most cooperative when anything came up pertaining to the ARBA, Dutch rabbits, or the cavy fancy. We are sorry with the passing of Mr. Frankli as we will miss him much since he was a young man and am sure could have always made a name for himself in the fancy. To his wife and any other member of his family who might survive, we extend our heartfelt sympathy in the bereavement."

Earl Hord called me on Aug. 18th. to inform me of the sudden passing of Andy Diamond of Pueblo, Colorado. He suffered a heart attack while on his way to work on the 17th. Fortunately his car just wandered over to the curb and no one was injured and no damage done. The funeral was held on Aug. 19th, the day after the opening of the Colorado State Fair at which Andy was to have been assistant show superintendnet. Some of you may remember Andy as our president, Bill Summer's travelling companion to recent Conventions and National Dutch shows. We had the pleasure of meeting him first, as I know many of you did at the National Dutch Show in Colorado Springs. He was a fine man and an excellent breeder of both Dutch and White New Zealands. Our deepest sympathy goes to his wife and to the son who was his partner in his rabbit activities.

On a pleasanter note -- Katherine Roberts writes me that their Little Dutch Girls soft-ball team are doing their utmost to prove "You Can't Beat The Dutch" being undefeated at the half-way mark of the season. She says their prospects looked good for winning the city tournament in August -- Hope they dyd! She says their team manager is none other than Pete Naylor, president of the Satin Rabbit Club and they've got him wearing a shirt with a pretty Black Dutch on his back. That's a sneaky way of getting publicity!

Just received some news that will be of interest to those of our members who raise rabbits for laboratory. The Bulletin for the National Society for Medical Research arrived today and it gives this happy news: "A House-Senate Conference Committee has resolved the differences between the House and Senate versions of HR13881, the Poage-Magnusen laboratory animal procurement bill."

Highlights of the Conference Committee agreement as it relates to rabbit breeders (and/or dealers) follows:

1. Dealers will be licensed by the Secretary of Agriculture.
2. Dealers will identify dogs and cats, retain records of previous ownership and conform to standards of humane handling. If a dealer, in addition to dogs and cats, handles monkeys, guinea pigs, hamsters or rabbits, regulations will be issued by the Department of Agriculture governing the handling of these "other animals". Those who buy and sell "other animals", but not dogs or cats, will not be considered dealers."

I'm sure this will be good news to many of our members. The full text of the final legislation will be carried in the Sept. Bulletin and I'm sure a copy can be obtained by writing them at NSMR. Headquarters; 1330 Massachusetts Ave., NW, Washington, D. C. 20005. They also have available upon request, a comic-book style pamphlet intended to acquaint primary school age children with the use of animals in medical research. The title is "A Medal for Bowser" and tells the story of a stray pup's contribution to research on aureomycin.

That is all for now -- maybe we will see you at Columbus, Ohio or at Springfield, Ill. at the Ill. Convention Show.
