

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

It has been quite some time rince I have come forth with a message for all of my Dutch Rabbit breeding friends. The first half of this year has been one of the most hectic we have ever lived through. On Jan. 1st we sold our home of 25 years. This same week we acquired two grandchildren 2 and 3 years of age to raise. About May 1st we moved in with our son a temporary basis. We also built a beautiful new home for our rabbits (not us, yet!) It is a turquoise steel pole barn 24 x 80 ft. It is set back in a notch between two hills and can only be seen from the road if one looks very quickly. Our new house will be completely hidden from the road. Our house will be up on a hill to the West of our rabbitry, with a view off to the North of trees and a swamp, which we plan on turning into a lake as it is full of springs, on our property 27 acres. Of course it is very inconvenient for us to have to travel 6 miles one way each day to care for them, but we do manage to spend most of each week-end at t the farm. One end of the barn is enclosed with a cement floor and we have our furniture stored there and have set up camping accomidations. It is really fun to stay out there.

Things are moving along fine as far as the Dutch Club is concerned. The new Guide Book is in the hands of the printer and should be ready to mail before too long. At this date there have been 4 more sweepstakes shows than there were by this time last year. 48 more than 1959. New temberships and renewals are coming in real well for mid-summer. Personally we are very said pleased with our new Editor, think she is doing a real fine job. Just hope you will be patient with our seeming slowness at coordination. We are working on it and hope to have things smoothed out real soon. If you receive your Dutch Reporter and find it stamped, "Your membership expired last month" and you KNOW that you have sent me your dues...don't worry about it until you miss another Dutch Reporter, if you should, just remember that everything between Doris and I has to go through that impossible Chicago Post Office!

I do have one problem with which I could use some help: I have never received Show Reports for two shows in the 1968 - 69 series. One is the Florida State Fair, held in Tampa on Feb. 4-14, 1969 and the other is Midwest RBA at Independence, Mo. This report was received but had to be returned for corrections and was never sent back. The Flordia State Fair Secretary has not responded to inquiries. Maybe some of you who have ribbons and points from these shows can locate the reports and get them to me.

The Election ballots are due to go into the mail on or before Aug. 15th, but to date I have not heard from several of the candidates. It would sure help to facilitate my we if the members would put their replies to these letters in the return mails after they receive them.

Hope to be able to get around to some of the fall shows...our breeding has been pretty fruitless this year. A great scarcity of showable juniors..sure hope we have better luck on the next round.

I wish this had been brought up for more thoughts and common sense by the breeders. I don't like the weight on juniors as many of us Dutch Breeders use our young for meat. Too small a Dutch and you wait six menths to get two pounds of meat. Lowering the weight to three pounds on Sr. Bucks will make lots of Grand Champions that have been shown as juniors for years. This is as like the stops a few years ago. They used to be one half way to the hock. Now it is one third because of a special group of people that couldn't get the proper length. This disqualification for dewlap is the silliest thing I've ever heard of, that is for does that do not breed or only have one or two young per litter, or for the person who buys the Best Dutch for showing only and never breeds them. At a show yesterday, a poll of Dutch Breeders was taken. They were against all of these proposals.

Dear Editor:

The belated I would like to comment on your remarks in a previous edition of the Dutch Reporter regardi. Judges and Judging. You said semething to the effect that the Judge who overlooks inequalifications is harming only himself. Fortunate, indeed if it were only so! Even worse he is being unfair to the exhibitors. We do not have rabbit shows for the sake of the Judges. They are only an adjunct. We have shows so that the exhibitors can have the results of his efforts evaluated with that of others. Anything less than a careful and objective appraisal is a travesty. The most authentic representative of the particular breed or variety is entitled to win. The disqualifications are specified in the Standard of Perfection and are not based on the whim of the judge. Any time a judge justifies an award with "I like"..... he has called his own competency into question. Only the standard is the basis of comparasion, not subjective preference. The disqualification are stated in the Standard of Perfection to be followed. In fairness to the exhibitors, the judge will letno subjective considerations influence his decisions....

An exhibitor that has been hours grooming and caring for his animals to be shown, deserves, as Mr. Dannehl says, " to have his efforts evaluated with that of others. Of course the guy that buys his winners, regardless of cost, is another matter. He is substituting money for animal husbandry, of course there is nothing wrong with that either, if one has a lot of money. Remember, little Breeder, the vi:tory is twice as sweet, when you have worked to raise that winner.
