

An Experience by Barb Walker.....

We have a very amourous Tortoise Dutch buck that lets nothing come between him and the lady of his choice, be it Dutch, New Zealand White or a cat. The wall between him and the New Zealand next to him was too much to scale, so, chew - chew - chew.....

Thirty days later there were ten results of that ill fated love. Eight black with a sprinkling of Dutch markings and two definite Tortoise Dutch...no White New Zealands. Kind of proves...."You Can't Beat The Dutch".....

Hints around the rabbitry....

This is fly time and many troubles originate with these pests. Be on the alert for dead babies in the nest boxes. If any of you have seen a rabbit with maggots, you know what I mean. Examine your breeders regularly and don't be afraid to clip the long nails (I use a Resco Dog Nail Clipper) if there is a problem with hocks that are just starting to go sore, use a bit of vaseline and rub it in good. I think it helps and one onnce of prevention is worth one pound of cure....Always check the ears and if there is any sign of wax deposit or ear canker, clean it out. I use 5% solution of phenol in olive cil. Use a cotton tipped swab and burn whatever comes out.....

Pick up the manure, flies breed in it, use a good fly bait...... Nest boxes with a 1/4 " wire floor work real good in the heat.

I promised to let you know the outcome of the doe that had the cesearian several issues back. This was the doe imported from Germany. R.E. Dwarf. I bred her to a Blue Eye Polish (he was a proven sire) and the doe kindled one bunny. The nicest Gray Dutch marked youngster one would want, as Barb says, "You Can't Beat The Dutch". dl It does prove that a Cesarian can be preformed on a rabbit successfully tho.......

How many of you attend the Conventions???Then how many sit through the Judge's Conference? I never fail to learn something by listening to my constituents discuss the pro and cons of judging. I ran across my file for the 1954 convention and my notes on Dutch read, "Charles Lewis stressed way of handling for judging undercut. There is a difference in arch. Keep away from too high check markings as it seems that the belt recedes also. The real fancier is the man who wins as tho he were used to it and loses as if he enjoyed it."

We are in the full swing of the Fair shows and I hear rumblings on cow hocked Dutch. This is a problem that we, as breeders are going to have to take a long hard look at. It is a disqualification and should be called. It seems that the only way we ever get down to the business of correcting a fault is when we have enough animals disqualified to drive the fact home that we have a problem....

I have also noted that a Dutch with a narrow blaze doesn't stand much of a chance, yet there are only 5 points on the blaze, the same number as there is on the neck. I am aware that there is 12 points on the checks, but I am talking of the narrow blaze with fairly good checks. I also wonder if there aren't times when we confuse type with condition. Our Director, Don Lovejoy said somethig that has stuck with me, "type is what you see and condition is what you feel".......

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH-

GUEST WRITER of the month......Mary Malikowski, Coon Rapids, Mn.

I'm not a long time rabbit raiser, about 6 years, but I think anyone can write about something they like. And I'm going to try. I began raising rabbits with "grades" and added a Chocolate Dutch Buck to my herd for color in Easter Bunnies. Two years later when I decided to raise pedigreed stock, I naturally chose Dutch. Not believ. ing a Blue Dutch rabbit existed, I ordered a pair plus a black doe. They were senior at the time and the blue doe lived to be six, when she died from mucoid enteritis with some of her 4 week old babies. The buck I resold to people from Wisconsin and the black doe went up north. She is still littering now. My herd buck is a blue from the original buck and one doe from my first pedigreed litter. This doe was with the first doe when I bought her. These are not record ages, but to me this is longevity. I've had other breeds and can't seem to get them past two years, the last of which they seem to spend sick. I've never had a Dutch die from colds or some unknown cause. Enteritis, the worst disease, will take a few. The only other way I lost any was dogs or babies in the nest box during heat because they were two fat. I owe a lot of my other breed juniors to a foster Dutch mother too. For me they don't get sore hocks or ear canker.

People say good rabbits in marked breeds are hard to get. Well, I think every Dutch raiser was pleasantly overjoyed by a Dutch litter they had and likewise dismayed with another, especially this year. But all are in the same boat. At least you know these breeders will be around to try again for you next year. For me, I seem to get about a 75% does, too.

The winters seem to go well for my Dutch. The markings, ears and type seem to be a lot easier to get. If only the weather would cooperate.

Perhaps I haven't added much with this article so here's my last try.....

I found a cheap feeder that is easy to clean. Just a 12oz vegetable or bean can attached to the wire with a clip like the ones you see on clip boards. So easy to remove and wash. Some of the cans are rustproof now, too. You can use any size you want and the clips are only 5 cents....

Have you ever heard of sheep causing trouble with the eyes in rabbits? I had two does with a complete moon eye, since disposing of the sheep, one now has good eyes and the other a small spot in one eye.

I've always found that if you had eye trouble you kisposed of the strain back to the trouble. The does (mothers) have kindled again from the same buck and carry good eye color.

ANSWER: I don't know, but one could prove this out by exposing the rabbits to sheep again and seeing what happened. In this day and age of pollution, insecticides and "what have you" one just doesn't know where to turn at times. I think of the article written by John Jennings in Small Stock regarding the addition of minerals to the rabbit's diet to eliminate eye trouble. Does anyone have any information on this problem?????
