



President's MESSAGE

he month of July flew by for me, and now I have to hustle to get this in to Julia. This should be the last fluctuation in the printing schedule of the DR. We had to adjust it again so that we could comply with the requirements for changing our Constitution and By-laws.

The proposed changes in our Constitution and By-laws are the largest portion of this DR. I would encourage you to read these over and VOTE! Your Board of Directors approved these last fall, and they were discussed at the membership meeting, then each proposed change had the necessary number of signatures to present each to the membership. The proposed changes in the Constitution and By-laws were made to give the club some flexibility in operations. If these proposals pass, we will have the flexibility to pay the sweepstakes chairman more or less, without a C & B change. A member will be able to submit a resume, instead of collecting signatures to run for office; some members do not see 15 members of the Dutch club in one year to collect enough signatures to run for office. Several of the proposals had to do with timing. We replaced some deadline dates, with so many days to comply, etc. We tried to make the document user friendly, while still requiring the vote of the membership to make major changes. Please VOTE! THE BALLOT DEADLINE IS THE 15TH OF SEPTEMBER. VOTE NOW!

We will be trying something different at this year's ARBA Convention. We did not put an ad in the Convention catalog, instead putting the money toward a double sized booth. This will give us room for the Publicity items, and a hospitality area. THIS IS NOT AN AREA WHERE PEOPLE CAN PILE ALL OF THEIR STUFF WHILE THEY WALK AROUND. THIS IS AN AREA WHERE ADRC MEMBERS CAN SIT A SPELL AND TALK. We hope this works out to the benefit of the ADRC members.

Anyone considering putting in a bid for the 2000 NDS? We would be able to secure the judges of choice if we can work two to three years ahead, instead of one to two years. This would also give the host club the opportunity to raise ample funds to put on a great show.

The Board has voted to allow the Kansas Dutch Club to charge \$3.00 for the 1998 NDS Catalog. This means that you will have to request a catalog. This is the second time that this has been requested and allowed. This gives the host club the ability to raise some funds, and not have to mail the catalog to all who exhibited at the previous NDS. In the case of the Kansas Club, they will not have to send to all who showed at Ohio, many of which won't be in Kansas. This will also help them to hopefully make enough money on the show so that they can return some of the sponsorship money to the ADRC.



A BIG WIN IN ILLINOIS

Dear Julia.

We realized that our little Brown Gray Jr. Doe was up for Best in Show. The six class winner was a beautiful Satin Chin. I personally thought that this was it, we would go home with the best four because a Dutch does not go all the way. The youngest judge looked at both and then picked our rabbit. We all were in tears that we won B.I.S.

The reason that I am writing this is during the next show our Brown Gray won two B.O.B.s and has accumulated five legs as a junior! I talked to some of the Dutch people at the shows and they had said to write and send a picture to the Dutch Reporter telling the story of our rabbits. We have to get another leg as a senior to register her.

The utmost important topic of this letter is not the winning of B.I.S., although it is a wonderful feeling that your rabbit is on the table winning. The most important thing is the people who helped Cindy

and I achieve this feat. I would Like to thank Kevin Hooper, Todd Uran, Denny McAtee and our partner and friend in Dutch Mr. David Graffund! Without these people, devoted to raising quality Dutch Rabbits, Cindy and I would not be here today. To all the people who raise, give, and sell their good stock to people who want to get started in Dutch rabbits, we Salute you.

FROM THE DUTCH STANDARDS COMMITTEE

about how to make our Dutch breed better by offering suggestions and/or possible changes to be utilized in our next breed standard.

You as a member of this association have a say in what you think may need to be changed, added, reworded or maybe even omitted. Your right to vote on such changes will be forthcoming in the months ahead, but for now let's hear your thoughts for the improvement of the breed.

However, there are a couple points to remember. We are looking for improvement in the breed as a whole, not something to help benefit an individual's herd or personal stock. These suggestions will all be considered carefully first by the Dutch standards committee. Upon the committee's agreement, a wording will be written and presented to the Dutch club Board of Directors and then presented to the membership for a vote. The new standards proposal along with a tally of the club's vote will then be presented to the A.R.B.A. Standard's Committee for their evaluation. Remember the Dutch standard is the property of the American

Rabbits Breeders Assoc., not the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Upon the acceptance of the changes by the A.R.B.A. Standard's Committee it then goes to the A.R.B.A. Board of Directors for final approval.

Therefore, it is very important to suggest points that maybe are being misinterpreted by not only breeders but also registrars and judges. By eliminating those inbetween "gray" areas and making a standard that is clear, concise and easy to understand it can only make our standard and the Dutch breed stronger.

Please take the time to correspond with your fellow Dutch breeders at the shows. Talk with fellow registrars and judges as well. I have made it a personal goal of mine to speak with each Dutch judge after they are done showing and ask them "What do you see in the Dutch that needs the most improvement?" After you begin to hear some of the same responses from everyone then maybe it is something that should be looked into.

Please feel free to contact any member of the Dutch Standards committee with your thoughts. They are: Erik Bengtson (Lewiston, MN), Ray Brewer (Saluda, SC), Marti Dill (Toney, AL), Sue Peters (Morgantown, WV), Martin Preede (Westwood, NJ), and chairman Eric Mixdorf (Waterloo, IA).

Here are a few suggestions that the committee is currently looking into:

Adding a section "NOTE TO JUDGES" on how to properly pose and roll over a Dutch without distorting the animal's type and markings.

Color description clarification on the Tortoise and Brown Gray varieties.

A clearer description on the disqualification of the undercut marking.

A new point distribution on the markings.

Weights on juniors.

Article II of our constitution states: The object of this club shall be to promote, encourage and improve the breeding of Dutch rabbits. We are doing our part now let's hear from you.


PUBLICITY REPORT

FROM THE CALIFORNIA DUTCH RABBIT CLUB "THE DUTCH BLAZE"

Did you know

Did you know chocolate Dutch is the most recently developed recognized color of Dutch we have today? The Dutch originated in the Netherlands but was further developed in England. In 1925, Mr.

E. Mitchell of Northhampton, England started the strain of chocolate Dutch that we have in America today.

He used a good typed black buck and crossed it with three Havana does. He bred the black buck back to the F-1 does and crossed F-1 bucks and does. With careful selection and judicious breeding while paying particular attention first to color and type and later to markings, he was able to produce and show better and better marked chocolate Dutch. In 1933 he won The English Chocolate Junior Cup.

In the fall of 1935 Mr. Charles O. Lewis brought this chocolate Dutch from Mr. Mitchell. The rabbit was entered at the National Convention Show at New Haven Conn. and won Best. A.O.C. (In 1935 A.O.C. was blue-gray, blue-fawn, yellow (gold?), red, and any other color). It lost out for best Dutch to a fine black. This rabbit became known as "Chocolate Pioneer."

Mr. Lewis imported a doe the following June and one or two others were imported later. This is the foundation stock for our modern chocolate Dutch as we know them today. Thank you Mr. Mitchell and Mr. Lewis.



Proposed changes to the ADRC Constitution and By-Laws

The American Dutch Rabbit Club will be listed here as the ADRC.

#1) Current Version, Article VI Section 1 Constitution

A petition shall be requested from the Secretary of the ADRC by any member who wishes to run for an ADRC office. The petition must be returned to the Secretary by June 1st, prior to an election with a required (15) signatures, all of whom are American Dutch Rabbit Club members. All candidates must be current ADRC and ARBA members. Those signing a petition may only sign one (1) petition for the office of Director within your District.

Be it resolved that we change Article VI Section 1 Constitution to read:

Section 1: Any member wishing to run for an elected ADRC office or Board position shall submit a resume to the Secretary-Treasurer, prior to May 1st, in the year the office or Board Position shall be voted upon, stating the position for which they wish to become a candidate. The resume shall be printed in the April-May-June Issue of the Dutch Reporter. All candidates must be current ADRC and ARBA members, and be actively breeding Dutch Rabbits. Any member to be eligible for office must have been in continous good standing at least two (2) years prior to May 1st of the year in which the election is being held, and all candidates shall remain in good standing with membership fee paid in advance at least through the date of assuming office, January 1st.

Rational for the above changes: This will make the process to run for an office open to all. Some members may be in an area where they would not be able to get the required number of signatures on a petition.

#2) Current version of Article VI Section 2 Constitution

Two final ballots and two (2) ballot envelopes shall be included in each July-August Dutch Reporter Mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the ADRC, with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of September, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee; open the ballot envelopes; count the ballots; and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of September. The Election Chairman shall then package the final ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the ADRC, and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible to any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

Be it resolved that the new Article VI, Section 2 Constitution read:

Section 2 Final numbered election ballots, shall be mailed out by August 1st to eligible voting members. Ballots shall then be marked and placed in a pre-addressed envelope and returned to the ADRC Election Committee Chairman by September 15th, at which time the polls shall be closed. The Chairman of the Election Committee, will assemble the Election Committee; open and count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor, within 22 days. The Election Chairman shall then package the final Ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the ADRC, and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible to any member in good standing, provided proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

Rational: A separate mailing will get more attention and better voter turn-out. The numbered ballots will identify who

is voting. This will maintain the confidentiality of the ballot, yet allow the eligibility of the ballots to be determined. Currently about 1/3 of all ballots are being rejected because members have not been following directions.



#3) Current Version of Article VI, Section 3 Constitution reads:

The Secretary-Treasurer shall then inform the candidates and the Board of Directors of the results and shall declare the candidate having the highest number of votes elected. The officers-elect shall assume offices on the following January 1st and serve their elected terms or until their successors have been elected.

Be it resolved that Article VI, Section 3 Constitution be changed to read:

Section 3: The Sec-Treas shall then inform the candidates and the board of Directors of the results within three weeks, and shall declare the candidate/s having the highest number of votes elected. The officer/s elect shall assume offices on the following January 1st and serve their elected terms or until their successors have been elected or duly appointed. In the case of a tie for any office, a majority vote of the remaining Board of Directors shall break the tie.



#4) Current Version of Article VI, Section 4 Constitution reads:

Any member to be eligible for office, must have received at least 10 votes to become a candidate for office of President or Vice President; he/she must have received at least five (5) votes to become a candidate for the office of Director. Any member to be eligible for office, must have been in continuous good standing at least two years prior to certification date of election, September 20, and all candidates shall remain in good standing with membership fee paid in advance at least through date of assuming office, January 1st.

Be is resolved that Article VI, Section 4 Constitution be changed to read:

Section 4: If any candidate is running unopposed for office, they shall be declared elected. No ballot will be issued for an unopposed office. Any office where no candidate has submitted a resume, shall be filled by appointment by the President with a 2/3 majority approval of the Board of Directors.

<u>Rational for above change:</u> This will save the club money by not having to issue a ballot for a person running unopposed. Eligibility requirements are listed in section one of this Article.



#5) Current Version of By-Laws, Article I-Dues:

The membership dues shall be seven dollars (\$7.00) per year payable in advance, with a combination membership being provided for husband and wife at nine dollars (\$9.00) per year, expiring with the same date. One dollar (\$1.00) of each yearly membership fee is to be placed into a separate account called the guidebook/Contingency fund and the provisions of Article III - Section 1 and 2 of the By-Laws shall not apply to these monies. A single paid life membership may be purchased for the sum of one-hundred and forty dollars (\$140), payable in advance. A husband/wife life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred eighty dollars (\$180), payable in advance. All deductions from paid life membership are excluded. After membership has expired, the member may renew within a period of sixty days (60); otherwise upon sending in membership fees, the member will be given a new membership unless they specifically request that their membership be back dated more than sixty (60) days to the original expiration date in order that they may keep their original membership number. Any member having been delinquent sixty (60) days or more, whether requesting old membership number or not, shall be deprived of all sweepstakes points accumulated prior to the expiration date.

Be it resolved that Article I of By-Laws be changed to read:

Dues - The membership Dues shall be: Adult \$10.00 Youth \$8.00 Husband/Wife \$14.00

Family Membership \$20.00

Youth must be 18 years of age or under at the time of application. A family membership shall consist of no more than two adults and their children (18 years of age or younger) who are in the household, at the same address.

Only one Dutch Reporter and Guidebook shall be mailed to a Husband/wife membership or a family membership.

Lifetime memberships for Adult and Husband/Wife members can be purchased for twenty (20) times the current membership fees, payable in advance, by those members 35 years of age or older. All deductions from paid life memberships are excluded.

One dollar of each membership shall be placed into a separate account called the "Guidebook/Contingency Fund", and the provisions of Article III - Sections 1 and 2 of the By-laws shall not be applied to these monies.

Membership dues are good for a one year period, beginning from when the membership is processed. After membership has expired, the member may renew within a period of sixty (60) days; otherwise upon sending in membership fees, the member will be given a new membership number unless they request that their membership be back dated more than 60 days to the original expiration date, in order that they may keep continuous membership and the original membership number. Any member having been delinquent sixty (60) days or more, shall be deprived of all sweepstakes points accumulated prior to the expiration date. All youth members retain all of the privileges as adults except for voting.

<u>Rational:</u> The addition of the family membership would be a benefit to many of our members and we would be following the lead of several other specialty clubs. The membership fees have not been raised since back in the seventies. We have had to restrict what our club can do because of tight funding. The above membership fees are in line with other breed clubs. The last paragraph has been condensed while keeping the intentions intact. The life membership will be restricted to those 35 or older. This follows the lead of the ARBA.



#6) Current Version of Article II Section 4 By-Laws reads:

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to edit or cause to be edited, the Dutch Reporter. If for any reason the Secretary is unable to perform this duty, it shall be the duty of the President to appoint an editor and the Secretary shall cooperate with the appointed editor by giving such news from the office as would be of interest to the membership.

Be it resolved that Article II Section 4, be changed to read:

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to edit or cause to be edited, the Dutch Reporter. If, for any reason the Secretary is unable to perform this duty, it shall be the duty of the President to appoint a Dutch Reporter Editor subject to 2/3 majority approval of the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall cooperate with the editor by providing such news from the office as would be of interest to the membership.

<u>Rational</u>: This makes the appointment of the editor consistent with other appointed positions by requiring a 2/3 majority Board approval.

#7) Proposed Article III Sec 1a By-Laws

Current version of Section 1a Apportionment of funds reads:

The Sweepstakes chairperson shall receive one dollar (\$1.00) per open show sanction paid from the open show sanction fee as remuneration for time and effort spent by said chairperson in calculating, tabulating, and recording all show results. The sweepstakes chairperson shall provide the Dutch Reporter Editor with a typed copy of each show report listed chronologically and sweepstakes standing for both open and youth divisions listed numerically; top twenty open and youth divisions as well as top five from each district.

Be it resolved that Section 1a be changed to read:

Section 1a: The Sweepstakes chairperson shall receive compensation for each processed show report paid from the show sanction fee as compensation for time and effort spent in calculating, tabulating, and recording all show results. The ADRC Board of Directors will determine the appropriate fee. The Sweepstakes Chairperson shall provide the Dutch Reporter Editor with a typed copy of each show report listed chronologically and sweepstakes standings for both open and youth divisions listed numerically; at least the top twenty (20) Open and Youth as well as the top five (5) from each district.

Rational: Flexibility to pay the Sweepstakes chairman as they deem necessary and it allows more than twenty listed in sweepstakes standings.

#8) Current Version of Article III, Section 2 of the By-Laws reads:

The dues shall be further divided with twelve and one-half (12.5) percent to be allotted for the ADRC Publicity Department. These monies are to be placed in a separate account and retained by the Secretary-Treasurer. Any portion of these monies may be transferred to the Publicity Department, or to any ADRC purpose, upon approval of a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The purpose, upon approval of a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The remaining sixty-two and one-half percent (62.5%) shall go to the General Fund. All percentage payments are to be paid on a monthly basis.

Be it resolved that Article III, Section 2 of the By-Laws be changed to read:

Section 2: The dues shall be further divided with twelve and one-half percent (12.5%) to be allotted to the ADRC Publicity Department. Any portion of these monies may be transferred to the Publicity Department or to any ADRC purpose, upon approval of the Board of Directors. The remaining sixty two and one-half percent (62.5%) shall go to the General Fund.

Rational: Removal of separate account retained by the Secretary-Treasurer. Publicity Chairman to maintain this account. Removal of payments being made on a monthly basis. Currently, the publicity fund is self-sufficient. Any payments that are made can be between the Secretary-Treasurer and the publicity chairman.

#9) Current Version of Article III, Section 2A ByLaws reads:

An annual allotment of five hundred dollars (\$500) from the General Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Show, with further stipulation that the ADRC Receive recognition for this allotment. Said money to be sent by the Secretary-Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to January 1st preceding the National Dutch Show for that year. Show sponsors must have all NDS Show judges secured before any ADRC allocation is made. The ADRC requires three (3) open judges, chosen by and from the membership, at each National Dutch Show. The ADRC Board of Directors has the authority to change the required number of judges if deemed necessary according to the entry. If a third open judge is required, the ADRC will make payment for this judge up to two-hundred-fifty dollars (\$250). The open judges at the National Dutch Rabbit Show shall be the top selections from the ballot if possible.

Be it resolved that Article III, Section 2a By Laws be changed to read:

Section 2a: An annual allotment of five hundred dollars (\$500) from the general fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Show, with further stipulation that the ADRC receive recognition for this allotment. Said money is to be sent by the Secretary-Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to the 1st of January, preceding the NDS for that year. Show sponsors must have all NDS judges secured before any allocation is made. The ADRC requires three (3) open judges, chosen by and preferably from the membership, at each NDS. The ADRC Board has the authority to change the required number of judges as deemed necessary by the number of entries. The open judges shall be the top selections from the ballot if possible.

Rational: In many instances, our judges that are chosen from the membership are not available. This enables us to use the same procedure we have been using, hiring who we have to hire to fill our judging requirements. This also removes the responsibility of the ADRC for paying for a third judge.



#10) Current version of Article III, Section 2C By Laws reads:

An annual allotment of fifty dollars (\$50) shall be paid out of the General Fund towards the American Rabbits Breeders Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for youth Dutch Specials.

Be it resolved that Article III, Section 2C By Laws be changed to read:

Section 2C: An annual allotment of \$150 shall be paid out of the General fund towards the ARBA Convention, with further stipulation that the entire amount be used for youth Dutch Specials.

<u>Rational:</u> \$50 will not buy much in the way of awards and we need to support the youth showing Dutch as much as we can.

#11) Current version of Article IV, Section 1 By-Laws reads:

The Publicity and Promotion Committee shall consist of a chairmen and State Representative, and shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years. The Chairman of the Publicity and Promotion Committee shall be known as the Publicity and Promotion Director, and shall have charge of all publicity and promotion work for the club except for the editorship of the Club's publication. He shall be custodian of and be responsible for the Publicity funds and give a financial report at each annual and regular meeting.

Be it resolved that Article IV, Section 1 By Laws be changed to read:

Section 1: The Publicity and Promotion Committee shall consist of a chairman and at least two members appointed from the membership by the President for a term of two (2) years with the majority approval of the Board of Directors. Chairman of said committee shall have charge of all publicity and promotion work for the club except for editing the club's publication. Said chairman shall be custodian of and be responsible for the publicity funds and shall give a report at each annual and regular meeting.

Rational: Clarification of the Publicity committee.



#12) Current version of Article IV, Section 2 of the By-Laws reads:

The Standard Committee shall consist of a chairman and four (4) members, at least two of whom shall be licenses ARBA judges. The Standard Committee shall all be members, in good standing, of the ADRC. They shall be responsible for maintaining continuous study of the standards, receiving any requests for a working standard on a new variety, and transmitting any proposed revisions or additions to the entire ADRC Board. Upon majority Board approval, the Secretary shall cause such proposed revisions or additions to be sent to each member in good standing with a mail ballot so that they may register their vote for or against each change, revision, or addition. If these changes, revisions, or additions are approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the ballots cast, it shall be the duty of this committee to submit them to the ARBA Standard Committee with the recommendations that such changes, revisions, or additions be adopted.

Be it resolved that Article IV, Section 2 of the By-Laws be changed to read:

Section 2: The Standards Committee shall consist of a chairman and four (4) members, at least two of whom shall be licensed ARBA judges. The Standards Committee shall appointed from the members in good standing by the President with majority approval of the Board of Directors. They shall be responsible for maintaining a continuous study of the Standards and communicating any proposed revisions or additions to the ADRC Board. Upon majority Board approval, the Secretary shall cause such proposed revisions or additions to be sent to each member in good standing with a mail ballot so that they may register their vote for or against each change, revision, or addition. If these changes, revisions, or additions are approved by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the ballots cast, then the committee must submit them to the ARBA Standards Committee with the recommendations that such changes, revisions, or additions be adopted.

<u>Rational:</u> Current version is in conflict with the ARBA's procedure of introducing new varieties. Portion pertaining to the introduction of new varieties has been removed.



#13) Current Version of Article IV, Section 3 of the By-Laws reads:

The Election Committee shall consist of a chairman and two other members, none of which shall reside in the same county as either the President or Secretary-Treasurer. The Election Committee shall be appointed annually by the President, from the membership, with majority approval of the Board of Directors. The Election Committee shall assemble, open the ballots, tabulate the results, and certify the results to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and the Dutch Reporter Editor within ten (10) days after the closing of the polls. If all three members of the Election Committee are unable to meet to carry out these duties, the President shall be notified immediately, and different Election Committee members appointed as needed, prior to the opening of the ballots. It is necessary that the signatures of all three (3) members of the Election Committee accompany the results as sent to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Dutch

Reporter Editor. No member of the Election Committee shall be eligible for election to any office. Any member serving on the Election shall not be eligible to serve on this committee again for a period of three years.

Be it resolved that Article IV, Section 3 of the By-Laws be changed to read:

The Election Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two other members, none of whom shall reside in the same county as either the President or the Secretary-Treasurer. The Election Committee shall be appointed annually by the President, from the membership, with 2/3 majority approval of the Board of Directors. The Election Committee shall assemble and count the ballots, tabulate and certify the results to the President and Secretary-Treasurer within 22 days of receiving the ballots. If all three members of the Election Committee are unable to meet to carry out these duties, the President shall be notified immediately, and different Election Committee members appointed as needed, prior to counting the ballots. It is necessary that the signatures of all three members of the Election Committee accompany the results as sent to the President, and Secretary-Treasurer. No member of the Election Committee shall be eligible for election to any office. Any member serving on the Election Committee shall not be eligible to serve on this committee again for a period of three (3) years.

Rational: Requiring a two third majority approval by the Board makes this consistent with other positions.



#14) Current Version of Article IX Constitution & Article VII of By Laws reads:

Amendments: Any alteration of, or amendment to the Constitution shall be made by way of a resolution. This resolution to be submitted to the Secretary of the ADRC with the signatures of twenty-five (25) adult members in good standing of the ADRC. Said resolution to be submitted no later than January 1st of the year in which the resolution will be voted on. The secretary shall send copies of the resolution to each officer of the ADRC and shall have the resolution printed in the January/February issue of the Dutch Reporter so that the membership shall have ample time to form an intelligent opinion on the resolution. The resolution shall also be printed in the issue of the Dutch Reporter containing the final ballots on which the resolution will be voted. The ADRC voting membership shall then cast their votes by mail. The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of all eligible votes cast. All amendments shall take effect January 1st of the year following acceptance.

Be it resolved that Article IX Amendments and Article VII of By-Laws be changed and combined to read as follows:

Any alteration of, or amendment to the Constitution and By-Laws shall be made by way of a resolution. This resolution must be submitted to the Secretary of the ADRC in writing, no later than thirty (30) days prior to the opening day of the National Dutch Show or the ARBA Convention. The secretary shall send copies of the resolution to each officer of the ADRC for their review. Said resolution shall be reviewed and discussed at the next Board of Directors meeting, with the board, by 2/3 majority, either supporting or rejecting the resolution. The resolution and the Board's recommendations would then be read by the ADRC Secretary at the next general membership meeting, with ample opportunity for discussions. The resolution and the Board's recommendation would then be printed in the next issue of the Dutch Reporter. Voting on the proposed amendment would be held with the annual ballots, to be mailed out August 1st. The Constitution may be amended by a 2/3 majority of all eligible votes cast. All amendments shall take effect the January 1st after the election.

Rational: This would replace both Article IX of the Constitution and Article VII in the By-Laws would be deleted. This provides us with a process to amend the C & B with all of the member's having a voice, yet it is flexible enough that we can make changes as they are needed.

## MEET THE NELSENS OF WASHINGTON STATE

i! We are Pete and Debra Nelsen of Everett, Washing ton. We live in the foothills of the mountains, 15 minutes away from the beautiful Puget Sound. We were novices and it had been many years since Pete had been in 4-H, but I must say, Pete had enough enthusiasm and zeal for an army. His first stock came from local Feed stores and the Co-op. We wanted so much to buy some better stock. Then, we kept hearing a name pop up over and over again in the world of Dutch.

This brings me to a thank you that I have been wanting to say for over two years now. When an actor receives the Academy Award, he pulls out his thank you speech and proceeds to thank all the people who have gotten him where his is. At graduation it is not uncommon to hear the Valedictorian thanking his or her parents and teachers before philosophizing about the future. Football players thank their Moms. Pete and I want to thank Donna Brak. Recently we have received a lot of recognition for our rabbits, and as fun and wonderful as those accolades are, we could not have achieved them without the efforts of Mike and Donna Brak. Donna who has worked in this area raising Dutch for 25 years has in my opinion helped change the world of Dutch. Everyone wanted to buy a rabbit from Donna.

Donna sold us our first pedigreed rabbit and taught us everything we know about Dutch, and we were teachable. We watched and did everything she gold us to. Pete laughs, because during that time of learning, many times' one of us would say, Donna says to do it like this ... She was unbelievably gracious and available to us. Everything about her rabbitry we duplicated. So if I say it once, I will say it a thousand times, we had an excellent teacher. From that wonderful foundation we have grown and so has our rabbitry.

The days of having "A COUPLE" of rabbits are gone, and our rabbitry now consists of two separate rabbit barns. We like to fool ourselves a little by saying barns. Ha Ha! The brood does and all juniors under three months, live happily in "The Nursery." The nursery is located right next to the house, and in reality it is a big converted carport. The does are close by and I am able to watch them all day when they are kindling, or on really hot days, etc. That is one of the lovely things about the Northwest, we are able to have

litters all year round because, the weather here is so moderate. So, I am always out in the nursery. We handle our babies starting at day one, and they are spoken to and held often. My most favorite thing is when we are feeding and all the babies who are out of the nest box run to the open cage door and Megan licks all their faces. They are so funny, it is like clock work, they just wait to get a kiss. Megan also is broken hearted if a rabbit leaves because it is being sold. She whines and the rabbit gets a kiss good-bye before it goes home with its new Mom or Dad. Our other rabbitry is farther away from the house. All our herd Bucks and show rabbits are kept there. It is cool and protected from light. These rabbits only get visited twice a day and sometimes it is a big shock when our juniors get moved from the nursery down to the show rabbitry. They miss all the attention. So, I like the nursery and the babies, and Pete likes the bucks and the show rabbits. I guess that is why we do this together.

In the breeder profile we were asked and, we will take a brief moment to respond to. What has been your biggest win? Our biggest and most overwhelming honor has been that our Sr. Blue Buck, "Berry," was Best Blue at the National Dutch Show this year in Ohio. What was your most exciting win? Our most exciting win came when our Sr. Blue Buck "Berry" took Best in Show and our little Jr. Blue Doe "First Prize" took Best of the Best Opposites in Show at the same show. It was a first, same breeder, same breed, same variety at the same show. That is a lot of sames .... smile!

Pete and I are divided on which variety is our favorite. We really do like them all! Pete is very partial to Blacks and Brown Grays and I raise all the Blues. But, we feel a responsibility AND <u>privilege</u> to raise all six varieties. We always make it a point

to take all six varieties to every show. It is amazing how many people and kids have never seen some of the varieties. We have often heard people express how they did not know Tort was a recognized color not to mention Brown Grays and Steels. In fact, once we took our rabbits up to Canada and participated in the fair. The 4-H ers had never seen a Tort before or a Steel and they were quizzing us with questions. Can you imagine the excitement and interest? It was really fun, as they brought their parents in and we happily fielded questions. Up until two years ago, Brown Grays were virtually non-existent over here, now they are some of the biggest classes, with some of the best breeders interested in this variety. All that to say, we love the idea of being ambassadors to such a charming wonderful rabbit, and we enjoyed seeing the interest in Dutch grow in the Pacific Northwest. AND to be quite diplomatic we love all six varieties ... BIG SMILE!

Finally, we would like to address the questions .... What do you think would help the Dutch Club? We love that familiar saying ... If it isn't broke don't fix it. Out local club has taken 13 new members this last quarter. That is not to brag, but rather to say people are interested in this fancy breed called "Dutch." To the next generation of Dutch breeders our youth (who we are so proud of), and to those in Dutch now. Keep on learning about your Dutch. If you are like us, the more you learn, the more hooked you will become, and the better the breed in general will become. That is what we want most for the Dutch clubs, to promote OUR breed and introduce people to the rabbits that we have fallen in love with. We will all enjoy the ride!!!

In closing, Pete and I (the students) have felt, what was graciously passed on to us, we would like to share with






