



This DR contains your nomination ballot for the 1997 National Dutch Show and ARBA Convention judges. Please check the reverse side of the ballot for the listing of judges that are ADRC members. The National Dutch Show Guidelines state: "There shall be a minimum of two judges for each NDS. The senior judge will be chosen by the membership of the ADRC in a mail ballot of judges who are ADRC members. The judge receiving the most votes shall be secured as the senior judge. The other judges(s) will be selected by the sponsoring club with consideration given to those judges receiving the most votes. The senior judge must be a member in good standing of the ADRC, while the junior judge(s) are not required to be ADRC members." Please use the envelope marked "Ballot",

insert your nomination in that envelope, seal it and then place it in another envelope. Make sure that you include the name and address of the voters whose ballots are contained inside. Mail the ballots to the secretary's office. Then, the names on the outside will be verified and the ballots will be prepared to send to the election committee. Deadline is November 1. So, please vote, advertise, renew, and whatever else fits your condition.

Since I work in the paper industry, we purchase roll stock in 5 ton sizes. The price at the mill rose between 15 and 25% last fall and in many instances are just now hitting the consumer due to warehouse inventory. If you couple this with the fact that postage has risen, you can quickly realize we are living on the edge financially. Kevin Hopper has all the fine details on our fiscal situation, but the end result will be that the sooner we can raise dues the better off we will be. The initial proposal suggested going from \$7 for a single adult to \$10 and likewise across the board. Considering what other organizations charge for dues and the high quality of the Dutch Reporter, this is not unreasonable nor out of line.

Everyone should take note that our publicity chairpersons Rick & Julie Billups are completely going over the Dutch Club inventory and have some good ideas for new merchandise. There are many items which have done seen their day and it is time to close them out. Rick is willing to make specialty clubs and individuals good deals on items and perhaps some state specialty clubs would like to do the ADRC a favor and

help themselves out at the same time by using some of this material for awards at shows.

Also interesting is the fact that 70 dutch in the open and 24 in the youth showed up at the Muscatine Co. Fair, which means the dutch was not only the largest breed, but comprised over 12% of the total entry in the show. I do not have the details of all the local shows, however I understand they are having similar numbers also. Let's keep the momentum going and until next time keep cool.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

After a VERY wet winter, California is now being hit by heat wave after heat wave. For the first time, we lost a show animal to the heat while on our way to the Sun Valley Dutch Fanciers Dutch show in the San Diego area. One town we passed through hit 111 degrees F! Even with the air conditioner running constantly, one of our nice tort does apparently did not get enough ventilation, got stressed and died the next morning.

Many other areas of the country are also experiencing very high temperatures, and many breeders are losing significant quantities of rabbits. One local breeder apparently lost about 200 rabbits when his cooling system failed, and the enclosed barn had no other ventilation source. Excessive heat has to be one of the top concerns of any rabbit breeder.

The California Dutch Rabbit Club held their Dutch Extravaganza show series in June, and judges Glen Carr and Cindy Wickizer said they had an outstanding time judging and collecting loot at the banquet. They * both carried home a lot more packages than they arrived with. The big winner in the open shows was Joanne Purpus with a gray senor doe, who took Best of Breed in both shows. Jim and I took Best Opposite Sex with a tortoise junior buck on Saturday and Joanne Purpus won Best Opposite Sex with a steel junior buck on Sunday. Youth Best of Breed winners were Julie Toth with a black junior doe on Saturday and Jason Bennett with a blue junior doe on Sunday. Best Opposite of Breed Youth winners were Holly Klopfer with a black senior buck and Courtney Lewis with a black junior buck.

I encourage all Dutch breeders to take out an advertisement in the DR. ADRC badly needs the additional revenue to offset the increased cost of the DR. Julia Anderson is doing a fantastic job of producing a high quality newsletter. Unfortunately, though, many costs have gone way up and we are going to be forced to take some budget cuts since our dues do not even come close to covering the cost of the DR. It will be some time before a dues change can be made, so additional advertising is VERY important! If you can't produce camera ready copy, Julia will be happy to format a nice advertisement for you. Communication via Computer Fran Schettler, Chairperson Floyd Dopler Jr., Assistant (fdopler@aol.com)

At the National Dutch Show in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, Director Fran Schettler's husband Jim brought up the subject at the general meeting that more and more people are using computers and that some move should be made to establish some sort of standard for those interested.

President Fred Mullinax appointed Fran as head of this committee. I requested to be on the committee too, and it should be said here that although we are not raving experts, we have had some experience in the field. It should be noted here that our secretary, Doreen Bengtson, and editor Julia Anderson are working on getting "on-line".

I had my first experience in using a modem for telecommunications back when you had to get up your courage and install it yourself into your prized machine. Now, every computer sold seems to come with a modem already installed. Match this with the fact that accessing and using computer bulletins boards has become easier, quicker, more user friendly and more cost effective over the last few years. Obviously now is a good time to get on line and make your first connection.

The easiest way for the newcomer to make connection, is to join a commercial BBS (bulletin board system) such as America on Line (AOL), CompuServe, Delphi, Prodigy or other such service. You find each has the same basic services and each differ in exactly what they have to offer and their rates. For the sake of simplicity, we have decided to endorse America on Line and explore how such a system works.

I have to mention here that I am a director in the Dwarf Hotot club and currently our president, vice president, secretary, sweepstakes person and four of our nine directors are connected along with some of our members. Sending E-mail message has greatly increased our effectiveness as officers and helped us to become more in touch with new developments for better or worse, within the organization. I might add here that we all found our way to AOL on our own and there was no collective deal made to push us to using it.

AOL has its own software which you can obtain free along with ten hours free time during your first month of connection. The software is easy to follow and setup. It even helps you find a local access phone number to help make all your calls to the system a local charge. After your first month of connection you are allowed 5 hours per month at the basic rate of \$9.95. Additional time is at \$3.50 per hour. As a person who does alot of traffic this way, let me say by finding your way around the first month and learning the

ropes, \$9.95 is all a person should have to pay.

A person can send internet mail out through the system too at no additional cost. This means that if your buddy is on CompuServe you can still send him messages. ARBA president Gary Michaud is on AOL now; however, even when he just had an internet address with no connection to another service, we could still send and receive mail to him through our AOL connection. Another plus is that it doesn't matter if you are running an IBM compatible or a Mac as either one can access the system. All of my director's articles for the Dwarf Hotot News are sent via the AOL mail system and even though our editor has not completely mastered the system yet, even she has no problem taking her mouse and clicking on the icon that says "download attached file". This becomes extremely nice for an editor as it is much simpler to format an article for publication rather than retyping all of it.

Another enjoyable aspect is meeting Dutch breeders and finding out not only what is happening in their area, but also their thoughts on a subject. Last December I had the pleasant surprise to find a Dutch breeder on line who introduced himself and let me how the dutch were doing in his home state of Ohio. We also discussed some ideas which were expressed in the Dutch Reporter. When was the last time a breeder you did not know took the time to discuss an item of equal importance with you? E-mail has a way of breaking the ice and simplifying matters. No envelope, no address to look up and no stamp to lick.

I am certain that the newspaper, post office and telephone company are not going to go out of business, but having one more means of communication at your finger tips is worth having, especially if you already own a computer.

Future articles on this subject will appear as the need or interest arises. Some of the topics which Fran suggested we cover are: modem cost, installation, whether or not a dedicated phone line is necessary.

Hello, my name is Becky Cason. I saw the article in the Dutch Reporter so I decided to give a "Rabbit Show Checklist", that I made for my 4-H demonstration. I'm in the 4th grade. I'm 10 years old and I have black, chocolate and tortoise Dutch and plan to raise blues. I hope this information about getting ready for shows is useful. I advanced to county level with this 4-H demo and was told I would have been picked for county finals (top 12 kids) but I was two years too young.

I keep my rabbits out of the sun and feed them sunflower seeds and some dairy goat food for conditioning. A very nice judge, Donna Brak, told my mom to use Listerine or baby wipes on urine spots on the rabbits coat.

THE RABBIT SHOW CHECKLIST SHOW BOX

Two carpets, bottles in a bag, brush, comb, nail trimmer, kwik-stop, first aid kit, cottonballs, rescue remedy, hairball tablets, rabbit food, crunchies, hay, carrots, portable crocks, large & small old towels, wet towel in a bag, hand towel, paper towels, garbage bags, 4-H book, pedigrees, signs, note paper, people first-aid kit, paper cups.

COOLER

Sandwiches, ice packs, juice or pop snacks, thermos, water jug for rabbits, blanket, lawn chairs, back pack: toys, extra clothes, book, billfold (money, ID cards), fruit chips, cookies, camera, carry cages.


RABBITS!

Three days before: start medicated water, 1/2 tsp. terramycin, 1/2 tsp. acidophilus, diluted Gatorade powder, 1/2 gram vitamin C per gallon; continue until three days after show.

Two days before: clean rugs, health check, trim nails, clean carry cages, clean show box and check items.

Night before: all food in refrigerator,

clean cooler, wash, dry and bag up crocks & bottles, fill water jug, lay out

I am a youth Dutch breeder who has been raising them for almost six years. I raise blacks, blues, torts and steels. I breed my blacks and blues together to get the combination of markings, type and color I want. Almost all of my blacks will throw at least one blue per litter.

When I breed my blacks to steels, I get grays, steels, and blue steels. These blue steels happen at least once a litter, generally more, but since they are not recognized, they have to be sold as pets.

Since as much as half of the litter is not showable because of color, and the blue steels can't be used in a breeding program without throwing more blue steels, I am considering selling out of steel. I do not have the cage space to run two lines blacks (one black to black only, and one black to blue).

Blue steel is a beautiful color and would be of great value to steel breeders. When Mr. Gehr stated that we already have enough problems with the steels and grays, he overlooked the contribution the blue steel could have made to these varieties.

NEWS FROM WISCONSIN

Hello, my name is Angie Aisbet. I live in Slinger, Wis. I've been raising Dutch Rabbits for about seven years. I got started when my parents got me a black Dutch for Easter. He wasn't the perfect Dutch, but he was a good start. Since then, I have raised about all six colors. Torts and chocolates being my favorite. My mom and I are currently in charge of our county 4-H rabbit project. I mostly enjoy going to all the shows and meeting with breeders.

I wish I knew all the secrets of keeping rabbits cool. I do suggest bringing the rabbits in a cooler environment such as a basement. Also keep a spray bottle near by and constantly mist the rabbits of run ice through out the ears. And of course giving them ice bottles.

I look forward to meeting a lot of you and until then, good luck keeping your rabbits cool.



CHCOLATE DUTCH BREEDING

....what a subject!! I raise Chocolate
Dutch with a little black here and there. I
have found that by breeding in a little bit
of black now and then it helps with the
richness of the chocolate color. Not
everyone agrees with me, but it seems to
have worked with me. As with any breed,
breeding can be a challenge. My husband
and I have found that by leaving a light in
our barn on at all times (as well as yearround) helps with the does being more
agreeable to breeding. And of course,
there are those who will breed no matter
what as well, as whenever.

Anyone who knows me knows that I love the chocolate color in almost any breed, but Dutch being my first and only love. It is a real challenge sometimes, but an enjoyable one. I believe that a breeder would need to master the type, fur, markings and color. I realize that you probably would never "master" it, but you would at least become comfortable with the type and fur that you would be receiving from constant breedings. Line breeding is another way of keeping with the chocolate color. In that I mean that if you are fortunate to get good dark, rich color from a particular breeding, try it again. Breed your darkest to your darkest being sure that the body type and fur are desirable for showing.

Another thing that I firmly believe in is keeping the chocolates inside away from the sunlight. I believe that even daylight from being outside under shade or a type of covering is not sufficient. I could be wrong or mistaken, but that is what I have found to be usually true in my own raising of Chocolate Dutch.

As I stated earlier, I raise Chocolate Dutch. I am from Rolla, Missouri and lived here for about four years. My husband raises Chocolate Satins and Broken Satins. Again, as I said earlier, Chocolate Dutch breeding — what a subject!! I started raising Chocolate Dutch inside because my dad said that would be safer since my pet rabbit as a

child was a wonderful dinner by the neighbor German Shepherd. Since I had a blue Dutch at the time, when we put it inside the barn for protection, I found that the fur darkened up very nicely. When I received my first chocolate, it was sun bleached, stained and not in very good shape. After being groomed and put inside our barn, the pet began to molt and the stains and sun bleach disappeared. When the new coat came into its finest, it was the darkest I had ever seen. That was when I fell in love with the Chocolate color. That was over 15 years ago. Since then I have had Dutch off and on, but always loved the chocolate color.

When I sat down to type this, I thought I would be lucky if I typed ten lines. But as you can see, I can chatter on and on about the Chocolate Dutch. I would gladly welcome any comments and/ or conversations on the subject that I think all of us could always learn about.

HOT WEATHER, COOL RABBITS

Hi, my name is Connie Hill. I've been actively raising rabbits for four years at my home in Jesup, Georgia. Summers can get pretty hot down here in southeast Georgia and on a lot of summer days, there is little or no breeze at all.

Now I'm no professional or real experienced rabbit breeder, but I haven't had any rabbits to die of heat exhaustion, so I can safely say my methods work. I don't have a "bunny barn" like most people who are really into rabbits. All I have are wood and wire cages outside. One day I plan on building a barn, with a heating and cooling system, but that is all in the future. For now, there are just three essential things I do for my rabbits.

First of all, outdoor rabbitries should be located in the shade as much as possible. Luckily for me and the rabbits, we have a lot of trees in our yard, so shade is no problem. All my pens are neatly situated in a shady place. This is good for two reasons: 1- the air is cooler under the trees and 2- the rabbits' coats won't get "bleached" by the sun.

The next step in keeping rabbits cool is water. Water is the most important nutrient to keeping rabbits in good quality and alive. Rabbits should be allowed to drink as much water as they want, especially in the hot summer months. It takes no time at all for rabbits to dehydrate and die if not properly watered. I have some cages with bottles and one row with the watering system (automatic). I check the bottles three times a day and on really hot days, more. On pens that are housing several growing bunnies I provide two bottles. A good thing to do when temperatures are really hot, might be to put ice in the water crocks or in the holding tanks of watering systems.

Finally, in the hottest part of the day (2 PM to 4PM) I lightly mist the rabbits. They don't really like getting wet but I'd rather the rabbits be a little mad at me than them suffer from heat exhaustion. The rabbits shouldn't be drenched, but

misted good enough that their coats are a little damp. I don't have a misting system, so I take a water hose with my thumb over the water opening to make a misty spray. Sometimes you have to work at it to get the water to come out right. Misting bottles are also good. Another things I do is put a sprinkler with a misting head on it, on top of the cage and that really keeps the outdoor rabbitry cool.

In summary, the three important things for rabbits during the hot summer months are: shade, plenty of water, and a light mist during the hottest part of the day. It is simple and it works for me and my rabbits.

HOT WEATHER CARE FOR RABBITS

Here are a few things I do to keep my rabbits cool in the summer.

I have fans placed in different ends of the shed to take fresh air in and to pull hot air out. I also have three feet of wire around the bottom of the shed to let fresh breezes in.

On the wall I have several vents placed on all four sides of the shed and a ridge vent on the roof to let hot air out. My shed is 20 by 28 with a white shingled roof with 75 foot oak trees on the southwest side of the shed to act as shade during the hottest part of the day.

On very hot days I take plastic soft drink bottles and fill them half way with water and put them in the freezer. Then once frozen I place them in the cage for the rabbit to lay beside.

When possible I take the garden hose and soak the roof. This seems to drop the temperature in the shed a few degrees.

Also during the summer I keep the cages, crocks, and underneath the cages as clean as possible. Underneath the cages I sprinkle hydrated lime once a week to keep odor's down.

Last but not least I make sure the rabbits have a clean and fresh supply of water in front of them at all times.

Here in Richmond from mid June to late September it is always between 85 to 95 degrees with high humidity. The afore mentioned things knock about 8 - 10 degrees off the thermometer in the shed in comparison to the outside temperature.

HOT BUNNIES - KEEP THEM COOL!

Summer's heat seems to be effecting us all. Even northern states such as Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin are learning about heat — and the mid 90's is definitely HEAT! Keeping your rabbits comfortable becomes a creative endeavor.

We have found that rabbits of all ages and conditions in life require varied methods to keep them comfortable. Since kits to weaning age are growing at an astounding rate, it is important to keep their ears especially cool. While numerous judges rattle off "good ears, good head" even when they're not, nothing is less appealing than a small head and ears that are long and flimsy. We always place does with litters in the lowest cages as the area closest to the floor is cooler, The nestboxes are build with wooden sides, no top and the best box floor is made of door screening, allowing the air to flow from the bottom up. If your thinking the screen bottoms might be only for small breeds, let me assure you that 250 New Zealand breeding does at the university rabbitry use them with a new litter every 60 days and no on digs or tears the screening out. As the kits are old enough to jump in and out of the nestbox, try placing water in the dish that fits under a clay flower pot. It is shallow so they won't drown and they love to walk through it or cuddle up to it. Does have been seen with a paw or two in the dish - keeping cool. Also west coast friends have suggested a clay brick soaked over night in water will keep does and kits cool.

Does who are only days from kindling can present real problems in extreme heat, Throw away plastic "Jr." pop bottles are fantastic when they are frozen (label removed) and placed in the cage. Appearing strange to the doe at first, she may move to the far corner but within minutes her body will be caressing the cool bottle. Just recently I spied a 4 - 5 week old bunny, lying straddled atop a "Jr." frozen bottle, with a front and rear leg hanging from each side of the bottle. His littermates were starring in envy of "Mr. Cool". The 2 liter bottle, also frozen, is great for the doe and litter.


Box fans are inexpensive although they do require more electricity that "squirrel cage" fans. We hang a soft rope loop through the handle of the fan. A bicycle hook screwed into an overhead 2x4 holds the loop from the top. When the fan is turned on, the motion of the fan blades will make the fan oscillate. A couple fans in a barn create a dandy "wind tunnel" The "squirrel cage" is a fan that has been removed from a heating/cooling unite. They come in a variety of sizes and varied horsepower. Flea markets, as well as heating and cooling companies, are excellent sources for these nearly indestructible units.

Keeping cages away from walls will allow for better air flow. If your cages set flush to the wall, consider placing the wide side of a 2x4 between the cage and the wall. Try removing the solid opposite ends of your building and then enclosed with 1/2 x 1 cage wire, will add more ventilation and if the solid roof is hinged, it can be pulled back easily with a pull rope or chain from the inside of your building.

The "old" boys in your barn deserve special consideration if you want fall litters. Moving their cages to the cooler portions of the building, keeping the cage close to the ground, a cool brick or clay water dish, and even a frozen bottle will keep the sperm count higher throughout hot summer days. In extreme heat, a spray bottle used for misting is loved by almost everyone. The ears, being the rabbits air conditioning unit, should be dampened or mist first. Use warm water from a crock or water line. Wet hands run through the fur not only cleans buts allows evaporation over the entire body.

Hopefully you'll never have animals become so over heated that blood stains the hair below the nostrils but if you do, submerge the rabbit (not the head, please) in lukewarm water for several minutes. Place him or her back in a quiet well ventilated cage and allow recuperation time of 5 - 20 minutes.

BLUE STEEL UPDATE

Just a few facts I wanted to give you on the Blue Steel variety that I am working on for presentation at the ARBA Convention in Louisville.



Out of four Blue Steel to Blue steel breedings, I have produced 76% Blue Steels, 19% blues and 5% Blue grays. The background of the Blue Steels in these crosses are, 7.25% Blue Steel, 23% Steel, 13% Gray, 23% Blue, and 33 1/3% Black. This is a very diverse background consisting of mostly black, blue and steel, yet I have not produced any blacks or steels. The blue gene will dilute the black to produce blue and the presence of the steel gene makes... Blue Steels.

Most of the time I have been using my Blue Steels with my steels and grays to get steels (which is working very well). I have produced some blue steel also by breeding a blue steel to a steel (the steel must be carrying the blue gene).

Once again, I feel that there is interest in this variety or we wouldn't have had 43% of those voting, vote in favor of the variety. If Dutch breeders start raising this variety, wouldn't that be beneficial to the breed? We are creating interest in the Dutch and thereby promoting the Dutch Breed.

RABBITS

DOE:

From baby to adult in six months. Female rabbit is one animal that does not show pregnancy, only by palpating between 10 - 14 days. A doe does not have a heat period - have cycle of 16 - 18 days. About 12 - 14 days receptivity and 4 days refuse to mate. Estrogen level controls receptivity.

NEST BOX:

Top closed, front open, like a tunnel, rough bottom. Never smooth or slippery. Nesting material - straw, marsh hay or newspaper.

DELIVERY:

Doe will start to pull fur and put in the prepared hole she has made in the nest box. She will enter the box when she starts to deliver her young. As her babies are born, she cleans each one, nurses each and cleans up all the after birth and dead ones. Does this in about 1/2 hour. The longer it takes, the more problems will arise. Difficulties can include babies are too large, too small of litter, and having babies on the wire.

CARE OF BABIES:

The babies will stir until they cover themselves with the fur the mother pulled for them. Many does will pull more fur the next couple of days and really cover her babies.

AGE 10 - 14 DAYS:

As the babies get older, the eyes begin to open. The doe drops fecal droppings in the nest box for her young. Replace soiled nesting material.

2 WEEKS OLD:

When young are about 2 weeks old, the doe will attempt to consume the fur that her young were covered with.

3 - 4 WEEKS OLD:

They begin to come out of the nest box and start to eat solid food. Mother's milk is cutting back. Remove box; clean the box for the next litter use.

5 - 8 WEEKS OLD:

Feed is increased gradually as the youngsters grow and age. Provide plenty of fresh water. NO GREENS.

WEANING:

Take the mother from the litter and leave the babies in the pen they're used to. If it is a large litter, move a couple babies with the mother. Cut back on feed a couple of days before weaning and very gradually increase after weaning.

10 WEEKS TO 3 MONTHS:

Separate sexes.

3 - 6 MONTHS:

Increase feed gradually until six months old. When feed is left in feeders between feedings, the rabbit is getting too much to eat or it does not have the proper supply of fresh, clean water, or it may have a physical problem.

5 - 6 MONTHS:

Age for mating.

LITTER SIZE:

Most litters are from 4 - 8 babies. The doe has 8 teats, but litters can be from 1 to 10 or more. She feeds them once a day, and spends only a few minutes to feed them. She washes them and makes each baby urinate. A rabbit cannot pick up her young. The doe does not sit in the nest box as a hen does. Check the nest box for dead babies. If the box is messy, try to clean it up.

FLUFFY NEST:

As long as you see a mound of fluffy fur in the nest box, the babies are living, as they cover themselves after the doe has fed them and stay that way until the doe returns to feed them 24 hours later. They uncover just before feeding.

INTRODUCING JIM AND FRAN SCHETTLER

California's Jim and Fran Schettler and their two sons, Matthew, 6, and Kevin, 1, live in the San Francisco Bay Area suburb of Danville. Jim is a mechanical engineer and Fran is a C.P.A. They have been raising all six varieties of Dutch for about 11 years at three different homes. Each move has enabled them to modify, improve and enlarge their idea of a good rabbit barn. Their current set-up of 84 holes is quite different from the initial start-up of a few cages out under the backyard pine trees. Hence their rabbitry name "The Danville Rabbit Tree." The Schettler's only raise Dutch now, but have had Hollands, American Chinchillas and Himalayans in the past.

Jim was the original backyard rabbit breeder back when he was a kid in Pennsylvania. Fran had always been a horsewoman, and never had a rabbit until a birthday present bunny to Jim—an American Chinchilla. Jim and Fran initially had no idea that there was such a thing as a rabbit show. Out of curiosity, they went to the show to see what it was all about, and Jim spotted a youth breeder (Jill Giron) selling Dutch. They immediately bought their first two black Dutch. After that, it was a challenge trying to find other local Dutch. Finally, Jim and Fran heard about Dorothy Bayliss and went to visit her rabbitry. George Bayliss had recently died, so they missed meeting him, but Dorothy was a wealth of practical information and a great source of stock in all of the colors. Local rabbit judge Bobbie Meyer was also a great help with practical advice.

The Schettler's usually show 15 to 20 Dutch at each show, but they rarely show an animal that has granded out. The Schettler's Dutch tend to have two distinct careers—showing and breeding. Jim and Fran have attended every National Dutch Show but one since 1986, and have been in the top ten of the ADRC sweepstakes almost every year since then. Their biggest win at the national level was winning Best of Breed at the 1992 Pomona ARBA Convention. They have shipped rabbits to other breeders all over the U.S. and Canada.

Jim is the President of the California Dutch Rabbit Club and Fran is the Secretary/Treasurer of Cal Dutch. Between them they publish the club's quarterly 20+ page newsletter *The Dutch Blaze*. Fran has also been an ADRC Director for several years.

After their first visit to a National Dutch Show, Jim and Fran realized that the overall type of the California Dutch had to be greatly improved. In 1985 California Dutch were typically long in body, head and ear, but had good markings and color. Scott Williamson had recently moved to California with his excellent Dutch and, by bringing in top quality animals (with some of Scott's help) from Mark Pecaric, Dale Zentner, Vicky Hertel, Wenton Carlton and Lowell Simonson, the quality of "California Dutch" began to improve.

The Schettler's breed their Dutch all year around and have a regular breeding schedule every weekend. Does are bred on Saturday and are rebred four or five weeks after kindling. They are then palpated on Friday at two weeks gestation. Does palpated negative are rebred on Saturday. Several does are bred each week, and the babies are fostered around as needed. First-time does are frequently given the pet-marked babies for "practice motherhood" before being trusted with show marked bunnies.

The Schettler's rabbit barn is 24' x 36', with a single door in one end and a double sliding door and window in the other. A gravel driveway runs to the sliding door, enabling easy loading and unloading of rabbits and feed. Their 1-1/3 acre property is horse property and the barn is designed as a 3 stall horse barn with an aisleway. There are no stall partitions inside. Since summers get hot in Danville, their barn was designed with extra ventilators all around the barn perimeter at knee level, the roof is a "pop top" raised breezeway, and there is a wall-mounted air conditioner. Two swamp coolers at either end of the barn also help in the hot weather. This arrangement has provided good ventilation for the rabbits year around.

All of the rabbit cages are on two independent automatic watering system lines, and all cages have "J" type wire-bottom feeders. The cages themselves are a combination of stacking and ceiling-hung wire cages in sizes from 18" x 30" through 30" x 30", and all the cages have pans underneath them.

The Schettler's main advice to new Dutch owners is to ask questions and don't be embarrassed to approach the established breeders for advice. As with anything else, the advice will vary somewhat depending on whom you ask, but you can sort through the varied information you get and decide what makes sense and what doesn't. What might work for one person might not work for you.

The biggest compliment the Schettler's have ever received is when a long time Eastern Dutch breeder remarked after a Schettler win at an early National Dutch Show, "hey, those California Dutch are pretty good!"

Husbandry of the RABBIT

Part 3

SEXING

Rabbits can be sexed when held on their backs. Gentle pressure is applied around the genital orifice with the thumb to evert the genitalia. In females, the vulva only protrudes cranially and is slit at the caudal end. In males, the penis protrudes in a complete circular tube shape. Bucks are usually smaller than does. Bucks lack an os penis and have hairless scrotal sacs.

NUTRITION

Rabbits require a diet high in fiber for normal digestive function. Pellets that contain 20% to 27% fiber along with quality grass hay are recommended. Other pellets may be too high in calories because they were originally designed to feed rabbits that were produced for meat and did not live long lives. If pellets are used, vitamin supplements are unnecessary. A general rule is 1/2 cup of pellets per five pounds body weight per day with ad libitum grass hay for mature nonbreeding rabbits.

High fiber hay may be offered to pet rabbits. Supplementing the diet of rabbits with high fiber helps prevent some gastrointestinal problems and is important in maintaining a healthy gastrointestinal tract. Hairball prophylaxis is

recommended via feeding a high-fiber diet and, if necessary, giving 10 milliliters of fresh pineapple juice or papaya juice daily for three to five days per month. Timothy hay is a good example of a high-fiber hay for pet rabbits. Because most pellets contain alfalfa, alfalfa hay is not recommended as a supplemental hay source because alfalfa is high in calcium. Too much calcium in the diet may result in the passage of white urine and may predispose rabbits to the development of urinary crystals.

Fresh vegetables and fruits can be offered in small amounts, and fresh water should be available at all times. A general rule for feeding is five grams of food per 100 grams of body weight per day and 100 milliliters of water per kilogram of body weight per day.

(Ed note: the following should be used under the advice of your veterinarian) INJECTIONS

Subcutaneous injections can be given in the neck, flank, or back area of the rabbit. Intramuscular injections can be given in the thigh, gluteal, or lumbar muscles. The same precautions to prevent nerve injury in other species should be used.

Intravenous injections can be given in the marginal ear vein or the cephalic vein. Intravenous injections given in the ear vein may result in skin sloughing when administered by untrained personnel: therefore, the cephalic vein may be the best choice. Any vein used for blood collection can be used for intravenous injection; however, sedation may be required. A 25- to 27- gauge catheter is recommended; however, butterfly catheters may be easier to use than needles.

MEDICATING

Medicating rabbits orally can be accomplished by pushing the pill into the interdental space, and the rabbit will generally chew the pill. Rabbits have large cheek pouches; therefore, it is imperative to make sure they are ingesting the medication. Pills that are crushed and mixed in

liquid or administration of a drug suspension may be superior to giving pills to ensure that the rabbit receives the entire dose. Medication can be placed in the feed or water of most rabbits. Adding molasses or jam may be necessary to disguise the flavor of some medications. Because it is also difficult to distinguish whether the rabbit has taken the entire dose with this method, administering medication via a drug suspension is the optimum method.

If the rabbit needs to be orally medicated, a feed or flexible tube that is 2.0 to 3.5 millimeters in diameter can be used. A section of hard plastic hose or a wooden dowel should be used to keep the animal from chewing the tube. A curved-tip, 12-cc syringe with the tip cut halfway off can be gently pushed into the interdental space. The syringe should be pointed backward in the mouth and only inserted far enough to allow liquid in the oral cavity.

ANESTHESIA

Rabbits are anesthetic risks and require specialized anesthetic techniques. Extreme care should be taken whenever a rabbit is anesthetized. Variation of response is a factor when any animal is anesthetized. Specific factors, such as age, sex, strain, weight, health, and nutritional status should be taken into account. It should be noted that ingesta-filled ceca can cause falsely elevated body weight values in rabbits. In addition, duration of anesthesia effects can be longer in animals anesthetized in the afternoon due to changes in hepatic metabolic activity evident in nocturnal animals. Fasting rabbits before anesthesia administration is controversial. Rabbits do not vomit, and it takes approximately three days to clear the gastrointestinal tract of ingesta; therefore, fasting is usually not needed. Most practitioners, however, fast rabbits two to eight hours before anesthesia is given.

HOW YOUNG IS THAT SHOW RABBIT?

What age should my Dutch be before we start showing them? I have been asked this question a couple of times recently, and so I wrote this article. It was originally published in the California Dutch Rabbit Club's *Dutch Blaze* newsletter.

Each breeder has to consider this question and establish their own criteria, but here is the decision making process my husband and I use. As you will see, age is not the only factor in the decision.

- What size is the bunny? Young bunnies can vary quite a bit in size, depending on genetics and especially on the milking ability of the mother. A one pound Dutch bunny should be left at home. A bunny between 1-1/2 pounds and two pounds, if otherwise healthy and cared for, should be able to handle the stress of traveling and showing reasonably well.
- How far away is the show? A short trip to a local show is much easier on the bunny than an overnight show four hours away. Leave the smaller rabbits at home when travelling long distances.

- What flesh and fur condition is the bunny in? If the baby is in poor flesh condition, leave it at home! The fur condition in baby Dutch varies tremendously. Some babies have very open, coarse and generally ugly baby fuzz, with poor color to boot. Leave these rabbits home.
- What is the weather likely to be like? Avoid hot weather travelling with a baby rabbit whenever possible.
- How many other rabbits are you already showing in the same class? If you are already showing two other rabbits in the class in question, don't take the baby unless your goal is to pad out the class for a leg or to accumulate more points. Even then make sure the baby is up to making the trip. Don't risk a promising junior just for points!
- Do you expect much competition at this show? If the show is likely to be a big, very competitive show, odds are that your baby won't have a chance against the older juniors in the competition. Many judges won't give equal consideration to a small bunny. If, however, the show is a small one where the baby might at least fill out a class for a leg, then you might consider taking it.

- I brought this bunny so the judge can tell me if I should keep it or not. This comment really makes me cringe. Never, ever do I let one judge's opinion determine whether to keep a rabbit or not. Anyone who is a serious breeder MUST develop their own personal definition of a good Dutch. Not the judge's definition, not Fran Schettler's definition, but theirs! Everyone has a different opinion on what makes a good Dutch. That is one reason why judging results can vary so much. If, however, you are going to rely on a judge's opinion, make sure you rely on a judge that really knows the breed and is respected by other Dutch breeders for their opinion.
- What is your real motivation for taking this bunny? Why are you considering taking the baby to the show? Give yourself a realistic answer and see if your reasons make sense. Anytime you take a rabbit on the road to a show, no matter what size, you are putting that rabbit at risk, no matter how well you care for your show animals on the road.

Don't risk your promising junior for the wrong reasons. You have worked too hard for too long to let impatience take over.



We received a note from Nelle yesterday telling us of his passing. Nelle said that she is still in shock, because although his passing was not unexpected due to a lingering illness, she didn't expect it right now. Nelle said that Don enjoyed all Dutch people and reading the Dutch Reporter.

I was surprised to hear from Nelle that Don began showing rabbits

when he was in grade school. He would carry his coop of rabbits to the show on the streetcar in Kansas City, Mo. Apparently the Dutch connection began when Don brought home three Tortoise Dutch he purchased on a horse showing trip to Lufkin, Tx. in 1969. Don raised Tans before that and when he found out that Nelle was interested in the Tortoise Dutch he got some more. Thus began the history of breeding and showing that made the name Brady synonymous with Tortoise Dutch.


Their first National Dutch Show was in 1974 in Rochester, Minne-

sota. They were to be seen at every National Show until Don became ill, and they moved to Florida.

Don was a director of the American Dutch Rabbit Club for two terms from 1976 to 1979 and then served a term as president from 1980 to 81.

HOOSIER DUTCH RAB-BIT FANCIERS

Hello to all fellow Dutch Breeders/ Exhibitors! I hope everyone and their rabbits are surviving this awful summer so far. I've not heard about anyone having a disastrous time, but quite a few breeders, as well as myself, have had a bad time with rabbits dying because of the heat! To try and combat the heat I've moved a few does with litters into the basement with the help of some stack cages (& permissions of Glenda and her Hollands!). The rabbits left outside I've tried to protect a little better with the help of a 36" house fan and a misting hose. I've picked up a few water stains, but I've lost no more rabbits.

I would like to end any rumors about Glenda and I getting out of rabbits - the rumors are false! We are down sizing a lot, but we are not getting out. We usually have had a herd of about 200 - 250 and we are now down to around 100, both Dutch and Hollands. No specific reason other than we showed so much last year - so this year we are taking time for ourselves and our home. The last child left the house in March and this has affected our lives too! We will still be showing, just not as much and not with 20 - 30 head a show.

I bring this next topic up because of the recent bid to accept Blue Steel as a variety. I now have a blue steel that is about 4 weeks old and marking wise is showable - how about the rest of you? Anyone else have one? It's appealing to the eye, but the uniformity of the ticking is lacking a bit. I will bring the one I have to the shows and if anyone else has some, let me know and we'll compare them and discuss what, if anything should we do about them. If we can reproduce these Blue Steels, and if they do ever get accepted, I feel they don't need their own color classification, but be included under the STEEL category and all steels compete against one another. It's hard to get enough brown steels exhibited.

Congratulations to all of you who did so well at the NDS. Hope everyone can attend and do better at the ARBA Convention in Louisville, KY. I might have a couple worth taking?! See all of you later.




