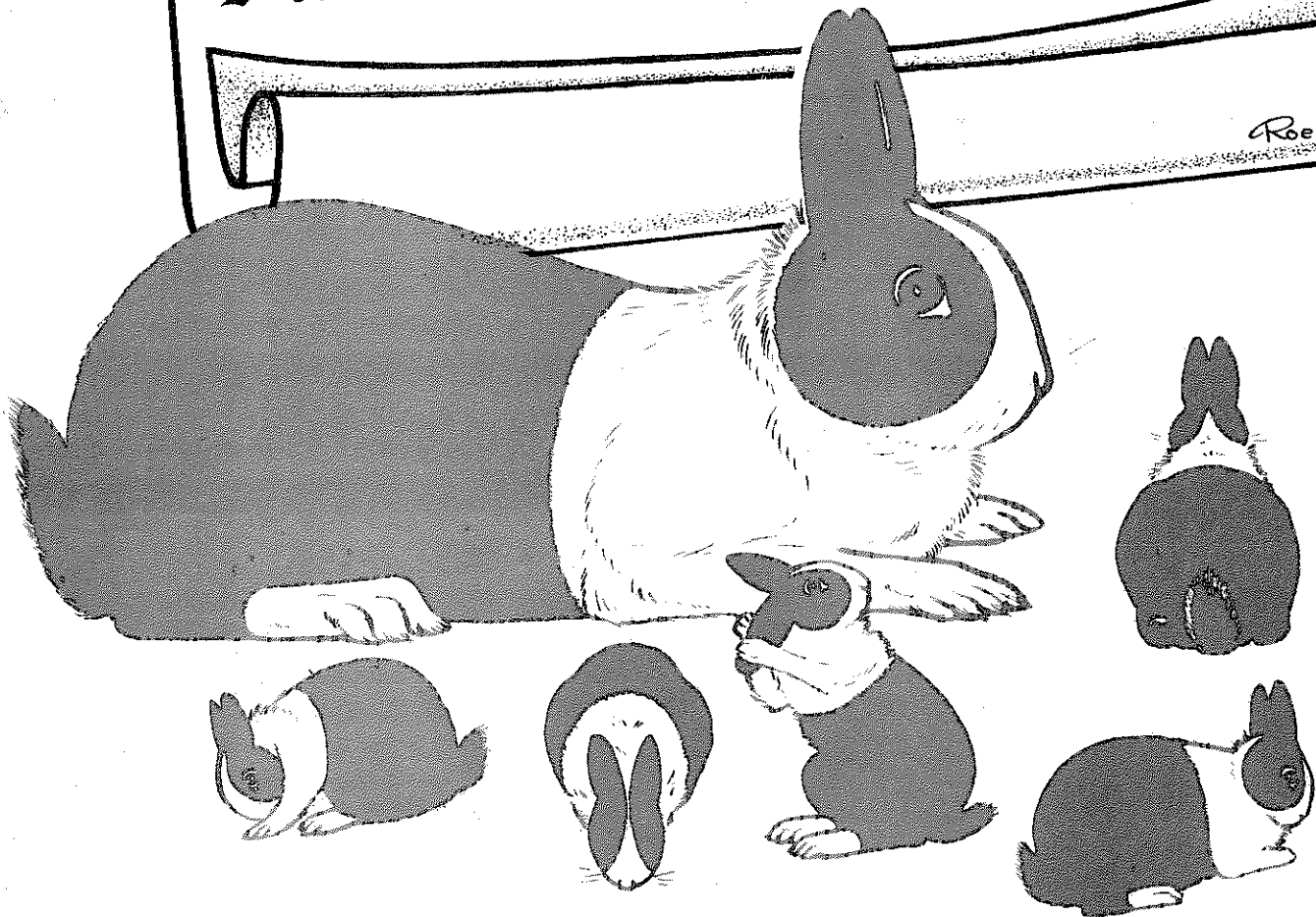

Our next National Dutch Show has been awarded to the Indiana State Dutch Club, of Indianapolis, Indiana, since this was the only group that bid on the show, balloting on the location was not necessary, so our 6th show goes back to the place where the first one was held in 1944 with a fine group of breeders to handle it. Ballots on the selection of judges will be sent out next month and we will also give you the name of the officers of the show at that time.

RESULTS OF BALLOTING ON CLUB DUES

The following is the results of balloting on the increase of Club dues from \$1.00 per year to \$2.00 per year; For increase 107 - Against increase 29. Ballots were counted by John B. Griffitts, Theo. C. Ruesche and R. J. Bernhardt.

I know a lot of the reasons that were told to me for the shortage but lets forget that angle completely, and look to Atlanta.

We Dutch breeders can do ourselves more good by fully supporting these National shows than I can do in reams of publicity. We have two very good reasons to begin to plan to show at Atlanta. The first is of course in support of ourselves and the breed. The second is in support of this man Wheelus. If you could see from where I sit the amount of excellent cooperation he has given this publicity program you would not fail to support the show. When we had to have advertising for our special issue he went out and solicited a large number of ads- if he had not turned in the ads that he did we could not have purchased the second section of advertising. Then he designed and made our tag plates that are now on sale. In addition to all of this, he has offered a number of good suggestions and has been highly cooperative in every way. I am not mentioning this with any thought of personal publicity for any one but I feel like you should know this so that each of you can begin to plan a Dutch entry for Atlanta.

WHAT IS YOUR OPINION:

We are quoting below from a letter that we received from Mr. S. T. Wheelus Sr. and would like to hear from other breeders regarding his suggestion, especially those from the middle west.

"You might think that the following is a crackpot idea, I want you to understand at the start that I'm not griping, but just have the interest of the Dutch in mind. As you know the majority of the big Dutch sweepstake shows are held in the middlewest this being due to more clubs and more Dutch breeders being located in that section. To get to the point I feel that if we could work out something to give the Dutch breeders in the more isolated sections a better chance of getting more sweepstake points it would not only put more Dutch in the show room but would create more interest which would mean a stronger club. The idea that I have in mind is to award sweepstake points according to the distance rabbits are shipped. For example, we now award everyone the same number of points according to his winnings, the breeder who is closest to the show location can show quite a few more rabbits than one 500 miles away. Express rates being quite high really hurts the distant breeder. I would like to see something along this line, let the points remain as they now are within a 400 mile radius of the show, over 400 miles that a additional half a point be given and so on for each additional 400 miles. This would mean that if a breeder shipped 1200 miles to a show or less but more than 800 would receive 12 points times the number in the class for first. I believe this would create more interest as a whole among the breeders and would increase the number of Dutch entered in shows outside of the middlewest. As you know we have a good size show here in Atlanta, I have tried every way possible to get Dutch breeders in your section to show with us but just don't get many in fact very very few. I can't help but believe the reason for this is the fact that they know they can get plenty of points without shipping a great distance. Think this over and let me know what your opinion is on it."

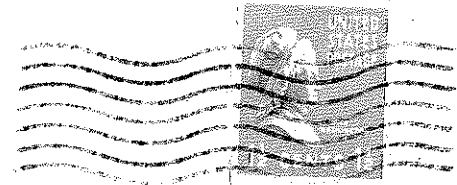
