

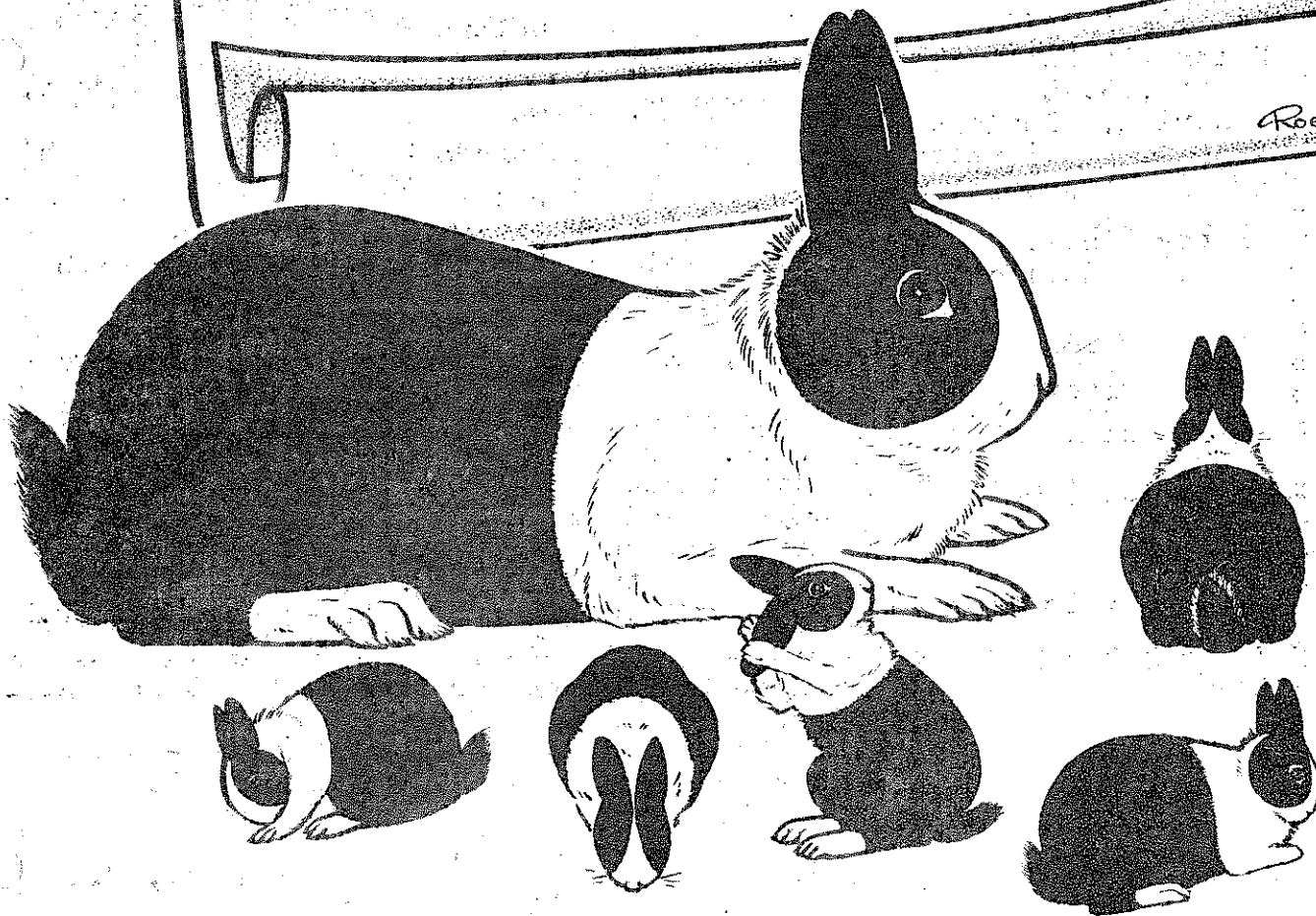

WHAT THE DUTCH MEANS TO ME

About five years ago, I was given a Dutch doe. I had been to some of the shows, but, having raised larger breeds for several years, I could not see just what made people go for the little Dutch rabbit. They were cute but, other than that, what good were they? Well, a neighbor of mine was going out of the business and he gave me a Steel Dutch doe. I didn't know too much about them at that time. Any rabbit I have ever had in my rabbitry receives very special attention from me. I looked her over and I petted her and talked to her and, before I knew it, she was my favorite pet. I bred her to a friend's Steel Buck. She had four young ones. About this same time, I had a bigger doe from the litter of one of the larger breeds. She was a very good doe but she died after having five little ones. I transferred these five to the Dutch, and she raised her four and these five to a weaned age.

I was very surprised because the five I had given her weighed as much or more than she did when weaned. Her litter as far as being show animals were a total loss. I butchered them, ate them and forgot about them. (Continued on Page 12).

## OFF-COLORS IN DUTCH

James Blyth

Our new president, Mr. C. W. Dugan, has asked that each of our directors contribute an article to The Dutch Reporter. I believe this a wonderful idea. Most of the older breeders know the answers to various breeding problems and should be willing to convey these to the new breeders who are readers of The Reporter. Too much of the work of compiling The Reporter is left to the Secretary, and she has difficulties soliciting articles. We are a part of the Dutch Club and should assist her by contributing constructive articles that will help the novice.

Having always been more or less of a crank on color, I chose the above subject. Outside of type, color is the most important item for Dutch. Fifteen points are allotted on color. Some might ask why this is considered so important when there are 85 points on the various other items. Color affects all the markings. If you don't have good color, you don't have sharp contrast and contrast is what makes the Dutch rabbit such a beautiful one.

Various breeders have many ideas as to how the proper color can be obtained. If carefully noted, those that are the most successful with winning Dutch are specialists. In other words, they stick to one or two colors. Others have the idea that good color can be had by crossing the various colors. This, I believe wrong.

Many breeders believe that by crossing black and blue, better color will be had in both of these. This idea no doubt comes from the idea of mixing paints, but I have never seen it work in rabbits. Some years ago, a partner and I discussed this mating of different colored rabbits as leading breeders had advocated it. Some of the best books tell us that color crossing is necessary. We decided to test it and see for ourselves. At the time, we were breeding English, and it was with them that we worked. After breeding the best colored blacks to good colored blacks, our color was very dense and the best we have ever had. In fact, it was much better than when we were crossing blacks and blues. We came to the conclusion that good color can only be gained by selective breeding with the best colored at hand.

We believe the greatest damage in crossing colors is not in the black and blue, but in the crossing of any color with another color. The breeder who does this has no goal of perfection. He is just breeding rabbits together hoping he will get something that is well-marked.

It would be an odd world if we all liked the same thing. Why not set your mind on a point of perfection for color? In mating the various colors together, what is to be gained? We have not as yet mastered the standard colors so why not try to produce a good standard colored rabbit. Most of the off-colors in Dutch have come, not from selective breeding, but from haphazard breeding. We must firmly set our minds on the color we are striving for, never once giving thought to any of the poorly colored ones that might appear in a litter. So many breeders, not only in Dutch but in other breeds, want new standards for new colors. So far as I know, none of us has mastered our standard colors; therefore, to fall for the weaker or poorer color shows defeat in our breeding operations. If we admit we have given up trying to produce the perfect standard color, we might just as well admit defeat in trying to produce the perfectly marked Dutch.

My honest opinion is that we should discontinue the A. O. C. class. Too many beginners in Dutch get a few of these, exhibit them, with little or no competition, and thus starts another series of color crosses.

Any building must have a firm foundation or the structure will not stand. Type is the foundation of Dutch. Let us all strive for the perfect type. The first floor is color. If we have a good foundation and then fail to build the first floor structure properly, the floors above will collapse. Let us breed Dutch the same way we would erect a building. Select the color you have decided on and then go on to work for those perfect markings. I breed Dutch because there are so many interesting problems and disappointments in their breeding operations. In the past few years, we have had many breeders of off-colors apply for a new standard, and very few have carried through to meet the requirements. They do, however, mislead the beginner and retard progress in obtaining a better color in our standard colors. Let us have more discussion on color and how it might be mastered.

WHAT THE DUTCH MEANS TO ME - Con't. I guess I fooled around with her and other Dutch for over a year before I really paid too much attention to them. Then, I entered her in a sweepstakes show in Champaign, Ill. She had been in other shows but, even though she won, she didn't have too much competition. This show really did open my eyes about the Dutch. Not only did I have a lot of competition but I made more profit with a 2nd place win than I had made with any other show's 1st place win.

This got me to thinking, why should I ship to shows which do not have a sweepstakes or some real specials? I was losing money and time by not showing at a sweepstakes show. Any club which has a Dutch Sweepstakes show has a good-sized entry and a lot of the Dutch breeders attend them. We get together and really enjoy ourselves and every once in a while someone has a new idea. We can share and improve our Dutch.

The point I am trying to bring out is: Let's Have More Sweepstakes Shows. It only costs \$2.00 for the Dutch Sanction and \$7.00 on Guaranteed Specials. If all of us would dig down into our own pocket once a year and sponsor a Sweepstakes for a club, we would not only be helping the clubs but we would be helping ourselves as well.

I know of clubs which held shows without a Dutch Sanction and very few have had over 25 Dutch, if that many, year after year. These same clubs then decided to hold a Dutch Sweepstakes Show and the results were 60, 65, 80, 100 and, yes, even more entered. I have known of some clubs where one-third of their shows' entries were Dutch. Needless to say, these clubs continue to hold sanctioned shows from then on.

Some clubs object to a sanctioned show on the grounds that there are either no breeders or very few breeders in their immediate vicinity. They think they will be wasting their money. Let me show you where this does not prove true. In our locality, there are only three or four Dutch breeders who show at all. In the past few years we have not had very many Dutch entries. This year we had a sanctioned show and had 63 Dutch. It really pleased and surprized everyone. Next year we hope to have over 100.\*\*\*So, let's really push the Dutch because they cannot be beat either on the show table or on the dinner table. I am just now waking up to the fact that our Dutch meat is really good meat and that there is a great demand for it. I do not know too much about the meat situation for our Dutch as yet, because I am learning, too, but I refer anyone who is interested in this phase to our President.\*\*\*

But I do know shows and the results of our advertising. Let's all dig down deep and put out a little cash for sanctioned shows, and we will have a medium of advertising our rabbits and our club that cannot be beat in any way. Don't just talk about them -- show them and make good shows in order to bring our Dutch out. It will benefit all of us and put our Dutch on top, where they belong.
