

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

I feel that all that attended this outstanding yearly event left well satisfied and happy; SATISFIED of the sportsmanship that was shown in the showroom, and of the renewal of old friendships and new friends made; HAPPY with the accomplishments made in all the Board and General meetings of your Club. A mojority of the Officers were present which enabled a lot of decisions to be made, and much was accomplished in the Board meetings. It is the hope of the Board that the membership will approve of these changes.

Fancier?

President George Bayliss

Raising rabbits would mean little, I am afraid, if it were not for the shows and our standards of perfection. But because we do have them, many are attracted to that enterprise or hobby.

In order to be a real success in raising rabbits for the shows, one must have a

real fancier's spirit.

The fancier must feel the appeal of beauty and perfection - the wish to better something of beaty and quality. He needs to be a sportsman, to be able to take a licking without crying all over the place.

Many times we see exhibitors kicking or protesting with the Judges and show officials, or who. perhaps, are appealing it to other exhibitors on the outside.

A true fancier must have some knowledge of breeding characteristics and to be able to benefit from mistakes made. The ability to cull properly and to have knowledge of the breed or breeds he is perfecting. All go to make up a fancier.

He must be able to carry on when the going is tough. When death claims the young buck he thought was going to be such a sensation at all the coming shows, when the champion doe refuses to raise her young, and perhaps when dogs clean out the best stock in the outdoor pens. There are, of course, many other setbacks and discouragments that the fancier must put up with and carry on in spite of it all.

JUNIORS or Juniors ? ? ?

By A. Careful Observer k should be rectified.

At a recent Dutch Show one thing cropped up which I think should be rectified, especially as it has happened with Dutch judges at several shows in the past.

What I am referring to is that in the judges' remarks on Junior classes was the statement: "Too large for the class - should be in Senior Class."

This, I think, is wrong; for a junior Dutch is just that, until six months of age. And at that age they should have attained mature growth, or nearly so. Therefore, if the junior rabbit is larger than some of the 8 to 12 week-old babies, it should not receive such a remark, unless the judge is SURE it is over six months of age.

TORTOISE DUTCH Color Standard

The following Tortoise color Standard has been approved and accepted, duly, by the ADRC and the ARBA. Since there are no changes in the color of the Tortoise Dutch but since this new description is so far superior to the one printed in the 1950-55 Guide Book, this new description is being printed here for the information, and value to the Tortoise breeders and our judges.

TORTOISE: To be a bright clean orange color, blending into smokey-blue shading over the rump, carrying well into the haunches. The top color should carry down into the under-color; blending into a dark cream color next to the skin. Tail should match top body color, under tail to match shadings; light tails are permisseable, but very undesireable. The shadings on the head should be darkest at the whister bed, blending into lighter shadings on the jaw, and darkening again at the ear base, blending up the ears to match body color; ears to have lacings to match shadings. Free from white hairs, smut or smudge throughout the orange color
