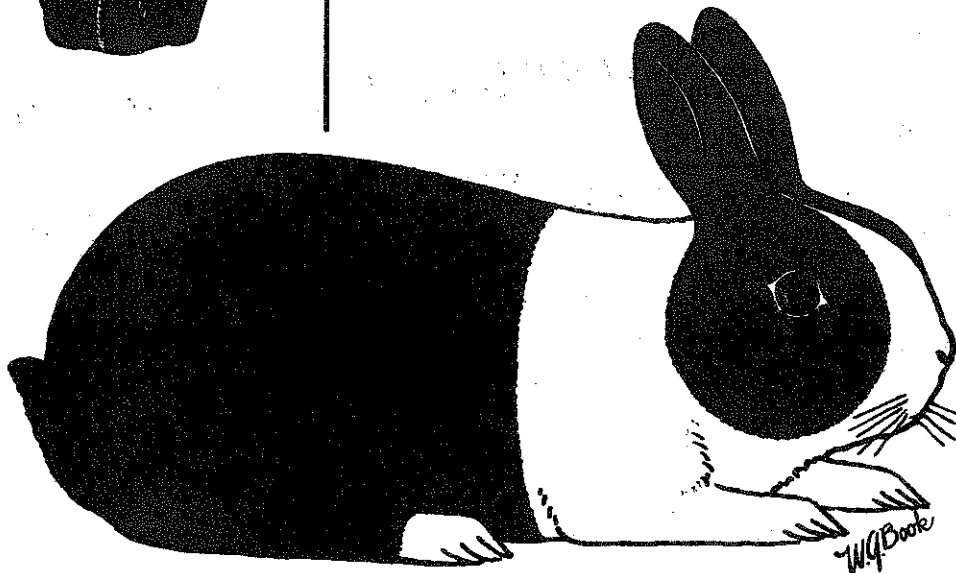


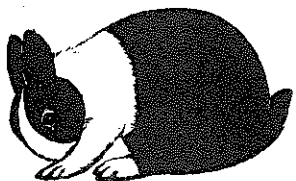

What's this, looks more like an English than a Dutch, maybe I can show it as an English. Well I guess not, no chain marking, so into the garbage pail you go. Hum, this looks like a self English. Wonder if I bred her to an English buck instead of a Dutch. Solid color you just keep the spotted one company in the can. Now this one looks something like a Dutch. Good belt, good undercut, stops look pretty good, but youngster you will never get past Cy Lowitt with that mouth drag. Maybe you will be a doe and a good breeder so you can stick around for awhile.

WOW! What the dickens have we here! Old Lady you did come across at last. This one sure looks great, but of course, rather small, so guess we will wait awhile and look him over again when the fur comes out. Two more yet. Pretty fair, so you can have four and see that you make a good job of the nursing business.

About the end of June and the club meeting;

Say, fellows, you should see that young Black Dutch I have in the nest at home, out of my good old doe mated to so-and-so's buck. Sure is a knockout. Looks like the best Dutch at our leading Dutch shows this year alright, etc.

July meeting:

Boys that young buck gets better every time I look him over, etc.

About August 15:

About time to wean the litter from the old doe. Here, you three can go right into this hutch, but young champ, here you can have a nice, roomy hutch all to yourself. Guess I'll look him over again, now that he has some size to him.

Sit right here little man. Don't stretch out like that. Hunch up a little and show your type. There that's something to look at. Don't be scared, you are not going to be hurt.
