THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In the May issue of the DUTCH REPORTER will be found a very interesting and constructive thinking article by Bill Geitzenauer. From time to time in the past I have asked for such suggestions that Bill has outlined; and although perhaps one or two of his suggested "Work-Load" sections are overlapping, his basic thinking is exactly my thoughts in streamlining the "Work-Load" of the Secretary's office. In a recent message of mine, I expressed that I did not go along with the practice of putting all the eggs in one basket; I contend that the more willing hands helping with the "Work-Load", the better the relationship is between the administration body and the members.

Some two years ago I asked the WAYS and MEANS COMMITTEE of our Club to give serious consideration in streamlining the overlapping condition between the office of the Secretary and of the Publicity Director. The Ways and Means Committee has given reports, facts and findings. It was determined by the Ways and Means Committee that what I had advocated would help to streamline the "Work-Load" of the Secretary's office; namely divorcing the complete operation of the DUTCH REPORTER from the Secretary's office and put it in the hands of the Publicity Director where it rightly belongs.

There is no doubt that steps will be taken at the meetings held at Colorado Springs to correct and distribute the administrative "Work-Load".

At this time I would also like to thank Mr. VanHorne for his "Open Letter" and to correct some of the statements made by Mr. VanHorne. In any organization such as our AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB which is one of the top Specialty Clubs in the nation today, there will always be found the element of jealousy and selfishness. I feel that Mr. VanHorne has been listening to a whispering campaign by those that delight in planting the seeds of jealousy and selfishness. I fail to see in presenting the facts, figures, and data that pertain to the administration of your Club is a smear campaign; to a great many the truth always hurts.

When any member accepts the obligation to become an Officer in the Club, he is duty bound to give back to the members who voted him into office, sound and truthful administration of the Club's affairs. I fail to see how an obligation of this nature can be called a smear campaign, or the seeking of personal gains. As Pres-

PROPOSED REVISED CONSTITUTION
AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

No changes proposed in the following Articles: I - NAME, II - OBJECT, III - AFFILIATION, V - OFFICERS.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP: Note: Some disposition will have to be made in regards to the State Dutch Rabbit Clubs and their memberships. (Editor's Note: All underlined portions represent proposed changes.)

ARTICLE VI - DISCIPLINE: Add SECTION 7 - No member or candidate for membership may infringe upon the name of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, or that of any other member or his rabbitry, this also applies to State Dutch Rabbit Clubs.

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS, No Change.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS, No Change.

BY-LAWS

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

ARTICLE I - DUES: CHANGE: The membership dues shall be \$3.00 per year payable in advance, with a combination membership being provided for husband and wife at \$5.00 per year, expiring with the same date. After membership has expired, the member may renew within a period of sixty days; otherwise upon sending in membership fees, the member will be given a new membership number unless he/she specifically requests that his/her membership be dated back more than sixty (60) days to the original expiration date in order that he/she may keep his/her original membership number.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF OFFICERS, No change SECTIONS 1, and 2. CHANGE SECTION 3 The Secretary-Treasurer shall be custodian of all general funds; shall maintain a bank account in the name of the Club; shall maintain a set of books and records suitable to the Board of Directors; receive and act on all membership applications received, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors; maintain Sweepstake records; consult and advise the Board of Directors on all unusual matters; furnish them with quarterly reports showing the condition of the Club's financial standing, these reports to be published in the Club's publication; keep an accurate record of all meetings; notify all Officers and members as appropriate, of place and time of all meetings; and perform such other duties as may be assigned by the President or the Board of Directors. The Secretary shall cooperate with the appointed editor of the Club's publication, THE DUTCH REPORTER by giving all such news and information as would be of interest to the membership. The Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish an approved bond covering the assets of the Club. The premium for said bond to be paid out of the Club's funds, with the bond to be delivered to the President within ten (10) days after assumption of office.

Change SECTION 4 - Repeal this section completely from the By-Laws.

ARTICLE III - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS: Change Section 1: The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ percent of all membership dues including re-newals as full compensation of his or her services.

Change SECTION 2: The dues shall be further divided with 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent going to the Publicity Fund; 25 per cent to the Show Fund of the National Dutch Rabbit Show, and the remaining 50 per cent to the General Fund.

No Change SECTION 3.

Change SECTION 4: The sum of \$1.50 shall be allowed each Officer and Director,

(other than the Secretary-Treasurer, and the Publicity and Promotion Director), and each Chairman of an A.D.R.C. committee for postage expense incurred incident to his or her office. Should any Officer or Director serve as a Chairman of any A.D.R.C. committee he shall receive but one allowance.

Add SECTION 5: The Publicity and Promotion Director shall receive 25% of the sweepstake sanction fee to apply to the cost of publishing the Club's publication, THE DUTCH REPORTER.

ARTICLE IV - STANDING COMMITTEES: Change SECTION 1; The Publicity and Promotion Committee shall consist of a Chairman and State representatives, and shall be appointed by the President for a term of -----year. The Chairman of the Publicity and Promotion Committee shall be known as the Publicity and Promotion Director and shall be in charge of all publicity and promotion work including the editing, publishing, and mailing of the Club's publication, THE DUTCH REPORTER. The Publicity and Promotion Director shall be custodian of and be responsible for the Publicity and Promotion Funds turned over to him/her by the Secretary-Treasurer and all funds collected from the sale of publicity and promotion items as well as from the sale of advertising in the Club's publication, THE DUTCH REPORTER: and give a financial report to the Club at each annual and regular meeting which shall include a separate accounting of monies collected and expended in the publishing of the Club's publication, THE DUTCH REPORTER. The Publicity and Promotion Director shall have the authority to pay to the person actually doing the work of mimeographing, mailing, etc., our Club's publication, THE DUTCH REPORTER, a reasonable sum not to exceed \$20.00 a month out of the Publicity and Promotion Funds.

No changes in SECTIONS 2,3,4,5.

No changes in ARTICLE V, VI, VII, VIII.

NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW RULES

Change Rule 1: Last paragraph of Rule 1 to read:-This show to be held during the last week-end of the month of May, unless decreed otherwise by the Board of Directors of the AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

Change Rule 9: First paragraph of Rule 9 to read:- Twenty-five percent (25%) from each membership in the American Dutch Rabbit Club shall be turned over to the sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show by the Secretary of the American Dutch Rabbit Club at the end of fiscal year, June 30th.

Change Rule 10: First paragraph of Rule 10 to read:- There shall be two (2) judges for each National Dutch Rabbit Show, and American Rabbit Breeders Association Convention Show, same to be chosen by the membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club by mailed ballot. Fifth paragraph of Rule 10 to read:- No judge shall be allowed to judge two consecutive National Dutch Rabbit Shows or two consecutive American Rabbit Breeders Association Convention Shows, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to inform the membership of those judges who are not eligible to judge due to this ruling.

Change Rule 12: Judging to start on Saturday and be completed in one day, and the judges shall be notified to this effect at the time of securing their services. No judging shall be done at night.

FANCIER OR MEAT HOUND

These few words are penned from the inspiration I received after reading an article concerning commercial value of the Dutch Rabbit sent in by Oliver Milliken for the special issue of Small Stock magazine now in the formative stage.

I know that this article will not meet with approval of many who are to read it - for there are many in our club and in other specialty clubs who hate to be referred to as any but "fanciers" and who react with great hostility to the mere mention of "commercial".

I have always considered myself as a fancier as my greatest kick comes from exhibiting and discussing my stock. I, too, must admit that I am commercial. I am taking nothing away from the show prowess of our sprightly little Dutch when I make this statement -- it is still among the most outstanding in the show pens.

However, we must face cold facts. Although you are primarily a fancier and primarily interested in the show pens, you are still commercial because the biggest percentage of Dutch kindled must become meat rabbits! If you are so fortunate that your rabbits do not have to be self-supporting this may not apply to you -- but if you are not that fortunate then you must find a market for your surplus or culls. Of course, the more does the breeder keeps the more commercial he must become! Regardless of whether these animals find their way to the meat pen, the deep-freeze, or for laboratory stock, they are still commercial!

I feel that when our breeders admit these facts the better it will be for the entire Dutch fancy!

I feel that the ADRC is deeply indebted to Mr. Milliken and the other staunch Dutch fanciers in Florida for the excellent work they have done in the past five years with their Dutch herds.

Having had the pleasure of meeting and working for the Florida Dutch breeders I want to say that they are REAL FANCIERS as well as being 100% commercial-minded. The stock that was put on the show tables was as good as any I had handled elsewhere.

This was only a month after I had judged the Dutch at Ft. Worth that I judged the Florida show. To be perfectly honest, I was surprised at the quality of their show specimens. They were as close to our standard of perfection as our standard calls!

As mentioned in previous articles I have known Mr. Milliken for the past 30 years. Since moving to Florida he has spent a lot of time working with the Dutch fanciers in that state in promoting the Dutch as a meat producer.

Having heard so much about the Commercial Dutch in Florida I was like the man from Missouri -- "show me". After visiting with Milliken and others in Florida and seeing their set-ups I was completely sold. I have visited many big commercial breeders across the expanse of the United States but I have never seen one with finer records or with more proof of the dual value of the Dutch rabbit than those of Mr. Milliken. He can convince anyone who is open minded that you literally cannot Beat the Dutch, both as a show specimen and as one that can pay its way commercially. I visited with other commercial men, or shall I say processors -- Mr. Ken Wigner and wife and others in Florida. These people are all convinced that in Florida you cannot beat the Dutch as a commercial animal and they are converting many of the breeders of heavier commercial breeds to the real value of Dutch.

In actual recorded tests, Mr. Milliken has proven that the cost of the Dutch meat per pound of production was far superior to that of other commercial breeds used in his experiment.

What the ADRC standard committee should work toward is a good working standard to fit the Dutch meat pens so they will have a fair chance in meat pen competition. As the standard is now written it definitely penalizes the Dutch.

Let us not forget that we are all fanciers but let us also keep in mind that the more we think commercially the better it is for the Dutch fancy. "You can't beat the Dutch" -- may we make it stick on both sides, fancy and commercial!

YES, MR. BAYLISS

Mr. Bayliss asked for comments in answer to his message in the April Dutch Reporter -- so here is mine. I look forward to the "Reporter" each month and was amazed when I read in the April issue, to find that there is such dissatisfaction with both the Reporter and the Editor.

Has the Secretary asked to be relieved of the "work-load"? If she hasn't, why all the discussion? The impression I get from the letters of Mr. Bayliss and Mr. Shufflebotham, and also from the discussion at the meeting at Ft. Worth is -- NOT that the secretary is incapable -- but that she receives "too much money" for her work. By dividing the "work-load" as suggested by Mr. Bayliss, there would be TWO salaries to pay, which could possibly add up to more than the amount now paid. Any good Club Secretary devotes many hours on Club work. Our Secretary is no exception.

Mr. Bayliss continues -- "What if some unforeseen circumstances happened to the Secretary?" Why suggest such a tragedy? Could it not happen to anyone? We hope not.

Mr. Shufflebotham is "heartily in favor" of separating the Reporter from the office of Secretary." How is the proposed new Editor to get the news? Most of it would of necessity come through the office of Secretary who would forward it to the Editor, thus giving the Secretary more correspondence with no compensation.

How would Mr. Bayliss and Mr. Shufflebotham feel if their "concern" told them that they would be relieved of some of their work-load thus having a cut of 50% or more in their salary?

We know how successful the Reporter is now. Why change to someone else who would want to be paid, too; and if not, would no doubt soon lose interest. A "new broom" might sweep clean, but it might also soon wear out.

I would also like to call attention to one statement made by Mr. Shufflebotham in the April '61 Reporter -- that "none of them" (other Specialty Clubs) "charge as much for Sweepstakes as we do." I would like to inform him that -- California Sweepstakes are \$5.00, Standard Chinchilla Sweepstakes are \$5.00, American Chinchilla

Sweepstakes are \$5.00, Champagne D'Argent Sweepstakes are \$5.00 and New Zealand Sweepstakes are \$5.00 and \$7.50 if Black New Zealands are included. All of these have been \$5.00 for some time.

The above is not the original as I did not feel even our Secretary-Treasurer would print it, but it gives a general idea as to one man's thinking. I received requests to submit this at the Columbus Rabbit Club Show when I asked and received views of different Dutch Breeders.

So Ladies and Gentlemen, again I say lets get behind our Secretary-Treasurer one hundred percent and let her know that we appreciate what she has been doing the past years and hope that she will be able to continue doing the same for many more.

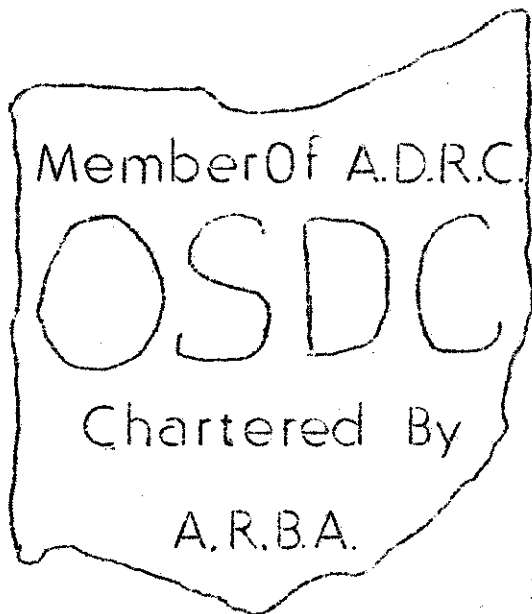
