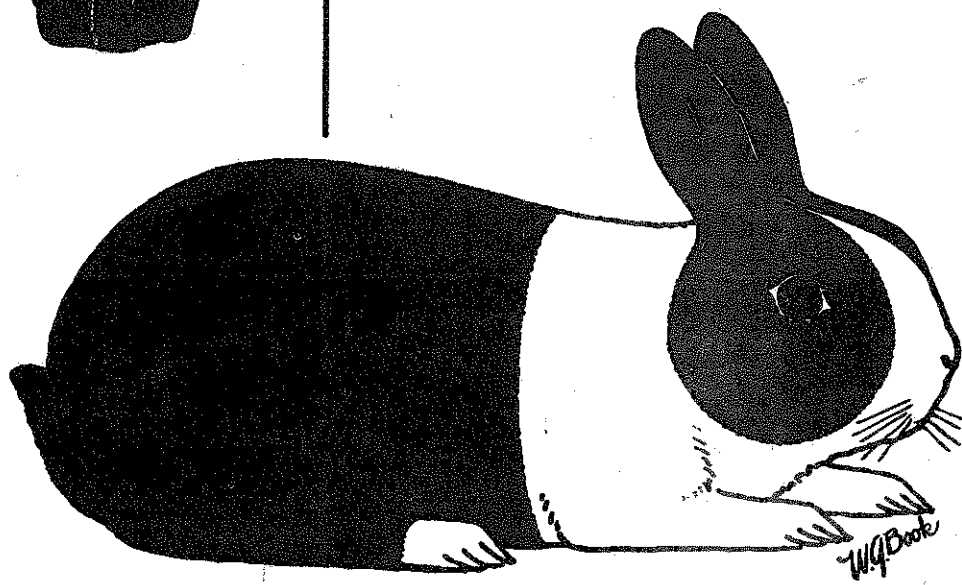

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT

June -- this is an important month for your organization. It is now time for all of you to think of just who you want to hold the reins of your club for the coming year. Sometime before the end of the month you will all receive nomination ballots for the purpose of selecting those whose names you wish to see on the election ballot later in the summer. You will find in this issue of the Dutch Reporter a list of all members whose dues are paid through June 1, 1965. Bear in mind that for a candidate to be eligible to run for the office of President or Vice-President he must have been a member, in good standing for a minimum of two years prior to Oct. 20, 1965. Also there is a requirement that any candidate to be eligible to run for President or Vice-President must have a total of 10 votes to qualify (or more than any other nominee from his state). Five votes are required for eligibility to be a candidate for the Board of Directors. Please read the directions on your ballot very carefully so you do not waste your vote.

You know it has been a good many years since I have paid much attention to what had been written on my show report cards from the shows. I have heard many breeders, especially among the novices complain that they could not understand these cards. Since I have been ill, and unable to attend the shows and listen to the judges, I have studied my report cards much more carefully than I have for a long time and I realize what these amateurs are talking about. I no longer smile when someone says, "But that rabbit has two legs on a Grand Championship, how could it have been beaten so badly?" I had always given out with the old saw -- different show, different competition, different judge, difference in condition of the various rabbits. But now I'm beginning to wonder if there isn't something really wrong with some of our judges -- if they shouldn't review their manner of judging, or at least take a closer look at just what they say about each rabbit. Here are the remarks on a single rabbit in three different shows between April 10 and May 22, with more or less the same competition and under three different judges. "Good type, head and markings. Good saddle. Stops even, step in undercut, good body color." "Good type, head, ears, lacks color, good fur, cheek markings, ear base, blaze. Stops even but ragged." "Good type, head, fur mouby. Good cheeks, blaze, fair belt, good undercut." Those remarks all sound like a pretty good Dutch rabbit don't they? Believe me, he is a good one, but what would a beginner think if he had the first set of remarks accompanied by a placement of 13 in 15? For my own satisfaction I would sure like to have seen what kind of competition he had. At the

second show he placed 1st. in 8 and Best Opp. of Variety in twenty. The third set of remarks were for a placement of 1st. in 10, Best Opposite of Variety and Best Opposite Dutch. I don't want anyone to get the idea that I am complaining about the placement of my own rabbits -- I have been at this game long enough to know that the game goes that way -- this week end we take it on the chin -- next week end it may be our turn to win. Win or lose its all just good clean fun. The thing that does bother me is the careless way some of our judges spout off their remarks. We have one or two judges. under whom I have shown who make it a practice of dishing out good remarks on most of t e first fifteen or twenty off the table and when they come to those left for the first five placements, they scratch their heads and begin looking for reasons why the fourth is better than the third and the third better than the fourth, etc. What actually happens is that they wind up with poorer remarks on the first five placements than they gave on almost any of the ones already eliminated from comptetion. I'm sure I don't know what the answer is, but we do have quite a large number of judges who belong to the Dutch Club, so maybe if they will just look at their judging next time, a bit objectively and ask yourselves if you are really being fair to the exhibitors and their rabbits, some good might be accomplished from this.

I would like to remind some of you that it would be very helpful if, when you send me material for publication in your Dutch Reporter, you would please work it up into a bit more presentable shape. I don't mind struggling with spelling and composition, but when you send me a few rough ideas and tell me to "make something of it", this is a bit too much, as the manner in which I might develope your ideas could be entirely different from your original meaning. It also helps, if you type your material to double space for easier copying.

Mr. Bob Hriffith forwarded the following motion -- "the members present should give the ADRC Standard Committee a vote of approval and ask them to pursue this Gray Dutch standard correction and attempt to get the ARBA Standard Committee to review their decision and accept the standard corrections that were approved by the ADRC membership. If the ARBA will not accept the revisions as approved then the ADRC Standard Committee should attempt to work out a compromise that the ARBA will accept." Mr. Simpkins seconded the motion and when put to vote, it passed unanimously.

Mr. Reid expressed the National Club's appreciation to the fine people of Georgia who had staged such a wonderful show and convention.

Upon a motion by Simpkins and seconded by Griffith, the members voted to adjourn.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW

by Don Guthrie

Once again our national Dutch show is history and if you didn't attend you missed a dandy. Unfortunately most of the Dutch club did not attend and this causes me to worry about the enthusiasm that once made our national shows very popular with a large number of members present -- perhaps I should say I am concerned about the lack of enthusiasm.

The show was awarded well in advance so that all Dutch members could make plans to attend, it was well publicized not only in our Reporter but in National magazines as well, it had a premium list that would put the majority of our shows to shame. Everything possible was done to attract the Dutch exhibitors to Atlanta. The show was neatly arranged and had coops ready for over 500 entries, the sponsoring group was present to help to keep the show moving efficiently, there was hospitality that few of us have ever experienced in previous shows. Everything possible was done to give the exhibitors and visitors a fine show -- in spite of these efforts the show only drew about 150 Dutch and what is equally important it drew only a hand full of Dutch raisers outside the immediate area.

We are well aware that the majority of the Dutch are raised in the area that includes Illinois, southern Michigan, Indiana, Ohio and part of Pennsylvania. Does this mean that this is the only area where we can hold a National show and expect to get a good entry? I certainly hope not.

We have heard many individuals express the opinion that our shows should be taken into new areas for it helps publicize our breed, instill new interest in our club and is beneficial to all concerned in making the Dutch rabbit a leading breed. Yet, when we do just that the support is missing.

We have a bid for the National Dutch show to go into the southwest part of the country in 1966 and if the statements in the previous paragraph have merit, it would be good for the breed and the club to accept the bid. And yet, not one individual from this area was present at this year's show and not one entry was present from the group bidding for the show. If our show is to become regional only we have lost the intent for which they were begun.

I think it would be appropriate if the membership would use the pages of the Dutch Reporter to make suggestions and open a discussion as to how we can once again create interest in the National Dutch Show and encourage entries and attendance.

In the meantime, I would suggest that we take steps to make some changes in the apportionment of funds as directed by Section 2, Article III of our ADRC By-Laws. Some time ago, some members in the club pushed through a plan to place all our show fund moneys on the National Dutch Show and none on the ARBA National Convention. I was not for the change at that time but believe the reasons expressed were that it would create more interest in our Dutch Show. It is obvious that it has not. The ARBA Convention entries in our breed has been among the largest at the Conventions and usually over twice the number our Dutch show attracts. I think it hardly fair to the exhibitors winning at the ARBA Convention which is also where we hold our annual membership meeting to receive none of this show fund apportionment and those winning at our Dutch Show which is becoming more and more regional to receive none.

Before leaving this year's National Show I would like to comment a bit about the quality of stock present at Atlanta.

A third of the entries exhibited were in the black classes and the winners were good ones. This is especially true in the senior bucks and both junior classes. There were some good bucks in the senior class that lacked the finish of color and fur and flesh to win but the winner of Mr. Shufflebotham's was a very well marked individual with excellent top color. He needed a little more flesh and condition to be ideal. The junior doe class was perhaps the best class in the show with quality going very deep. Stohrer & Quinton won this class with a very fine doe with type and color and condition to burn. Her cheeks hooked slightly and evenly otherwise she was very cleanly marked. Our club president, Bill Summers, won best and best opposite blue with a couple of

dandy juniors. They needed a little more development of body especially through the hips but were quite classy. We had a good entry of Chocolates with 40 being shown. One of our newer exhibitors and members, Jodie Croker, had best with a senior buck and best opposite with a junior doe. I want to especially commend these for excellent color. The buck had a few minor faults in markings and lacked the conformation and smoothness of body of the black but he was a good winner. Bob Harris had both best and best opposite in Tortoise with a senior doe going best tortoise and best senior all colors. This doe was very stylish with a good tortoise color. Johnny Mellozzo (Johnny Ideal Bbtry) won in both steel and gray and these were good representatives of the breed and varieties. It is too bad that there weren't more entries in these classes for these two senior bucks could have handled a lot more competition than they had.

The black junior doe nosed out the tortoise doe for best of breed as she exhibited a slight edge in body conformation, balance of markings and finish of flesh and fur. The black senior buck went best opposite sex, beating the blue buck on markings and development of body and the chocolate buck on body conformation and cleanness of markings. The Steel and Gray bucks lacked the condition of fur and body and quality of color to beat him.

We met a lot of fine folks at the Georgia show and Don Reid and myself are most appreciative of the wonderful hospitality accorded us.

The American Dutch Rabbit Club's Standard Committee at the National Dutch General meeting at Atlanta, Georgia last month voted to endorse Don Guthrie's letter to the A.R.B.A. Standard Committee and to instruct the A.D.R.C. Standard Committee that Dutch Standard that was mailed to A.R.B.A. Standards Committee is what the DUTCH BREEDERS WANT.

It was also the unanimous opinion that any A.R.B.A. member has the right to write to Standard Committee in regard to his or her BREED.

The A.D.R.C. Standard Committee realizes that this wish of the Dutch Breeders can not be fulfilled as A.R.B.A. Standard Committee has already voted it down. We are therefore sending you a counter-proposal.

Our committee is trying to correct present Gray Standard to conform with our present day Gray Dutch. We are calling our present day Dutch Brown-Gray. If your committee does not like the word Brown in front of Gray, why not cross off BROWN??? You will note a working Standard for Light Gray Dutch at end of Standard. This is our present day Gray Dutch, of which there are very few (if any). The idea of this is that any breeder of Gray Dutch has been trying to breed to our present Standard will have a chance to show them to A.R.B.A. Standard Committee and if they can prove to you that they can be bred then your Committee can accept or reject them.

We hope that your committee will accept proposed changes in our Gray standard whether you call them Gray or Brown Gray is immaterial. We realize the A.R.B.A. OWNS Dutch Standard. Our Committee has no other suggestions. It is up to your Committee to decide what is best.

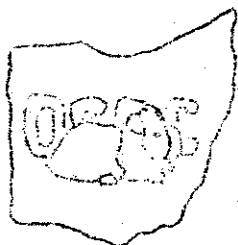

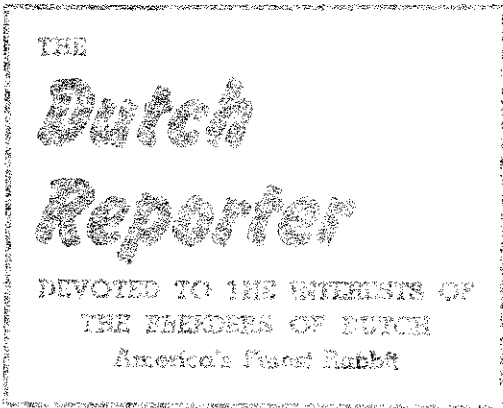

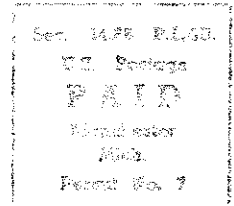
