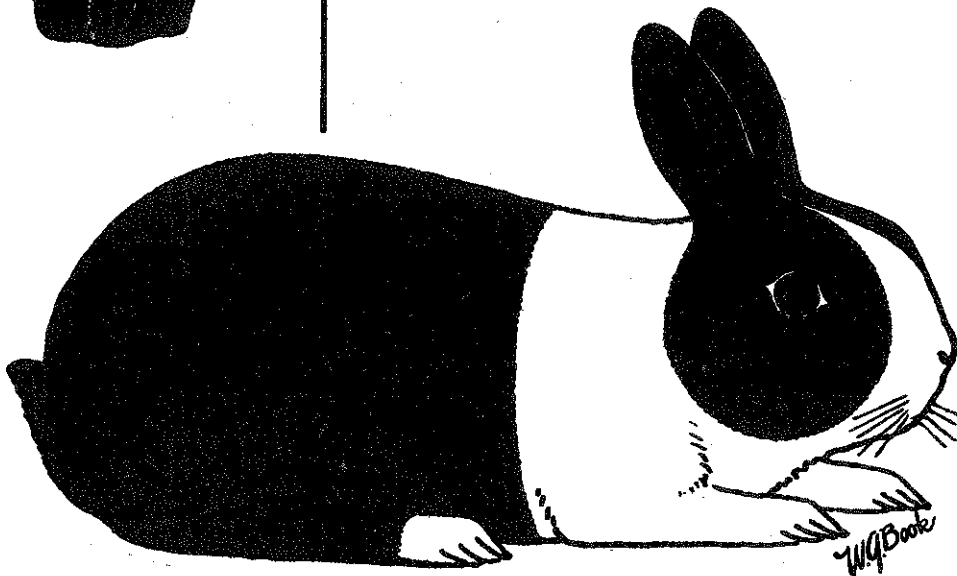


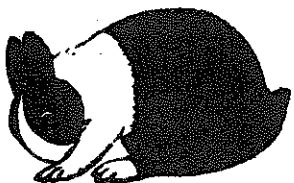

or three different does before we would find one that would accept the orphans. Guess we have that problem about licked (or rather it has about run its course as is the way with most rabbit epidemics) as we have only lost one doe in the last three weeks. On top of that problem our rabbitry was invaded by a predator which would either tear the wire off of a pen or open the door, kill the rabbit, eat the entrails and leave the remains lay. We were visited by a professional trapper with the State Conservation Department and he said he was positive that it was racoons. He set two traps and we caught one Possum (which couldn't have done such damage) and both traps were sprung once but we have had no more visitors for the past week, so hope we are over that hump. Always something to make life interesting!

ADDED SHOW ROOM CLASSES

There has been some comment recently in the "Reporter" concerning showing of over age stock in junior classes and, coupled with these comments, there has been suggestions for going to either pre-junior or intermediate (6-8) classes, or both.

I can think of no arguments to support either class and hope at this time to furnish some realistic reasons why I object to these additional classes.

First, let me state unequivocally that a six week old rabbit of any breed which is hopefully being raised as a show specimen, belongs at home with its mother. Up to the age of three months a youngster is subject to stress from a number of reasons and none could be worse than the packing into a box to be transported to a show and there be subjected to too much handling often, in the instance of carrying case shows, being forced to spend most of the day in unfamiliar surroundings. There have been some of these babies do well at shows but it has been the rare instance that have been there at future shows -- it seems "something" happened to them which caused them to die or get so badly out of condition they never again attained show conditions.

Any youngster competing in an ordinary junior class with youngsters up to the age limit (5 months, 29 days) has very little chance under a good judge -- not by reason of size but because it has no finish to its coat and this automatically penalizes it in two areas at least. It cannot display good color because of the lack of sheen produced by a finished coat, and, secondly it has distinct disadvantage in fur quality -- additionally, each of these tend to diminish the sharpness of the markings.

It's my personal feeling that ten weeks of age is a bare minimum for showing youngsters -- in fact, if I have a couple of outstanding youngsters in a litter of either Dutch or New Zealands, I leave them with the mother till they are ten weeks of age -- and, in the hutch in which they were born.

There is really no need for an intermediate class in a breed not maturing at a weight of less than 9-10 pounds. There is no growth factor involved in evaluating the quality of a Dutch rabbit. The only factors involved are markings, color, type, fur and condition -- none of which are dependent on size. There is no advantage in showing seniors in a junior class unless there happens to be six week old juniors in the class. I'd guess the demand for a 6-8 class is mostly to extend the show careers for two months of those Dutch who are never going to make it. Any Dutch that has not made the minimum senior weight of three and one half pounds at six months of age is hardly worth the feed to maintain it. This is especially true when applied to does -- they'll never make it as breeders.

A good case, or cases, in point to prove that age, is no advantage in showing Dutch is that the best Dutch at both the last Convention and the last National Dutch Show were both juniors -- and, it's my guess that Tom Shufflebotham's fine Black doe was hardly more than three and a half months of age. My "Little Rocky" who was Best Dutch at the Little Rock Convention and was described at the time as being "as close to perfect as you'll ever see a Dutch" was the same age.
