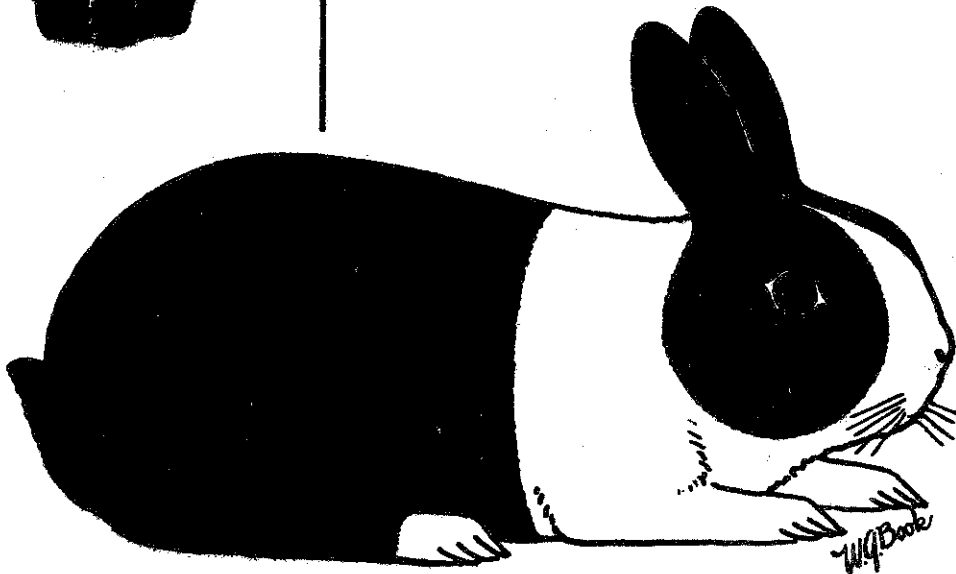

The minutes of Mason City, Iowa National Dutch Show have not been certified as of this date, July 9, 1970. Hope they will be submitted in the near future.

The California Dutch Club has asked me to inform the entire membership of the A.D.R.C. the reason for their recent protest. They objected to final count of 1968 - 1969 Sweepstakes Series as published in the July, 1969 D.R. and asked for an audit. Your President polled the A.D.R.C. Nomination of Officers is over. Our Secretary is busy verifying the candidates of their willingness to run for office. Was quite dissapointed in number of votes cast. I hope that all of you will VOTE in the coming elections. Ballots should be out on or before August, 15th.

Received a very nice financial report from the National Dutch Show of 1970. Was glad to see that they did not go into the red.

On Oct. 30 & 31 Britian's greatest-ever small livestock championship show and exhibition will take place in the Great Hall of the Alexandra Palace in London. We confidently expect over 1,000 rabbits, 500 covies, plus hundreds of other small pets such as mice, gerbils, etc. There will also be ranch chinchillas, mink, hamsters, goats, budgerigars, cage birds etc. Our schedule will have approx. 400 classes and we have 40 judges in the various sections. Other attractions for clubs include an exhibition stand contest, yearbook competition, inter-club challenge matches and for schools a national scrapbook competition which is being sponsored by a national newspaper.

The show will have a truly "royal" flavour - not only will we be holding it in the splendidly Victorian Alexandra Palace, but those eye catching busby clad and red coated Buckingham Palace Guardsmen will be at our palace (four of them) at the main entrance, especially to meet YOU. Everything has been done to make this a truly memorable week-end, and we have invited the presidents of clubs in France, Belgium, Holland, and Switzerland to attend. We have also been in touch with clubs in Germany and South Africa and I have been corresponding with Thos. Coatam. One novel new section will be the unstandardised section in which we hope for overseas entries.
