

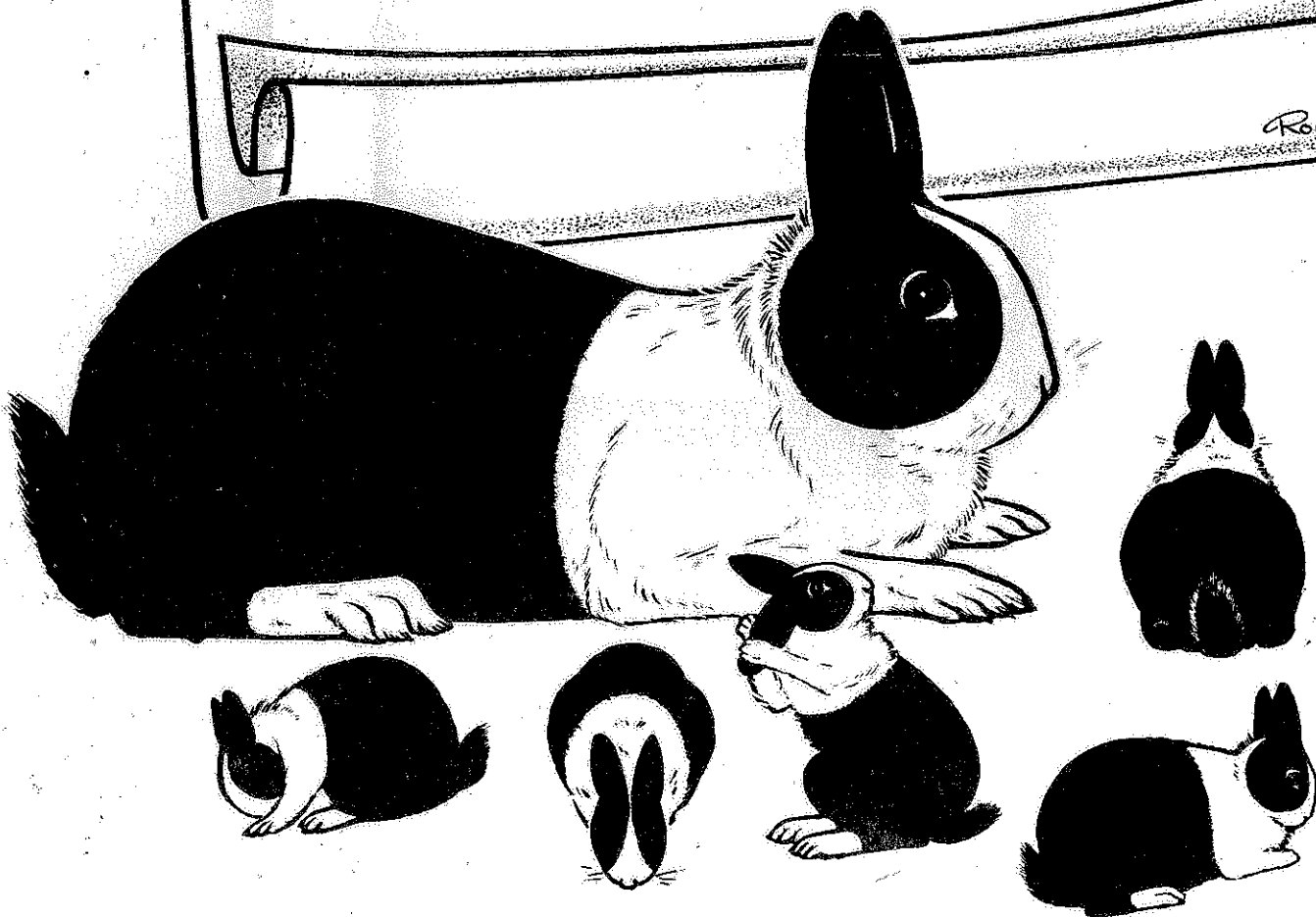

Dear Mr. Souers;

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all the Dutch breeders for their fine cooperation in our show which has just passed.

We had a total of 620 rabbits in our show and the Dutch was the second largest breed entered. There were 133 Dutch in the show. Personally I think this was outstanding.

All rabbits were single decked and the Dutch were in the first rows as the visitor entered the building. The comment on the Dutch was very satisfactory from the visitors.

We wanted to have the remarks, ribbons and prize money mailed at the completion of the show, but due to bad weather which delayed trains and also the keen competition in the breeds, judging was not completed until Sunday afternoon. All Rabbits were shipped out by two special cars of the Railway Express, one car going east and the other going west. Each car had a special agent on it, one agent going as far east as Buffalo, N. Y. and the other agent going as far west as Cleveland Ohio. The show closed at four o'clock on Sunday afternoon and at 6:00 P.M. these cars were on their way.

All the prize money, ribbons and remarks were in the hands of the exhibitors by 8 days after the close of the show.

It certainly was pleasing to see the expression on Jimmy Blyth face when he saw all the Dutch. I told him that the Dutch breeders would not let him down.

Thanks again for the fine cooperation of the Dutch breeders. We know that next year they will have the largest entry.

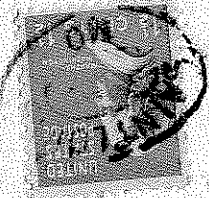
