PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

G. W. Dugan

When it comes to writing articles for a magazine, I would make a better blacksmith. You asked me to write one each month, so here goes.

This is going to be about something I've wanted to get off my chest for a long time. Our Standard. You go to one show and the judge places those nice, cobby, short-eared Dutch from 3½ to 4½ pounds. The next show, the same animals will get remarks, "ears too short and too small in size." And who can read over the standard and say they are wrong. It says ears of 3½ inches are ideal; 4½ lbs. is ideal, so a 5½ lb. one has as much right to win as the 3½ lb. one. But which would you rather have? I'll take the 3½ lb. one every time if its ears will not measure over 3 inches and preferably 2 ¾ inches. If you show me short ears on a Dutch, you will show me cobbiness of body at the same time. They just naturally go hand in hand.

The four or five judges who get the most votes year after year to judge our annual Dutch Show and the AR&CBA Convention Show all like the smaller, short-eared type, and so must you or you wouldn't elect them to judge the two most important shows year after year. Yet, when our standard comes up for a vote, it is never changed. But I know why. The older breeders, the ones who should vote, just put it off and never vote; while the new members, who are most always new breeders and enthusiastic, take time to vote but look at our old standard and vote it right back the same as it has been for years. I'm not in accord with the old saying that what was good enough for father is good enough for me. We should show a little progress in 35 or 40 years.

I have a picture of the first Dutch buck I ever owned. Didn't even know it was of any particular breed, only that it was pretty. This was back in 1913, thirty-eight years ago. He weighed $5\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. and in type compared favorably with one I saw placed Best Dutch at a recent important show. I just would not give him hutch room now. To me, he would compare with the ones our top Dutch judges place today just as a Model T Ford would compare with the sleek, smooth models of today.

It seems to me that we do not have enough points on type. A big, coarse, well-marked Dutch with New Zealand type can win over a nice, cobby Dutch with only a few faults in the markings and do it legitimately too. I always thought that type made the breed but, according to the standard, it's the markings as there are 60 points on them and only 15 on type.

Here are some changes I'd like to see made in the standard...take $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. off the top weight and $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. off the ideal weight. Make the ideal weight 4 lbs. and the top weight 5 lbs. This gives a 2 pound spread between top and bottom weights which is as most commercial breeds have. Ideal ear length to be 3 inches and disqualify for over $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Take enough points off markings and put them on type in order to equalize them with 50 points each.

I know a lot of breeders are going to throw up their hands and yell, "They won't be any good as a commercial rabbit," but I'll prove differently to you in another article for I have held to the so-called toy type for about 10 years and they have convinced me.

But, after all, since when have Dutch been classified as a commercial breed? To me, they are the fanciest of all fancy breeds and let's keep them that way.

The next show you attend, just hand around the Dutch exhibits and see which ones get the most attention. It will always be the little fellows with short ears and round heads who get the most fingers poked in their coops. People who do not even know their breed name stop longer with this type. Shouldn't this convince you? Almost invariably all the requests I get for Dutch state they want them small and with short ears. I'll grant that mine don't all come that way but every year the percentage is greater because I won't keep one with $3\frac{1}{2}$ inch ears or over $4\frac{1}{2}$ pounds, no matter how well marked.

Think this over, members; don't you think it time to do something about it? Let's fix it so these well-marked N. Z. type Dutch don't have a chance to win. I'd like to have your comments on this, either for or against. If we have room in The Reporter, they will be published.

Have you sent in your specials and entries for the Show of Shows? Better do it now.

Hageman of Englewood were appointed to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors. *** A letter from C. W. Dugan regarding revision of the Dutch Standard was read and discussed. *** Three new members were welcomed into the Club... Mr. Ralph Green of Englewood, Mr. A. W. Hageman of Englewood and Mrs. John T. Crane of Golden. *** As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
