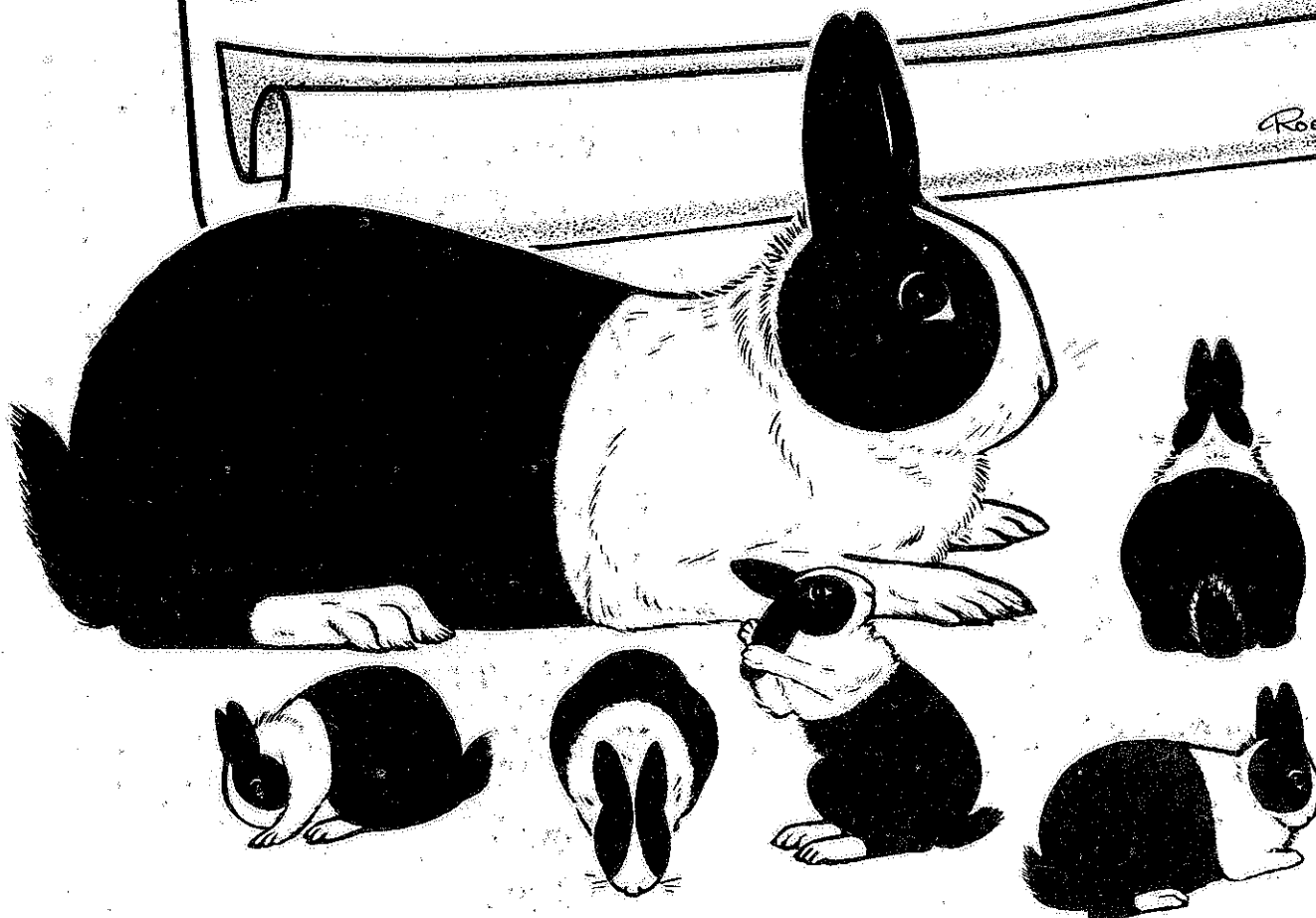

A. D. R. C. SETS UP JUNIOR DIVISION SHOW FOR 1954 NAT'L DUTCH SHOW

Here, I am sure, is the big news you have been waiting for - and in presenting this information to you I will try to cover the subject as completely as possible. No doubt you are interested in just how the "Junior Division" subject came about - just who is responsible for the action taken, and what plans have been made for the development of a program for the young Dutch breeders.

Mr. Grables (better known to most of you as "Ray") and I had discussed several times during the past year the possibilities of having a Junior Division in the 1954 National Dutch Show - and although we wished that this could be brought about, we did not want to force any issue on the subject, and so did nothing except - wish, UNTIL the article which was received for the Dutch Reporter (February issue) was received from William C. Stedman, a Director in the A. D. R. C. Whereupon, I immediately contacted Mr. Stedman, and inquired if he felt that if a program for young Dutch breeders was needed, and if it would be possible for the sponsoring club of the 1954 National Dutch Show to include a Junior Division in this show, would he support the idea, and the show. I immediately received Mr. Stedman's enthusiastic reply that he would go along on the program, and the idea. Next, I sent a letter to President George Bayliss, and to Director J. M. Brown asking for information, and whether or not President Bayliss would consent to have the Board of Directors of the A. D. R. C. polled for their agreement, or disagreement, on the setting up of a Junior Division Show, in conjunction with the Nat'l Dutch Show. Mr. Brown was singled out for this letter due to the fact that he lives in the midst of "Operations, Junior Division", in Oklahoma. Mr. Brown replied that he was "100 % - all the way for the idea, and would support anything that the Club did at the Nat'l Dutch show for the Juniors" - and Mr. Bayliss did not wait to advise us by mail - he telephoned across the country and gave his permission to "go ahead". The Board of Directors were then polled - and consent and agreement has been received from all except one Board member (not heard from yet) - A telephone call to James Blyth for some details on the matter was made, and a hurry-up trip to Indiana to talk with Director Shufflebotham and Vice-President Nitzsche IN PERSON - as well as a number of our A. D. R. C. members on the subject. Inside of ten days we had received money, and pledges of trophies for the show.

Since the A. D. R. C. Board of Directors have approved this Junior Division show, President Bayliss has made appointments to make the show officially a part of the 1954 National Dutch Show. The Show Committee with Ray Grables in charge, was appointed to set up the rules for the show; with Madeleine Grables, A. D. R. C. Director in charge of the show.

The Show Committee met and made the rules for the 1954 Junior Division show - and they were in accord with the opinion of A. R. B. A. Youth Division Chairman, Mr. Keith Forbush, of Dearborn, Michigan - except one rule, which was modified, and now meets his approval. We hope these rules will be "workable" at least for this show - of 1954 - which will receive a "test-run" - here in Detroit. I would like to add here that these rules have resulted from suggestions of A. D. R. C. members with whom we had the opportunity to speak about the subject, and to whom we are grateful for their interest and help in the beginning of this undertaking.

Whether or not the A. D. R. C. Junior Division is here to stay depends upon how the first Junior Division A. D. R. C. Show is received by the Junior Dutch breeders themselves -- and whether or the A. D. R. C. members will support an A. D. R. C. Junior Division. The subject will be brought before the membership meeting in Detroit, and it will be given careful thought and consideration. You can rest assured if the Junior Division is accepted into the Club as a part of it, the manner will be a democratic procedure.

It is rather early to make predictions, but at present the consensus is 100% for "anything we can do for the Juniors".

A JUNIOR CATALOG NECESSARY

Since the National Dutch Show catalog was sent to press March 1st -- there was only enough time to get the rules for the Junior Division Show into it -- no specials, no enticements for the Junior Dutch breeder to get into the show ... So it is necessary to put out a second catalog --

We are unable to get a printer to accept this work on such a short notice -- and we want to give everyone an opportunity to start this FIRST Junior Division DUTCH SHOW off RIGHT -- and to put it over in our BEST DUTCH MANNER. The Kasco Mills, Inc. is printing the catalog cover, and the inside will be mimeographed. This is not as we would like it, but we believe this may be satisfactory to the Club members, inasmuch as there will be no costs involved, and all receipts from the catalog will go toward supporting the Junior Division show.

So far we have received pledges of 8 trophies for the Juniors -- and about \$65.00 in cash, including ads received. This is a good start, but we hope to double this amount before the catalog is closed.

It might be well to point out that these Junior Dutch breeders may want to know where they will be able to buy Dutch breeding stock in the future -- and your ad will not only help you in selling your stock, but it will help get a youngster started with your stock, and at the same time will support the show, and serve "notice" to the youngsters that you are for them.

This may surprise you but we have had one breeder, an A. R. B. A. Judge donate \$5.00 to the cause -- and what do you think???? He is not a Dutch breeder -- he breeds White New Zealands -- but he considers this Junior Division a "step in the right direction" -- and is for the kids. A commercial breeder has contributed \$3.00 -- another judge, one noted for his excellent Whites -- however, he does breed Dutch too -- has pledged 2 trophies -- all these facts are pointed out to give you an idea of "what others think" --

We hope you feel the same way -- and will support this show. If you do not want an ad, perhaps you will send a contribution, small or large -- what you can spare. A dollar here, and a dollar there -- and we will make up a good pot for this show.

You may prefer to donate a trophy or a cup instead of cash. If you have ever won something of this sort when you were a youngster we believe you will know how much these things mean to you, and will mean to the children who will take part in this first Junior Division show of the A. D. R. C. They are treasured all through life.

There are many items children like to win besides the usual trophy or ribbon -- and if you prefer to donate some item useful to a boy or girl in the rabbitry, or in school work, or for play at home this would be a fine gesture on your part. If you are coming to Detroit to the show, why not plan now to bring along something for the Junior Dutch breeders?? However, to make an attractive catalog, and to let the boys and girls know that these prizes await them, we should hear from you very soon. We are sorry that we did not get started on this earlier, but we will all have to get on our fastest horses and get busy right now to make any kind of a catalog that will do justice to the breed, and our A. D. R. C.

We have no way of knowing how many Junior exhibitors we will have in this show; however, any funds not used this year will be retained for future use. Will you do your part by these young Dutch breeders TODAY, and send us a letter letting us know your intentions.

SPECIAL RULES

1. The A. D. R. C. National Dutch Show, and the Junior Division Show is an all-Dutch Show, and no other breed of rabbits will be accepted.
2. Entrant must be under 18 years of age.
3. There will be no entry fee charged in the Junior Division. Since there are no entry fees there will be no pay-back on class money. Prizes will be donated by those interested in the development of the division.
4. There will be no classes for does and litters, and no classes for neut pens.
5. All awards in this division will be governed by the latest official show rules of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc.
6. Entrants in the Junior Division are encouraged to ask questions of their judge in order that they may benefit by this project.
7. If entrant is a member of such a group, then entry must be accompanied by a signed statement from a Club Leader, F. F. A. sponsor, County Agent, Local Rabbit Club, or instructor, to the effect that the entrant is a bona-fide rabbit breeder, and that all entries are the bona-fide property of the exhibitor.
8. If entrant is not a member of any organized group for young rabbit breeders, then the entry must be accompanied by a signed statement from a parent, relative, or guardian to the effect that the entrant is a bona-fide rabbit breeder, and that all entries are the bona-fide property of the exhibitor.
9. A Junior exhibitor may also enter the same rabbit in the Open Division, provided
 - a. The regular entry fee is paid;
 - b. The rabbit is entered in the same name in both Divisions.
10. Send your entry blank properly filled out to the Show Secretary, Mrs. Jessie Weinhardt; Route 3, Manchester, Michigan. Deadline postmark Midnight, April 19th. Mark clearly "Junior Division". Ship stock to Michigan State Fair Grounds, Rabbit & Poultry Bldg.; c/o General Manager, Raymond J. Grables; Detroit, Michigan, pre-paid, to arrive Thursday, April 22, 1954. Rabbits brought in must be in show room before 8:00 A. M. Eastern Standard Time, Friday April 23, 1954.

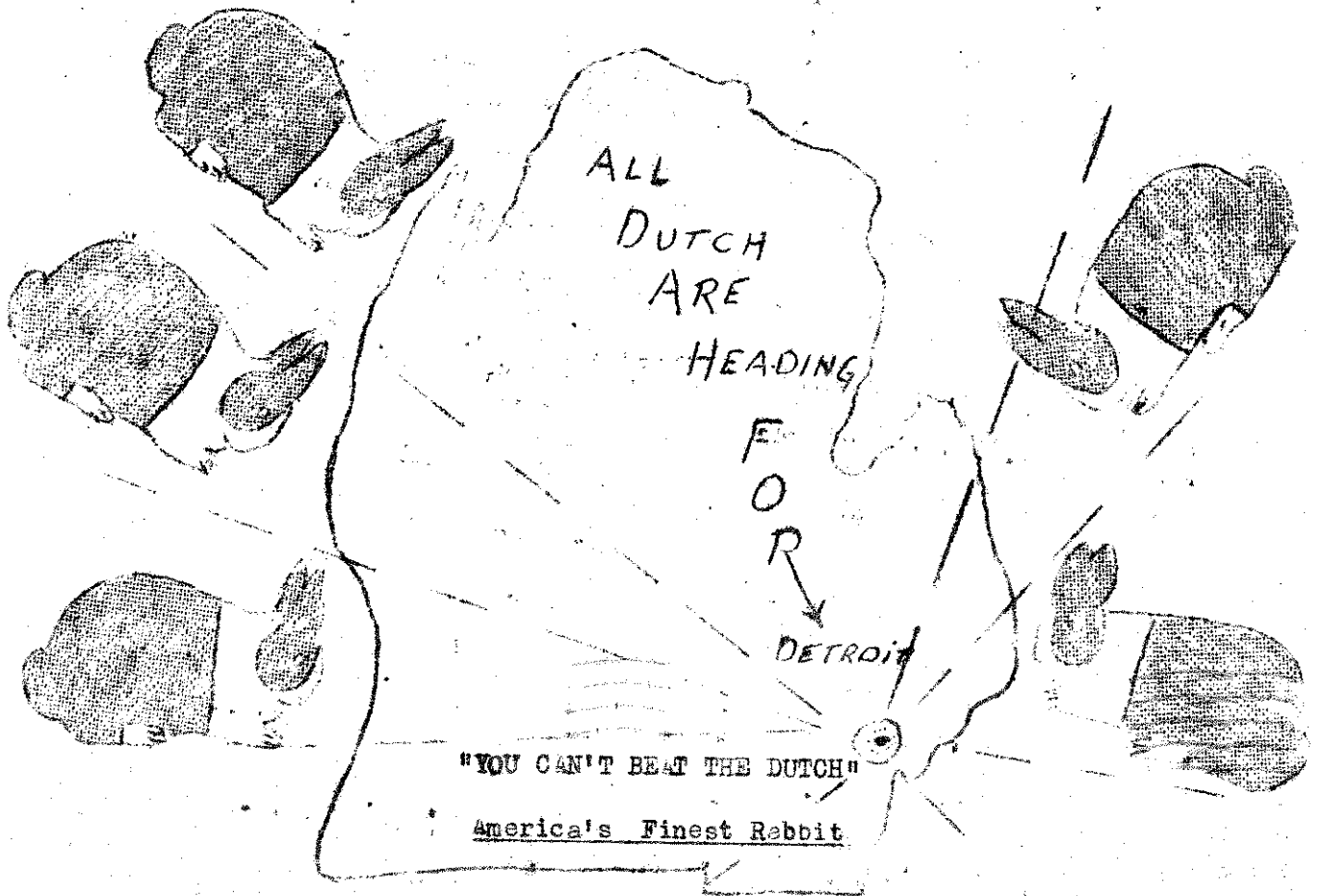

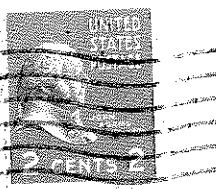
