

BREEDING STEEL DUTCH

Raymond H. Smith

(This is the second in a series of articles on the subject. If you have some knowledge on "Steel breeding", and wish to impart with some of it, your article or letter will be appreciated. The Editor.)

I have been breeding Steels for only five years, so I am still learning. But maybe what I have experienced in breeding this color may keep some other breeder from becoming disgusted in the breeding of this beautiful color. As you know, when you have secured that good Steel color, you have something to be proud of.

I think I shall have to go along with the "Old Timers", who say, "Steels are a made color." As you will see by my breeding of Steels, I had to put some blue in my Steels. Just like mixing paint, you mix a little of this color with a little of that color to get the right shade you desire. As I go along, describing my breeding of Steels, you will see what I mean.

In breeding Steels, I have one Steel doe who has had two litters of all Steel color ed offspring. This was accomplished in this way: I took my Steel buck (Beaver bloodline) and bred him to this Steel doe (Dugan bloodline). From this litter I saved a Steel buck. This buck was bred back to his mother, the Dugan doe. I have secured two litters of all Steels this way. When I breed my Beaver buck with the Dugan doe, I get mostly blacks and grays, maybe there will be one or two steels in the litter. I have other steel does that I bred to the steel bucks, but did not get any litters of 100% steel color.

On going back and looking at the pedigrees of the Beaver Steel buck, I note Mr. Beaver (the late Ancil Beaver) bred a black to a steel, or a black to a gray. Also on the Dugan does pedigree, I notice Mr. Dugan bred a black to a steel, in all three generations on the pedigree. My steels from this type of breeding were getting too dark over the back and on the ears; too much black, and lacked ticking. So from

I got the idea of trying some blue crossing. I find by using some blue I get the good slate under-color, and it also does away with the brassy color commonly found in steels. When I say "use Blue", I mean a good blue, one that is a dark slate-blue color, and I would not use a blue that has a lilac color, or is a light faded blue.

I was using my gray Dutch in breeding steels, but I found the young from the continued steel-gray cross were much too brassy in color; the brassiness showed up especially inside the hind legs and on the sides. Also, in breeding grays to steels some of the offspring will be half way between a steel color and a gray color, the kind of color very difficult to classify as steel, or gray, one you don't know just what color to show them as--always in doubt.

I breed a steel buck which has steel and black in his pedigree to a blue doe of blue color blood lines for three generations in her pedigree. In these litters I have always got 2 or 3 good colored steels; also one or two blacks and grays. Take the young does from this breeding and breed them back to the steel buck (sire) and you will get a majority of Steels in the litters, with perhaps an occasional black or a blue-gray. (Editor's note: For the benefit of our new Dutch breeders, a "Blue-gray" is a blue with agouti coat, ticked in much the same manner of the gray, the main difference being in the top color.) Use the blue-gray back to the steel. In this type of breeding for steel color, I have never had any judge remark that the steel color is "too brassy", or "too dark over the back and ears". Also, the grays from this type of breeding will be of good color, and not so brassy.

The steel doe that won Best Steel for me at the 1954 Convention in York, Pa., has been in three shows. In the three shows, she has had judges remarks, such as "Very good color". Never "brassy", or "too dark" in the remarks. She is from the steel and blue cross, and is now bred back to the steel "Beaver" buck. This is her first mating, and I can hardly wait to see what I will find in the nest box.

In using the steel and blue breeding, I find it wise to never use a blue doe that has black breeding in her pedigree. I have tried this with such a doe, by breeding her to a steel buck which also has black in his pedigree. The results--six black youngsters. I am now experimenting with these black youngsters, and am going to breed them to steels which have blue bloodlines in them, and see what I will get.

One thing I do not want a breeder of black Dutch to do, and this is to take a black from a steel (Ed.'s note: This applies to gay as well as steel) breeding and use it in his black strain. If he does, he will get white hairs galore. I found this out the hard way.

I am hoping that some day I will be able to take the steels from the steel and blue breeding and get a strain that will throw all-steel litters of good color.

FROM YOUR SECRETARY

An. S.O.S. for Dutch breeding stock was published in last month's issue of The Dutch Reporter. My thanks to those who answered this call, ALL THREE MEMBERS! This confirms the statement that Dutch breeding stock is very scarce; UNLESS some breeders are too busy to let us know that they do have stock for sale. We will again ask, or beg of you, to notify this office if you have any Dutch for sale.

There seems to be some misunderstanding regarding sanction fees. The One Day Show Sweepstake sanction fee is \$3.00 (Three Dollars), including listing. No advertising, other than the listing in the Dutch Reporter is required. The 2 or more Day Sweepstake Show sanction fee is \$2.00 (Two Dollars), and this show must be advertised

either in the Dutch Reporter, (the free listing in the Dutch Reporter on the 2 or more Day Sweepstake is NOT A QUALIFIED AD.) or the Small Stock Magazine, (or both, if preferred). Quite a few clubs have sent only \$2.00 for the One Day sanction, and of course this causes quite a bit of correspondence and book-keeping. Kindly note these correct fees, and be prepared to pass this information on to your local Show Committee.

In the future The Dutch Reporter will go to press on the 20th. of each month. All material must pass through this office, so a deadline for material in the hands of the Editor (your Secretary) is the 15th. of the month preceding issue. For example, if you have material for the July issue, then this material must reach my office by June 15th. We aim to adhere to this schedule if it is humanly possible, we hope to have posted the issues before the 1st. day of each month.

You may have noted that we are now using a "Request for Form 3547" from the local postmasters. This means that if the addressee has moved and has informed the postmaster of a new address, then the postmaster will fill in a card and mail the new address to this office, and we in turn pay our local postoffice a sum of two cents for this information. This insures those who do not notify this office that they have moved, (or have a new Post Office Box Number) of their current Dutch Reporters. However, we thank those members who DO notify us of their new addresses. We ask you to PLEASE NOTIFY THIS OFFICE if you are planning to move, or change your address. Our Dutch Reporter address labels are made up in advance, and your notice will assure your receiving the bulletin without delay. We will appreciate your effort in saving us some time, as well as the fee for the form being returned by the Postmasters.

Several of our members have written to this office to express their appreciation of the Dutch Reporter. Of course, we are pleased IF we are pleasing our members..... WE, in this case means Mrs. Weinhardt who publishes The Dutch Reporter, and me, MTG. Some say they do not wish to miss a single issue, and this is very gratifying to say the least. IMPORTANT, please note: we are sorry that we cannot furnish back issues. We have had requests for back issues from some of our members who forgot to pay their dues on time, and consequently THEIR Dutch Reporter was not printed. This leads to disappointment in many cases. To insure your copy of being printed, please RENEW your membership early, or on time. Your membership expiration date is printed on the address label of your Dutch Reporter, and we send expiration notices only once every quarter. So will you please note this date of expiration, and renew a bit early, if possible. (Publisher's Note: Your last issue is stamped "Your Membership Expired last Month". If this appears on your copy, you will get no more until your dues are renewed.)

We are sorry our "new look" Dutch Reporter is not available for this issue. We hope the material will be ready for the next issue. We are anxious for this.

Be sure to invite those who are not members of our Club to join us in promoting the Dutch rabbit. There are quite a few exhibitors who do not hold membership cards. Membership application forms will be mailed to you upon your requests.

Watch for your ballot for Judges for the American Rabbit Breeders Association CONVENTION Show, which will be held in October at Columbus, Ohio. These ballots will be mailed soon, First Class. I sincerely hope you will vote in this election. Mail your ballot just as soon as you possibly can. Ballots laid aside are often forgotten until it is too late to vote. Let's get a big vote out in this election.

WORKING STANDARD FOR GOLD DUTCH

A uniform, medium gold color running deep toward skin with a rich, cream under-color next to skin. Free from white hairs, mealiness, dark smut or smudge in cheeks, sides, saddle, loin and hips. Belly color should be ddp, rich cream with a shading on inside of back legs. Color is to be otherwise uniform throughout. Avoid a light, pale color or one which is too dark, and avoid a white undercolor. (Ed's. note: you will observe that no eye color was given in this working Standard; however, it has been assumed that the correct eye color is hazel.)

Several breeders have asked for a copy of this working standard. I have a catalog of one show which has Specials for Gold Dutch. According to the rules of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, the judge must be furnished a copy of a working standard whenever a breed on a working standard is presented to him for judging. So, if you are attending such a show, please make a copy available for the judge. MTG.

MORE ABOUT GOLDS

The Gold Dutch working Standard was first presented at the 1953 National Dutch Show held in Abilene, Texas. They were showed for the first time under the Working Standard at the 1953 A.R.B.A. Convention show in Amarillo, Texas, and made their second showing at the 1954 A.R.B.A. Convention show in York, Pennsylvania. According to the A.R.B.A. rules for "Admitting New Breeds To Our Standards", page 283 of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Official Guide Book, the Gold Dutch must be exhibited at no more than three Convention Shows under the Working Standard (total of three Convention Shows under the Working Standard); then, if the Standard Committee of the A.R.B.A. finds the new breed (variety, in this case) worthy of being recognized, and improvement has been made since the first time shown under the Working Standard, the breed (or variety) will then be admitted to the Standards.

Several have inquired whether or not the Gold Dutch can compete for Sweepstakes points. The answer is "No, the Gold is not eligible to compete for Sweepstakes points (or 'specials covered by the A.R.B.A. Standard of Perfection')". (Reference: page 274 Section 24, ARTICLE IX of the A.R.B.A. Official Guide Book.) I must admit that the last part of this ruling is not quite clear to me, so I hope to get this clause clarified for my own information, and will pass this on to those who may be my level (if there are any) on this interpretation.

According to the A.R.B.A. (ARTICLE IX, Section 26, page 274 of the A.R.B.A. Guide Book) Breeds, or Varieties on a Working Standard cannot be registered until admitted to the Standards of Perfection. In reply to those who are interested in this subject the Gold Dutch cannot be registered as of now; if, and when, the variety is admitted to the Standards, then of course it will be eligible for registry, under conditions the same as other varieties of Dutch. 
