



I have never before in over 30-years of breeding rabbits experienced the difficulty of getting does to kindle that I have this past winter! It apparently has been a general trend, as I have received many letters the past few months complaining of the same trouble; either the does will not accept service or, fail to kindle when they do. I have no explanation for this, other than the fact that in my locality we have had a rather severe winter with the temperature changing often and quite rapidly. In some cases as much as 25-degrees in 12 hours. This I am inclined to believe has been a contributing factor in the failure of so many does to settle this past winter. However the worst is over now, we hope, and I think the month of April will find most of us with some nice litters of DUTCH in the nests. From these early spring litters many of the DUTCH that will appear at the early Fall and Winter Sweepstakes shows will come. As I have stated above it has been rather tough getting litters and now we must prepare to nurse them through the hot months ahead so that we can bring the youngsters out in the Fall in the pink of condition. It appears we have a constant battle against the elements with our rabbits, be they DUTCH or any other breed; but, being devoted to this fine little animal, the disappointments which we experience in the course of a years breeding operations are overshadowed and completely forgotten when we hear the Judge read one of our entries' ear number and remark--BEST DUTCH.

It appears from the many recent requests received by our secretary for Dutch sweepstakes sanctions that there are still a great number of show secretaries who are not familiar with our latest revised rules. For the benefit of those people the following will be helpful: The sanction fee is \$5.00. This should be sent to our Sec'y, Mrs. R. J. Grables; 2545 Massena—Union Lake, Pontiac, Michigan along with the show secretary's name and address, place and date show is to be held and the name of the sponsoring club. This information must be in our secretary's hands at least 60-days prior to the opening date of your show. We now award member winners a rosette for Best Dutch and Best Opposite Dutch and a Special ribbon for each Best of six varieties, members dues MUST be paid up at the time of the show, in order to be eligible for these awards. These rosettes and ribbons are given regardless of the number shown in each variety or the total number of entries of the breed. Complete

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

FROM YOUR SECRETARY

Every once in a while a novice exhibitor of Dutch will approach me in the show room, or write me a letter, and ask for an explanation of the Standards in regards to weights of Dutch rabbits. Some of these things are taken for granted by the experienced showman, and too often, I believe, some of us lose sight of the fact that we ever were once a beginner. Therefore, I believe it worth while to explain what is meant by Ideal Weight, as this invariably enters the subject.

"Ideal Weight" simply means what it says. The weight of all senior Dutch should BE four and one-half ($4\frac{1}{2}$) pounds. We do not always get everything we want. Therefore, there is a lee-way of one pound under and one pound over the Ideal Weight, for the SENIOR Dutch weights. The senior Dutch (those over six months of age) must weigh at least three and one-half ($3\frac{1}{2}$) pounds, and must weigh not over five and one-half ($5\frac{1}{2}$) pounds in order to meet requirements of A.R.B.A. registration, and the standards of weights in the show room. All Senior Dutch in the show room that weigh under $3\frac{1}{2}$ pounds or over $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds are "eliminated" from further competition in THAT show, this also applies to Junior Dutch over $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds. The judge will give the remarks to the Secretary to write on the eliminated rabbit's coop card, then the rabbit is sent back to his coop. He receives no class money, and is NOT PLACED (first, second, ninth, or whatever the place might have been had he had the proper weight). Note that the only weight requirement for Junior Dutch is the top weight limit of $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds. (This is NOT impossible. I have seen Junior Dutch eliminated for being overweight in the shows.) There is no minimum weight for JUNIOR Dutch.

It may be possible for the exhibitor to increase or lower the body weight of an "eliminated, due to over/under weight" Dutch for a future show. This is perfectly legitimate, and is just what should be done, if the structure of the animal's body permits this.

The only time "Ideal Weight" should enter the picture on the judging table is in case the rabbit being judged are very close in respect to one another in color, type, condition, fur condition and markings. Those that deviate from the Ideal Weight of $4\frac{1}{2}$ pounds are cut, or should be cut, (penalized) for this deviation. The Ideal Weight is given in order that the breeders may have some exact weight to try to reach, at least aim at, in the breeding program. Ideal Weight, again, naturally applies only to matured (over six months of age) rabbits.

Summary: Weight - Senior Bucks and Does (over 6 months of age), $3\frac{1}{2}$ - $5\frac{1}{2}$ pounds.

Junior Bucks and Does (under 6 months of age), not over $5\frac{1}{2}$ lbs.

Ideal Weight (senior Dutch), $4\frac{1}{2}$ pounds.

AGAIN, may I state that RABBITS ON WORKING STANDARD ARE INELIGIBLE TO COMPETE FOR BEST DUTCH; BEST OPPOSITE DUTCH; BEST SENIOR; or JUNIOR DUTCH; BEST OF anything of the breed as a whole. It cannot be brought up to the judges table in competition with a rabbit that has an ACCEPTED Standard. We have one variety of Dutch, the Gold Dutch, that is still on a working Standard. The Gold Dutch was exhibited at the 1955 ARBA Convention in Columbus, Ohio for the THIRD time, and the ARBA Standard Committee felt that this variety had not improved sufficiently to admit it to the Standards of Perfection. This Committee COULD HAVE, according to the rules, refused to have allowed a continuation of the WORKING STANDARD on the Gold Dutch. However, out of their consideration for those breeders who have worked with and are still working with this color, the Working Standard was continued. They have given these breeders 4 years, instead of the usual 3 years, to make good, due to the difficulties of breeding in the markings of the Dutch, etc.

I have one Show Report that states a Gold Dutch was placed Best Opposite Dutch in the show. This is not judging, or conducting the show according to the Rules of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, my friends.

Also note, that a rabbit on a working standard cannot be registered, and it is not

entitled to a leg on a Grand Champion certificate.

We are again, printing the names and addresses of the A.D.R.C. Committeemen. Our Dutch Reporter will carry the names and addresses of only the CHAIRMEN of the various Committees in the future. Kindly address your inquiries on subjects pertaining to Committee work to the CHAIRMAN of that committee. This will save much time and effort in obtaining needed information.

All Committees are important, of course. However, we have a new Committee set up, called the Education Committee, and if their services are used we believe we may be able to help clear up some questions. This Committee will provide answers to your breeding problems, or answer any question as nearly as is possible, to any subject connected with breeding Dutch, and exhibiting Dutch. Any question you have, and for which an answer cannot be found in the Guide Book, write to the Chairman of this Committee, Mr. Tom Shufflebotham, Box 257, Valparaiso, Indiana. Mr. Shufflebotham will reply, and he will also set up a "question and answer" page out of your letters. Your name will not be printed. We do not intend to embarrass anyone. Any questions regarding the Standards should be sent to Mr. E. C. Bickley; 1019 Perry St., Sandusky, Ohio. Questions improperly routed will be re-routed by the Chairmen of these Committees. Write direct, and save time.

According to some published articles the Dutch-men are causing a little concern to those breeding the breed that is leading in number of registrations in the ARBAThat is, we Dutchmen consider ourselves as having exhibited the most rabbits in any ONE breed at the 1955 ARBA Convention, and the breeders-of-the-other-breed, or breeds believe that they exhibited the largest entry of one breed. The question is: if THEY have ONE breed, then why don't they judge Best of Breed between two colors, instead of Best of Breed in each color????? Can anyone enlighten us????? Don't get any wrong ideas, now. This is just plain rivalry, and friendly rivalry; however, it is not too early to start your plans for exhibiting your Dutch at the 1956 ARBA Convention IN FULL FORCE. Our scalps will be SOUGHT, and you can bet on that!

Our membership elected Judges "Jerry" Leisenring, Don Guthrie, and Tom Shufflebotham, in this order to judge the Dutch at this show. These are our "three-high" judges. All three have confirmed their availability for the Judging. Will keep you informed on this assignment. Two judges have been employed for judging Dutch for several years now, at past ARBA Convention shows and the Convention sponsors have complied with our wishes for our judges. I would like to point out that the Convention sponsors are not required to do this; however, they do wish to grant the desires of the Specialty Clubs whenever it is at all possible, and I am sure that our 1956 sponsors will be no exception. This year's Convention will be a shorter-than-usual session: This will mean that all business will be accelerated, and some of us may spin right off the earth if we speed up very much.

FOR GOODNESS SAKE, watch out for that first warm day that is bound to come. Be prepared for the worst. Have a cool spot picked out in advance in case your rabbits, usually your best doe that is due to kindle, become over-heated. A shady, damp spot on the north side of a building is OK; or a cement floor is good. I do not like to "dun" my over-heated rabbits in cold water, and do this only as a last resort. I feel the shock is too great. However, what works for you, may not work for me. I saved two does due to kindle after on had squeled, and both were bleeding at the nose, by placing them on the floor (cement) of my utility room. I wrapped a towel-full of ice cubes around each of their heads and throats--and leaned them against the wall so they were resting on their stomachs, with their front feet stretched out in front of them. One kindled late that evening, and both does saved their litters. Watch out for colds (however, I never saw this happen in Dutch, but it does happen often in other breeds) about 3 to 5 days later, after over-heating. Remove some, or all of the nest box material, straw and fur, from the bunnies in the day time, and replace it at night in regions where the temperature drops at night. Provide complete nest-box ventilation also, by drilling holes, or spacing the bottom boards apart a trifle. (Not more than a trifle, or you will have another problem - the

bunnies feet will go through, and get caught.) Provide plenty of fresh, cool water, and feed on the light-side. Apple, plum, and willow twigs and small limbs are relished by rabbits. Take it easy on feeding fresh green leaves and weeds, however. If you wish to feed dandelions, or other weeds, be very careful. If in doubt, DON'T feed them. ONE dandelion leaf is enough to start out with. If you have never fed greens to your rabbits, and want to experiment, I suggest you experiment with some old stock that you will not regret losing. Watch it, very carefully.

Your Secretary was recently apprehended in a show room and advised that the contents between the back and front covers of your Dutch Reporter exude and objectionable odor. To which your Secretary agreed--AFTER A FASHION, and also pointed out that it would be entirely un-lady-like, and unethical for the Editor to tote a "persuader" to flourish at those capable of furnishing "reading material" or articles "with teeth in them". So, will someone please take me "off the hook"?????? Your articles WILL BE appreciated.
