

How about sitting down with a pencil and paper and recording some of your thoughts or experiences that you might like to share with the rest of us? There is at least one person that will be deeply grateful for your efforts.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all of those who are responsible for the show reports coming through so much more promptly and with so few errors in them, lately. Now if we could just get our show secretaries educated to sending me catalogs a lot of my extra work would be eliminated. Also if each of you will bear in mind, and remind others of the raise in our dues, so that new and renewal members would send me the correct amount for membership fees, a lot of work would be saved. I hate to keep harping on these subjects and I don't want anyone to think that I don't like working for our fine club, but the less of these routine (and unnecessary) things I have to devote my time to, the more time I have to do constructive things for the betterment of our club.

There is one little point to which I have given a great deal of thought lately. When we first started raising rabbits some twenty years ago, the American Checkered Giant Club boasted a membership roster of over one thousand. Now, at that time there weren't even a fraction of the number of Checkered Giants being shown in the shows that there are Dutch being shown at this time. I can't see why, with a little more "push" on the part of our present membership, we can't break that record all to pieces. I think one reason we haven't done this long ago is reflected in a remark I have heard a good many times, when speaking of a breeder who has been showing quite consistantly, I say, "It's too bad he isn't a member of our Club." The person to whom I am speaking says, "Why, I thought he was a member. He sure has been doing a lot of showing."

Perhaps the reason he doesn't belong is because he has never been asked to join. Don't take anyone for granted. When you read through your show report, or some show report in your area, check through and see just whose name does NOT appear at the end of the report with a total of sweepstake points. If his name is not there, he is not a member, and that is your invitation to extend to that breeder an invitation to join the ranks of the boosters of our FINE DUTCH PARFIT.

I don't know how many of our members happened to see the small item in our National Magazines for this month, telling of the stark tragedy that struck the home of our dear friends, the Clinton Dennis' last month. Their little six year old daughter Kathy, was fatally burned on February 13th. We read of such things in our papers nearly every day and we think "Oh, how terrible." and go on to something else. Then suddenly we find these things CAN and DO happen to those we know and respect and suddenly it is a different story, the fact strikes home that these aren't just words in a newspaper, but human hearts are aching and there is reflected pain in our own chests because we know these people and share their sorrow. I feel sure that each and every member of the American Dutch Rabbit Club will follow me in extending deepest sympathy to this fine couple in what I know is their darkest hour. My personal prayer for them is that the sun may shine for them again, and that the memories that are now so painful, turn to sweetest blessings in the future.
