YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

#### DUTCH FUROR

Last fall, on my vacation trip to Florida, one of the rabbit breeders whom I visited was James D. Collins of Bradenton, Florida. Jim is a tall, genial fellow, an old Bostonian and retired Army officer, who raised cattle in West Virginia for 10 years before coming to Florida. Now he raises Dutch rabbits. His rabbitry, as I saw it, was a small backyard set-up (similar to mine) and his hutches were out near the back fence and were surrounded by bananna and other quick-growing plants which served both as a screen and as a shade for the hutches. From the street you'd never know rabbits were anywhere near the modern home in a tropical setting! The rabbits were Chocolate Dutch, some of which were nice enough for any show in the country. As they were used primarily for the raising of meat, they were on the large size near top registration weight. Still, they were good-looking Dutch, both in type and color.

Mr. Collins said that their club was composed mostly of retired people who had taken up rabbit raising to supplement their income. He said that Dutch rabbits were ideal for Florida, not only because they could be raised better than larger breeds, but because nowadays many people, there, were living in trailers and didn't have available cold storage space for large amounts of food. Thus a small rabbit could be

purchased for meat and used up at once.

At the time of my visit to Mr. Collins' it was just before their fall show, and as Show Secretary, he was very perturbed over the A.R.B.A. rules relative to the judging of meat pen classes. He had no objection to the A.R.B.A. general disqualifications (which apply to all breeds) but did object to color and marking disqualifications which apply only to Dutch. He said their meat pens were meat rabbits which were healthy in every way, but had marking disqualifications such as runs, split stops, tied front legs, etc., which in no way hindered their use as food, and should be used in meat pens and judged for "just that". He says that this is one rule that should be amended.


