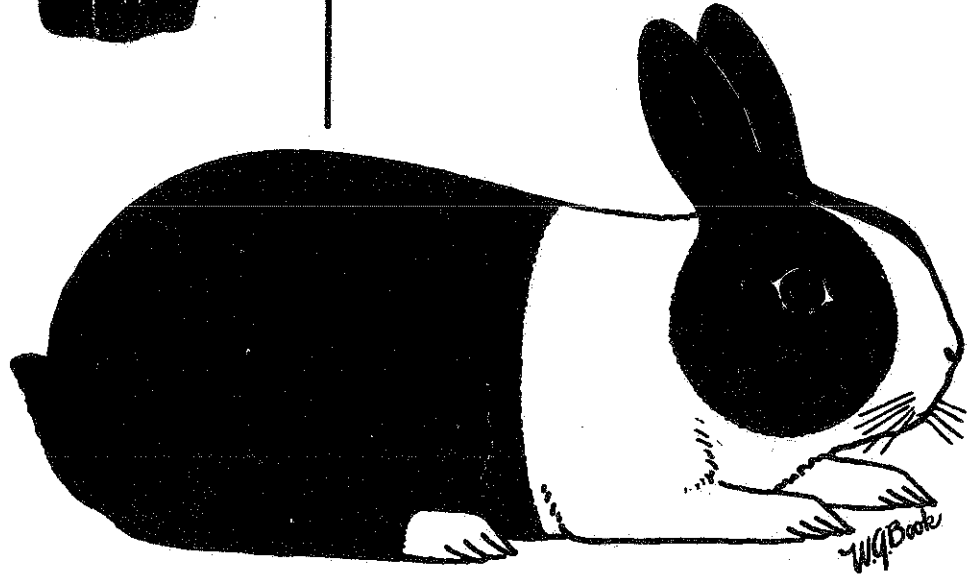
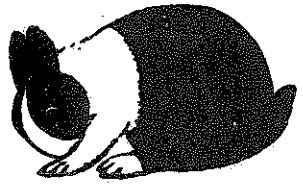

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

HOW LONG MUST THIS GO ON?

One of the most controversial subjects of Dutch breeding has been our Gray Dutch standard as it now is written. It is both confusing to breeders and judges. Quoting the standard under Grays: "suaqualifications: undercut showing on surface of belly-color" -- (description of saddle and undercut) -- "the saddle is the point where the white ceases and the color begins, on the upper part of the body. The division should be just behind the shoulders and form a perfect circle around the body with the undercut. The undercut naturally refers to the underpart of the body. This is a continuation of the saddle markings, and it should be in an unbroken line right close behind the fore legs but not touching them."

I have been in opposition to the standard as it is now written and if judges follow it literally they must eliminate the Grays which show an undercut. This is in direct negation to that part of our standard which describes the undercut (to quote) "the undercut is a continuation of the saddle". Hence, if you have no undercut you have not a complete saddle.

The American Dutch Club committee on standards, composed of men with more than a century of combined service as judges, breeders and exhibitors, presented to the meeting in Colorado Springs their recommendations that Grays not be disqualified or eliminated should their undercut be showing. This was accepted by the membership. This recommendation was brought to the ARBA standard committee and it was their decision that such a change could not be made until the revision of all breed standards in 1965. Perhaps some of the blame can be laid at our own door by the failure of the ADC committee to bring it to the attention of the ARBA before the 1960 revisions.

This action of course, means that we must wait for another three years for this change to be made. It does seem ridiculous that we should have to breed, exhibit and judge the Grays by the present standards -- which neither judges nor breeders wish.

It does seem to me that the American should be only too willing to lend a receptive ear to the standard committees of the various specialty club recommendations, and to act on them NOW when it is obvious that something should be done. It seems that we must fool around for three years with a sick baby and do nothing about it. Is this what we call progress?

NEW GUIDE BOOK

When Colonel John Glenn was put into orbit it took years of planning to get his capsule off the ground.

At Harper, Iowa, it was decided that we would put out a special edition of Small

Stock and a new guide book. It is easy to make resolutions and pass on them -- getting the job done takes lots of hard work and planning. The special edition of Small Stock is now a reality and almost every one will admit that it is a very worthy one, too.

Now we come to the Guide Book, which is at present "on the board" stages. The guide book committee has been appointed with myself to serve as chairman. This is a tremendous task -- much larger than the production of a special edition. It takes quite a lot of money to get these books off the press and into the hands of our membership. Of course the stumbling block is always the financial end as all of it must be raised either by subscription or advertising. I know that it puts quite a strain on a good many of our members as we have to be begging them constantly for funds. Last year it was for ads in the special edition and at present it is for ads and specials for the National Dutch show. I trust that as many of you as possible are supporting this, for it is your show and the sponsors have much hard work to do before the judges start looking them over on the tables. I feel that this project should be finished before we undertake another one.

I also feel that it will take nearly a year before we can get the guide book in the hands of the membership. The cost of the last edition was close to \$1,000. If we are to have a better book, with the rising cost of labor and materials, we must plan on raising at least \$1,250. Should you have any plans on how to help finance this project send them to me.

Any suggestions for the book or its production will be welcomed. Some have already reached me and they are appreciated. My committee will soon be at work and it is my earnest hope that you will give them your whole-hearted support. Remember our motto, "You can't beat the Dutch!" Being another Milton Berle I am adding this, "You expect more from the Dutch and you get it."

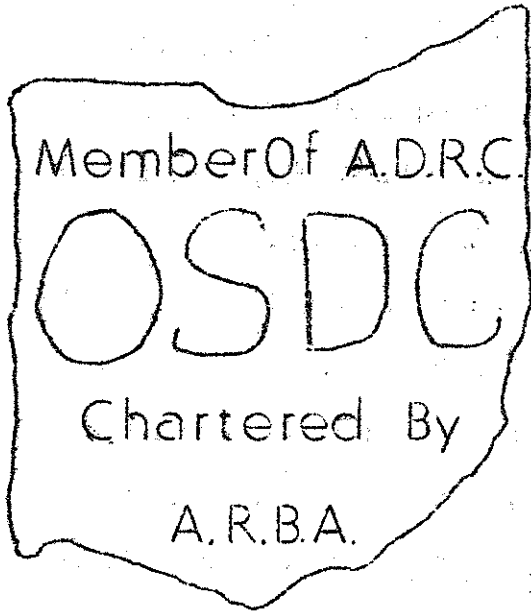

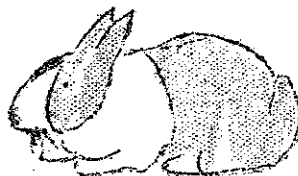
