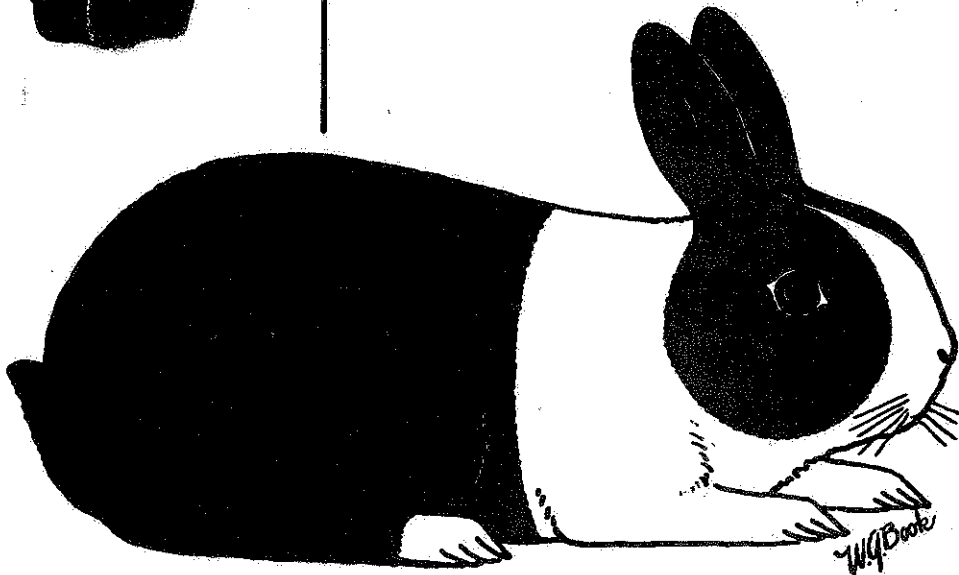

THE WORLD'S GREATEST SHOW RABBIT

I've just had the most frightening experience that ever befell any young, handsome Black Dutch buck. I haven't completely recovered from this nerve wracking event so I hope that you will bear with me as I relate my tale.

It all happened last week-end when my old buddy, who sometimes brings my feed and water and sometimes cleans my living quarters when he has nothing else to do, upset my uneventful existence and caused me much unneeded pain and worry. If I had only been told where we were going and the reasons I would probably have thought it a little ridiculous but at least I would have better understood the situation. I should have been aware that something was amiss because of the special care and consideration that my fellow inmates and I had been afforded the past few weeks.

Last Saturday morning about 4 a.m. I awoke to find my old buddy putting a group of my relatives and friends into small wire cages. I was shocked when I was put in a similar cage and along with my friends, loaded into a deal on wheels and took off early in the morning with bright lights streaming from it's eyes that pierced the darkness and enabled my old buddy to guide the contraption toward its unknown destination.

After hours of darting in and out among similar contraptions we finally arrived at a large building and I was greatly surprised to see many others who must have undergone the same harrowing experience. My old buddy carried us into the building and we were placed under rows of wire rooms to ponder our fate. After a couple of hours in deep thought it finally dawned on me that I was a very sick boy and my old buddy was alright because he had taken me to a hospital. I was certain it was a hospital because we were surrounded by men and women in white coats who were consulting with each other as they looked from one patient to another. There was no doubt in my mind that these people were qualified doctors and nurses.

As I looked across the corridor I noticed a card which bore my ear number and it made me wonder when the nurse would show me to my private room. Instead of a nurse, my old buddy came for me and I was astounded to find that he was also a medical man.

Upon entering my quarters I was pleasantly surprised to learn that my problem couldn't be excessive weight as I was amply supplied with food and water.

After endless hours of waiting a group of internes carried a number of the patients to what I supposed was an operating table. The patients were placed in small indivi-

dual rooms on the table and the doctors and nurses crowded around to watch what I guessed would be a mass operation. Sure enough the surgeon put in his appearance behind the table for the operation. Instead of an operation I found that the surgeon had only a physical examination in mind and they proceeded to examine the patients teeth, ears, legs, etc. Everyone present was very concerned with his findings as two nurses sat at a table and kept a written record of everything said by the surgeon.

Finally all the patients passed the examination with the exception of one old fellow who was evidently being held for further observation as he was placed in a room on the main floor away from the others. This procedure was repeated with a group of feminine patients and one of these was detained. At last I was taken to the table with a group of young bucks and after much deliberation, I ended up by being placed in a room by the others. Other sessions followed including a group of young Black does, followed by groups in several different colors and each time one patient was detained. Finally all of us being held for further observation were placed on the table.

It was at this time that I discovered that I was at what they called a rabbit show and I could overhear remarks as to which of us was the Best Dutch. I found that these imposters who led me to believe that they were in the medical profession were called exhibitors and they didn't know too much about us rabbits or they could have easily seen that I was the Top Rabbit. The fellow that I took to be a surgeon was really a rabbit judge and he finally told everyone that I was Best of Breed.

If I had understood at the beginning what the deal was I could have saved these people all the trouble of having a show because I, Paradise Seven, have always known that I was the best.

I won't be surprised if all these exhibitors, plus new addicts, continue to have these shows just to try to find out who is the second best rabbit in the world.

SECRETAR'S CHIT-CHAT

Well, old man winter is still hanging on -- it is snowing here again today and after the way we got clobbered last week, I don't believe I'd really care if I never saw another snowflake. We were only snowed in for two days, but believe me the sight of that old snow plow chugging down the road was a mighty welcome sight.

Not much new going on so thought this would be a good time for reminiscing, especially since my good friend, Russ Hall has sent me a whole envelope full of ancient history as evidenced by clippings taken from old Small Stock Magazines.

Russ mentions in his accompanying note, "In the Dec. 1944 issue, I note that that was the time (the first time) that a minimum weight was voted on for Dutch." I will quote from the column of R. L. Souers, the Secretary of ADRC, in notes on that year's National Dutch Show (no mention as to where it was held, and the official records of the club in my possession only go back to 1950) as follows: "The Dutch club meeting on Saturday evening had the largest attendance of any meeting ever held in the history of the club. Several questions of importance were taken up, some were acted upon at that meeting----. One of these is the question of a minimum weight on Dutch." "Our Club bulletin which we have talked about will be a reality by the first of the year. Now we want a name for this bulletin, so how about sending in your suggestions for a name." In a clipping from the January, 1945 Small Stock, Mr. Souers again refers to the Bulletin thus, "The first issue of the Dutch Club bulletin will be out some time this month and we will try and put one out each month, this will depend a lot on the support we receive from you." It would be interesting to know who the member was who came up with the name, "Dutch Reporter". Any of you "Old Timers" happen to have this information?

In Mr. Souer's article for Nov. 1943 he states, "The Dutch club has reached the 100 mark in memberships, in fact we have passed it. At the present writing we have 103 members from 23 states and Canada. Ohio leads with 22. Indiana a close second with 20 and Missouri and New York tied with 11 each. This is an increase of 63 members since April 1. A few comparative figures might be of interest at this point. Our membership now totals 485 with Ohio STILL leading with a total of 81. Indiana is still second with 42 members. New York is again in a tie for third place, having the

the same number of members as Michigan -- both 37. We now have members in 35 states, Canada and England.

In March 1944 Mr. Souers wonders, "Do you think we are big enough to put on an all Dutch show and if so, where and when?" In this same article he also says, "At the present time the Chocolates are more in demand than any other color, just why this is I cannot say, but I do know one thing; you Chocolate breeders are going to have to start producing if you ever expect to fill the demand." This is just as true today as it was 20 years ago. More than half the inquiries I have for breeding stock is for Chocolates and I have reached the point at which I no longer know where to tell prospective customers to look for such stock -- if any of you have good chocolates to sell, why don't you advertise them, and then ANSWER LETTERS WHEN YOU RECEIVE INQUIRIES!

Another question that comes to me occasionally is "Where can I get red-white-blue registered Dutch?" I know Mr. Zimmerley of Pennsylvania advertises that he has such stock in Tortoise, but I do not know of anyone else who maintains such a herd in any color. If you have it -- ADVERTISE.

I have recently received a copy of a letter from Vern Ashton, Chairman of the Standards Committee to Don Reid, Chairman of our Standard Committee as follows: "Just heard from the last member of the A.R.B.A. Standard Committee on the Dutch Standard.

"All members have voted 100% that the Brown Gray Dutch is a New Variety and must be shown as per our rules admitting New Breeds or Varieties to the ARBA Standard. You will find the rules on page 12 of our Standard."

I am hoping to have an article in a forthcoming Dutch Reporter explaining in detail, just what this "Working Standard" is and how it will effect all Gray Dutch.

DOUBLE R YOUTH RABBIT CLUB

We decided on the name, "The Double R Youth Rabbit Club." We elected the following officers: Jerry Schroeder, President; Dorcey Gable, Vice President; Rena Gable, Secretary and Glen Smith Treasurer.

A constitution was written and agreed upon. It was decided to have the meetings on the first Saturday in every month at 2:00 p.m. in the basement of Sterling Library.

As a fund raising project it was decided to sell ball point pens. First prize for selling the most pens was a pair of rabbits from our sponsor, Walter Mantz. Second prize was a pair of Dutch rabbits donated by Walter Schroeder. At the January meeting the winners were announced. 1st. Steve LeClerc, 2nd. Jerry Schroeder and 3rd. Rena Gable.

There were some designs submitted for our shoulder patches and it was decided that we would vote for the patches at the next meeting.

The program was given by Rena Gable. She gave a talk on the Black Silver Marten. Mr. Walt Schroeder of Bunny Acres at Hutchinson brought a Chocolate Dutch (buck) to the meeting. Each member put their name in a box and there was a drawing for this

rabbit. It was won by Eileen Misner. Slides were shown by Mrs. Gable of the Rice County 4-H fair and the State Shows at Ft. Scott and Topeka. Pictures of the ARBA National Show were shown by Mrs. Mantz.

On January 10 the officers of our club attended the Kansas State Rabbit Club Ass'n. meeting in Emporia, Kansas. Rena Gable, secretary, gave a short talk on the purpose of our club. The State Association voted to accept the club as a member. The Double R Rabbit Club is the first youth rabbit club in Kansas.

At the February meeting, the club agreed upon a patch design for our club. Three delegates were elected to go to the Kansas State Rabbit Breeders Ass'n. meetings. Jerry Schroeder - 3 yr. term, Dorsey Gable, 2 yr. term and Rena Gable, 1 yr term. Jerr Schroeder was elected show superintendent of the Youth Department for the Salt City Rabbit Club show on April 24.

The program was given by C. L. Gable. He gave a talk on the Champagne D'Argent rabbit.

Anyone wishing to join should contact Eileen Misner, 436 So. 6th., Sterling, Kansas, or Jerry Schroeder, 2808 N. Lorraine St., Hutchinson, Kansas. This club is open to anyone between the ages of 9-18 years. The dues are \$2.00 per year.

(Editor's Note: Although the above report may not prove of great interest to the majority of the adult members of the ADRC, we do have an ever increasing number of young breeders coming into the club and inasmuch as Eileen's report was so full of so many good ideas which could indirectly benefit this organization, I felt it well worth the space given to it.
