

MORE ABOUT TYPE

by Art Armon I have been meening to write you for some time regarding your article in the September Dutch Reporter concerning Chocolate Dutch.

T certainly agree with you that all varieties of Dutch should have the same type as the Blacks and Blues, as you stated in your article.

There are some rather nice specimens of Chocolate Dutch bred here in California. My friend Robert Ellett, of Norco, California raises quite a few nice ones. I mention Mr. Ellett, as his show record with Chocolates readily backs up my statement. However from what I have observed the Tortoise, Steels and Grays are the poorest in type out here. Generally speaking the Torts just don't begin to compare with the Blacks and Blues. For the most part they seem to have longer heads or overly large ones and their bodies appear overly large in comparrison to the Blacks and Blues. This is also more or less true of quite a number of the Steels and Grays shown.

I am personally trying to breed some Torts that will conform to the fine Blacks and Blues that are being bred. This means of course that I must cross my better black or Blue bucks with the Tort does to come up with better typed Torts and then breed the Tort offspring until the desired type is fixed in the stock. Of course this cannot be accomplished overnight, but my progress so far is encouraging.

I happen to be the type of person that gets a greater pleasure out of breeding outstanding stock than in showing, although I do occasionally show and I am not disappoint ed in the results.

I also enjoy the letters received from other breeders that tell me of their wins wit the stock I sold them.

I always promptly answer any letters of inquirey and include a pedigree at the time of shipment. I am happy to say that I never lack for buyers of my stock and get many repeat orders. I have an outlet for all my mis-marked or poorer quality rabbits. I only ship to breeders the better quality rabbits and price them according to their individual quality. I feel that any rabbit breeder that will be fair in their dealings

will not have to worry about selling their stock.

The most important thing a breeder can do to produce fine stock of any kind is to buy the best that can be found. In the case of Dutch rabbits, I would look for type, color and markings. I would advise any new breeder to buy breeding stock that was as close to the Standard as possible. Type would be most important as a Dutch without type is not a good Dutch regardless of its color or markings, and regardless of whether it wins in a show or not. Color is very important, as good color contributes to the over-all appearance of the Dutch rabbit. Poor or faded color makes a very poor impression and remember, color is an inherited factor and good or bad, it is passed on to the next generation. Markings are essential to a Dutch rabbit, for without good markings a Dutch is nothing. I cannot agree with those breeders that use a poor marked speciman for breeding just because they came out of a pair of well marked Dutch parents, as the pattern of markings are not all inherited equally in a litter. It is my opinion based on a good many years of animal and bird breeding that one should only use good specimens for breeding to produce better or equal offspring. Naturally there are exceptions to this, but by and large like will produce like. In the case of show rabbits a large buck bred to a small doe or a small buck to a larger doe seems to work quite well, however all the rabbits should be within the Standard weights. The does need to by nice and typey just as the buck does, however by their very feminine nature, a doe is a little more fine in type. Any mean tempered stock should be eliminated, as temperment too, is an inherited factor, and certainly no one cares to work with ill tempered stock.

My own particular strain of Dutch rabbits is based on the fine Paradise strain of Judge Don Lovejoy and the real backbone of the herd is a very fine blue Grand Champion buck that I purchased from Don. He did not come cheap, but he has been worth all I paid for him and more, as he has the ability to produce outstanding young. I might

mention that plue is my favorite color.

Despite the fact that I attend only a few shows during the year, I have met and become friendly with a good many of the really fine rabbit breeders and I sincerely enjoy talking with them and corresponding with others, just as I enjoy reading the Dutch Reporter and some of the other fine rabbit magazines.

I have belonged to many breeders organizations through the years, but I must say, I enjoy the American Dutch Rabbit Club best of all and take pride in calling myself "The Lucky Dutchman".

MORE ABOUT STEELS

I'd like to add some comments to Earl Hord's article on Steel Dutch (DR, Jan. 167). His article shows much comprehensive research on the subject and courage to tackle a subject which has needed clarifying for quite a while. I thoroughly agree with him on the three steps needed for improvement of this color.

I believe that the Blue-Gray must be recognized as a color, or perhaps a return of the A.O.C. (any other color) class to the Standard as the Blue Fawn is also needed by the Tortoise breeders to improve the color in that area. Removal of the A.O.C. class has hurt these two colors, Torts and Steels. Lots of us don't keep them if we can't show them and consequently the cross we need isn't available for the improvements that they would present to the major colors.

I also like Golden Fawns and Lilacs. I believe that these four colors would be acceptable in an A.O.C. class. It should not be necessary for promiscuous color mixing to make a place for those colors which would promote much better colors in other classes in the breed.

The Blue-Gray is also on the plus side in color breeding for the Grays. Let's hear what other breeders are thinking along these lines.
