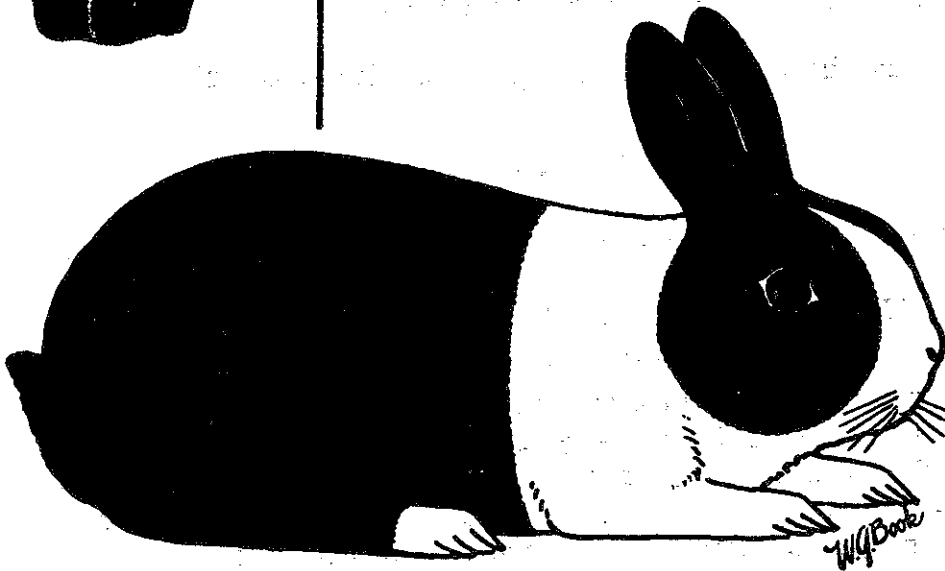

NEWS FROM MICHIGAN

Well, my fellow members of the A. D. R. C., as I write this, up here in Michigan we are in the grips of one of our hardest winters in many a year. Seven weeks of below normal temperatures and way beyond our usual fall of snow. You folks down south wouldn't believe the snow banks along our highways.

This is hard on the rabbits, especially youngsters. Like Mike said in his President's Message, in Febraury Issue, we have lost many litters of Dutch, even in our basement where we have a sort of maternity ward. Since January 1st the temperatures have been mostly from 10 below to 15 or 20 above.

Now the article I am attempting to write concerns those breeders that live on a couple of acres of land or more, where it would be possible to raise a % of their own feed.

An acre of good hy-bred corn will on good ground put out well over 100 bushels of ears and when the corn has just become half dented, there are few feeds that will condition rabbits any better. It should be chopped into about 2 inch pieces and start out with one a day and in a week, give them a couple to chew on. In our northern states corn may be fed from September to May in considerable amounts, with no bad effects. If you have an acre or two to put into alfalfa hay and a way to get it harvested it can cut cost and be very beneficial to your Dutch. It is a rabbits natural feed and will help solve a lot of failures to breed if fed two or three times a week. Jim Blyth, wrote an article on the benefit of hay for breeding does a few years ago and I very much agree with him.

I'll admit we get a lot of hay, in pellets, far to great a percentage in most, considering their cost, but that hay in pellets and natural hay are not at all alike in benefits obtained. A rabbit loves to chew and it is his nature to eat roughage.

We here at Hillcrest Rabbitry have always fed a lot of our own feed produced on the 40 acres we have left for our bunnies along with an average of 8 to 12 young cattle.

We are feeding a very good grade of second cutting alfalfa this winter 2 to 3 times a week. I prefer second cutting over third as it contains more vitamin A.

First cutting alfalfa will make good rabbit feed if harvested just as the first blossoms appear. Although we have never tried it a few rows of sunflower seed will produce considerable feed to be used as a fur conditioner. Just a tablespoon at a time. Quite a few breeder buy sunflower seed for this purpose.

Going back to feeding corn again; when it gets dried down hard it should be shelled off the cob as some rabbits, especially young can get sore mouths trying to get it off the cob.

We have been breeding Dutch for 29 years and have had our ups & downs, good & bad luck but the Dutch are tops. As long as we have bunnies they will be here.

Might add one more thing on feed, if your rabbit gets loose or sticky droppings from some feed, be it commercial or home grown, if they will eat, take everything away and put them on rolled oats, preferably from the grocery store. I have given this advice to 4-H and others when they were in trouble. If they will eat it will usually work.

I think our Dutch Reporter is unbeatable as a Speciality Club Publication and we sure do thank Bob & Kathy for the wonderful job they are doing. Keep the articles coming to them.

SHOWING RABBITS OR TAKING RABBITS TO SHOW

The experienced breeder should be aware of the following facts, however the newcomer may learn from these few ideas expressed here. We have learned these in showing our rabbits the past five years.

First, an exhibitor should plan his campaign much as an athlete or any other well organized animal exhibitor. How many shows are you going to make and where?

One should get a catalog as soon as they become available and determine the dates, judges and whether a table show or a coop show of more than one day's duration. If you are a regular exhibitor you will probably receive a catalog. If not you can write for one. The best way to do this is first of all to join the American Rabbit Breeders Association, which gives you a magazine listing the shows and also your State organization. Most of the State organizations also have a magazine that gives the dates, secretaries and judges.

If we are going to a show outside our area, we write for a catalog. After we receive this and find that our breed is sanctioned and we think the specials are worthwhile, we next look for the name of the judge. In rabbits, the same as in horses, dogs, etc., you will find some judges you prefer over others. Sometimes you can find out which judge will look at your breed. After showing a while, we find there is not much use attending some shows, for you know that the judge does not care for your type of rabbits. We realize that when you put your rabbit on the table, you ask for the judge's opinion. After having him at two or three shows, you find that it is not worth the money spent traveling to a particular show. This is not meant to make it sound like "sour grape attitude", just facts.

You will find some judges are marking judges, however markings are only half of the Dutch story, 50 points. To us, type is the most important thing, but some judges can't see past the markings. But that is the way they look at it. Most judges consider a well balanced rabbit, Dutch type, not a New Zealand or some other breed. The Standard spells it out pretty well what a Dutch type is. Most of the judges are fair to excellent on Dutch, but you will be aware of some that are weaker on the Dutch.

Now that we have decided to go to the show, let's get our entry in early. Please print or type your entry, as most secretaries are not handwriting experts. Look one more time to see if it says what we intend it to and check the ear numbers one more time. Remember one wrong letter in rabbit doesn't make much difference but one wrong letter in the ear number makes it another rabbit. Let me say right here that we have learned the hard way and have made many of these mistakes.

Dutch probably haul as good or better than any other rabbit, however the coops should be big enough for your rabbits to move around in. They should have bite proof partitions, and the buck coops should have peg board between them to keep the bucks from soiling their fur.

If traveling more than one day, small aluminum measuring cups on the inside with the handles through the wire will take a dowel through the handles real good. We use one for water and one for feed. You can remove the dowel and clean the cups easily.

When we are going to be going to a show for several days or weeks, we put our juniors in New Zealand carrying cages and our Seniors in some Flemish coops we bought at a dispersal sale. This way the rabbits have plenty of room and can move around enough to stay limber. We believe very strongly in giving a small amount of alfalfa hay in the evening, plus our regular ration. This seems to keep them in good, tight condition. We also use a little apple or carrot. Feeding this way and with the good sized coops, we find that our Dutch won't lose as much weight and stay in condition.

One word of caution, we have found that the rabbits won't eat as much on the road. Traveling and stress at a show may cause some rabbits to go off feed. We take them off grain for a feeding or two and offer them apple or carrot. They usually go back to eating.

If we are going to attend a show nearby, we usually take a bunch of juniors so we can get an opinion on them. It also gets these rabbits used to show conditions. We don't always realize it, but some get pretty upset the first few times away from home. We bought a New Zealand buck at Milwaukee and when the owner brought him to the fairgrounds (he wasn't entered), we put him in an unused coop. The rabbit shook all over he was so scared. We finally had to take him out and put him in the van. Come to find out, the owner was busy and had not had time to spend with his rabbits. Today the buck is very gentle and not easy to frighten. Handling the rabbits before a show helps get them ready for the table.

Some sort of judging table at home in the rabbitry or nearby is a great help. A table needs some holding coops and an apron or shelf in front of the coops. This way a breeder can give his stock a good going over. Good light is important over the table. This is where a breeder can find out if his rabbit has cow hocks. There are a lot of people who have different ways of detecting cow hocks, but to me the surest way is to get behind him and make him travel away from you. When he goes up and down the table, he can't lie to you. This will dispel any doubts you may have. Breeders hold the hind legs in all kinds of positions to detect or disprove cow hocks, but watching him travel will give you the answer. While on the subject of legs, check the feet for toe nails, split stops, broken bones or sore hocks (why do we call sore feet, sore hocks?) Now the sex organs, are they healthy and is that a doe or a buck?

At the head, we check the eyes: are they the right color, do they have specks, is the rabbit blind in one or both eyes? And the teeth: are there enough; are they broken or improperly shaped, etc? Check under the jaw for abscesses, which are sometimes found with bad teeth or mouth trouble. Right now check the nostrils for discharge or a cold.

To the ears, check for canker. Check the ear number, is it legible. Check for white hairs, scars or pieces of the ear missing.

When you get to the show; try to be there when the catalog says to: unload your rabbits and get them out of drafts or direct sunlight and don't place them where people will be falling over them. You should check in with the secretary to verify your entry if it was mailed. If you are entering that morning, let your socializing wait until you have entered. Too many wait until the judging is ready to start and realize they aren't entered.

The next business is to check with the Superintendent to see if he can tell you on which table your breed will be judged. Don't try to pin him down when they will be judged. Some shows have a listing and are able to tell you, but if not you are just adding to a Superintendent's problems by trying to find out when they will be judged. Don't try to influence him to get them judged early. Everyone likes to have them judged as early as possible, but if you don't have time to wait, then you should stay home.

Check to see if your rabbits are in a good position to get them on the table. Now is the time to move them instead of when the building is filled. Keep an eye on the table where you will be judged. If you are showing blacks, the judging will move from another breed to the Senior Black bucks. Be alert if the Dutch entry is small and have your rabbits ready to go on in your classes. If you are not known to the Superintendent, pay close attention to him and listen for his call. Getting the rabbits on and off the table fast makes a good show. Also, be sure the rabbit the judge has put off is your rabbit. Some real mixups occur when the rabbits are going off the table in a hurry.

It is difficult if you are showing several rabbits to get the comments and some of the secretaries miss some of the comments or get them a little different from the way they are given. This is not a criticism to the secretaries, for some judges talk a mile a minute and some who speak very low and it is difficult for them to get all comments. The best remedy we have found is to have someone take them for you in a notebook. Shorthand is good. I might explain here that this is what we have done. Then when we get home, we compare with the last judge to see what his comments were on the same rabbit. After showing under three judges, you can get a pretty good picture of your rabbit. Good and bad points. This will also help you in your breeding program.

These are a few hints that have helped us and may help you. This is showing rabbits. Some exhibitors grab up a load of rabbits without having looked at them and then are disappointed when they are put off the table early. This is called taking rabbits to a show.

We know that there will be a number of breeders and exhibitors who will disagree with some of the above. By the same token some will agree. We have found that these practices are (CONTINUED)

a pretty good plan, and we have done pretty well.

Have a note for Bill Geitzenauer - we like oil and if the people on the east coast weren't so hard headed about the looks of the coast line and pollution, they too could have lots of oil. I saw a bumper strip on the highway the other day (of course a Texas highway) and it expressed my sentiments - "Let them freeze in the dark." We're nice and warm down here.

Just had an idea???? in the March Issue of the Illinois News, Don Reid sent us the following letter and really it can be used for the DR so I guess I will go ahead and print it and that lets Don off the hook for a month or two.)

FIRST LITTERS

Dear New Breeder:

Glad you received pedigrees for Adam & Eve. Sorry to hear that Eve lost her first litter.

The biggest problem rabbits have is their owners being so anxious to see how many she had, etc. Also strangers around the expectant mother will make her excited. It could be any kind of two or four legged animals or people. Try to give her a little privacy next time.

First I would suggest that you breed her back NOW, if she likes hay this hay you gave her for a nest, give her twice as much as she will eat. If she is on a wood floor, do not give her a nest box. Just put so much in that she can not hardly move around and let her alone. She will build her own nest where she wants it. If she is on a wire floor pen, pack her nest box FULL, but do not give her a nest box until the 28th day (31 day gestation).

Always let her know when you are coming. You can whistle or sing or just talk to her. If she is in the garage, house or basement you will be surprised how they like music or??? a little radio music helps.

If she has a problem next time, you can foster her young the same way you do with other animals.

Just give her a chance and she will do O.K. If she does not pull enough fur you can use peices of cotton. After she has her next litter check her nest a few hours later. If everything is O.K. do not look in again for several days unless you smell something, (dead young). You will be surprised how efficient these mother rabbits can be if they are given a chance.

If you are concerned about the scent of your hands when checking the young the first time, you can pick up some of her droppings and rub in your hands or you can put a drop of Vicks in each nostril and keep her out of the hutch while you are checking the litter.

Hope this information will be of some help and let me know how Eve does with her next litter.

SECRETARY'S MESSAGE

Spring itself has not quite arrived in Minnesota, but the activity in preparation for the spring shows certainly has. Since the first of the year we have issued 134 sweepstakes sanctions. Most of these shows come in April & May and then they taper off rapidly into the summer months. We have attended our first couple shows of the year, entries seem to be good and the number of people attending these early shows is phenomenal.

On February 22nd I had the opportunity to Judge at Peoria, Ill. Had planned on a nice leisurely trip, with a couple of stops to visit some friends on the way. What I hadn't planned on was a full-fledged blizzard across Iowa & Wisconsin. Although I made it through the 10 inches of snow with 40-50 mile winds, it was not fun driving. Strange, too, as we had no snow in Minnesota & when I hit the Ill. border several hard hours after leaving, I found no more snow in their beautiful state. (At that time, my main criteria for being beautiful was to be without snow.)

The Peoria Club always has a good show and this was no exception. I didn't get to see many Dutch, as I was busy judging elsewhere, but I understand there was a nice entry and the Kahlers had BOB with Bill Eck having BOS. After the show having little desire to brave the Blizzards again, I jumped at the invitation to spend the night with Don & Muriel Reid, and had a very pleasant evening visiting with them.

The membership listing is in this Issue of the DR. I hope that it's new format is acceptable. By having the pages reduced & reproduced on an offset press, we saved several pages of listings and freed these pages for other material. I made every effort to include every person possible but if the membership had expired prior to March 1st, we had to leave them off. All members with expirations in January & February had been notified in plenty of time to get their renewal in by the cutoff date for the D.R.

An unpleasant subject - COSTS ARE RISING steadily. We have recently ordered ribbons & rosettes and their prices are up about 10%. As everyone knows postage costs have risen 30% for First Class and the costs of mailing the new guidebook is more than double the old cost. I hate to keep harping but you as an INDIVIDUAL can SAVE us some postage by RENEWING on time, so we do not have to notify you.

The elections are coming up soon. The ballots for nominations will go out on May 1st. Return ballots will be accepted until June 1st. Check the membership listing for eligible nominees. You must be a member in good standing to be eligible for office, or to be selected as a Judge for the Convention or National Dutch Show. Check your constitution for further information. Make your nominations wisely. I know that we have the best membership in the world, so it follows that we should have the best officers possible.

We would like to Thank all those who made such favorable comments about the new guidebook. To date we have no complaints and apparently all members have received their book. (Sometimes the Post Office does good work.)

The final cost of the guidebook came to \$2,319.82 including tax. The printer stayed within their bid price, even though it took us almost a year for completion. This price is higher than we had originally figured but the increase in cost is due to the increased size of the book. Because we had so much advertising, we had to expand the size of the book proportionally. (CONTINUED)

The advertising totaled \$1,632.50, so the cost of the book to the club came to \$687.32. This figures out to be 77 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per copy full price, or 23¢ per copy after subtracting advertising.

The club was able to put out a nice product at a reasonable cost only because the membership gave their full backing to the project. Over $\frac{4}{5}$ of the members helped out with their advertising, which from what I have heard of other publications of this sort, is fantastic. It might interest you to know that the last guidebook (1969) cost the club \$796.34 after advertising is subtracted, or a cost of 38¢ per book printed. So after 6 years of inflation & rising costs, we were able to get our new book for less money, (including 24 pages of additional copy) because YOU CARED ENOUGH TO SUPPORT YOUR CLUB. See how easy it is to be successful when we all work together! THANKS AGAIN.

The NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW is coming up this month. I'll be there, will you?????? Sure hope you can make it. The EASTERN DUTCH FANCIERS have put a lot of effort into making this the finest show ever and they need your attendance and entry to achieve their goals. It will be a great show - all NATIONAL DUTCH SHOWS ARE. See you there.

HISTORY

Scanning through a Small Stock Magazine of April 1936, we find interesting articles by H. C. (Gillie) Gilbert, John Furer and James Blythe. Mention is made in the magazine of sub-zero weather and blocked highways which were affecting the number of entries at many of the show.....For instance, the 3rd annual Tibbar show which was held at 10824 So. Michigan St., Chicago, drew around 400 animals (that is the four-footed ones.)

During the same period, Judge John Fehr was shipping 6 registered Chinchillas and 12 New Zealand Whites to a Mr. Habu of Japan; Ed Stahl was also arranging the shipment of 16 Chins and New Zealand Whites to the same party. (You don't suppose that, that could have contributed to the cause of the war?)

Murray A. Donald submitted the information that he had been browsing through some old papers and had found a directory of the old (defunct, I presume?) National Pet Stock Association of America boasting of membership of 295, 53 from Illinois, 36 from New York, 28 from Ohio, 21 from California, 18 of Indiana and on down to a State membership of 1 from various other states. This was in 1914. Three members of this early organization were presently members of the AR&CBA namely John Fehr, C.F. Goetel and Lewis Griffin. Further checking with this early data we do not find the Dutch among the top favorites but do find them tying with ANGORAS for 5th rating. Also, among the 295 members, 87 or 29 $\frac{1}{2}$ % were raising cavies.

The members of the Ft. Wayne, Indiana, club were planning the annual convention which was to be held Nov. 25th through the 28th. The Silver Marten breeders were requesting Silver Dollar donations for their convention pot. The Duneland Rabbit Breeders of Michigan City, Indiana, were planning their 5th annual summer table show, which is about where I first loomed on the rabbit horizon, (Me, being Squeak) Well, time does certainly march on.

The Secretary of the American Dutch Club, Mat A. Welling of Detroit, had about 6 inches of club notes in that particular Small Stock Magazine and was doing a good job of promotion as the magazine carried an article by HC Gilbert titled: 35 years with Dutch.(CONT)

HISTORY CONTINUED

He was further heralding an article by E. Mitchell of England on the production of Chocolate Dutch. Dutch club members were planning a fall Nation Dutch show to be held in Detroit which was to be judged by James Blythe.

In April of 1945 Dutch Club Officers were President A.S. Gibbons Vice-President Ancel R. Beaver, Sec'y-Treas.-R. L. Souers. Directors were: James Blythe, Tom Shufflebotham, Chas. O. Lewis, George Bayliss, A. E. Sautters and Carldon Gaddis. At this time many of the shows were being cancelled because of priorities on rail shipment; the Guide Book was in the process of reprinting and the editor of the Reporter was conducting a search for a new design for the monthly Reporter cover.
