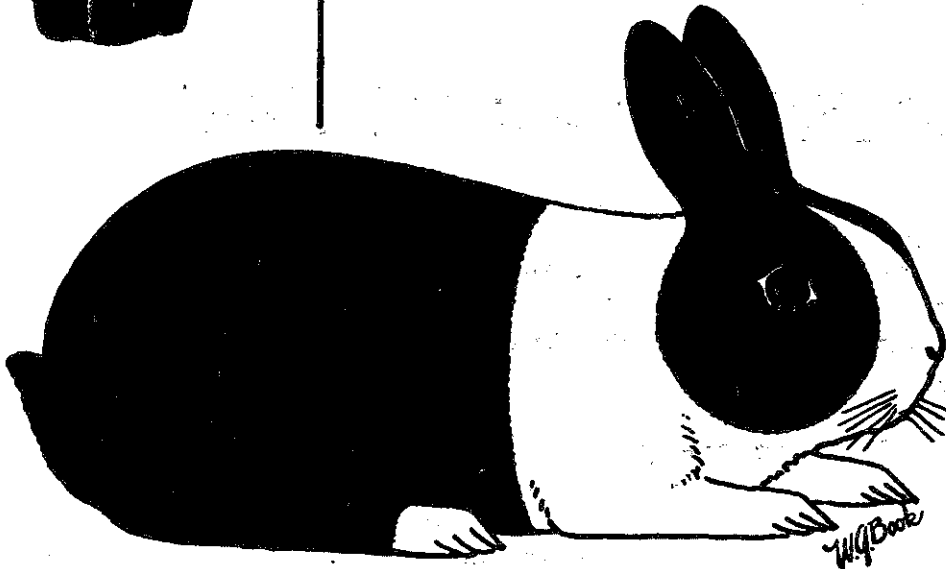

Secretary's Message

I Can tell that spring is getting close - the National Dutch Show is just around the corner. Hope we are able to see many of you there, at the BIGGEST DUTCH SHOW of them all. If I am not mistaken in my historical facts, the NDS is the oldest specialty club national show. Our club has a lot of history and tradition that many are not aware of. How about some of you "old-timers" jotting down some notes on some of the past events of the club, and sharing them with the club. We especially need dates and names and places of what has happened. If anyone has old pictures that they could share with us, we could copy them and return them. Our club is sadly neglecting an official history, and perhaps we could start now. The results of this years photo contest will help provide us with historical facts for tomorrow.

Unfortunately I am going to have to report to the Board of Directors at the NDS that there is going to be a need in the near future to either increase the membership dues, decrease our membership services, or find additional sources of revenue for the club. The costs of the necessary items to service the club keep rising, and in spite of our attempts to economize and hold the line as much as possible, we are not going to be able to prevent an eventual raise in income to balance the expenses.

I recently sent a check to Kathy and Bob Kahler for the remainder of the 1977 editors fees. These fees are based upon the number of sweepstakes sanctions, and I am proud to announce that we issued 441 sanctions for the year of 1977. This is an increase over 1976, which was an increase over 1975. The Kahlers have certainly earned their editors fees, producing one of the best club bulletins of any of the specialty clubs. But like everything else, they need your assistance to continue. We could use many articles from many different people. Articles from different areas of the country. Articles concerning the club, or the shows, or what have you. I would especially like to see more from the state or local Dutch clubs. What is going on in your area? Got a bitch? Maybe a compliment? Or a question? With over seven hundred members, there should be at least a few that would have some thoughts they could share with us.

HELP! We have a need for some sort of display material that we could send out for promotional purposes. We get many inquiries each year for informational material to be used at displays or booths or for educational purposes. I guess what we need most is the art work, producing some small poster type, informative, educational, items that could be easily reproduced and sent out in standard size envelopes. If someone could reproduce the Dutch on page one of the present guidebook in a 8 1/2 x 11 size for us, this would be a start. Items of 8 1/2 x 11 or 8 1/2 x 14 sizes in black and white can be reproduced economically, and would serve the purpose. I know that someone is going to question this, being very concerned with expenses in one paragraph, and then talking about spending money for a project such as this, but we have found in the past that these efforts tend to more than pay for themselves through the goodwill the club gains, plus promoting new members. We hope that all of our members make an effort to help promote our club, and encourage new members to join.

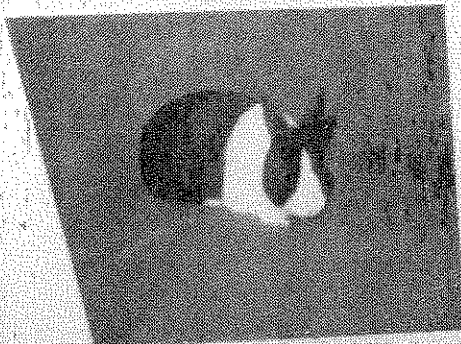
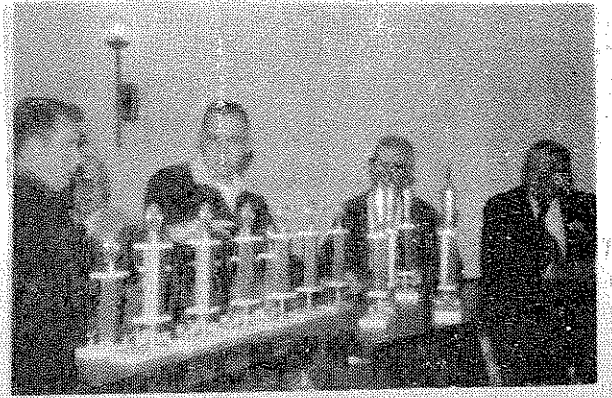
Election Nominations...

The nomination ballots will be in the mail on or about Apr 1st. They are sent via 3rd class mails, so allow two or three weeks for their arrival. If you do not receive your ballot by May 1st write us, and we will send you one via first class mails. Ballots must be received by May 15th, so dont put it off too long. Every year I repeat these words: make your nominations carefully, selecting people who will work for the club. I think we have been very fortunate in the quality of officers we have had, and I believe this reflects the quality of the members of our club. Give the new election committee something to count. **MAKE SURE YOU PUT YOUR NAME AND ADDRESS ON THE RETURN ENVELOPE** when you send in your ballot. Otherwise it will be invalid. The outside envelope is discarded before the ballots are opened, so your vote is still secret.

The 1978 American Rabbit Breeders Association annual convention show will be held in Saginaw, Michigan, October 9-12th. Each year we make a plea for specials from the membership. When is the last time you donated towards one of the national shows? Lets do our best to have a respectable list of trophies and specials for this fall's show. The catalog deadline will be in May, so dont wait. We will accept donations or pledges, and you will receive credit for them in the convention catalog. Thanks.

If there's one particular point that this writer does not want to see changed, it is our Standard of Perfection. It hurt many breeders of the 40's and 50's that inbred for generations to obtain stops that we half hock. When this was changed to one-third it took years to change the strain and even 25 years later, there are a good amount left being shown. No, in answer to many inquiries, I do not agree that either the hock stops or the ideal weight should be changed. Those of you who want the weight decreased to $2\frac{1}{2}$ to $4\frac{1}{2}$ pounds, do not have my vote of confidence. This would cause a decrease in meat production for our culls, as well as herd vitality in that runts would have to be saved. You know how they make out!

There are those judges who have asked me about changing our point spread to include more on type. The judges contacted (5) agree that Dutch type with only 5 points allowed (A.R.B.A. Standard of Perfection 1976-1980) must be false. Our own Standard (Guide Book 1976) calls for type - 15 points. Most judges (A.R.B.A.) use their own standard published by the American and well they should! This is their bible. Hopefully Glen Carr will rectify this point differential in Standards. We of the Dutch Club, must do the same. We have 0 points on weight and condition. Please Mr. Chairman straighten this out. This question has been raised for two years now, must we wait for another two to straighten out our affairs?

Perhaps this will be a good year with each officer concerned about little things that cause frustration. How many years have I asked for an interpretation of Article IV of our By-Laws from our higher officers and received no answer. How many of you have written me in the last four years asking me if you could be a State Representative. What is this in the By-Laws for if no one is willing to come forth and explain what it means. Do you Mr. Officer know?

It is nice to know that Mark Bean has been selected committee chairman. Or has he? This would please a lot of people including Fred Glasoe and myself. This is the least the Mother Club could do for our Fledglings. In 10 years these Fledglings will be our officers. Who Cares? Some of us do! I hope the above points will be on our Canton menu.

I believe our club is being run as a corporation and well it probably should be but infuse some heart into it. This writer is going to be in attendance at the Canton board meeting in April. Please write me before the end of the month. There is little that I can do concerning the inconsistent judging of our Dutch unless the A.R.B.A. steps forward to develop consistency. Both Standards are incorrect by mutual disagreement. Perhaps Glen and his committee will straighten this out.

In any case WRITE ME so that it cannot be said that a "Lame Duck" staff represented the membership again. Don't turn to that other Dutch member and tell him what's wrong. Let me know so that 700 other people become aware. (Ed's Note: Bill it is Canton not Akron.)

CULLING

Have you ever given a thought to the fact that if you go to a large shopping center or onto a school ground and check one hundred human beings, you would find that very few of them would have even reasonable confirmation, and in younger children there would be a frightening amount of mouth trouble. I am not talking about decayed teeth, but about crooked teeth and what horse people call parrot mouth.

What this is leading up to is the fact that if you go to a rabbitry or animal breeding operation, whether cattle or horses, or whatever, you will find the reverse true. What this proves is the fact that by judicious culling nearly perfect animals can be bred. At least one time in history an individual tried to create a master race of humans, but his approach was too crude for the rest of the world and his experiment came to a halt.

It is too bad that people do not pay the attention to the defects of their children that they do in their animals. Some could be corrected. But I have been told to be sure to straighten that horse's feet "up", while shoeing it, and collect a good fee for same, while their child walked by so pigeon toed he could hardly walk.

If you are discouraged with your breeding program, don't be. Do some checking, and if necessary, get some outside help. Don't be discouraged if the person is blunt and sharply criticizes your herd. If it is honest criticism, the more it hurts, probably the better off you will be when you correct your problem.

If you think you have a problem, look at what the hog breeders had when lard was sidelined by vegetable oil. They just bred a leaner, longer hog with more bacon and chops. The same can be done in the rabbit program, with good culling.

If you think it is an insurmountable problem to change the makeup of a rabbit, get an ARBA Standard of the 30's or 40's and look at a picture of an ideal New Zealand Red. Body type was nothing like we have today. A little closer to home, look at what the English people are breeding as Dutch. Here in this country we have a lot of Dutch that resemble the Standard only in markings. Right along with these Dutch, we have judges who pick them on the table. Where these rabbits and judges are popular, it is hard to find a pair of scales around.

Type on any rabbit is most important. The standard is clear on all breeds and shouldn't be too hard to interpret.

The cab driver got a call on his radio from the dispatcher for a pick-up only 2 blocks from where he was cruising. Within a minute he pulled up & rang the bell. "Taxi!" he called. The door opened, a woman stuck her head out & said, "Go away! I'm not riding with anybody who drives that fast!"

Just had to congratulate Don Lovejoy on his article about judging Dutch. I don't think anyone could say it better. A real Dutch Breeder loves to see a beautiful specimen win - - no matter who - - but a beautiful rabbit loses by an incompetent judge - - - really hurts.

Boycotting a show with one or more of these judges may get the message across but also your point standing would suffer. This would take second place to really learning true faults and delay our efforts to improving our DUTCH or any other breed for that matter.

Possibly, could a petition of complaint, or some such be submitted to the Licenser, namely the ARBA informing them of noted violations, and they in turn inform the person responsible. If discrepancies in their judgements should continue, perhaps a temporary suspension while they are under tutorage, the same system that was employed by them to get their license.

A publishing of their names and offences could bring possible legal action but then again I'm only thinking.

In follow-up of Larry's answer to my question (s) last issue of D.R., I'm happy to say that my Dutch faired better than expected. One litter came in during the cold snap and I didn't lose any Dutch. None of the young Dutch were good enough to keep for breeding due to bad markings. A part of the success for the litter pulling through the cold, windy weather was because I lined the "rabbit house" with sheet plastic and also partially wrapped each cage for further protection. My biggest problem was hay and straw blown in with snow.

A piece of perhaps helpful information; before tattooing animals for breeding stock or sale, (I don't tattoo the ones to be eaten), I punch a hutch card that goes with that animal first to eliminate chance of error.

Enough for now, hope to see more of you in Canton. As ever.

COMMENTS ON JUDGING DUTCH - PRESENT & PAST

W. C. STEDMAN - NEW YORK

Having raised Dutch since 1946. I think I can justify a few remarks concerning judging of Dutch over the years. Altho I have not shown for some 10 years, I still take an interest in how our Dutch are being judged by both the old time judges and our present day judge.

When I was showing Dutch I felt that in order to be competitive I had to have a varied group of animals to show and probably, more importantly, to know your judges, their likes and dislikes and then show your animals accordingly. Your real out-standing specimens generally never had any trouble with any of the judges, but the marginal ones, I believe it was important to know something about the judge looking them over. There were times that I would not even show because I knew the judge would not give them a fair break.

I think the rabbit breeders would do themselves a real service, if they would get a resolution passed that the American Rabbit Breeders Association license both fancy and commercial breed judges. Most Shows, today, employ at least two judges and they could hire one of each. This does not mean that a judge could not qualify for both licenses, but it might require more knowledge and study on his part to obtain both of them and would be a direct advantage to the breeder. A good all breed judge then would have some knowledge of all the breeds and probably would raise some of them for a period of time to learn more about them.

Probably the biggest fault with most judges, when judging Dutch is their method of handling them. They stretch the animal out of shape while handling it and if they would just read the Standard they would find that the rabbit is supposed to be posed in it's natural position. It's very easy to get an irregular undercut by mis-handling the rabbit and many, many times I have seen this happen. A real sincere judge will talk to a well known Dutch judge or breeder and ask for advise and discuss Dutch judging with him.

The above remarks are my own personal feelings and they cover a long period of time and observation. If what I have said will help improve the handling and judging of Dutch just a little, I will think that my time was well spent.

DEFENSE

Me again, Kathy, Sometimes our SHOW OFFICIALS are at fault. I can remember at one Convention (I won't state whether it was a State or National) anyway our friend, "Mr. Commercial" Ted Wengert was hired to Judge - - what did the show officials give him to Judge?? Tans - Now Ted did his best and I believe he apologized for months after that - to the Tan Breeders. Ted could judge most breeds but of course Meat Pens was his speciality. The breeders were understanding but this didn't help the breed. Ted had about an hour's warning - he spent it studying his Standard on Tans. This happens - who would you blame Ted or the Show Officials? Kathy

In the last issue of the Reporter there were some articles pertaining to judging. There were some valid points and a few bouquets thrown in. I'm not a Judge or even a Registrar but would like to read or hear from some of them on these articles.

What this letter is really about is the other side of the table. In two words: TABLE MANNERS. If I were a judge and heard some of the things from the other side I'd be tempted to mess up on purpose hoping some one would learn a lesson.

For instance: "Hey, Thorndyke, where's that Senior Doe that's never been beaten?" "She took first again!" (the class just finished) To me, that's a form of intimidation from two people who probably don't realize it. I'm not saying you shouldn't talk at the judging table. After all we go to these shows to compete, learn and socialize. But there are things that can and things that should not be said at the table.

I think that our youth should also learn this right along with everything else they are being taught at their 4-H Club meetings and other club meeting.

This pertains to all rabbits not just dutch.

Dear Mr. Bengtson:

I have a question. I showed a Black Dutch Doe at a recent show and she got disqualified. The judge said that she would not get disqualified in a normal show (this was an all Dutch show) A disqualification is a disqualification no matter what type of show isn't it?

My rabbit already has 2 legs (Grand Champion) and no judge ever mentioned the white spot on her ear. The spot was this size (--). The Standard states the spot must be "Plainly visible" in order to be a disqualification. If an experienced judge can miss a spot until he has placed all the rabbits except two (there were 8 in the class and only my doe and another were left, going for best Sr. Doe) I would not call that spot plainly visible.

Dear Kirsten:

You raise some interesting and perplexing questions. To start right I would like to applaud the Judge for one thing - he did have the "guts" to go ahead and disqualify the animal even though he had missed the spot on his initial examination. Give the judges a break, as they are as human as the exhibitors and occasionally do make mistakes. I think I speak for the majority of judges when I say that I would rather be able to rectify a mistake before it's too late, and the judging is over, than to have it slip by.

As you stated, "A disqualification is a disqualification, no matter what type of show, isn't it?" This is true. Perhaps the reason that this was noticed in an all-Dutch show was one of two things. The judges selected for these shows are usually considered to be good Dutch judges, and he might be more concerned with the breed than others. The other reason could be that in a speciality show, be it a breed show, or a national show, the judge is apt to be more critical, and take more time to judge the rabbits. In many normal all-breed shows the judges are expected judge literally hundreds of animals in a relatively short time. This means that the judge does not have the time necessary to go over each animal very thoroughly. More mistakes are possible. I have seen a judge given an almost impossible task of judging five hundred rabbits in a single day. It is possible and has happened many times. The quality and amount of light at the judging table may well be an influencing factor as to what the judge sees in a particular instance. Many times you will see a judge having to take an animal to another area, especially into normal daylight, to see a particular feature.

Plainly visible spots are another question. At one time the number of hairs in a spot was a determining factor in whether or not it should be considered a spot. Quite often judges will disagree and a rabbit like yours, may make it through 1 judge and get thrown out by another. One thing to consider is that a spot may not show up readily when looked at from a certain angle, and be very apparent from another angle. Another factor is experience. Judges are used to looking for spots. I think that I would bet money on the fact that since that show YOU have no trouble seeing that spot. The same spot that you had probably never seen until the judge showed it to you.

I think you can easily see two sides to the story, but there is another side also. How do you think the exhibitor that owns the rabbit that would have either won the class or placed second, depending upon how the judge placed your animal feels about the situation? Judging is a subjective thing. The person evaluating the animal, be it the Judge behind the table, or the exhibitor, or a third party, is applying the Standard of Perfection as they interpret it. Mix this up with emotions, variations in facilities, a few other opinions, the weather, bio-rhythms and a few other odds and ends, and it's no wonder that there are differences of opinions after it's all over. But it's fun, often exciting, and all-in-all, a great sport. Winning or losing isn't everything, so enjoy it for what it is, (CONTINUED)

and be a gracious winner and a graceful loser and everyone will benefit.

Ed's Note: Thanks Larry for sharing this with us. Hope you keep up with this idea of questions and answers. One thing in reading or typing your answer I kept thinking of "When is a disqualification a Disqualification?" and I kept thinking of our different judges here in Illinois. Now since (I Hope) Don Reid is a good friend - - I thought of him and his judging - - He is good but he could have been that judge that caught that white spot - - Don is known to look for disqualifications - - so if you have a border-line rabbit and Don is judging - - leave the rabbit at home. We also have another judge that judges Illinois shows - - that could care less about disqualifications, color or markings just what he can feel - - Personally I would rather have Don judge Bob's rabbits because after he gets done looking for disqualifications and your rabbit is still up there - - then Don gets down to all the other things that go towards a good show rabbit - - and the exhibitors can learn from his comments. Actually though we have a judge here in Illinois who can or has reached the happy "Middle", he looks for disqualifications but they have to be visible - - if it is a border-line then the rabbit is cut and he explains why to the exhibitor. Maybe this animal has other excellent points that might carry it as far as 2nd or 3rd, the judge will tell why it can't go first. I have wrote for this judge more times than I care to count and he judges (I believe about the most of any judge at a show) I don't care if it is 300 entries or 1,700 entries, he always does more than his share. Now his secret is great - - he takes time with the animals - - but when he starts to give remarks - - watch out - - because "Machine Gun Oren"- - - talks at a fast clip. In this way he can judge and still keep up a good pace because if the exhibitor is listening they will know why that animal didn't go first, also Oren will always tell why it was beaten on that particular day. After reading or typing Steve's and Larry's articles - I would just like to say - - don't get us the ones who have been complaining about poor judges wrong - - we know there are some EXCELLENT JUDGES and they are in the majority BUT wouldn't it be nice if we could say (ALL JUDGES ARE EXCELLENT) it would also be nice to say (ALL EXHIBITORS ARE GREAT) Maybe though because of these articles some of our judges will take a second look at their judging recently and say to themselves, "If I fit into any of these categories (even a little) I will try to improve myself." Kathy

CULLING YOUR DUTCH FOR BREEDING STOCK

By BILL SUMMERS

One of the most perplexing problems confronting a beginner in raising Dutch rabbits is the culling and selection of breeding stock. The ideal breeding stock would have excellent type, color and fur and near-perfect markings. If we used only Dutch with these qualifications, within a few generations we would have an animal far superior to the ones we have today. (Speaking of the breed as a whole of course, as we do have a few very good animals throughout the country.) Unfortunately, very few Dutch that come out of the nest box measure up to these specifications. Therefore, if you don't have the patience to wait for this type of an animal to come along, you have to use animals which are not perfect.

Now we are faced with the problem that if we don't have perfect specimens to breed from, what kind of an animal do we use, and where do we draw the line? First, let's get a clear picture of what we are looking for, in the order of their importance. Type, color, fur and markings, in that order, are the things I look for in my breeding stock.

TYPE - The most prominent feature of a good Dutch is his head and ears. The head should be rounded from any angle you wish to look at him; does, possibly a little finer drawn than bucks, but still showing a nice round head. The ears should be short and stocky, with lots of substance, and well furred. The body should be very stocky and well rounded from any angle. The shoulders should be slightly narrower than the hips, and the profile should show a nice arch from the shoulders to the hips. To feel the body it should be smooth and hard. This is important; strong bone and hard flesh are what makes our little Dutchman the cobby, stocky, attractive little animal he is. Prominent hips, rough and undercut rump, soft flesh and fine bone are the ruination of body type. Avoid failures in good type above anything else.

COLOR - Color ranks second in importance to me. In Blacks the color should be jet black, showing a very high surface sheen. Scattered white hairs, grizzled ears, lacking surface sheen and a rusty cast to the coat are all undesirable characteristics. Blues should be a dark shade, with the color running well down into the undercoat. Evenness of color throughout the colored sections is very desirable. Scattered white hairs, powder blue color, light-colored ears, uneven color and silver-tipped guard hairs are the things to watch here.

FUR - Fur on our Dutch is, without a doubt, one of our most neglected points. The type of fur you have on your animals affects your color and your markings. The fur should be short and dense, with a good flyback texture. Avoid long silky fur; although this type of fur will show good color and sheen, it detracts from the sharpness of markings, making it undesirable. Avoid a soft fur, as it is very hard to obtain sheen in your color with this type of fur.

MARKINGS - Markings in my selection of breeding stock ranks last. I won't comment too much on markings as our Standard is clear-cut and concise on these.

Now, then, we come to the problem of selecting and culling our breeding stock. Over a period of the last 15 years, we have made much improvement with our stock, but not nearly as much (CONTINUED)

as we could have made with better breeder selection. I think the main reason for this is that every time we come up with a well-marked Dutch and do a little winning with it, we lose sight of all else and make a breeder out of it. One of the most common requirements of beginners wanting breeding stock is that they must be well marked and eligible to register. This idea in itself is a fallacy and misleading. Some of the best breeders I have ever had were not show animals, and some of the best show animals were not breeders. Now then, why would this be true? It's simple: A show animal does not have to be superior in any one point, but rather a well-balanced animal to go a long way in the showroom. This brings me to the first point I would like to make:

POINTS ON BREEDING - 1. Always select an animal with several superior points and a bad fault, over a well-balanced one with no superior points.

2. Select for breeders only animals that have superior type. This is the most important thing, above all; it's the foundation and the biggest selling point of our breed. You don't have a Dutch until you've got type, no matter how good it may be in all other respects.

3. Select animals with good color. Here I would like to make the point that it is much harder to remove something bad that you have put into your Dutch, than it is to add something desirable. This applies especially to color. Sprinkled white hairs in the colored sections, this one will really kill you. White spots in the colored sections, especially white ears, here is a good indication of loss of pigment and you'll find a good percentage of the same kind in their litters you breed from them. In Blues we have two real bugaboos, frosty-colored juniors and silver-tipped guard hairs in seniors. Frosty-colored youngsters are easy to spot, as their color is very light, and when you blow into their fur the undercoat is white. Although they molt out to a pleasant color, it is not nearly dark enough, and they tend to produce in their own likeness. Silver tipping in our Blues is harder to spot, as it does not make it's appearance until juniors molt into their adult coat. I think that someone at some time must have bred Grays into his Blues, as I can remember, when we had A.O.C. classes, a few of the Blue-Grays that resembled this.

4. In selecting your breeders, remember that it is always best to use well-marked Dutch. However, if you're like most of us, you don't have the time or patience to wait, so you'll take shortcuts. If you must take shortcuts, here are some of the things I go by:

A. Don't use animals short in color, or the first thing you know you'll be showing English Spots instead of Dutch.

B. Pick animals with clear, distinct markings, over ones with well-placed, ragged markings.

C. Pick animals with several outstanding markings and an outstanding fault, over one with well-balanced markings but none of them outstanding.

With all that we have talked about for selection of our breeders, we must add one more thing. As you go along breeding your Dutch, you will notice that some breeders consistently throw certain good points and bad points into their young. Take advantage of your observations and mate your animals so as to accentuate their good points and (CON)

eliminate their faults. The same thing applies in mating animals with the same apparent faults as it does with good points. By this I mean that if you were to mate two animals with the same good points, you would be doubling up on these points, giving you a much better chance of reproducing the same. The same results could be expected if two animals with the same faults were mated, so try not to mate animals with the same faults.

I hope I've been of help to some of our beginners. Get in the swim of things by breeding and showing Dutch, and you'll soon be a believer in our motto: "You Can't Beat the Dutch."

JUDGING DUTCH

By G. A. BURKE

It is necessary at all times to have the Standard in mind. Every exhibitor believes his Dutch to be the best, and we must admit this is only human.

Correct handling is important and essential in the placement of Dutch. Markings may be in the proper place, but incorrect handling will not show them off properly. Posed properly, the judge has the opportunity to observe and examine the markings as they really are. The type should be cobby and close coupled.

In handling large classes, the judges should not be in a hurry to weed the class down, as sometimes snap decisions are made, and they may be wrong. As the Dutch of today are a very competitive breed of rabbits, sometimes in the last 5 or 10 in a large class it is difficult to determine which one shall win. You must then remember the Standard of Perfection and be guided accordingly, always remembering that the markings are permanent, while fur condition, etc., change with the weather and the age of the rabbit.

I have judged many Dutch in the state of Ohio and surrounding states, and find them very interesting to judge and breed. I have seen the Dutch rabbit come a long way in the past 10 years, as each breeder is breeding and culling to come as close to the Standard of Perfection as possible. The points allotted and cuts as outlined in the Standard are a mathematical proposition and are easy to work with if the judge will carry on his work properly, keeping in mind that there are years of planning and breeding on the table in front of him, and judges by the use of the Standard and not by his personal likes or dislikes. Judging Dutch then can be a matter of knowing that you are picking the correct Dutch in each class, best of breed, etc., never being ashamed to have the Book of Standards before you, open to the proper page on Dutch. This shows that the judge has the Standard in mind and is ready to use it as a reference at any time.

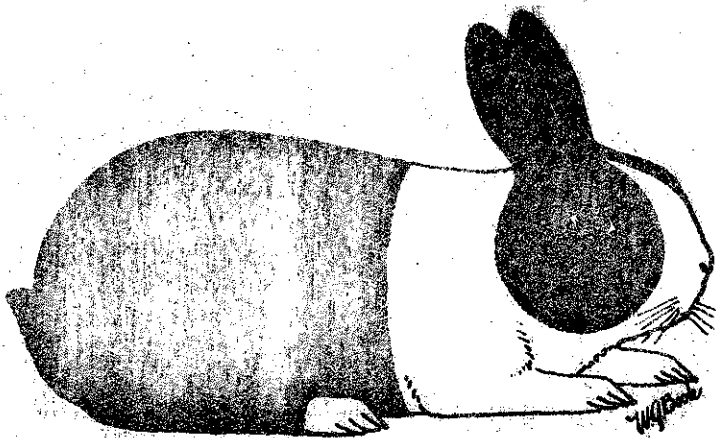
