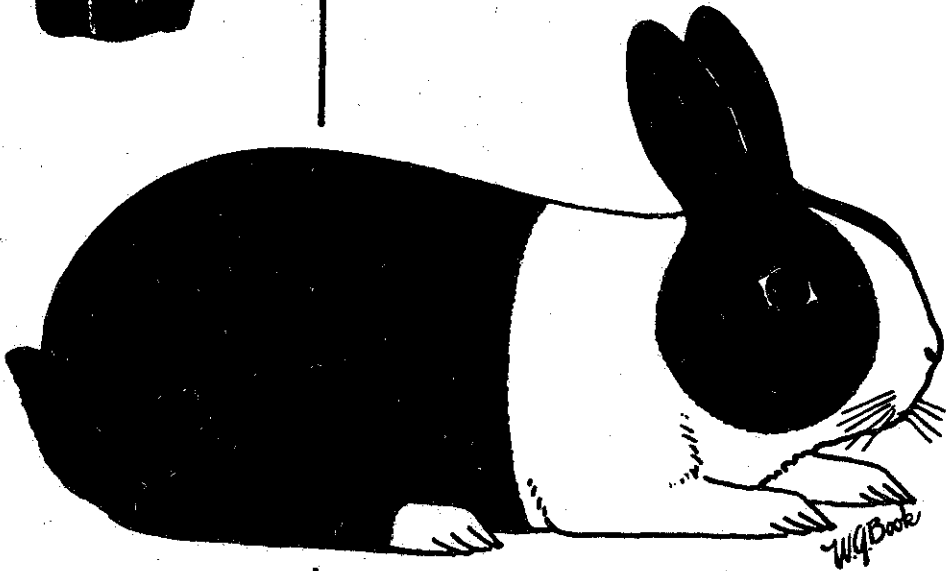

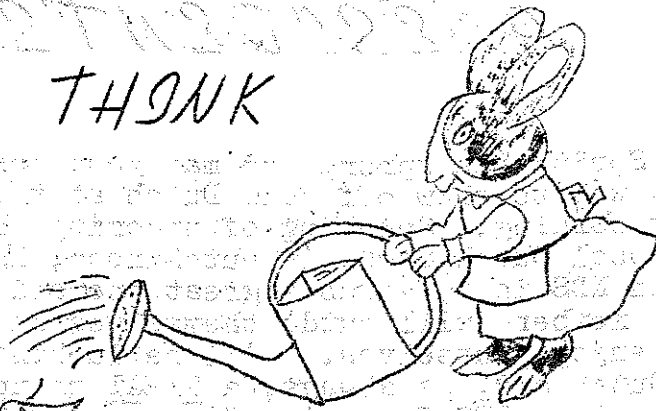

Their catalogs are out and if you would like to attend and weren't on the mailing list, just drop a line to Conall Addison. I'm sure he'll get one right out to you. His address is: Box 356 St John, Kansas 67576 or phone him at 316-549-6647. Deadline for mailing entries will be Midnight, Saturday, April 3, 1982. If you are planning on attending the banquet, send your reservations in along with your entry. Banquet cost is \$8.50 per person. These people have one fine show planned!

I hope you receive this issue of the DR before you leave for Kansas. I'm going to have it in the mail a little earlier as mailing third class can take about 3 weeks for arrival. Please remember also to have those articles in to me by the 15th of the month. This gives me ample time to put the DR together and have it out on time.

I've had to return quite a few \$8.00 checks that have been sent to this office requesting a youth sanction along with their open. I've also had many inquiries about the cost of a youth sweepstakes. We have a youth committee working for these young people, but at the present, we have no Youth Sanction. Also, please remember that youth dues, under the age of 18, are \$5.00. If you are a youth but want to have voting privileges, then you must submit \$7.00 to this office. When applying for membership---If you are a youth,---please check the appropriate place and give your age. This way there will be less refunds that have to be made. If you check youth and your age, for example, is 15, I'll assume that you wish to vote if a \$7.00 fee is enclosed. Adult fees are \$7.00 single and \$9.00 Husband/Wife.

From IOWA

Director Eich.....

Spring has finally arrived and oh what a winter we have experienced. Many breeders say they were unable to raise any young at all this winter and that may take a toll on the spring shows.

While we are on the subject of cold weather I will share a peculiar (and costly) situation that happened in our rabbitry for the first time in all the years we have raised rabbits. To begin with, we try to breed our rabbits on the moon signs of cancer or pisces; we start the evening of the first preceding day of either one of these signs and continue until completed, trying not to extend beyond the last cancer or pisces day. Our barn is heated to forty degrees and that was very warm compared to the temperature outside. On January 27, 1982 we bred 36 does,--32 conceived and have since littered from 6 to 12 rabbits.

On January 28th. another 41 does were moved to the farm and housed in a very nice building previously used as a staging area for laboratory rabbits. This building has many windows on the south side, insulated both ceiling and side walls, dirt floor but no heat. There is no mouse or rat problem and other animals are not allowed in the building. We mated these does starting Feb. 5th of '82. Disappointing as it may be, only 12 of the group conceived. To make the situation even more confusing is we used the same bucks on both groups as they were moved to the farm building just three days after the does arrived.

Many questions are still unanswered. Was the different water supply a factor? Did the tremendous change in temperature affect the bucks or did it affect the does in some way?

I suppose without some irregularities we would have no challenge. We may never know the real answer. If anyone has an idea or similar experience please feel free to write me. I would welcome your letter.

April 16th. is fast approaching and that also means National Dutch Show time is closing in. Bonnie and I are looking forward to Hutchinson, Kansas again this year. One just don't forget what a tremendous well organized show they put on just a few years back. I would like to encourage every Dutch breeder to try and make this show and especially new breeders. The friendly smiles and warm welcome will never be forgotten.

Rabbit convention shows are similar to a good sales seminar, when you head for home you're bubbling over with enthusiasm.

DON'T CRY WOLF!

In the past three months have received six letters from newer breeders who are worried about the same thing. It seems that five of them purchased stock from different nationally recognized breeders. Two purchased from the same breeder. The complaint is that they are paying good money (\$40.00 to \$100.00) for show stock hoping to improve their own stock. Nothing wrong with this as we have all done this at one time or another. These newer fanciers, it seems that the fallacy is that by purchasing good bloodline (one) to combine with your own, one expects the first litter to contain some of the new bloodlines' characteristics.

This may be true in a small percentage of the cases but not the majority. I personally remember my first Dutch purchase. Paid \$4.00 for a buck and \$3.00 for a doe from two different breeders. The first litter produced a brother and sister that were B.O.B, and B.O.S. in the first three shows I attended, from a mismarked pair.

Granted this rarely happens, but it could. When buying that one or two to add to your own bloodline, the chances are you will get mismarked in the first litter. Don't discard the litter! Rather save the best of these mismarks but none with generic major defects. These are: off color eyes, excess long bodies or crooked legs or pinched hindquarters. Look to save the one or two that have more color than white. Lack of color takes generations to breed out. The ones you save, breed back to your own bloodline again and hopefully you will get a percentage of the "new" characteristics. If the original two bloodlines are not related closely, you will have to go to the next generation to obtain maximum results.

Never expect to obtain an entire litter of young to be show animals. It is rare to obtain 4 or 5 out of 7 or 8 in a litter worthy of showing.

Some of you buy trios of one persons stock and by inbreeding obtain the other persons stock (bloodline) in your rabbitry but not mixed to make your own hopefully superior line. There is nothing wrong with this if you want to develop anothers line but you can never call it your own!

Hopefully you will give it a chance by not getting discouraged and crying wolf because you now understand.

DIFFERENCE IN

JUDGING

Why do we get so much differences in judging? It's hard to say why one judge, one day, will place a rabbit 1st. out of a class of 7, Best of Breed, and Best in Show-----The next day, under a different judge, the same rabbit, in the same class of 7 could do no better than 4th. There has to be something wrong! I know that judges do not see things the same on each rabbit and placements will vary. I just don't know how they can vary this much!

The above actually happened to me. The rabbit was a Black Jr. Doe. She has good stops, undercut, saddle, head, neck, ears, type, excellent color and fur. The only fault was a slight fault in cheek markings. The cards for the two shows had about the same comments. The card where the rabbit received a 4th place had the comment, "loses to class on markings." No other remarks were made on the markings of this rabbit.

This is very hard for a new breeder to understand. It is the result of alot of breeders dropping out of rabbits and showing after a few shows. The only advice I can give them is don't despair and never get rid of an animal on the say of one judge.

What can be done about this? There is not alot that can be done. The following things and suggestions will help.

1. Judges should take a few minutes before they judge each breed and read the book of Standards. This is not a sign of a poor judge, but to my way of thinking, a Good Judge. There is no judge around who can remember every point, weight, etc. out of approximately 40 breeds in the book of Standards.
2. Breeders can demand that a better job be done by judges or not hire them again.
3. There is a program, at least I am told that there is, by the ARBA where breeders can rate the job a judge has done. I think this should be used more often.

If anyone has any other ideas, I would be pleased to hear them.

I don't think judges should resent a breeder asking him why he placed a rabbit in a certain placement. I am a judge and I like to know when I do a good job. I also like to know when I do a bad job so that I can try to do better the next time. I have always welcomed any questions a breeder has about the placing of his animal. As a breeder, I would much rather see a judge read his Standard before judging because that indicates to me that he is going to give it his best shot!

There is no one around who can remember every cut, fault, elimination disqualification, weight, and etc. of all the approximate 40 breeds. If we all try to do a little better job judging our shows, we won't have so many complaints, and I think we would have a lot more rabbit breeders.

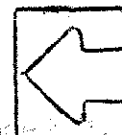



Where are the Dutch Rabbits Hiding?

Hiding you say? How can that be? The ADRC is one of the biggest and most accoladed clubs around! How could that be if Dutch rabbits were hiding?

I follow the show reports in the DR very closely and have noted that with the exception of the East, where we average 95 head, most clubs average 40 head. Maybe being an Easterner I've become spoiled. To show you how spoiled one can get, the first show of the year in my area was held February 28th and of 980 head entered only 40 were Dutch. I'm not used to such small entries and was frankly disappointed in so little competition. Think about it, there are six varieties of Dutch, each with four classes; that's twenty four animals. With only forty head entered, that's less than two animals per class. Again I ask, where are our breeders and their animals hiding?

In talking to several breeders in my area, who were conspicuous in their absence from this show, I discovered their reason for not attending was they objected to the entry fee of \$2.00 per head. Granted, that is 50¢ per head more than we had been paying but the increase did not mean the sponsoring club made a huge profit. We all know how the cost of everything has risen drastically in the last few years; well the cost of putting on a good rabbit show has risen too and our entry fees have not risen enough to keep pace. When we show our animals and are the fortunate winner we want something to show for it. A decent trophy that cost \$4 or \$5 a year or two ago now costs \$7 or \$8. Judging fees have to be increased, and rightly so for travel expenses have gone up for them as much as for any of the rest of us. It is not right to ask them to work a long hard day judging one hundred fifty to two hundred head of animals and expect them to pay out of their pocket for the privilege of doing it. Suitable buildings are getting harder to find and are in no way cheap. There are many more expenses involved but I think you get the idea. The point is, even at \$2 per head entry fee, show me a cheaper and more enjoyable hobby than showing your Dutch rabbits. If you think I exaggerate, check out the cost of entering a dog or horse show; you'll see what I mean.

Anyone who reads the DR knows by the show reports we are real "show" bugs; meaning win or lose, we enjoy going to rabbit shows and miss very few in our area. I would like to hear from you breeders out there; what do you consider your show area (miles radius), how many shows a year in your area, how many shows do you attend a year and why that particular number? How about it Norma, do you think this a sufficiently interesting topic for a DR issue? It won't help improve our rabbits but it might help us to get to know more about each other.

As for me, I love going to a show and having raisers of other breeds marvel at the large Dutch entry. I keep telling them, You Can't Beat the Dutch!

Editors' note:

Barb; if I'm not mistaken, I read an article in one of our Illinois news bulletins last year concerning the expense involved in putting on a good show! Being both secretaries and show secretaries, you and I, along with others, are aware of the hard work and costs incurred just continued.....

Editors note, continued.....

getting ready for a show;--The cost of sanctions, building rental, insurance, judges, trophies, ribbons and cash paybacks, not to mention if your club has a kitchen available and food must be purchased....I wish more breeders, who just strictly show would take the time to get involved! I believe that only then will they realize what an expense it really is! More often than not, a club will just barely break even if not go in the red.

Let's have some articles from all of you, for publication in the DR, as to your feelings on entry fees and shows in general. Barb has some very good questions in her article.....In the long run, your views could help to encourage larger Dutch entries and more people exhibiting. Norma

HOW ABOUT SOME STATISTICS?

These statistics have been compiled by your sweepstake chairman, Dick Gehr. This seems like an appropriate place to list them.....

In 45 states plus Canada there have been 327 ADRC sanctioned shows held since the 1981 N.D.S. At these shows there has been a total of 12,027 Dutch shown; this works out to an average of 36.8 Dutch per show.

There have been 325 ADRC members exhibit in ADRC sanctioned shows since the 1981 N.D.S. from 40 states plus Canada.

42% of total members have exhibited Dutch at ADRC sanctioned shows since the 1981 N.D.S.

773 persons belong to the ADRC. (this is counting husband and wife as two members)

BREEDING & SHOWING DUTCH RABBITS IN ENGLAND

by Miss Jo Sutton...Essex, England

I have been breeding and showing Dutch Rabbits now for 23 years, and have so improved my own stock that I now enjoy a modicum of success at the Shows and have three Champions to my credit.

The colours of Dutch currently on show in these parts are as follows:
BLACK, BLUE, CHOCOLATE, BROWN/GREY, TORTOISESHELL, YELLOW, STEE,
TRI-COLOUR, PALE GREY.

We seem to have great following in the Dutch fancy particularly, with some of the better known names having been 'Dutchman' for a great number of years.

As with many other breeds, there are still 'wrinkles' to iron out in the Standard Dutch, some being out of type, either too big or too racy. The shape of the head seeming to be the biggest difficulty, trying to get a good head on a body with the correct type, and the correct markings seems like a tall order in most cases.

When I first became a 'Dutchman' (female version!) all those years ago, I was firmly convinced that breeding a Flyer was more luck than judgement, and that given the same luck as others seemed to enjoy, I too could produce consistent winners. Having bred more dinners than winners over the years, time has mellowed my ideas and I now accept that breeding the Perfect Dutch has more to do with Genetics and sheer dogged determination and perseverance than with any sort of luck.

Some of our judges also have a preference for the wider blazed Rabbit, whilst others call them Gay-Faced and plump for the ones with the narrow blaze. So it seems a clear case of Horses for Course, or similarly Rabbits for Judges! So breeding to standard or as near as possible to the guides laid down by the powers that be, seems to be the best way of going about it.

I've found through the years that line-breeding produces the best results, and having line-bred consistently now for the past eleven years, I now attribute my success to that. Knowing the genes that each individual rabbit carries makes for easier selection when it comes to a mate for any one rabbit. My results seeming to back up this theory, as the improvement in stock is nothing short of phenomenal! The ratio of good to bad is now 70% of all litters born being of reasonable appearance with a good proportion of those being of showable quality.

The Dutch content of any General Show in this Country is usually quite high, with something like 20% being Dutch.

In the Dutch Specialist Shows put on by various clubs, the numbers obviously vary from time to time, but around 200 is usually about right. Blacks and Blues predominate usually, but of late, the colours are coming into their own, and maybe the day will dawn when the colours beat the blacks hands down. But there is a great deal of work still to be done before that happy day arrives!

Dutch Breeders are very popular over here, there being a large percentage at each show, a cross section in ages too, ranging from the very young 5-6 year olds, to the older ones of 60 to 70 year olds.

Our youngest member is, I believe, 5 years old, and our oldest to date is 76 years old, and a Dutch Breeder all his life, also a Judge of a great many years standing.

I myself, although having been a judge for quite a few years, have not yet reached such an exalted position as being an honorary member.

Personally I just love the Dutch Rabbits and will never 'defect' to another breed, rather will I try to introduce new colours etc., to keep the interest high.

JR? OR WHAT?

After reading some old Dutch Reporters, and the statement by Mr. Frisby in the last issue, I started thinking alot about the Jr. classes of Dutch.

Since Dutch are a comparatively small breed, if you happen to have a fast developing Jr., you could conceivably be showing a Jr. that is bigger than the Srs. that are being shown. With a lot of the judges that seem to lean towards the commercial type rabbit, this large Jr. catches their eye. To alot of Dutch Breeders, this is not right. On the other hand, since the only limitation to Jrs. is under 6 months, this larger rabbit deserves every consideration of the smaller ones.

Then too, it is embarrassing to show a Jr. that is 4½ lbs. or better. At least to me it is. So what do you do? Leave the large Jr. at home, when it might be the best Dutch you have? Or do you push it up into the Sr. class where it looks like it belongs but should not be? This is quite a dilemma.

Over the years I have been going to shows and raising Dutch, there has been much discussion on providing some other rule pertaining to the Jr. class. Such as a weight limit.

They have this stipulation in the Florida White standard. The top weight for Srs. is only ½ lb. more than the Dutch, but they do specify not over 4½ lbs. for Jrs.

In the Tans, top Sr. weight is 6 lbs. for does, 5½ lbs. for bucks, similar to the Dutch or Florida White, but they too, like the Dutch only state "under 6 months" for Jrs.

I have no suggestions for this problem, nor do I have any preference. I would like to hear from some other breeders as to what they think about, or what they would do in this situation. Do you show that "Big" Jr. as a Jr., or what???

" A STITCH IN TIME SAVES NINE "

by Bill Geitzenauer.....New Jersey....

About this time of year we in the east are in the fruitful period of rabbit production. God only knows why the huge majority of Dutch and rabbits generally find the mating call a call to reproduction.

Even though I have mentioned it before, look over the does and bucks as to type and markings but more important, the bone structure. Straighten those hind legs out and look for the "knee joint" being out of alignment denoting crooked legs. Also the hind quarters being "pinched" instead of being rounded. The side view of the Dutch instead of curving from the back of the ears to the tail, it being flat for a couple of inches then perhaps slightly curved. Also the flat back seen on an awful lot of Dutch or the sudden plunge close to tail where it is as if the Dutch were cut off like a cliff.

Don't breed bad type or generic (bone) defects unless you really know what you're doing and expect to cull heavy for a couple of generations.

If possible, have another breeder look them over and being a true friend, let them give constructive criticism. Sometimes the owners are too "close" to the stock and can't see the trees for the forest. A mistake in breeding at this time of ripeness could cost you elimination of half your head in two or three years.

Judges are now more aware of genetic defects and have started culling out their show table full of classes because they have to. At one time a judge could expect 6 or 8 in a class. Now classes run 8-14 particularly in black and at National Shows, 30 to 40.

This spring do something perhaps different than usual. Don't just throw doe to buck indiscriminately, look them over before hand. Plan ahead. If having trouble with pinched hindquarters and you don't have any without, look for stock to "add" and eliminate by culling any with the fault.

It will take about three generations but I'd rather have good type/ no generic faults over a well marked Dutch unable to be used for breeding that no one wants!

A Genetic look at the color of your Rabbit

by Jennifer Gioielli of Gioielli's
Rabbitry

PART I

There are four sets of genes; A and a, B and b, D and d and E, eg and e; capital letters dominant over lower case letters. Every animal derives one gene of each set of genes from each parent. Which gene and how it combines with its dependent gene tells the story of the color of the young.

The A and E Series

A is the agouti factor, so all Steel and Gray must be A- (meaning AA or Aa). The E, eg, e set of genes determines amount of banding. An animal with EE will always be solid (Black, Blue or Chocolate, depending on other genes) whether A- or aa is present. An animal with Eeg or Ee and A- will be a Steel or variation such as blue-steel. The Eeg and/or Ee allows for black hairs with a band (not as wide as found in gray). If animal has Eeg or Ee but has aa, it will be a solid because of the lack of the agouti factor. To be an agouti there must be present A- and eg or e. An animal with eg e or eg eg and A- will be gray or variation like blue-gray. Combinations of eg and/or e allow for wide banding, found in grays, if A- is present. Again, the A- must be present as aa will produce solid color. An animal with ee will be yellow; combined with A- it will be yellow agouti or fawn. If animal has ee and aa it will be tortoise or possibly fawn.

Conclusion using only A and E series:

Black or other solid: A-EE
aaE-
aaeg-

Steel: A-E-

Gray: A-eg-

Tortoise: aaee

yellow: A-ee

The B and D Series

The B and D series depend on each other just as the A and E series. B- allows for Black color whereas bb is Brown or as we would call it, Chocolate. The D series is dilution factor; D- allows for natural color whereas dd dilutes color.

Conclusion using only B and D series:

Black: B-D-

Blue: B-dd

Chocolate: bbD-

Tortoise: B-D-

lilac: bbdd

Steel and Gray cannot be included since B and D series allows for solid color only.

Conclusion using all four sets of genes:

All animals of a given color must carry one of the series of genes outlined for that color with one possible exception, Gray. This subject will be covered more extensively in Part II which will deal strictly with genetic possibilities for Steel, Gray and variations thereof. Isn't it a shame our kits are not born with little tags telling us their genotype? All levity aside, your rabbits are what is put into them as well as what was put into them.

All genetic information for this article was obtained from our present Dutch guide book however I feel my presentation is more understandable to the average person. For the most part we are hobbyists, not scientists. We need as much genetic information as we can get to continue to better our animals; but, it must be made available to us in laymans language if it is to benefit us.

In closing I am sending out a call to all our members to help me in conducting an experiment in Gray genetics. The old adage of Gray to Gray begets Gray would be genetically false according to the system I translated from the guide book; unless--. In other words, there may be another factor involved but to prove or disprove this factor, with any degree of validity, data from mass breedings is needed. The only information I need from any breeder willing to participate in my project is the pedigree (color only) of both parents as far back as possible and the results of the kindlings i.e. number of young and color. Therein lies the catch. If you normally cull at birth to a day or two, I must ask you hold off until young are at least seven days old to be absolutely sure of color. WHAT IS A STRAIN?

The following article was submitted by Tom Shufflebotham and written by James Blyth.

There are many books that are written on the science of rabbit breeding, such as Scientific Aspects of Rabbit Breeding by C.N. Pickard. However, many of these books which are written by scientists and professors contain language which the average layman does not understand. Therefore, it is of little use to the average rabbit breeder. Rabbit breeders as a rule are working people although their ranks do carry many well educated people who understand the terms used by these scientific men. The vast majority of rabbit breeders are lost to get a good understanding of the real scientific method of breeding fancy rabbits.

The definition of science is a systemize collection of knowledge and this can be simplified without many big words or anything that might lead the average breeder to misunderstand the proper procedure of the scientific breeding of rabbits.

This collection of knowledge has been obtained through experience and experiments over a long period of time, and has proven trustworthy and practical in every sense of the word. There are a number of people who advertise they are offering for sale some particular strain of rabbits. Upon purchasing the rabbits, the purchaser finds out if he or she has an understanding of pedigrees that they came from several breeders and are not actually a strain. The real trouble leads up that the average rabbit breeder doesn't know what constitutes a strain.

A strain is a family of rabbits or a breed that is bred closely in relationship to obtain certain desirable results. Unless the rabbits are closely selected bred for a period of years it cannot be classified as a strain. Strains of rabbits over the years have indicated they belong to a certain family that was closely bred and selected bred for certain characteristics such as the buck owned by Strickland Bros. known as the "Cobby Buck". This buck was not produced by Strickland Bros. but rather imported and when mated to most any other doe would produce a certain characteristic which the buck showed himself which had been carefully line bred and in bred and selective bred in England before coming to this Country. This buck contained a very desirable color. His markings were heavy and his ears were the outstanding factor that he was a specimen that had been produced by a certain breeder who had bred this type of ear into his Dutch as there were no other Dutch before or since in the United States that has ever carried this type ear.

Another example, an old breeder J.B. Carlton, who bred New Zealand Reds for years. He had much experience in chicken breeding before taking on rabbits. After several years he had produced a type and color in his reds that was almost impossible to distinguish one rabbit from the other. Another example might be a breeder of today, Glen Johnson. Years ago he was breeding for stops in Dutch alone. The fact that he had bred them so closely that he did lose type and color that almost every rabbit produced had excellent stops. These strains indicate the good that selective line breeding and in breeding can do, however, it can do many harmful things such as a breeder by the name of Sickman of Western New York some years ago was breeding Lilac rabbits and it was noticed in his herd some of the rabbits had

side carried ears. This was called to his attention, however, he bred on the same way, driving for a particular color and lost sight of his ear carriage. In a few years time, every rabbit exhibited and in Sickman's hutches had side carried ears.

To be successful in rabbit breeding, you must first have the knowledge of when a rabbit is in good health and under no condition should rabbits be bred when they show any indication they are low in vitality or subjected to some disease. This can be indicated by watching the rabbit's eyes. If they are bright and bold, the rabbit generally is in good health. If the coat is slick and smooth is another indication, --if the flesh is firm and solid, that is still another indication. All of these indications should be taken into consideration before any selective breeding is carried on. Health and vitality is the most important thing in rabbit breeding, and without them you are sure to fail.

The next step is to obtain a copy of the Standard of Perfection, the latest revised rules and study them carefully and draw a picture in your mind of just the type rabbit that is described in the Standard. In some cases, particular breeders are more fortunate than others such as the Dutch and English which have a perfect drawing and they can paint this perfect drawing in their minds and work towards it. However, you must know thoroughly and understand well the Standard and it's requirements, defects and the fine points in your rabbits before starting on this procedure.

After one has started to put to work on a strain, there is one thing that possibly they better bear in mind and that is this is a long drawn out process. There is no short cuts to success. Only perseverance, patience and careful study of the animals at hand will lead to success after a period of years of practicing selective breeding or line breeding.

If one step is made wrong and it is not quickly noted by the breeder and the second mating is made from the animals with this defect, it is stamped into the strain or into the breeding and a person must go to an outcross which stops right there the action towards the strain of rabbits.

The trouble with the American breeders is they do not have the patience, they do not stay with one breed. They want something that will win for them in a year or two or three. This is not possible as nature doesn't work quite that simple and easy. It must be thoroughly understood that inbreeding and line breeding will work for the bad as well as the good. Therefore, if you are not careful and do not have a correct understanding of the Standard or take a chance on breeding sickly rabbits together, you are in trouble.

There are breeders who buy winning rabbits from year to year with the expectation they will produce winning rabbits. Such is not the case. In many cases these often produce very poor rabbits because many of these winners just happen by luck and not plan and the breeder has no idea how he produced the winner other than he just mated two rabbits. Many breeders and fanciers are continually purchasing new stock and outcrossing with their own. As a result there is a conglomeration of mixed breedings that couldn't possibly bring you a winning rabbit under these conditions. But with careful selection of the stock you have at hand, watching color, type and markings and making sure you do not breed two animals together that might have a defect thus stamp it into your breeding operation.

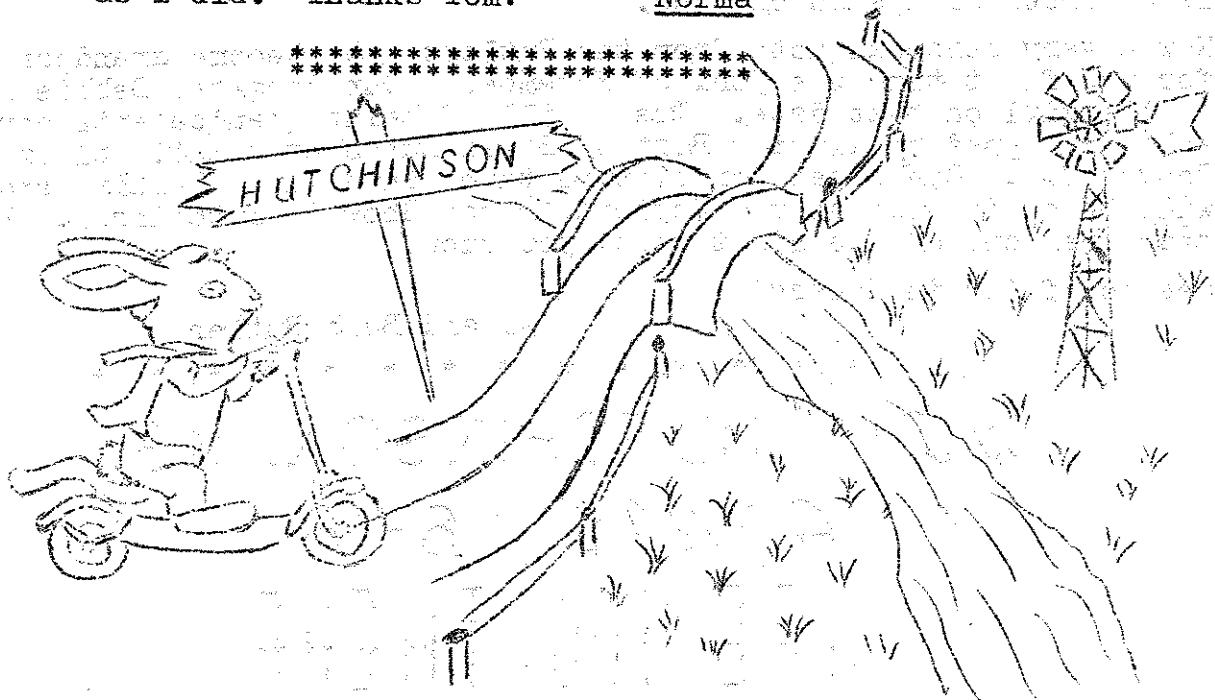

There are some people who argue Dutch and English rabbits cannot be produced in this manner and the best offspring comes from mismarked rabbits. Such is absolutely not the case. They may, in rare occasions, produce a good specimen, but to go along and win, build up a strain with the winning characteristics, they will not do it. For example, it is said that White New Zealands can be bred in this manner but English and Dutch cannot. Yet;--Jackie Boughton, one of our present day breeders, was 15-20 years ago raising White New Zealands and winning every place he showed. He had a distinctive strain of firm flesh and good fur on these rabbits so that Jackie's strain of white could be told in any showroom. But when he started on Dutch, many said it won't work in the fancy rabbit. But he has done the same thing in Dutch that he did in New Zealands, therefore, this brings out the fact that you cannot produce winning rabbits unless you select the best specimens at hand and those that carry good color, type and markings and inbreed or line breed around these particular things.

There are very few strains, real strains, in the United States. This is all due to the misunderstanding of the things I have mentioned above. I trust all will make a study of selective breeding and make their animals accordingly and when they have a good understanding of this, then breed around the blood lines and not use so many out-crosses which brings us a conglomeration of colors, markings, type and fur. I hope this article will be of some help in producing better fancy rabbits in the United States in the future. It has proven by items I have cited it can be helpful and it has been proven in England that such breeders as C.B. Thompson, Mr. Dangerfield, Ford Bros., Phillips and many others that after many years of careful understanding of the Standard and using the same bloodlines they have produced winners. This will give us a greater fancy in the United States so we never need to look to another country for breeding stock.

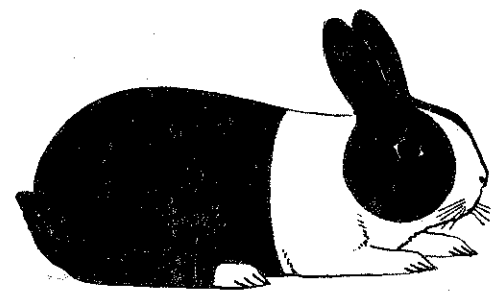

DUTCH REPORTER EDITORIAL POLICY

NAME: The official organ of the Dutch Rabbit Club shall be known as the Dutch Reporter.

OBJECTIVE: The objective of the Dutch Reporter shall be to assist the American Dutch Rabbit Club to promote the Dutch rabbit, encourage the breeding of better Dutch, serve as an entertaining and educational media for the membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club and provide a necessary link between the executive body and the membership.

CONTENT: The Dutch Reporter shall contain only those articles, reports, news items and advertising that can properly be considered pertinent to the American Dutch Rabbit Club, its members and the rabbit it sponsors. All material that appears in the Dutch Reporter shall be judged by whether it is educational, informative, constructive and/or newsworthy. It shall never be used for personal promotion, personal attacks or articles that would tend to reflect unfavorably upon the American Dutch Rabbit Club and/or the Dutch Rabbit.

The preceding paragraph shall not be construed to mean that articles of a controversial nature should be rejected. To the contrary, controversy sparks interest, thought and participation. However all articles must reflect good taste, be constructive in intent and absolutely free from personalities. All articles used in the Dutch Reporter shall be correctly identified as to author.

DUTCH REPORTER COMMITTEE: The Dutch Reporter shall be the proper business of a committee of five. The Chairman of the Committee shall be the Editor of the Dutch Reporter. One Committee Member shall be the duly appointed Publicity Director. Three committee members shall be appointed from the Board of Directors by the President.

DUTCH REPORTER COMMITTEE DUTIES: The Chairman shall receive all articles, news and reports. Any article or item that might be considered in conflict with the content objective of this publication shall be submitted to the other committee members for ruling, by mail. It shall take a 2/3 vote of approval for it to be published.

The Publicity Director as committee member shall constantly and actively solicit advertising to help defray the expense of publishing a necessary and worth while Dutch Reporter.

The Board Members as Committee Members shall be responsible for at least one article in each issue of the Dutch Reporter. In addition they shall solicit at least one article from each elected official during the calendar year. The articles should be of an instructional and educational nature.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS: Should any committee member neglect the responsibilities of his office and fail to follow the intent of this editorial policy, he shall be asked by the President to resign his said office; in case of failure to do so, the Board of Directors by a 2/3 vote shall declare the office vacant. It shall then be the duty of the President to make an appointment to fill the vacancy.

This editorial policy shall not be considered restrictive or censorship in any form. Rather it provides an outline for the editor and committee members to properly provide the type of official organ that will aid the growth of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, the promotion of the Dutch Rabbit and the usefulness of the Dutch Reporter.

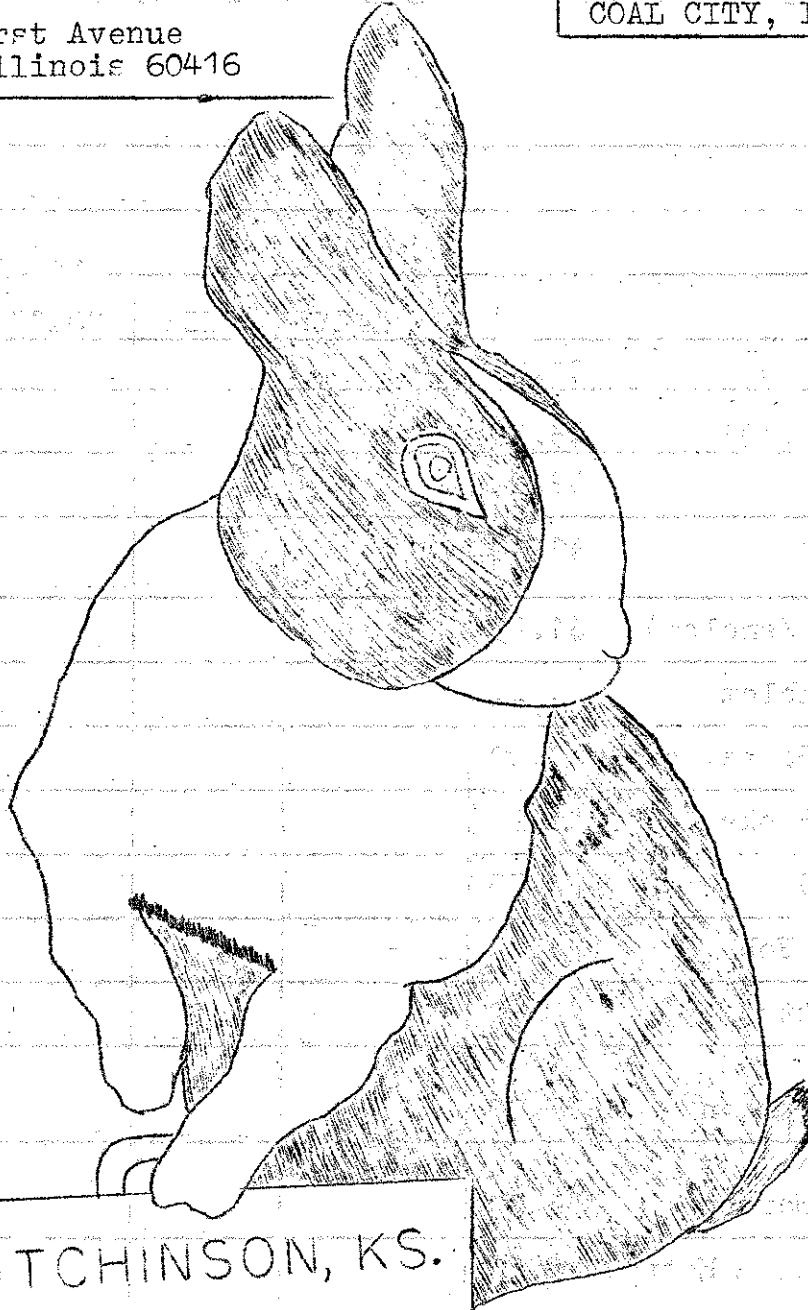
