

I know that Jack Wireman will be accepting any contributions for the NDS up until the first rabbit goes up on the table. So if you have forgotten to send off your support, dig down in your pocket and send that special to the Ohio crew. I sure would like to see about 500 Dutch at this year's NDS. (And that's just for open.) Another 100 Dutch could be expected from the youth, a far cry from my first youth NDS where there was only 5. Everything about the Canton Dutch Show is promising; an excellent location and facility, one of the finest group of Dutch members sponsoring the show, two ace Dutch judges, an outstanding list of specials, the promise of fine fellowship and showmanship, and of course the opportunity to invade Ohio with the chance to come home a big winner. # SECRETARY'S MESSA



604 Ballots have been mailed out. You will note on the inside page of this D.R. that if your membership expired anytime before March 1, 1983, you were not issed a ballot. Please take the time to VOTE. Those, whose terms will expire this year are; President, Scott Williamson and Directors Geitzenauer, Watters and Dietrich. Please be certain to fill out your ballot properly. Those without a return address will not be counted. Ballots must be in the hands of the Election Chairman by May 15th.

At the time of this writing, we have 107 husband/wife memberships, 254 youth, and 428 single. This is a total of 896 members. Some of these memberships have expired within the last couple of weeks, or will expire shortly. Please check your card and see if it is time to renew. There is a 60 day grace period for the Dutch Reporter, but after that, your name is removed from the files.

To date for this year, I have issued 213 sanctions! I have had to return quite a few as their dates were for May during the NDS and within a 500 mile radius of the show. I hope we continue to issue that amount throughout the year.

This office has been receiving some show reports with exhibitors names being divided, instead of one. Confusing? I thought so! For example: Dick Gehr and I show under "Nor-Dick Rabbitry, Dick Gehr." My name appears on nothing. Therefore, all of the points we accumulate all go under Nor-Dick, Dick Gehr. Should Dick show at a show and enter the rabbits as normal, and then I show at that show and enter rabbits under Norma Hart, the points will not be combined. Another example: John and Jane Doe; Some reports come in as John and Jane Doe while others come in with John Doe as an exhibitor, showing 3 blacks, and Jane Doe as an exhibitor show-2 blues and 1 tort. If they were exhibited seperately, the points are totaled individually. Please remember this when showing!

Another thing that this office has encountered is that some sponsoring clubs have not been paying the required specials for the Dutch. Some catalogs have stated that so many had to be shown in the variety before the \$1.00 would be paid. As long as ten or more Dutch are shown in the breed, the variety specials must be paid. Some clubs have only placed specials on BOB and BOS while others leave out some of the varieties. If you should encounter this at a show that you are attending, please notify the show officials. The ADRC's only requirement is \$6.00, \$1.00 for each variety and is a very small amount compared to many.

Remember the dates: May 6, 7 and 8. I do hope that you are all looking forward to Canton and a mighty fine NDS! The Ohio crew is very well organized and I'm sure that they have a swell time planned for us all. Remember the "Seller's Class", adult and youth! Pedigrees must accompany the rabbit! This is an ideal time to purchase some quality stock for your herd and also to enable some to purchase stock from YOU! Adults and youth are encouraged to bid in both sales! Let's make this class a huge success. Plan now to place a rabbit in this class - everyone benefits!

#### DIRECTOR CARLTON, from Arizona

Here in Arizona we finished two shows last month, February 5th. & 6th., with very good turnouts of Dutch. We were priviledged to have Scott Williamson judge on the 5th. with 79 Dutch being shown. On February 6th., we had another midwest Judge, Kyle Cunningham, do 87 Dutch. Dutch in our area has increased with several new youth and adult breeders.

I would like to discuss a subject that comes up around here many times in a year. What would you use to start a breeding program in Dutch? In order to answer that question, I would recommend that breeder's first order of business be; get good stock from a breeder that you can trust. To me, this is the most important part of a breeding program. I would also recommend that they look for the following:

- Good type. a full rounded body, short and cobby. Avoid long bodies, pinched hip, flat hips and undercut hips. If you don't have good type, you don't have good Dutch.
  - Next, I would look for good Dutch fur. Good density and a short coat.Stay away from thin coats and long fur.
  - 3. Color is most important. Make sure you get good glossy color that runs deep toward the skin. Avoid light, faded, mealy colored rabbits, especially any that have brown tinges. This is most important in blacks, blues, grays and chocolates.

4. Head and ears are next on the list. A rounded, full head with a very short neck, set close to the shoulders, is a good Dutch head. Ears to be in porportion to the size of the head and body. They should be carried erect and well furred.

I look upon the above 4 items as 80% of your Dutch rabbit. It is very hard to breed out poor type, fur, color or head and ears. Get these good qualities in your Dutch and you will have a good start to a winning herd. I think these qualities are more important than markings.

Now it is time to look at markings and I rate them as follows in order of importance. The same was a second majam ad maja kupa at



- 1. Blaze, cheeks
- 2. Saddle
- 3. Stops
- 4. Undercut

ou to lighter he religi Blaze and cheeks are very important. I don't breed a rabbit with a drag into the mouth or with high cheeks. Only breed those with good cheeks, well rounded, and a good blaze. Avoid a narrow blaze. Saddle, even and well defined place near the front feet. Stops, 1/3 of the way down on foot, starting from toes. Having these even is more important than length. Undercuts: avoid drags if possible. Get as even as possible and well defined as possible. Neck: I prefer a clean neck. If I have to do without on neck markings, I would make it hairline or wedge. After all, there are only 5 points on neck and these are broken up between the three areas, clean neck - hairline - wedge.

The important parts of the Dutch are, type, color, fur, head and ears. Then you must have fairly good markings. If you have the good type, color, fur, head and ears, it will show off your markings to the best advantages even if they are only fair markings. You want an eye appealing animal, especially the parts that a judge can see easily. I think that most judges give an advantage to animals who are very appealing, clean and glossy. In Dutch, you need all the help you can get as some judges tend to take a small fault and cut severely, especially when judging best in show.

## DIRECTOR GEITZENAUER, from New Jersey

"Culling Dutch"

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

One of the most exasperating experiences, when raising Dutch, is that of culling. This is the process of selecting both future show animals, as well as potential breeders. Now that the "kit" are born, what is to be saved, and what sold off?

The first question you must ask yourself is what were you trying for. Did you expect the results to have produced better bodies, heads or markings? After you have established, in your mind, if you were breeding for a particular trait, look over the litter from the top view in the box. Before you do this, allow them to grow at least 2 weeks, unless you see something obviously wrong. This could be white in the ears, a spot in the dark section or in the white, long head or body or excessive lack of dark color, like very high cheeks or long white hocks.

At two weeks, or earlier, unless you're raising some for pets or meat, discard the obvious culls. Understand, that as these kits grow, they need cage room. If you don't have it, take that into consideration. Look into their eyes to see if they are both the same color and fit the standard for eye color. Next, eliminate the runts (very small ones) as they make poor breeders and probably will never develope type or senior weight. Look carefully at the very large ones, and unless they are exceptional in type and markings, cull them out. Remember that the ideal Dutch weighs 4½ lbs. as seniors but will show well at a little over 4 and less than 5.

Hopefully, you will have a few left that can be raised until the next cull at 6 weeks. At this time, look over each again, particularly the type. Are they close coupled? (Head close to body, - head rounded in both directions, body oval top view and side view.) Remember that we are not looking for "round" but rather oval. Do they have a back that rises as it goes from the short neck toward the tail with a "slight" curve in by the tail. Do the hips stick out on the top like two long lumps? Are the back hocks straight or do they look like duck's legs that angle out? Is the hind end by the tail rounded, or does it look like the prow of a boat, slightly pointed? Is there excessive white hairs in the dark section? At this age, they should have none, but tolerating a few would be normal. Is the hair long? Five eights of an inch to three quarters would be normal. Perhaps lastly, are the teeth straight and no spots in the eyes?

All of the above are faults as well as obvious things like short stops or long stops, saddle sway, cheeks into whisker bed, etc.

If you can now say that all of the above are not present, you have produced the "perfect Dutch!" A wee secret is that it has never been done!

Pick the ones you want to save for yourself, but look for those with outstanding features with one or two defects, over those with no outstanding points but "passable" in other points. Try not to save those with the same defects as the parents. It will tend to "concrete" it into your strain.

The next cull period is at 6 months old when you will do it all over again. If your kits have survived this long, you are on your way, and should be quite pleased with yourself. The important point to remember is to cull to a point where you are pleased, but do not be a perfectionist. There is no "perfect Dutch!"

  - B. Youth Seller's Class will be judged seperately
  - C. Alternate open and youth in selling order
  - D. Pedigree papers MUST be presented at the time of sale
  - 2. A judging clinic will be conducted for the youth
- 3. Explanation of all the youth programs and contests.
  - This will include a discussion on Sweepstake Points

At your local shows, you should be signing up all the non-members that are showing their rabbits. Take some blank forms with you and sign them at the shows. With some special effort, we could really have a fine youth club and some very challenging programs and contests. Let's make it the best youth club in the rabbit industry!

#### FEEDING AND MANAGEMENT

Here are some feeding and management practices that I have found helpful, and I hope they will help others. Some of these are my own methods, but many are tips and advice that I have borrowed from many dedicated and helpful breeders of Dutch.


First and foremost, clean cages, clean feeders and clean water go a long way towards promoting the good health and act to prevent disease in the herd. In addition, I try to disinfect everything at least once a month. I feed once a day, in the evening, and hand feed each rabbit somewhere between 3-4 ounces. Does with litters receive as much as they will clean up, but one caution, please don't overfeed. Overfeeding will cause real trouble in the rabbitry, so by all means, limit feed. As for the feeds I use, I try to stay with a 14-16% rabbit pellet and then I may supplement this, depending on the condition, with a tablespoon of oats, calf manna, or cracked corn. Go easy on the treats. Too much of a good thing can cause digestive In the summer I like to treat the rabbits to a comfrey leaf every now and then. It's great for their general well being. I also keep aqua-vite, which is a mineral and vitamin supplement, in their water year round and once a month I medicate with Terramycin in the water for approximately 4 days. The next month I may use Sulfamethazine in the water for 3 days, but I try to alternate and keep medication I use to a minimum.

I am a big user of vinegar in the water at breeding time for 3 or 4 days before you are ready to breed a doe. It really helps conception rates. I put the nest box in with the does 3 to 4 days before they are due, and in the winter I have used bunny warmers, cardboard, newspaper and insulation board around the sides and straw for nesting continued.....

material with good success. In the summer, I try to keep the nest box as cool as possible.

In culling, I like to give the little ones time to develope to their full potential. There are some that are late bloomers, so give them a little time to develope out some of that bloom and see what you I try to breed closely to one strain, carefully studying the pedigrees, and even experimenting now and then, but more consistent success will come, I feel, staying with one strain closely.

I hope some of these ideas will help. Keep looking into that hutch for that one special "Best of Breed" Dutch!

I especially appreciate a friend for his help and knowledge in getting me started raising Dutch rabbits. He, himself, is a long time Dutch breeder. His name is Mr. Ray Willey.

is Mr. Ray Willey. I was only 4 at the time, back in 1967. I was showing horses and needed a second project for 4-H at the Fair. A friend introduced me to Mr. Willey. That day, I purchased a pair of Dutch. Those Dutch put me at the top of the Fair and the talk of the rabbit barn. I then went to the State Fair and did very well with blues and blacks from Mr. Willey and torts from Mr. Cooper.

At that time, I was still showing horses all over the state, and the rabbits just sat in their cages. As the years passed, boys were looking better then the rabbits, and the rabbits would remain at the bottom of my list. Again, more years passed and I got married and had a son. My husband thought rabbits were a "pain in the neck," and took alot of time.

Finally, last year, 1982, we sold the horses and moved to a home by St. Clair. I've got my Dutch, and my husband and son have their fishing and boats. I've got my Dutch next to our neighbor's house, so I have to keep them extra clean.

I decided to join the ARBA, the Michigan State RBA and the Eastern Michigan RBA, a local club. To my surprise, I met Mr. Willey. I again purchased more Dutch, but this time I was determined to show with them.

I went to 4 sanctioned shows in Michigan. I received, all together, 11 legs, 1 Grand Champion, 6 times BOB, 5 times BOS, 5 times Best Black, 5 Best Opp. Black, 2 times Best Blue, 4 times Best Gray and 1 times Best Opp. Gray. I am very happy with my first year and very thankful to Mr. Willey.

I found something interesting, even better than placing with my Dutch. I found out that the Dutch breeders in Michigan are a special type of people. They are very warm, helpful, friendly, and most of all, very enjoyable people to show with. They are unlike the people over the past years that I have met and competed with in showing horses, or in sports events that I have been in. Those type of people are out for blood and even go as far as to harm you or your animals !

For this issue of the Dutch Reporter, I though I would write in and tell everyone a little about the 4-H Clubs in this part of the country and their members who raise Dutch.

At non-ARBA sanctioned shows (4-H), there's a class that is called the "mismarked Dutch class." I wanted to share this with you because alot of people have not heard about this type of class before. These are the rabbits that can never be shown at any ARBA sanctioned show since they'd be disqualified. The mismarked Dutch is not judged according to the animal's type, head, ears and etc., but the fly-back and overall condition of the coat.

To expect to win in this class, you must exhibit a rabbit that is in good condition and in good health. Naturally, a rabbit that is in poor health certainly won't have a clean, glossy coat. You should also be sure that the rabbit isn't in a molt.

Awards vary from show to show. Usually, there is a nice rosette offered for Best Mismarked Dutch. There is usually no trophy given for it, unless you were to have an enormous amount of exhibitors and entries. The Best Mismarked Dutch can also sometimes compete for Best in Show since at some shows, is considered a breed by itself.

I feel the mismarked Dutch class is very fair. The person who thought this up fully realized how hard it is for children who raise Dutch and try to come out with something with nice markings. During the winter, Thumper would receive plenty of alfalfa to keep him warm, and a salt pellet which lasted during the whole year. When the family moved to St. Louis, we prepared him for the trip by walking him on a leash. He took a trip with the family to Wisconsin. After some months in his new home in St. Louis, he ran without the leash throughout the huge back yard. He learned to follow and chase after the boys. From this, he also learned to run around the baseball bases.

One day when Thumper was out he even chased a neighborhood dog who didn't know what to make of the situation. Thumper had a craving for apples and also chased other wild rabbits around the yard. During the hot St. Louis summers, we would put burlap bags, soaked in water, over his hutch to keep him cool. He has stayed in motels overnight, visited Mark Twain's home in Hannibal, Mo. and gone on many family trips.

My wife and I will be making a visit to the Chicago area on the 2nd. and 3rd. of June and would like very much to come and visit with you and also purchase another rabbit.

Do the majority of that breeder's animals have that look, feel, etc.? If they do, then that one eye catching rabbit is not a fluke or a one shot
- 2. Also, I note if a breeder is raising good junior animals. Usually the junior class animals were raised by the breeder exhibiting. This is not always the case in the senior classes as the exhibitor may have purchased the animals and shown them for a year or so.

The following letter was sent to each ADRC Officer, each member of the Standards Committee and to Mr. Al Meier. This was sent over two months ago and each contained a self addressed, stamped envelope. I felt that this way, the response would be of no expense to anyone. To date,, 4 of the officers have not answered, and only 1 of the ADRC Standards Committee sent me a reply. Mr. Meier was very prompt with his answer. It seems that some have shown no interest in the Dutch standard. This is very disheartening!

In my mind, our standard needs some revision. My letter points out what I feel needs looked into and given consideration. I would like each member to consider this letter, and if you care one way or the other, please let someone know!

Nothing is ever so perfect that it can't use a little revision, so let's take a close look at our Dutch standard. Now is the time to think about these things so they can be discussed at Canton.

Let's not be afraid to give our opinions on these, as it is for the benefit of the ADRC, it's members, and the Dutch rabbit.

#### Fellow Dutch Club Members;

As we will soon be having an updated Guide Book coming out, I would like to express my opinion on several things.

First is the controversy on the gray color. After seeing several letters in the Dutch Reporter pertaining to this, and an article by Al Meier in the Domestic Rabbits, I figured the Dutch Club membership would be seeing something concerning this by the ADRC Standards Committee. Will we be seeing some kind of solution to this problem, or will it remain unchanged?

Second, I wonder if the Blue's eye color should not be worded a little different? Dark blue could mean anything from ink colored to the color of the ocean, which would probably be closer to the blue in the eye of a blue-eyed Polish or Netherland. These both use the words "dark blue" in their eye color description.

Next, and I know it has been a sore spot for some time, is CONDITION. Many Dutch breeders scream when they hear a judge use the word condition when giving comments on a Dutch rabbit. I believe there should be some points on condition in

the Dutch standard. After all, If I spend time and effort trying to get my rabbits in good condition, I think there should be some justified merit for it. If two animals are judged the same, I believe the condition of the rabbit should be considered, legitimately, when making the final decision.

Listed under "body type" in the Dutch standard, the last sentence says "flesh firm and solid, skin to be tightly drawn over the flesh, making the coat tight and hard to grasp." This, in essence, is the same as part of the ARBA definition of CONDITION.

Under "fur" of the ADRC standard, it states "in good condition and free from molt and stain." This is also, essentially said in the ARBA description of CON-DITION.

In going through the standard, I find that Dutch and Harlequins are the only two breeds that do not have points on condition. Are all of the other breeds foolish?

It is my belief that the general overall state of health and cleanliness of a rabbit should be considered when judging.

I had a talk with one of our members and in their opinion, they thought we would only be justifying those judges that use condition to place a Dutch, if we added points for condition. In my opinion, we do have points allocated for condition, they are just hidden under other headings. Let's think about bringing them out into the open so we can take advantage of them.

The full neck is another spot that needs something done. If the neck is indeed full, then the marking is missing, making it a disqualification. If we are not going to disqualify the rabbit for it, then let's clarify it in the standards.

Finally, I believe the description or definition of stops should be made clearer. Some of the judges can't even interpret the standards on this, so how are we supposed to? This should be made so that it can only be read one way, taking away any doubt.

It is hard enough to try and interpret the standards as you think the judges will, without having descriptions that can be taken different ways. Let's try to clarify, for our sake, as well as the judges'.

If any youth members have a pet rabbit that is ill, they should treat them immediately. The medical bill was well over fifty dollars, but after six years of feeding and petting the rabbit, I felt that the price was well worth it!

#### "STATISTICS"

#### By Dick Gehr, Sweepstakes Chairman

A year ago, I published statistics about our sanctioned shows, broken down by states. Some people thought it was interesting, so I'm doing it again. For those of you that have last year's March-April issue of the Dutch Reporter, I think you will find some of the comparisons interesting.

All of the figures are from the day after the 1982 NDS through March 27, 1983.

46 States, plus Canada have sanctioned Dutch at their shows. 5 states have had youth ADRC sanctions.

In the open competition, 15,764 Dutch have been shown in 438 sanctioned shows for an average of 36 Dutch per show. These Dutch have been shown by 409 ADRC members plus many non-members.

In the youth, 964 Dutch have been shown at 46 sanctioned shows for an average of 21 Dutch per show. These Dutch have been shown by 58 ADRC youth members and many, many non-members.

Following is the state by state break downs of these statistics.






