DILL'S LAW says never take a shower before going to the barn or put on good clothes - even when you're just running down to check a doe before leaving for town. They'll get 'ya!


QUALITY POINTS are an item that was discussed by your ADRC Board of Directors and the general membership while attending the ARBA Convention in Columbus this past October. The main problem with the ideas suggested for quality points was that a rabbit winning Best of Breed over 150 rabbits would receive the same points as the rabbit who only had to beat 10 rabbits to be awarded BOB. At the general membership meeting, I suggested a method of awarding points that might satisfy everyone. This system would rate shows according to the number of DUTCH shown; Example - Class A might be 76 & over; Class B, 50-74; Class C, 25-49 and Class D, 1 to 24.

After checking through the show results that were published in the November/December issue of the DUTCH REPORTER, I found shows with less than 25 Dutch (46), less than 50 (24), less than 75 (10) and 76 & over - one show. In order for you to understand more fully, I'll include a hypothetical situation below.





Spring is just around the corner with its nice weather and abundance of shows. By the time you read this the 1987 National Dutch Show will be history and maybe someone will have been lucky enough to derail the E & S Express, although it would be nice to see them win three in a row. I personally did not get the chance to make the trip to Texas due to tests and work, but I have already checked on the possibility of flying out to Portland in October for the Convention. The 1987 Nationals will be the first one that I have missed in several years and I can assure you that it will have been on my mind the whole weekend. For those of you who have not been lucky enough to attend one you don't know what you are missing, it is one of the two most prestigious shows in the country. An early congratulations to the winners and to the others (my category) there is always the thought of next spring.

In this issue of the Dutch Reporter I have decided to share some of my record keeping methods which I hope someone will find helpful. The first page(s) is what I call the "Litter Record sheet", it allows you to record the litter number in the left hand box. I use this number for the tattoo number on the rabbits by giving the best rabbit the litter number and the second best receives the number plus a letter either B,M or D,F depending upon the sex of the animal. An example would be in a litter of 3 babbies if the best one was a buck it would receive ear number 1 and the second best was a doe so her ear number would 1D and the next male would be 1B. The next box is for the date of birth with the weaning date to go directly below it. The third and fourth box is were information concerning the buck and doe belong, there is room for their tattoo numbers and color of each. The next to the last box is for litter size information and the color of the offspring. The last box is for the tattoo numbers, color and sex of each rabbit with room out to the right for remarks.

Rabbit Performance Record sheet. The record sheet has room for extensive information the rabbit and its sire and dam. You may notice that there is no mention of the colors Grey or Steel, this is due to the fact that I have never owned one for a period long enough to add them to the sheets, the sheet can be made to fit anyones needs. The bottom half of the sheet is set up for production records on the rabbit and may be used for either sex. If the sheet is for a buck then it allows you to keep a record of his stud service and genetic throws.

Page C is for Livestock-Upkeep records and it allows you to record any business transaction during a period of time. The sheet is actually set up for monthly records and has room for the ear number and sex of any rabbit that you may sell or buy during that time. There is also room for purchases of feed to be recorded with its price and weight. The last two sections are for the purchase of equipment and other needed objects such as show expenses or memberships. If you would try and keep one of these record sheets you might be shocked at the amount you spend during a month.

The last page of records are for keeping track of your show animals. Page D is a Show Record Sheet which allows you to keep information on certain animals that are shown more often then others. The sheet has room for the name of the show, date of the show, the judge, place of finish, number in class, specials won and remarks made by the judge. This would enable you to go back through and see which judge your rabbit did better under for future shows and give a table record for the rabbit. The results of this sheet shouldn't be used as a reference for breeding since often the better show animals produce the worst offspring unless related which still doesn't produce a winner everytime.

I hope someone has found something helpful in the article and can make sense of it. Until next time, keep those nest boxes full and keep looking towards the future.

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE: Bill Geitzenauer, NJ

On behalf of my husband, Bill Geitzenauer, I'll write his report since he is required to but is not physically able to do so as yet. As most of you know, from seeing me at the 63rd ARBA convention, Bill suffered a stroke on October 9. He was totally paralyzed on the right side and speechless. Bill has made remarkable progress and during my stay at the convention I was told that he began to walk, although his speech still suffered severely. I was delighted to be able to bring him home a 2nd place ribbon won by his Steel doe. By Thanksgiving he was walking on his own and could come home on weekends.

Bill was discharged on December 18 and it was great having him home again! He continues speech therapy as an out patient. It's a big help for me having him home to help feed and clean our 60 bunnies (half of them - of course - Mini Lops!). He helped me breed some of my bunnies but didn't start breeding his again until February. We have our reservations for the National Dutch Show in Texas and are really looking forward to seeing everyone again.

Bill is still disappointed about how prevalent cow hocks are in the Dutch breed. More and more breeders and judges seem to be overlooking this serious defect which certainly doesn't enhance the cobby type of the breed. Although I still believe Mini Lops are tops, I have taken an interest in the Steel variety of Dutch as my secondary breed (though I won't tell my Mini Lop peers). I figure I have the time and patience to try to work out Larry Thompson's formula starting from scratch. In the meantime I've also agreed to help develop a pamphlet of information about the Dutch breed. Hopefully, it will be presented during the Board meeting in Texas.

We attended the last show of our winter season here in these northern parts on December 7th at the Stabbiteers Show in Somerville, NJ. There were 134 Dutch shown; Best of Breed went to Rickey Wood of Virginia with a Blue junior doe and Best Opposite went to Katie Fine of New Jersey with a Blue senior buck. Hi out there, being one of the so called "new kids on the block" I guess I really blew it last issue by being so slow I didn't get an article into our editor in time for printing. Sorry about that -- and so here goes.

I am 63 years old, married for the last 40 years to the same good woman Maxine, and am more or less retired. 



RULES? CHANGES or NO CHANGE?

We have some rules, but how far do we go?

Cowhocks are a problem. It seems to me a lot of so called cowhocks are a result of pinched or undercut rear ends. That is a fault on type - and should be discounted as such. If the judge sees that it is enough to warrant it, place the animal further down the line. If a breeder sees he is not going to win with this fault, they will try to correct this problem on their own. Everybody likes a winner. Some breeders are not going to like this decision but you are not going to please everybody. The judge is not in a popularity contest. The rules we already have, the judges differ on the severity or importance. A judge that handles the rabbits with care - a thorough look to each rabbit - being consistent and in their own mind, placing such animals, gains a lot of my respect. I never agree with every judge, even if I win sometimes, but I'll probably have respect for them. If a judge tries their best, that's about all we can ask of them.

They've changed the rules on the Grey Color twice that I can remember. I'm not a breeder of Grey Dutch, but after listening to some that are there still seems to be a lot of dissatisfaction.

They tried to change rules on the weights for Junior Dutch. The thinking behind this was: too heavy as a junior would make a larger senior. I've had 4½ lbs. juniors at 5 months of age, when they were 8 months to one year old they never did get over 4½ lbs. Fast maturing - some more than others!

It looks to me that some breeders let some faults get away from them. They don't win, so try to change the rules to fit their needs.

The Constitution and By-Laws: First changed to 9 Districts, after only 1 year try-out, don't think it will work so now want 3 Districts. We have some good and dedicated members that would be good prospects for being on the Board of Directors. But being in another State that is in the Same District as a person already holding a position, we can't elect them and use their abilities. Are we picking Officers and Directors only on where you live or qualifications? I'm not saying there are not qualified people in every District, but why tie it down? I believe if something is working well, why change it? Are we getting a stronger and unified Club? The voting percentage is a good indication.

Maybe if some changes are to be made, give them to a Constitution and By-Laws Committee say a year in advance, plenty of time for pros and cons to be printed in the Dutch Reporter. Members would have time for discussion at the National Shows and the committee could offer their recommendation as to their feelings to accept or reject for the best of the A.D.R.C. Let a well informed membership vote on each item as it deals with Their Club.

I have some strong convictions on some things but after discussing the topic, maybe I can see the other side and learn about a few things in a different light. So maybe I was wrong! Comments are welcome - these are my opinions and reasons - What's yours? If you have an opinion - write to Kay Stearns, State, I AGREE or DISAGREE and Why - even if it's just a couple of sentences. If I'm way off-base, say so - I don't mind. GOOD DISCUSSION make for a Stronger and more Unified Club!



I think that cow hocks is very much a problem in the Dutch breed. And I also think it has been overlooked for many years.


I also think that the problem has to be rendered by the breeders of Dutch by keeping track of the breeding stock. A breeder must choose the animals with the straight legs.

Therefore, it's up to the Judges to at least point this fault out. And also up to us breeders to try to eliminate cow hocks from within our own herds.




CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS

3-10-87

CONSTITUTION Article V:

- 53 19 Be it resolved that: Section 1 of the Constitution to strike the sentence: Each of the nine (9) Directors must reside in a different district.
- Accept Reject
- 66 6 Be it resolved that: Section 1 of the Constitution amend to read:
The elected officers of this association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, and nine (9) Directors who shall be elected for a three (3) year term, by and from the membership. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed by the President, approved by two-thirds majority of the Board of Directors, excluding the Secretary-Treasurer. The appointment of the Secretary-Treasurer will be for three (3) years. Any member, to be eligible for office, must be an owner and breeder of Dutch rabbits.
- Accept Reject
- 68 4 Be it resolved that: Section 2 of the Constitution amend to read:
The Secretary-Treasurer may be reappointed by the Board of Directors, who may also remove him/her from office, for cause, by a two-thirds majority, during any term of office. The Secretary-Treasurer will be an active voting member of the Board of Directors, except in the appointment or removal from the office of Secretary-Treasurer. The Board of Directors therefore, consists of the: President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer and nine (9) Directors. The term of any office shall begin on January 1 of the year following each election.
- Accept Reject
- 61 11 Be it resolved that: Section 3 of the Constitution amend to read:
The President and one (1) Director representing each district will be elected for a three (3) year tenure. The Vice-President and one (1) Director from each district will be elected the following year for a three (3) year tenure. Finally, the Secretary-Treasurer will be appointed and the final three (3) Directors each from a different district will be elected the third year to serve a three (3) year tenure. Directors may be from same state and district as other officers: President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer. The Directors representing each district will be elected by a vote of only those members living in that district. Direct may be nominated by any member of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.
- Accept Reject
- 55 17 Be it resolved that: Section 5 of the Constitution amend to read:
Directors shall be elected from the three (3) districts divided as follows:
- DISTRICT 1: Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia.
- DISTRICT 2: Alabama, Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Tennessee, Wisconsin.
- DISTRICT 3: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Kansas, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wyoming.

*Note: No foreign member will be eligible to hold office.

CONSTITUTION Article VI, add Section 2A:

- 65 7 No one person can run for more than one (1) office during any election.

BY-LAWS Article III, Section 2A to read:

72 0 An annual allotment of \$500.00 (five-hundred dollars) from the General Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show with further stipulation that the American Dutch Rabbit Club receive recognition for this allotment. Said money to be sent by the Secretary Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to January 1 preceding the National Dutch Show for that year. Show sponsors must have all National Dutch Rabbit Show judges secured before any A.D.R.C. allocation is made.

BY-LAWS Article III, Section 3A to read:

67 5 The Publicity Chairman shall be paid \$100.00 (one-hundred dollars) for each annual National Dutch Rabbit Show and American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention which he/she transports American Dutch Rabbit Club publicity items for sale at the club booth; such funds to be paid from the Publicity Funds.

BY-LAWS Article III, Section 1A add to read:

52 20 The sweepstakes chairperson shall receive \$1.00 (one dollar) per open show sanction paid from the open show sanction fee as remuneration to compensate for time and effort spent by said chairperson in calculating, tabulating, and reporting all show results. The sweepstakes chairpersons shall provide the Dutch Reporter editor with a typed copy of each show report listed chronologically and sweepstakes standing for both open and youth divisions listed numerically; top 20 open and youth divisions as well as the top 5 youth from each district.

ELECTION PROCEDURE CHANGE

55 17 A petition shall be requested from the secretary of the ADRC by any member who wishes to run for an ADRC office. The petition must be returned to the Secretary by June 1st, prior to an election with a required fifteen signatures, all of whom are American Dutch Rabbit Club members. All candidates must be current American Dutch Rabbit Club and American Rabbit Breeders Association members. Those signing a petition may only sign one (1) petition for the office of Director within your district.





1. All entries in this class subject to sale to the highest bidder. A minimum bid of \$10 to be set.
2. A \$0-50 per rabbit to consignors and National Dutch Rabbit Club will be in effect. (Consignors may donate their share to the National Dutch Rabbit Club if they so desire.)
3. No entry fee required for Seller's class. Entries to be given to Seller's Class Chairman. A separate caring area will be provided for the animals in the Seller's class.
4. Rabbits may or may not be eligible to register. Seller's class rabbits do not have to be entered in the open show, but they can be.
5. All rabbits have to have an accompanying pedigree. None will be accepted without pedigree. Rabbits are to have a permanent, readable ear number.
6. The Seller's class will be judged as one class without regard to age, sex, or color. (The Dutch Standard will be the Judging Guide.)
7. A Youth Seller's Class will precede the Open Seller's Class.
8. Seller's class will be held at the conclusion of all Open Judging.
9. The winner of the Seller's Class will receive:

 - A. A trophy from the American Dutch Rabbit Club and a one year membership in the ADRC.
 - B. The exhibitor with the highest selling price rabbit will win a one year membership in the ADRC. (No duplication of awards will be given if one rabbit wins the class and is also the highest priced animal.)

10. The Seller's class committee reserves the right to reject any sick, injured or poor specimen animals.
11. PLEASE ENTER QUALITY ANIMALS. THIS CAN ONLY BE NEFITT ALL CONCERNED.
12. If trio or pair are entered, only one breeder's designated rabbit will be judged. The others will sell with that individual.

Getting up in the morning and arriving at a show on time is not hard. Having a couple cups of coffee and talking to some of the other people is easier yet! Putting on the show coat and getting behind the table doesn't even present a problem. But when it comes to pleasing the exhibitors, that's where the tune changes a little.

Since obtaining my Judges license, I have had the good fortune of working at quite a few shows. For the most part, the exhibitors have been great, shown very good sportsmanship, and I haven't been shot at yet! However, there are those that will disagree with every placement and remark. Ninety percent of the time, these are the people that need to sit down and read their Standards.

Every rabbit has some good point, or points. As a judge, I give each animal credit for these things. As a judge, I must also determine the faults of the rabbits. Every animal has one or more of these also.

Speaking as an exhibitor, I used to concentrate on certain characteristics or features of my rabbits. Speaking as a judge, I was crazy to do that.

Overall complete balance should be the ultimate goal. With this, if in the proportions called for in the Standards, your animal should be very competitive.

Too many times, I have heard an exhibitor remark, "Look at the coat of fur on that rabbit. How can you place it so low?"

If there are 50 points on type, and 10 points on fur, that should give them some inclination! The amount of points allotted to certain items in the Standard depicts the importance of that feature. Once the judge steps behind the table, all things must be considered in the order of their importance. Personal preference towards certain characteristics are set aside. This is where the judge and exhibitor differ at times.

Many breeders concentrate very hard on certain areas of their herds, and believe if they achieve their goal in this area, it should be the deciding factor. If it isn't, they become irritated. It seems they forget the other parts of the animal that the judge cannot.

I am not saying that all judges are experts on each and every breed. As much as we would like to be, we are not. But we spend much time and effort studying and working for our licenses, and are knowledgeable in each breed. The Cardinal Rule for us, is to judge according to the proportional breakdown in the Standards.

If the breeders would look at their rabbits according to the Standards, with no prejudice towards certain areas, I am sure they would see their animals closer to what the judge sees.

Believe me, there are many things that go through a judges mind when he is working a class of animals. It isn't just picking one out that he or she likes and forgetting the rest of them. Too often, and I say this from experience, the animal the judge really likes isn't the first place rabbit. Many times I have found an animal I would like to take home, knowing it could improve my herd because of some outstanding feature, and had to place it third or fourth in the class.

Judging is indeed a pleasurable experience and duty, but it is not as easy as one might think. If you don't believe that, try it sometime! It is a different world than showing.


Above: Laurie Lettire-West - Best of Breed winner & Derek Carnahan (Judge) Below: Derek looking over top animals before picking Best of Breed.

Amy Minter, a 10 year old A.D.R.C. youth member from Flint, MI. was crowned National Rabbit Princess in Nov. at the ARBA National Convention in Columbus, Ohio. In addition to winning the National Rabbit Princess title, Amy, also won the National Judging Award, winning it with a perfect score (the only youth to ever do this at a national level). Amy also entered 4 Dutch rabbits at the ARBA Convention and all 4 did very well: 1st place black jr. doe; 2nd place black sr. doe; 3rd place black sr. buck and 5th place blue sr. buck. It was Amy's first national convention and what a wonderful time she has to remember.

Amy has raised Dutch rabbits for a little over 3 years and has over 75 animals that she cares for daily. She breeds and shows black, blue, chocolate, and tort Dutch. Amy competes in most sanctioned and 4-H rabbit shows in Michigan and is top point winner for Youth Dutch in the state.

She is a member of the Auto City R.B.A. chartered club as well as an active 4-H member in the Swartz Creek Hare Raisers 4-H Club.

Amy's goal for the future is to continue to raise and show quality Dutch and as National Rabbit Princess, to help spread the words "YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH".





GIRLS CAN DO IT! Yes, girls can and do raise some of the best Dutch and to prove it I would like you to meet Jeanette Demers from Clifton, Illinois, and Mary Maxwell from Amesville, Ohio. Both young ladies are very active in the American Dutch Rabbit Club Youth Division.

JEANETTE DEMERS, 15 yrs. old has been raising Dutch for the past 3½ yrs. and doing an excellent job. She raises four of the six varieties; Black, Blue, Chocolate and Steel. Jeanette says she raises blacks because of two reasons, 1) "I can cross them with other colors", 2) "They don't fade as bad as some of the other colors." Her main reason for having blues is because she hopes to see a good blue take Best Fur at a National Show. She feels chocolates are a challenge and wishes that more people would raise the steels.

When asked about other breeds, Jeanette's answer was, "I have one Florida White." That's what we like to hear, a good "Dutch" person! Jeanette has given several demonstrations with her Dutch rabbits, one to her school class and another to her 4-H club - "How to raise a good Dutch Rabbit".

We ask Jeanette on her ADRC Achievement form, Give your views of the Pros and Cons of Dutch versus another breed. "The Pros are - they are fun to raise and a challenge, the cons - Dutch hardly ever win a show because they get beat by commercial rabbits."

Jeanette is a busy lady when she's not working with her Dutch rabbits. She is the Vice President of the Livingston County Rabbit Club, photographer for her 4-H Club, President of her school band and belongs to the school chorus. She also belongs to the Little League. She plans to attend a Junior College for two years after graduation from High School and then finish her education at a University.




MARY MAXWELL is the second oldest with two brothers and a sister. Mary, 14 yrs. old is a gal that never stops moving or smiling. She's busy with 4-H clubs, The Hounds, Hares & Udder Animals and Nature's Crafty Kids, Ohio State Dutch Club, Girls basketball and on her school's Honor Roll. Mary has raised Dutch for three years. She raises Black, Blue, Chocolate, Tortoise, Steel & Grays. When asked why she raises all of the varieties, her answer was "It's hard not to raise them all! I enjoy raising rabbits."

Mary said, when asked about problems that she's had with raising Dutch, "I've had problems keeping litters alive in the harsh winters; does scattering their litters; and intruders (animals) causing injuries and sometimes death." She has solved some of her problems with keeping litters alive by using newspapers, a layer of wood shavings and hay in the nestboxes. She has culled does who scatter their young. Rat poison - plenty of it, and blocking their entrances into the barn have stopped many of the problems for intruders.

Mary is responsible for her own rabbitry with the family helping out during basketball season and if she's ill. She orders the feed, medications and equipment and pays for it out of the money she makes from the sale of her rabbits and steer. She has spent many hours promoting Dutch - in nursing homes, shopping malls and 4-H clubs.

In the ADRC Achievement form, we asked all of the youths, in your opinion, how can your Dutch Club be improved? Mary answered she felt it would be better if those people who grumble before and after the meetings, speak up during the meeting with constructive criticisms, "to see if we can improve".

Mary placed first in the 1986 A.D.R.C. Youth Achievement Contest - Jr. Division.

President's Message

It is with great pleasure as President of the American Dutch Rabbit Club to present to you this special issue of Small Stock Magazine devoted to the Dutch rabbit. As was the case with the preceding issues, each in its turn, I fully expect this one to exceed the others. A pat on the back for a job well done should be extended to Stan Gauglein and Bill Hobin for correlating all this material for your reading pleasure.

In my travels about the country, I find the quality of stock to be much better than years gone by. In my opinion, the reason for this is the willingness of the old established breeders not only to share their stock, but to share their experiences. With all the articles made available by special issues such as this, beginners in the game may share the knowledge of many years' experience gained by trial-and-error. There are many things generally accepted as fact in the breeding of small stock, however, one is never so smart or well read not to listen to the advice of others.

The Dutch rabbit—ideally the little Dutchmen should be neat in appearance, compact in body, and completely balanced. The round head with the stocky, well-formed ears should blend with the cobby body. The body should be smooth and give a round appearance from all angles.

The fur structure should be short, dense with a sheen to best enhance the markings and give it a sharp appearance. The color should always be well defined and even in order to properly show off the markings.

The blaze should form a perfect triangle, the point being directly in front of the ears and the sides a straight line to the whisker beds. The cheek markings are formed by a continuation of this color pattern following the edge of the whisker bed without going into it and then continuing along the jaw line upward to the back of the ears. If the head is round, the cheeks should form two perfect circles of color on each side of the head. The saddle and the undercut form the "belt" completely around the body as close to



the front legs as possible without touching the first joint. The "belt" should be straight and even and the undercut is examined as illustrated in the photo. The stops should form perfect circles of color around the hind feet one-third of the distance from the feet to the first hock joint.



National Dutch Show Winners

To a Dutch rabbit fancier, the annual National Dutch Show ranks in importance with the ARBA convention and show. The American Dutch Rabbit Club was one of the first specialty clubs to sponsor a National One-Breed show, and over the years it has grown in stature. Many specialty club shows are strictly regional events, but the Dutch fanciers have made theirs national in scope. The site of the show has been moved around the country and attracted many new breeders to the Dutch fancy. In recent years, the show has been held in Georgia, California, Michigan, Ohio, Colorado, Iowa, Indiana, and Oklahoma.

The 1960 National Dutch Show was held in April in Amarillo, Texas. The sponsoring fanciers from the panhandle area of Texas went all out to make this a memorable event. The show was held in the new rabbit building at the Tri-State Fairgrounds. This provided an excellent setting for the top competition that gathered there from all parts of the country. It would be impossible to name all the people who put forth such an effort to make the show a success but we would be negligent if we did not mention the yeoman work done by show superintendent, J. C. Wilshire and show secretary, Mrs. Floyd Hustead. Lee King handled the publicity for the show and Charlie O'Dell was m.c. at the banquet. This was a real good-time show and the Dutch club is indebted to all the folks who so ably demonstrated hospitality "Texas-style."

The competition at this show is invariably the "toughest" of the year and this year was no exception. Dan Lovejoy made the placements and did it to the satisfaction of everyone.

Best Black

Tom Shufflebotham of Indiana won best black with his senior buck, Dutcheng-Lucky Strike. It is fitting that Tom should win the big prize at this year's show since the winners are to be honored

ed in this special issue, for Tom had served on the committee of two of the three previous Dutch issues. Tom's buck won best black and then went onto take best of breed.

Rabbits have been a hobby with Tom since he was a small lad in England. He came to this country in 1921, was married in 1928, and got his first Dutch in this country in 1930 and has been in "dutch" every since. He showed one of his first Dutch at Fort Wayne shortly after that under James Blyth and took best junior with him and then named the winner "Wayne King." He then traded a model-T Ford for another pair of Dutch that came from the stud of B. Ayres one of the country's leading Dutch breeders. Tom joined the Dutch club and named his rabbitry, "Dutcheng," and was really in Dutch.

At this time there were quite a few good imported strains brought into this country by well-known breeders. The Strickland Bros. brought some from Gee Foord of England and Tom obtained some out of these first importations and has kept the same strain every since. In 1946 he imported four more from Foord and among them Lucky Boy Blue III. He had Tortoise from the Ashley Realshade strain and in 1949 imported the Tortoise buck that had taken best in show at both the British Dutch Club Young Stock Show and the annual Adult Show and has worked with these Tortoise since that time.

The American Dutch Rabbit Club was reorganized in 1934 and Tom has been director ever since, missing only one meeting 11 years ago. He is hoping that he can make many more and adds, "once in Dutch, you don't get out; for when they say you can't beat the Dutch, just try it."

Best Blue

He obtained stock with Beaver background buying from Dugan and Pickley and soon developed a strain of blacks and blues that have won at every national show he has exhibited at.

Bill is serving his second term as president of the American Dutch Rabbit Club and the club is prospering under his leadership.

He comments, "I like the Dutch because you get the pleasure of anticipation from the first day the litter is born."

Mrs. Bernice Hord scored a big win at her first National Dutch show, taking home best opposite black honors with a junior doe.




Mrs. Bernice Hord with her best opposite black doe.

hibitors at National Dutch shows for years and it would hard seem official without them.




in the show by a comfortable majority.

Memory Lane

By Tom Shufflebotham

Thirty years is a long, long time, and during that thirty years I have written many articles relative to the Dutch rabbit for publication in the Small Stock Magazine and our own Dutch Reporter. I feel it would be repetitive for me to pen another article for this, the 1968 issue of our special edition.

For the new members who have not seen the earlier copies of our special editions, 1937, 1948, 1954, and 1961, a few backward looks and a "walk down memory lane" may be interesting. To those who were then, and who still are, members of our fancy club, a nostalgic peek through these editions will prove warmly rewarding—as it does to my wife and I who have worked closely on all former specials.

On the cover of the 1937 issue is a fine picture of Strickland's Lucky Son—truly a fine buck and the equal of any shown today. This buck was a son of Lucky Boy, an outstanding buck shown and owned by Foord Brothers of Durham, England. Incidentally, the buck pictured on the cover of this magazine is a direct descendant of this buck and resembles him closely.

Inside there is a wealth of material—a fine article on Chocolate Dutch, by that master breeder, Charles O. Lewis of New York. This is one of the most enlightening articles on chocolates ever written, and is worth repeating over and over. There are also articles by Judge Goettel's of California (one of the better breeders of his day, who passed away years ago); an ad of Herbert Buck of California who used to send a blank check to the secretary of the ADRC annual show to purchase the BOB; an ad for the fifth annual ADRC show to be sponsored by the Michigan State Dutch Club with prizes of \$2.00, \$1.00 and 50¢ on an entry fee of 35¢—a total of \$125.00 on specials; an ad of Jimmie Blyth offering Juniors for \$5.00 a pair; biographies and pictures of club officers and directors; and an article and ad of my own.

John Furter (who is still living, and a resident of St. Louis) served the club as president. Charles O. Lewis, also still living in Roslyn Heights, New York, was active as vice president, and Matt Welling of Detroit, who has been out of Dutch for years, was serving as secretary. Among the directors were Jimmie Blyth (still living); Robert M. Scott, deceased — whose son, Robert Junior, was elected to serve as a director several years ago but met an untimely death in an automobile accident; Judge H.

C. Gilbert of New York, who was a fine fancier and a good friend who passed away a number of years ago; Harold Brear of Detroit who is no longer interested in Dutch, and myself.

There is also a fine article on Breeding Dutch in Winter by Ben Swinburne who was among the best of Dutch breeders but who had returned to England before the 1937 issue was printed. There was also an article by D. F. Strickland who, with his brother Bob, was among the leading award winners of their day, and who were among the first to import Dutch stock from George Foord of England. Other articles were written by Judge Parker of Canada, George Bayliss of California, and W. H. Kennedy, who at one time was an avid booster of the Dutch and was active in the 1934 reorganization of the ADRC.

There were ads of Barnhart and Oliver of Endicott, N. Y., who were the first to import Tortoise Astley Reashade Dutch from England in the early 1930's; Charles O. Lewis, Herbert Buck, Judge Goettel, John Woolough, John Furter, the California Dutch Club whose secretary was George Bayliss, Tom Shufflebotham and "Gillie" Gilbert.

On the cover of the 1948 special appears a winner owned and shown by William Hawthorne, a minister who was at that time president of the ADRC but whose interest in the rabbit fancy flowered only a short time. R. L. Sowers was at that time a dedicated, hard working secretary of the club who did much to put the club back on its feet—"Lou" passed on many years ago. Inside pages carry a three-page spread of breeder ads, listing some 30-plus breeders. Listed in this ad are many of the breeders who were active at the time of publication of the first special edition—and I would like to say here that the idea of an edition dedicated to a specialty interest was originated with Dutch club members. Among those listed in the '48 edition are Charles O. Lewis, Fish's Dutch Rabbitry, Ayres-McCuston, John B. Griffith, Jim Blyth, Lester Wells, Jerry-Lou's Rabbitry (no longer interested in Dutch), Bud Shirrall, Joe Crawford, R. C. Shopshaw, W. T. Robinson, and the deceased George Slater, Wood Alexander, E. F. Kuntz, Dr. Ayres, Dr. Gale Russum, Ancil Beaver, R. L. Sowers, Ralph Walborn. Other ads and articles include the Dutcheng strain, Judge Bass, Strickland's, L. A. Schutze and Charles Pine. An excellent article "The Good and Bad in Dutch," written by Dick Bernhardt, ap-

pears in this issue, illustrated with cuts made and paid for by Dick.

There is also a picture of Johnny Richards who, with Don Lovejoy and Johnny Baker, were officers of the Young Rabbit Breeders of America. And incidentally, dues for membership in the ADRC at that time were \$1.00.

Writers of articles in this issue include such names as Charles Pine, Gertrude DeAtley (who pioneered in the development of red Dutch but was unable to get them into orbit), R. L. Sowers, William Hawthorne, Herman Roerig and Charles O. Lewis.

The cover design of the 1954 issue was the work of Herman Roerig. W. G. Book appeared among Dutch breeders of this time and during his interest and work with Dutch he designed the present cover of our Reporter and the cut used on club stationery. Active at this time also was Madeline Grables (recently deceased) who was serving the club as its capable secretary. In four pages of breeder ads we find again the names of Bayliss, Jim Blyth, Dr. McCuston, Joe Crawford, Charley Pine, John Griffiths, Charles O. Lewis, "Pop" Sautters, and we note that club dues had been raised to \$2.00 per year. Other breeders active at that time were the O'Havers, Herb Nitsche, G. C. Leisinger, Bill Stedman, J. C. Lowit, Cooper's, Dr. Russum and many, many others. Several articles by members of the United Kingdom Dutch Rabbit Club are also featured in this issue and we find an article on the controversial AOC which has since been discontinued; an article on Dutch in Canada, and an article by Charles Williams who has long been a member and supporter of the Dutch fancy. Hall's (Russell served as publicity chairman for a number of years) Backyard Rabbitry also appears among the ads. Also to be found in the articles are one on Dutch fur by "Buddy" Jaynes and one on commercial values of Dutch by Pete Leeuwenburg.

The cover of the 1961 edition was again designed by Herman Roerig. We find again among the breeder ads such familiar names as Charles Williams, "Pop" Sautters, Hall's Backyard Rabbitry, Jim Blyth, Bill Stedman, Dutcheng (Shufflebotham) Rabbitry, Cooper's, Don Guthrie, the Weinhardt's and others. Featured in the magazine are the Clint Dennis', Osmans, Stan Goggin, Bill Summers, Bickey, Jack Boughton (for the past several years vice president of the club), Al Meier, Jr., Mrs. E. P. Hall, Jimmy Sinclair, Roger Eich, Don Reid, Hulda's Rabbitry, a fine article by the late Oliver Milliken

of Florida, and many more. Since there should be numerous copies of this edition scattered throughout the country among Dutch breeders, I shall not go into detail further.

If you have borne with me throughout, you will have noticed that many of our outstanding breeders have a rich background in the fancy, and have been exhibiting and raising Dutch over good long span of years. I have, I know, omitted names of many who have a deep and abiding interest in the Dutch rabbit and I these I offer a sincere apology. This article is overlong and in fact, may be "cut" by the editor—but writing it has given me deep satisfaction and hours of pleasant retrospect.







Dutch Out of the Past

By James Blyth

In the early years of Dutch in the United States, Mrs. M. M. Guggenheim, G. W. Abbott, John Shannon and several other breeders imported outstanding Dutch exhibits from England. They exhibited these throughout the Eastern part of the United States which some of us had the pleasure of viewing since Mrs. Guggenheim, in the year 1912, exhibited her prize winning Dutch at the Cleveland Convention. The other importers remained generally in the East.

One thing were two animals that impressed me and were the product of the master breeders of Dutch—A. H. Bentz of Akron, Ohio. The Bentz', father and son, who now is an outstanding Poultry Judge and Secretary of the American Bantam Assn., was a master in breeding rabbits as well as poultry. They produced these two outstanding Blue Dutch bucks that were known as Knobby and Blue Perfection. Both of them had outstanding color and beautiful cheeks and blaze. I do not know of any Blue Dutch that surpassed these two bucks for the shape of their heads and head markings, and the sharpness of the markings. It is too bad that Paul Bentz left the Dutch rabbit fancy to enter into the Poultry fancy. His father, who was an outstanding breeder, passed away some years ago. Any breeder who saw these two bucks would be impressed and realize what wonderful specimens they were.

Loomis and McLaughlin showing under the Watershed Rabbits of Akron, Ohio, and W. F. Gilbert, who is still alive and resides in California but lived at Maumee, Ohio, owned two outstanding bucks. Their color was excellent. There was no brassy cast to it and the color resembled a fresh broken piece of steel. They were well-marked and exhibited in various shows over Ohio. One would win at one show, the other at the next. I hope

In 1928, Robert M. Scott, Sr., imported a Black Dutch buck from England known as Bell-

grave Model, this too was outstanding in all characteristics and was the best Dutch at the Lima Convention in 1924. It was later purchased by E. Peterson of Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, who I believe kept this buck as long as he lived and had some excellent stock from him. These Dutch were excellent specimens and while there was not the keen rivalry there is today among the Dutch, these old-time breeders had some outstanding stock like those we mentioned.

Another buck that impressed me as an exhibition animal was a little Black Dutch buck owned by Charles J. Plunkett of Long Island. He imported this buck and it was the smallest and most well-marked buck I had seen.

Shortly after this, Charlie Williams of Pennsylvania produced Sunshine Don which was an outstanding buck for color and type. His color was as good as any I had ever seen, however, he was missmarked to a certain extent. Still, he made a great name for himself in rabbit exhibits through the East. While Sunshine Don was in his "heyday," Scott, Sr., produced another Black buck of his own mating which was extremely well-marked. However, his coat was a trifle long, his markings not as sharp as Sunshine Don and he was longer in body. Judges of that day differed in these two bucks. Some would place Sunshine Don over the Scott buck and others would place the Scott buck over Sunshine Don. There was keen competition between these two animals for several years, until Williams sold this buck and he was later known as the Puffer buck, as this was the man's name who purchased him from Mr. Williams.

About this time or shortly hereafter, Marshall of Indiana came out with a small light Grey Dutch buck that was very well marked and small. Many of the breeders remarked this could have been a cross with a Polish. There was much talk in those days about outstanding specimens. I believe that Ancel Beaver of Indianapolis later purchased this buck and Beaver too proved to be a master breeder of Dutch. He produced some of the finest exhibition animals of that day. And was a great success. It is reported that Beaver was a fancier of bird dogs and understood selective breeding, therefore, counting for his great success with Dutch rabbits. He had several beautiful black specimens that gave a good account of themselves at all exhibits.

About this time, the Strickland

Bros., Dan and Bob, of Endicott, N. Y., imported a number of rabbits from England and some from Charlie Williams and Ned Shaw. They had a great success with what was known as the Foord buck and the Phillips buck named after the English breeders who exported these two to the Strickland Bros. They had one buck known as the cobby buck. This buck had exceptionally good black color and beautiful type. He could be recognized by the shape of his ears. His ears were shaped much different than any Dutch of the past or present and some judges gave a great deal of consideration in making awards at shows. At the first Fort Wayne Convention, the Stricklands exhibited four of their outstanding bucks—Foord buck, Phillips buck, one that I cannot recall the name of, and the Cobby buck. There were predictions the Cobby buck would win. However, the other three bucks won over him with Pop Sautters' outstanding black Dutch buck at that time placing 5th. The competition was getting keener and the rabbits closer to perfection than they had ever been before.

Then Swinburne, an outstanding Scotch breeder of Endicott, N. Y., who had worked with Charlie Williams, Red Shaw, Dewey Mains, and others in that area, had proven himself to be a master breeder. Mr. Swinburne produced many of the rabbits that were winners at that time. Later he returned to Scotland and became an outstanding judge in that country. We do not know today if he is alive but had some correspondence with him shortly after he left this country. When he left, he left a buck with Charlie Williams which he exhibited at the Detroit Dutch show that year. In keen competition, this little black buck that was in the pink of condition and outstanding in every respect, was placed Best Dutch at that early Dutch show. This buck was later sold to A. S. Gibbons, an ardent Dutch fancier, and later years always known as the Gibbons buck.

In Tortoise, two outstanding specimens imported from England—one by Charles Williams, the other by Carl Oliver—will long be remembered for their clean, good color and outstanding markings. They were as close to the standard in color as any Dutch that will ever be produced. It is the opinion of some that the Oliver buck had better color over the back and was free from any smudge and had outstanding shadings. These two bucks battled it out at many shows and there was much difference of opinion between the exhibitors and judges as to just

which one was the best.

Then along came Clyde Dugan of Iowa who landed small Dutch during his regime as an outstanding Dutch breeder, the question came up of the Dutch or Western Style Dutch and Eastern Style Dutch which caused quite a controversy between breeders and judges. However, I am sure we are over that period and the judges and breeders today are not classifying Tay Dutch, or Eastern Dutch or Western Dutch but looking for the ideal Dutch as set forth by the Standard of Perfection of the ARRA.

It seems that only so long an outstanding breeder could maintain top place in the Dutch fancy, and there were such men as Tom Shufflebottom and others who were producing outstanding Dutch, in some case which came down from the Swinburne stock or the Oliver or Williams stock. Williams kept on breeding Dutch and today produces winners every once in a while.

Then came Jack Boughton who had had a great success in raising White New Zealands, which proved beyond a shadow of a doubt that he was an outstanding breeder in any type or breed of rabbits. He purchased rabbits from various sources and by careful selective breeding has produced a most outstanding strain of Dutch we have had. He has sold many of his winners and breeders until there are many Dutch over the country today that lead back to the Boughton strain. He produced stock that was outstanding in both color, type and markings. And has proven his skill as an outstanding Dutch breeder over the last few years. How long he will manage to head the list no one knows or who will take his place as a master breeder. Boughton, to my knowledge, did not outcross his Dutch by stayed within the same strain and understood the selection of good breeding stock which is so essential to the success of Dutch breeding.

We look back on these old fanciers of by-gone days and the specimens which they exhibited. We turn our heads and look into the future and we are sure the American Dutch Rabbit Fancy today are attempting to produce their own Dutch from American strain and bringing out a more uniform exhibit for Dutch that are closer to one another and the competition is keener today than it ever has been. The future for the Dutch rabbit looks bright and we can thank any of the old breeders, those who imported stock from England and those who improved it by careful breeding. It is through the efforts of these old timers and their rabbits that today the Dutch fancy is leading in America.
