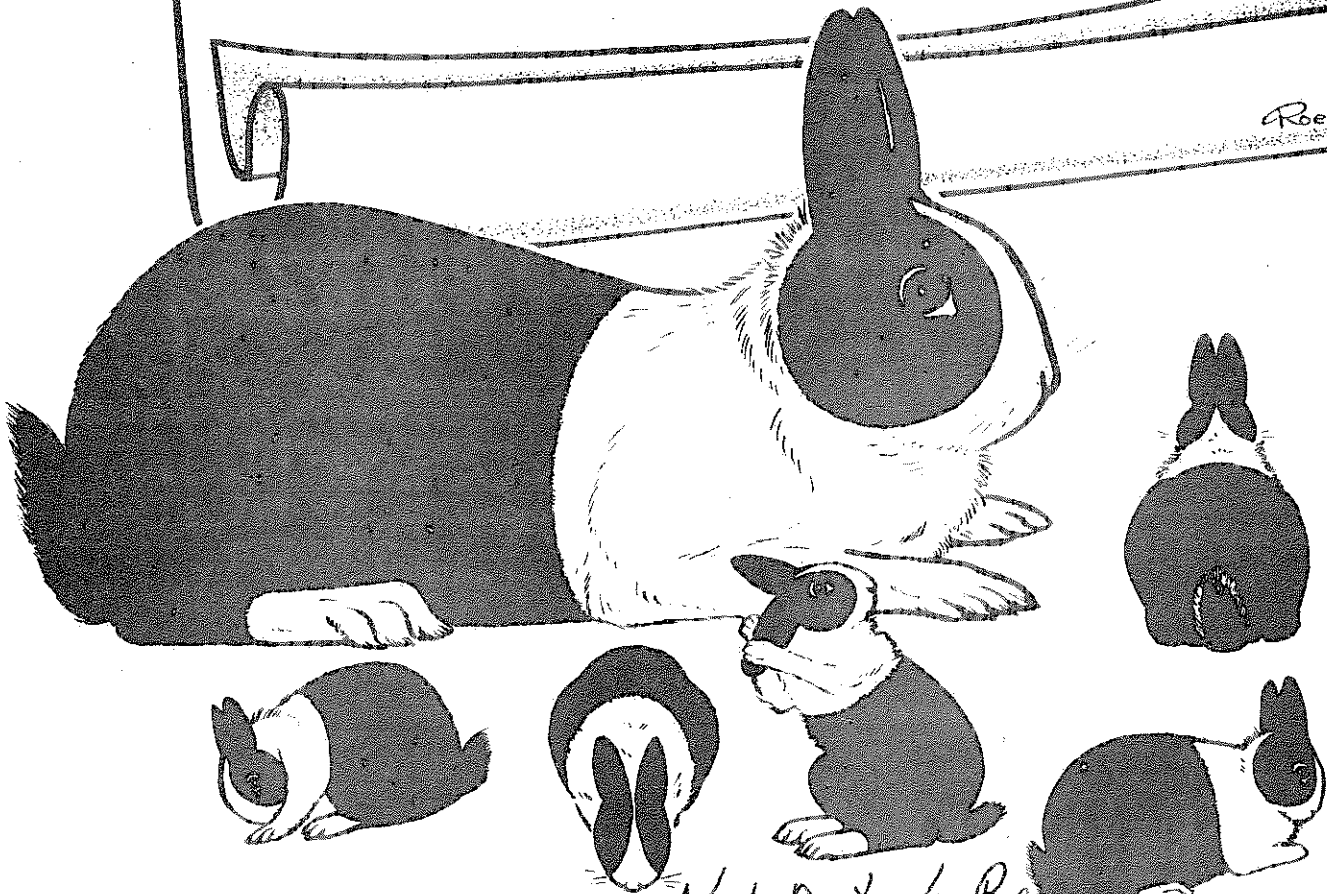



YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

1955 NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW and MEETINGS, Norwalk, Ohio

M. Grables, Sec'y.

To state that each of you who were unable to attend the 1955 National Dutch Show missed a show that was conducted in a manner which showed the outstanding ability of the personnel; or to say that you members who were not able to attend the meetings here at this show, really missed something - is superfluous - So, I shall try to give you some of the highlights. All of you, I believe, are anxiously waiting, so here they are: There were 249 Quality Dutch in the open Division and 61 in the Junior Department.

The Board of Directors met twice. Their first meeting lasted over two hours. Their second meeting was just short of being two hours, and believe me, your Secretary had to really go to keep abreast of the suggestions for improvement in our organization. There were notebooks, letters from members, etc. in front of all of us, and the suggestions that had been made to each individual officer and director were brought before the Board for discussion. Now, as you will see, we did more than just talk about these things. There was a quorum of Officers present: Pres. Bayliss Sec'y-Treas. Grables; Directors Shufflebotham, Stedman, and Bickley, along with Publicity Director Leisenring. The actions of the Board, of course were presented to the Meeting of the Membership, and accepted. Briefly, here are the matters of business of the meeting at Norwalk, Ohio, April 22-24, 1955:

- (1) Eastern Rabbit & Fanciers's Ass'n. given permission to use 2 cuts, property of the ADRC, in the printing of their Guide and Standards book.
- (2) Letter read by Sec'y. from Geo. Scott, Pres. Beehive Rabbit Club of Utah, requesting Dutch pelt to be used for exhibit. Referred to a furrier, inasmuch as no one knew where a good Dutch pelt could be located within the membership, owned by a member who would be willing to donate same.
- (3) On Sanctioning Dutch Sweepstakes for "2 in 1" show sponsored by the Nebraska State RBA and the Tri-State RBA, show to be held in Sioux City, Iowa; Board approved sanctions (2) if requested; PROVIDED sponsors print in their catalogs and advertisements the following line: "THIS 2 in 1 SHOW HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB". (Sec'y's note: This show had already been sanctioned by the American Rabbit Breeders Ass'n., Inc. Our Sweepstake rules provide for sanctioning any show sanctioned by the AREA, except shows held on dates of the Nat'l Dutch Show.)
- (4) Secretary requested, and was granted, permission to solicit the trade magazines and ask them to submit plans whereby the ADRC may sell subscriptions through the Dutch Reporter. (Purpose to create a Special Fund for expenditures not provided for, such as Junior Department, ARBA Convention Shows, etc. and purpose is not to increase the revenue of the ADRC Secretary, as this Fund is to be intact.)
- (5) That we donate a Guide Book to Don Morgan, Mason City, Iowa, for lending-library he is setting up on rabbits.
- (6) Sec'y-Editor Grables asked and was granted permission to publish in the Dutch Reporter the revised color description of the Tortoise Dutch, for the clarification

and value to the breeders. (Note: there was not any change in the Tortoise color standard. It is just a better description than the one printed in the 1950-1955 Guide Book.)

(7) Drawings for cuts to be used by the ADRC are to be the property of the ADRC, and said drawings are to be referred to the ADRC Standard Committee, this Committee in turn to recommend or to reject proposed drawings for future cuts in due notice to the Board of Directors of the ADRC.

(8) The Standard Committee of the ADRC reported through the Committee Chmn., E. C. Bickley, that the Committee is intact, and would continue to serve the Club. Mr. Bickley pointed out that he had received a letter from one of the members, and that evidently there was some disappointments from the Gray color standard which was read and approved at York, accepted by the ARBA Standard Committee, and gone to press along with the Standards of Perfection of the American Rabbit Breeders Ass'n., and that it was an impossibility to add to or alter Standards at this time. That the letter had been received just recently, after the Standards of the ARBA had gone to press. In lieu of adding to the Gray color description, Mrs. Grables suggested that an article describing "just what constitutes a desirable Gray" be inserted into the new Guide Book of the ADRC for clarification to the breeders, judges, etc., and included the same suggestion for Steel Dutch, in a separate article, to be printed in the new ADRC Guide Book. The suggestion was well received, and consented to by the Chmn. of ADRC Standards Comm. Bickley, PROVIDED THAT such articles would be edited by the ADRC Standards Committee. So, these two colors, Gray and Steel Gray will be described in articles in the new ADRC Guide Book.

(9) Deadline of all material for the new ADRC Guide Book to be in the hands of the Standards and Guide Book Committee, L. E. Settle by June 30, 1955. Approximately \$200.00 in ads were reported. Needed, \$500.00 up, depending upon size, contents. Report given by Wm. Book. Vote of appreciation and compliments on the good manner in which this committee has taken care of their work. They are NOW WAITING FOR ADS to finance publication.

(10) Dutch Sweepstake sanction fees were raised to \$5.00 (see notice printed at beginning of this article). Suggestion to Editor of the Dutch Reporter that the Coming Shows be announced one time only in the Dutch Reporter; and that a charge be made of 50¢ for each additional publication of shows. New ribbon offer to include rosette for Best Dutch, and rosette for Best Opposite Dutch, (with Show Secretary reporting these winnings) and a ribbon for the best specimen in each of the following varieties of Dutch: Black, Blue, Chocolate, Tortoise, Gray and Steel Gray. These rosettes to be purple in color; the new ribbons to match the color of variety for which it is given, as closely as possible. That new ribbons and rosetters shall be given for shows to be held after June 25, 1955: that Secretary is to return \$2.00 sanction fees (received with requests for sanctions for shows held after June 25, 1955, and ask for the \$5.00 fee, advising the local Show Secretaries of these changes and modifications. (Sec'y's note: we may hit a snag or two here on this fee being raised - said snag being made by local Clubs. I feel sure that our ADRC members know that we have actually lost money on the old sanction fee of \$2.00; quite a few members asked for a ribbon or rosette for Best & Best Opp. Dutch, and thought it would not be out of line to raise the fees to provide for rosettes, and the obtaining of the information on the winners of these two prizes: that other Clubs obtained this information as to who were the winners of Best, and Best Opp. Breed. We can say to the Local Clubs we have 24 classes of rabbits, with our sanction: that we do not require that unpty-nine rabbits be in the show to win a rosette or ribbon, and that we do not require any certain number of members to be competing against one another to win our ADRC ribbons or rosettes. Note further, that there are no requirements for advertising of the ONE DAY Dutch Sweep stake show; the listing fee is included in the \$5.00;) It was the concensus that NO CHANGE should be made in the advertising of the Dutch Sweepstake show which is TWO OR MORE DAYS long, at this time. So, note, carefully, for local shows: the show two or more days duration must be advertised in accordance with Rule 2, which is published in your ADRC Guide Book, page 22, (EXCEPT the request must be sent to the Secretary sixty (60) days, at least, before the show.

This 60 day clause was passed at Abilene, Texas, 1953.)

(12) The Secretary has been authorized to purchase office equipment, up to a limit of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00); date of purchase, and amount of purchase (not to exceed the \$200.00) to be determined by the financial status of the Club, and left up to the Secretary to decide.

(13) That the Secretary be authorized to pay to each Director, Officer, and the Chairman of each ADRC Committee \$1.50 to be used for postage on communications, in carrying out his duties, as outlined above.

(14) All traveling trophies belonging to the ADRC for National Dutch Show and the American Rabbit Breeders Ass'n., Inc., Convention Show shall be held by the Secretary of the ADRC until such time won permanently; and that a small cup be given by the ADRC to each winner of a leg on any above traveling trophy.

(15) Each AREA Judge who advertises that he is a licensed ARBA Judge in the Judges Listing-ads at the rate of \$4.00 for 1/8 page, in the New Guide Book, shall receive a complimentary copy of the New ADRC Guide Book.

(16) Pres. Bayliss directed Sec'y. Grables to purchase a rubber stamp with the words "Compliments of the American Dutch Rabbit Club."

(17) It was the consensus, that the Secretary of the ADRC is to mail the new Guide Books to the members, upon receipt of same from the printer, and that mailing of these Guide Books was the duty of the Secretary, and not a part of the task of the Guide Book Committee.

(18) The Secretary of the ADRC has been directed to write to the American Rabbit Breeders Ass'n., Inc., asking that before any additional Dutch Specialty Clubs, local,

State or otherwise, are Chartered with the ARBA a clearance be made through the American Dutch Rabbit Club Officers and Directors.

(20) Ballots and envelopes, with envelopes numbered, for future Nomination and future Elections of Officers and Directors shall be printed commercially.

(21) The ADRC bought the first booth sold for the 1955 American Rabbit Breeders Ass'n., Inc. Convention to be held in Columbus, Ohio, October 22-26.

(22) The ADRC has subscribed to a full page ad in the 1955 Convention catalog.

(23) The ADRC shall furnish a full set of ribbons for the two following shows to be held in Canada: Canadian National Exposition and the Royal Winter Fair.

(24) Sec'y. Grables reported the membership paid up to date through the Nat'l Dutch Show as 510 members, with approximately 10 renewals and new members received at the show to bring this figure to 520; and approximately 70 who are dependable members had not renewed for the months of March and April, the 70 NOT included in this figure of 510.

(25) Mr. Keeman of Ft. Wayne, Indiana reported his son breeds Dutch only, and has been in a 4H project for the third year; son age 13; that his son (ADRC member) has purchased \$300.00 in postal savings from this project in this time, plus maintaining his herd of Dutch from the income derived from the Dutch.

(26) Pres. Bayliss requested members to contact him if member had anything on his mind regarding Club's activities; that the Club will go forward, not backwards, and asked the members to support the Guide Book publication with their ads, as the present 1950-1955 edition is not only out-moded, but the supply is getting very low. He also stated that he wants it understood that any changes, revisions, etc. affecting our Constitution and By-Laws shall be brought to the membership and voted upon by mail ballot.

(27) Pres. Bayliss stated that our Jr. Dept. show has been successful and that he particularly would like this department to be very successful, as it is the first Junior Dept. of any Specialty Club.

(28) Wm. C. Stedman, Chmn. of the Junior Dept. of the ADRC asked that members send their suggestions on this Department to him; that he and his committee would give all suggestions careful consideration, and asked that this be done at once, as the rules would be incorporated into the new Guide Book, the deadline on which is June 30, 1955.

(29) Mr. Bickley and Mr. Emery reported on the coming ARBA Convention, and stated they believed the entry would amount to, or exceed 5,000 rabbits; that the Dutch Breed chairman, Ray Hickok and Bill Book would take excellent care of the Dutch, as would all breed chairmen care for their own breeds; and that there is no earthly reason why Dutch cannot be the largest breed entry. That (according to Mr. Bickley) they intended to try to get the specials on Dutch in the amount to entice breeders of Dutch to enter DUTCH in numbers in this show, and so far the Breed Chairmen had done very well on this support; that the Convention catalog deadline is August 1, 1955, and ads are: Full page, \$35.00; 1/2 page, \$20.00; 1/4 page, \$10.00; 1/8 page, \$6.00; Judges and Registrar's listings \$4.00; catalog to be same size as the 1954 Convention catalog. There is a Special price on booths for Specialty Clubs and Local Clubs, and Clubs should contact Convention personnel on this soon. The building to be used is a huge building, large enough for all exhibits of rabbits and booths under one roof. The figure of 600-700 Dutch at this show is aimed at, and that cooperation has been excellent.

(30) Canada was well represented at the show; Mr. Melrose described the rabbit industry situation and rabbit show situation in Canada; these Canadian members left \$30.00 worth of new Guide Book advertising with the Sec'y., and Specials for the 1955 Convention with our Dutch Breed Chairman.

(31) We felt honored with the presence of ADRC-ARBA Standard Committee member, and Director of the ARBA, Mr. J. Cyril Lowit of Oregon. Mr. Lowit stated it was his first opportunity to attend a National Dutch Show, and that he was glad that he came; that the increase in the number of memberships in the ADRC was the talk in Show rooms around the country, and the progress that has been made in the Club in the past few years is outstanding. That he owns 100 Dutch does, for the reason that they are

profitable. He asked indulgence in sportmanship in the show rooms, and thought especially that exhibitors should never "crab" at a judge; that if the judge was really this bad, the thing to do was not to hire him again. Mr. Lowit stated the quality of the Dutch in this show is very good, and that he enjoyed meeting the Dutch breeders; and complimented the ADRC for being THE only Specialty Club to have an Annual Convention over the period of several years, that other Specialty Clubs had tried this, and had not been successful.

STANDARD COMMITTEE REPORT

At the open Forum on Dutch held in connection with the National Dutch Show at Norwalk, Ohio a very interesting and informative discussion was held on just what constitutes good Gray color.

It is apparent that the new Dutch Standard is weak on its description of Gray color, calling only for a uniform clean gray shade.

Inasmuch as this new Standard has been approved by the ADRC membership in attendance at both Abilene, Texas and at York, Penna, and has been accepted by the ARBA Standards Committee and incorporated into the new ARBA Standard of Perfection, no changes can be made for five years.

In our new Dutch Standard and Guide Book will appear a complete treatise on Gray color for the guidance of both Judges and Breeders. It will specifically describe the desirable shade of Gray to strive for; will give detail on ring color, etc., and will in general clarify those points now in question.

From a copy of a recent letter sent to Dick Parker, Chmn. of the ARBA Standard Committee, it is learned that the eye color of Gold Dutch is hazel. This had been omitted from the working standard.

The recent ruling of the ARBA Board of Directors to extend the time limit of outlawing A.O.C. classes until January 1st., 1958 will have no bearing on our Dutch Fancy. We, as a group, voted to drop the A.O.C. color classification in Dutch and your Standard Committee set March 1st, 1955 as the date of its official demise in the Show Rooms.

I have the assurance of Dick Parker that our wishes in this matter will be followed and that the A.O.C. will stay out of our Dutch Standard.

STANDARD AND GUIDE BOOK COMMITTEE REPORT

The Standard and Guide Book Committee in conjunction with the Board of Directors, Officers and Membership at the National Dutch Show decided that the new Standard and Guide Book should be in the hands of all AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB members before the ARBA Convention this fall. It will be necessary for all material including Advertisements to be in the hands of the committee on June 30th.

We have received \$225.00 in cash for advertisement and have received a promise of about \$100.00 but have not received the money and in some cases the ad has not been received. If the individual breeder or Specialty clubs desire an ad in the Guide and Standard Book the copy of the advertisement accompanied with any cuts and money must reach L. E. Settle, 2110 - 29th. St., Lubbock, Texas by June 30. This date, June 30 will be the deadline on materials and advertisement. The committee will secure the cut for you if you furnish the gloss picture or a negative and you pay just what we can secure the cut for.

The advertisement is very reasonable, being only \$17.50 per page, \$10.00 for 1/2

page, \$6.00 for 1/4 page, and \$4.00 for 1/8 page or breeder ad if you prefer to call it that. A copy of the Guide and Standard Book will be sent free to all AKBA Judges that carry a breeders size ad.

This new Standard and Guide Book will contain the new Standard and Sweepstake rules, the Junior Department rules, and an up to date list of the membership. It will probably be five years before another one will be printed and your ad will be before the present membership and all new members for that length of time. There is no doubt that this is the cheapest and best advertisement for a Dutch breeder even if he has nothing for sale at the present time or any time in the near future.

If you want an ad in the book as an individual, as a specialty club, or as a Judge, or as a business ad, your money and other materials must reach the committee as of or before June 30th.

JUNIOR DEPARTMENT COMMITTEE REPORT
