On Sunday April 15th. another highly successful National Dutch Show came to a conclusion at Logansport Indiana and the Indiana State Dutch Club should be commended for their effort in conducting another fine Show. The number of entries was not as large as some of our Nationals in the past, but the quality again was good.

Judging of the open classes was completed on Friday and the assignments were handled in a most capable manner by the two Nationally known Dutch Judges, Jim Blyth and Carldon Gaddis. At the completion of the Judging the customary rounds of congratulations were in order, followed by a general DUTCH gab-fest and the usual fun enjoyed by Dutch Breeders wherever they chance to get together at a National. On Saturday morning Judging of the Junior Department started promptly as scheduled and was completed early in the day. This was followed by the Judges Forum which was enthusiastically attended and apparently enjoyed by those present at this increasingly popular event at our National Dutch Shows. At the conclusion of the forum nearly all retired to their rooms to prepare for the Banquet held at one of Logansport's many fine restaurants and scheduled for 8:00 P. M. Here we found the dining rooms gaily decorated for the occasion and a fine dinner. Following the dinner, Director; E. C. Fickley, in behalf of the many Dutch Breeders gathered for this show presented a beautiful Plaque to Mrs. Grace Stanear, Secretary of the Indiana State Dutch Club, in recognition of her devotion, loyalty and outstanding contributions to the Dutch Fancy over a period of many years. From the banquet, the members motored to the Cass County Court House in Logansport, where facilities were in readiness for the annual membership meeting of the A.D. R.C. The meeting was well attended and presided over by our President, George Bayliss who for the second consecutive year, has traveled more than 2,000 miles by plane from his home in California to be in attendance at this annual meeting. This certainly is a fine example of his devotion to the Dutch Rabbit and the Dutch Fancy in general.

On Sunday morning the show room began to fill at an early hour with exhibitors and spectators, many of them who were unable to attend on the two previous days, motored to the show room for the final day. By noon the

LET'S THINK IT OVER

This rabbit business of ours, new or modified approaches to the problems involved are continually being evaluated. When any member of our organization proposes a new idea, procedure or practice, he should immediately be asked some questions - questions such as these:

1. Why do you propose this idea, procedure or practice?
2. What do you think it will do?
3. Where in the rabbit business does it apply?
4. When in the rabbit business will it apply?
5. How will it work?

If he can satisfactorily answer these questions, the organization will most likely adopt the proposal. If he cannot justify the idea, it should be rejected.

Again, we review, the proposal offered by a member to determine its value for the entire membership. Any proposal offered should be made in a "cover all" form. We should review any proposed plan to determine its merits in light of situations that persist, its possible benefits in the future and of determining whether any change in its application or structure may be necessary.

The constant flow of new ideas, the continuous developments of more effective policies and the unending improvements in procedure and practice techniques could bring about a better business economy which has already no parallel in this or any period in the experience of the A.R.B.A.

These methods of approach should apply not only to the Fancier but to the Commercial Breeder as well. A.R.B.A. members should "take stock" at frequent intervals. Indeed, a continuous study of our policies would be a good practice. No doubt, we would come up with proposals to alter or change some of our now existing policies that would bring about a change for the better, keeping in mind the "Why-What-Where-When-How" questions outlined above.

All proposals, irrespective of their source, that might affect the A.R.B.A. should be subjected to severe examination. The members should demand the facts and their verdict should be in accord with the truth. Only those proposals that stand up under the "Why-What-Where-When-How" formula of evaluation should be considered as possibly worthy of adoption. Think back of the many proposals or resolutions that have been passed on a convention floor, only to be rescinded at the next Convention. This question can be answered by saying that the "Why-What-Where-When-How" formula was not followed.

Those who are charged with the responsibilities of administering the affairs of established practices and procedures should be held to strict account of their activities. They should apprise the members of the efficiency of the practices and advise with them pertaining to all modifications or changes that are to be essential to the continued success and increased progress of the American Rabbit.

Just as the Board of Directors designates and controls the policies and practices of the A.R.B.A. so should the members of this Association direct all factors of its endeavor. It is only when the membership becomes derelict in their duties that powers are wrested from their hands. Our institution can endure only so long as the members declare the exercise their powers in accordance with the provisions of the

fundamental principles of business progress.

We want our Association to grow, not to die, increase its value and not lose its effectiveness. There is no middle ground, we succeed or fail. There is no place in it for a partially planned way. In short, the A.R.B.A. should strengthen its policies and adopt other progressive plans to better its membership. It is about these things that I hope you will think with me for a little while.

To some of the members, the A.R.B.A. has been perfectly satisfactory. It has afforded us opportunities we could reasonably want, it has encouraged us to develop our abilities and make use of our talents, it has made it possible for us to realize our hopes and ambitions far more than anticipated.

Despite A.R.B.A.'s "Proven Worth", there have always been and there are now those who find fault with its fundamental principles and applications. They criticize the operation of our system and magnify any deficiencies in its practices, even to a point of destroying long established ideas, ideas that have made thousands of successful Breeders. We did not question those who were crying out against the laws made by the members who were building this Association. We did not subject them to the "Why-What-Where-When-How" formula that should have been applied to our business.

We should no longer continue our "All is Well" attitude toward trends that threaten our progress. Everyone of us must exercise more than a casual interest in the business affairs of our Association. Whether we like it or not, every member should participate in the A.R.B.A. of tomorrow. We must determine what our respective part shall be, what action we are to take and what course we are to follow. When these things have been determined, we must follow them through to the limit of our ability. If it is a bigger A.R.B.A. that we want and there is no reason why we can't have it if we have complete faith and complete loyalty to its cause and a burning desire to be of service to our fellow members.

Not only does it take the complete faith and loyalty of the Officers to make a stronger and better A.R.B.A., but each member has to think along the lines of progress and advance his ideas in order to obtain the growth needed for the building of a stronger organization. Despite all our failures, our members have never despaired. They are continually working toward the objective of the dreams, hopes and plans that have been in the hearts of Rabbit Breeders for years.

Progress requires active and intelligent participation of all our members. It is necessary that all our members understand and believe in the aims and purposes of the Association and contribute their respective share to the maintenance and advancement of A.R.B.A.

Minutes of Meeting, Columbus, Ohio

The Annual membership meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was held at the Ohio State Fairgrounds, Columbus, Ohio, October 23, 1955.

The meeting was called to order at 1:15 P. M. by President George Bayliss, who opened the meeting in memory of our late members of Ohio, Dr. Gale E. Russen, Ralph Walborn, and Charles Austin, and one of the late members of A.R.B.A. who was always a friend of the Dutch Club, Gustav Siegmund of Michigan.

Officers present: Pres. Bayliss; Vice-Pres. Chas. O. Lewis; Sec'y-Treas. Madeline Grables; Directors James Blyth, Tom Shufflebotham, Wm. Stegman and L. E. Settle. Mr. E. C. Bickley was excused to attend the business of the Convention. Absent, J. M. Brown.

Minutes of the meeting at Norwalk, Ohio, National Dutch Show of 1955 were approved as read. The Secretary reported the paid up membership of the Club was 459.

The Treasurer's report was approved as read.

Report of meeting of the Board of Directors held October 22, 1955 (Report separate).

Report on the new Guide Book was given by L. E. Settle, Committee Chm., who reported the total of cash received approximately \$558.00 and that a figure of about \$600.00 the committee believed would cover the cost. Attention was called to the

members that ads were being solicited during the Convention, and there was still ample time to send in ads.

Constitution and By-Laws; Pres. Bayliss pointed out that it was necessary that due to circumstances that the Board of Directors approve the Constitution and By-Laws revisions, and that this had been accomplished in the meeting held the night previously.

Mrs. Harry E. Stansart, Secretary of the 1956 National Dutch Show to be held at Logansport, Indiana, April 12-15, reported that John Ehler of Logansport, Indiana would be General Chairman of the Show. She also gave the prices on ads for the catalog, and expressed wishes that the members present would give their ads to her during the Convention. Ads to be: Full page, \$20.00; 3/4 page, \$15.00; 1/2 page, \$10.00, 1/4 page, \$5.00 and Breeder card ads, \$3.00.

Unfinished business: The Secretary was to have contacted the trade magazines to have them, if possible, submit plans whereby the A.D.R.C. could sell subscriptions to the members of the A.D.R.C. on a commission basis. The Secretary reported that she was working on this at the Convention, and believed this plan would be accomplished very soon.

Good of the Order: Question was raised why the A.D.R.C. did not compel sponsors of Dutch Sweepstake Shows to offer Special prizes on Best and Best Opposite Dutch. Pres. Bayliss answered that he believed, personally, that if the Clubs could afford to offer extra Specials, they would do this without a demand in our Show rules, however he stated that he would bring this matter to the attention of the Board, and would try to get opinions from other members on the subject.

Pop Sautters asked if there is a provision for life membership in the A.D.R.C. Pres. Bayliss replied, there is none, however, this is another matter that needs study.

A cash pot for the "Best Four-head of Dutch, owned by one exhibitor" at the 1956 A.R.B.A. Convention, was started by J. C. Lowit, and had already reached the sum of \$56.00. Members were asked to contribute whatever they could to this pot, or to mail it later to the Secretary. This pot, would be divided into 2nd., 3rd., etc. displays, should it reach a high figure.

The members gave their appreciation to the outgoing officers. Mr. Chas. O. Lewis outgoing Vice-President, was given a standing ovation for his untiring efforts to the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Motion to adjourn, supported by A. E. Sautters, was made by Tom Shufflebotham. Adjourned at 3:00 P. M.
