

Saturday, April 15, 1967 Angie (my wife) and I jumped in our bucket of bolts and headed for Arva, Ontario, Canada to a rabbit show hosted by the Forest Hills Rabbit Breeders Assin. Arva is a nice little town located about 10 miles from the beautiful city of London, Ontario, for us here in Southfield, Michigan it is about 300 miles round trip.

The Forest Hills Rabbit Club put on a very nice show, and under Dominion rules had 150 head. They claim that under A.R.B.A. rules they would have about 300, or the same as they had last year in their fall show.

we took five Dutch, one Blue sr. buck, one Chocolate sr. buck, one Chocolate sr. doe, one Chocolate jr. buck and one Chocolate jr. doe. All took firsts, with the Chocolates going Best of Breed and Best Opp. Sex, or grand champion and reserve.

These Dutch breeders in this part of Canada are very eager to raise and show good Dutch and they have some good marked ones, too, but the big thing over there is type. They can't seem to get a good cobby rabbit with good head and ears.

I wasn't there fifteen minutes when a good Canadian Dutch breeder presented me with a cold beer and asked if we could have a little talk. It seemed that he and a couple of other fellows came over across the boarder to buy what they thought were some good black and blue Dutch from who they thought were honest Dutch breeders. I don't know what they paid for these rabbits or how many the got but I do know that they got what they thought were honest pedigrees.

The rabbits they bought were JUNK and I really mean JUNK.

This man told me that out of a litter of six he had three that were Dutch marked and three that were POLISH. Another man told me that out of each litter he gets one or two Polish. We were invited to a pork chop dinner at the home of one of these Dutch breeders and he showed me a litter of Dutch out of a buck from the states. That litter had Black, Blue, Lilac, Tortoise and Polish — all litter mates — hard to believe? Well. I saw it!

I felt so bad about t is that I left him my good Blue buck so that he might have some chance of coming up with a good one for a change.

Fellow Dutch breeders, this is down-right rotten. It's hard to believe that some of our own Dutch Club members would sell their JUNK to our good friends across the boarder.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

MORE ABOUT THE COLORS

I read with interest the article in the January 1967 "DR" concerning the winners in the various colors of Dutch for a large number of shows.

Many have been watching this procedure for a long time and have been perturbed about the matter. There is some valid reason why this is as it is, but basically why do we have this predominately Black and Blue winning situation?

Basically I believe it stems back to the juding table itself. As I remember a judge's remark from 1953, which has stuck in my "gizzard" ever since. Harold Adams and I were partners in Sandstorm Rabbitry at the time and were showing large numbers of Dutch throughout the Southwest and even shipping some to other parts of the country. We produced a little Gray Dutch buck that was a beauty during this year. He was shown throughout the country and won very consistently everywhere. But, on one occasion, a judge had Best of each color on the table picking the Best of Breed. When he had gone through them several times, he made the comment, "The Gray is the best rabbit, but I can't give Best of Breed to a Gray." Needless to say, the gray was not Best of Breed, but a rabbit which was, but the judge's own remark, inferior to the Gray. Why? Was it simply because the judge was afraid of publick opinion? This should not be! Just because a rabbit happened to have a gray coat, was no reason to discriminate against him, or is it? It so happens that the Standard of Perfection lists Gray as one of the recognized colors and I thought all colors were to be considered in the final analysis of picking the top honors. By that, I do not mean color quality should not be considered, but that a good colored gray should have the same consideration as a good colored black or blue, or for that matter, a chocolate, steel-gray or tortoise.

In the English Spots, we have had this battle for years. Several of the better known judges simply would not consider any color but black or blue for the top two honors, until they were forced into it by devious means, such as holding out the blacka and blues so they had to place a chocolate, tortoise, or lilac as it were then. This has done some good, and it is not unusual to find even a gray being given Best of Breed. By so doing, the quality in these colors has also risen to well above former plains.

Another contributing factor to this matter is the emphasis on markings on the Dutch. Most judges now, place most classes of Dutch primarily on markings alone, and leave type and color out unless the decision is a close one. The competition being closer in your blacks and blues has caused these breeders to select very closely. If the other colors were judged not only on markings, but type and color too, they too would soon show imprivement enough to compete on a stronger basis than they do today, thereby making them better still in all respects.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

by J. Weinhardt I know you are all just dying to hear about the National Dutch Show so I will try to give you a few details even though the minutes are not ready for publication at this time. The show itself was held in a beautiful building and there was quite a showing of good rabbits. We had 222 in the open classes and 70 in the Junior Division. You will find full details in show reports toward the back of this issue. The arrangements were quite satisfactory with one judge (open class; set up at each end of the show room with all of his classes arranged at that end of the room. Made it a bit difficult for the exhibitor to locate any special rabbit without consulting his catalog to see which judge would, or did handle it. Also, this is the first time in m y twenty + years of showing that I've ever seen the rabbits all cooped on the floor. Sometimes when the coops are three high the lowest one is awfully close to the floor. The rabbits didn't seem to mind and at least if some got out there was no danger of them being injured by

a fall! The banquet was held downtown in a dining room connected with a large bank and the food was delicious and plentiful. Also it was very well attended. The meeting went off quite well and there was some partying afterwards.

The Seller's class created considerable interest and the total money raised for the

club was \$124.00. A full report of this will be found on a later page.

One thing I'd like to call to your attention -- a resolution was introduced by the Board of Directors and approved by the membership present for placing on the ballot which will be sent to you the end of next month. This also appears on a later page. Please read it over carefully and give a great deal of thought to what it could mean before you vote on it.

The editorial which I wrote for the April issue created so very much comment and such a flood of letters that I thought I'd bring another problem to the view of the members and try to learn what your thinking is on the subject. The question was raised in the organization of Specialty Club Secretaries at the Louisville Convention regarding the unfairness of some Specialty Clubs in requiring the local club sponsoring the show to place (and pay) quite large specials on their breed to qualify for a Sweepsta ke while the Specialty Club refuses their own specials unless there is a certain number of their members showing. In fact some Sepcialty Clubs go so far as to try to tell the local show officials that they cannot pay out the special money or trophies as +.e case may be unless the exhibitor is a member of their specialty club: Since there is no way of enforcing or policing such a rule it is ridiculous so we won't go into that.

It is my belief that the ADRC Sweepstake rules are about the fairest there are on the books. All that we require is that \$1.00 be offered and paid on the Best of each of our varieties. It isn't too often that you will find this paid out when there is only one rabbit critered in a variety and almost always when this is true the loss is far more than made up by the more popular varieties.

In all the years I have been secretary of this club I've had only one complaint from a show secretary and that was this past winter when a secre tary wrote me that she didn't think it was right to have to offer and pay \$1.00 when you know an exhibitor would enter an inferior rabbit in that variety just to collect the \$1.00. I pointed out to her that I could remember when that club was paying out \$1.00 on one inferior animal in another variety so what had happened? Somebody must have decided they weren't going to let that exhibitor get away with that kind of stuff any more and got some good ones and this year there were almost as many animals in that variety as there were in Black. After all the purpose of a Sweepstake is to stimulate interest and encourage the exhibition of that breed and it is mutually beneficial to the local club and the Specialty Club and should not create a hardship for either one and above all should not put an additional burden on the show secretary, who is THE most overworked and underpaid person in the rabbit industry.

Along these same lines is the matter of show rules which the specialty clubs set up for the conduct of sweepstake shows. Again, since the main purpose of a sweepstake show is to encourage the exhibition of the breed, these rules should be made as simple as possible and the Crecialty Club secretary should lean over backwards to make it

easier for the local club to comply. These rules have been set up by the membership to aid THE MEMBERS and anything done by the Specialty Club Secretary to make it more difficult for the members is only going to hurt his (or her) own Club. Maybe this is a confessional and just maybe I'll get my ears pinned back for it, but I have NEVER disqualified a show for errors in the printing of their catalog. When the catalog is mailed to me in plenty of time before the show I have written the show secretary and pointed out the error with a request that a correction be posted in the show room. When the catalog isn't sent to me until the show report is mailed and I find an error I write and ask the show secretary if the rules were complied with. These people aren't trying to be masty, or to deliberately flaunt our rules -- they are poor overworked human beings who are doing the best they know how many times with very poor equipment. Let's give the show officials a break and build our own Specialty Club while helping them out.

We had planned to replace them anyway, but not quite so soon. We even lost all of our carrying cases although we sure won't need them for a while. Now will be a good time for all those people who have a case or two berrowed to return them.

In the process of fighting the fire, saving rabbits, etc. my son-in-law Wroke his
