

As markings are of primary importance in breeding Dutch, this article will be devoted to the reproduction of well marked animals.

Type, Color & Fur while also very important are characteristics that are easily fixed within a bloodline by selective breeding.

Much has been written about the use of mis-marked Dutch as breeders. Are they of value? Are you building on a good foundation? Fist we must decide what is a mis-marked animal. A Dutch could possibly have high cheeks, long odd stops and a poor belt and still not possess a standard disqualification. Another could have excellent cheeks, belt and stops and be disqualified by a colored spot on the shoulder.

In my own program off marked does are used for breeding if they meet the following conditions - they must be the direct offspring of outstanding show quality parents. They must come from a litter in which an outstanding show animal is produced or a litter in which all desirable markings are found. They must have markings which impress me, along with their faults.

Careful, selective line and inbreeding will produce well marked animals for you with amazing consistancy. Most rabbit breeders place their evaluation of an animal strictly on its phenotype. Proper consideration must also be give to the geno type as what markings you put into the makeup of your Dutch will come back to bless or haunt you.

Your stud buck should be as good as you can get in markings, as well as type color and fur and should be replaced as soon as you get something better. When you get a buck that is truly outstanding, you should line breed him as much as possible to fix his characteristics firmly in the line. Does mated to him should be well marked show animals or meet the qualifications for a mis-marked breeder. Do not save anything from a mis-mark that is not of top quality.

Some breeders select their matings on the basis of balancing faults. I personally try to eliminate faults by breeding only from the best or as close to desirable as possible. If I have five black senior bucks to show, one isstill the best. He is the one I want my litters from. Any mating of Dutch can possibly produce a real winner if you're lucky but where do you go from there. Only from a good foundation where all characteristics are firmly fixed can you hope to breed good Dutch consistantly.

One of my most promising youngsters at this writing is a baby blue buck from a mis-marked black doe. The doe is the product of breeding two Grand Champions and is a litter sister to my Grand Champion EZ. She was bred back to her G.C. sister to produce this Blue buck. the mis-marked doe that produced him is disqualified by a very poor saddle. She has excellent type, color, stops and the best blaze and cheeks I've ever seen. When this blue buck is ready to use he will be mated only to well marked does.

I have a litter of seven tortoise at present. Five will show and three will make Grand Champions easily. The mother is a Grand Champion and it out of a G.C. buck and a good show does. The father of the litter is also a G.C. and is a son of the doe. Mis-marked does from this litter would be satisfactory for breeders if they are impressive in some area.

BREEDING BETTER DUTCH (CONT'D)

Basically then to raise well marked Dutch, I believe you must start with the best stock obtainable and stay within a line. Breed from your best and replace animals as you produce better ones. Use mis-marked breeders only when they have the characteristics and background to better your herd. Learn to evaluate your litters. To me a good litter is one in which all markings that are desirable is produced even if a top show animal is not there. It is simply a matter of combining their markings on one animal and repeated breeding of this combination will usually do this or come close. A litter which produces a fault consistantly is not a good breeding and the combination should be changed or eliminated.

While some may not agree with my program, I can only say that this has been a successful approach for me for many years. I breed all varieties of Dutch but only have a few breeders in each bariety. I am unable to attend as many shows as I have in the past but am still raising and shipping to other breeders the kind of Dutch that makes your heart beat a little faster when you look them over.

In regards to the extra points on Dutch, there are several arguments against Norm McNary's suggestion. It would not cause any more work for a show secretary. The number of Dutch has to be counted for the purpose of making out the legs for B.O.B. - B. Opp. Sex, Best & Best Opp. Varieties. It would not promote a larger entry than the other suggestion. If a breeder knew he would get a point for each rabbit shown, that would entice him to show more Dutch. It would hardly be fair for an entry of 35 Dutch to get 50 points for B.O.B. and an entry of 135 Dutch to just get 50 points.
