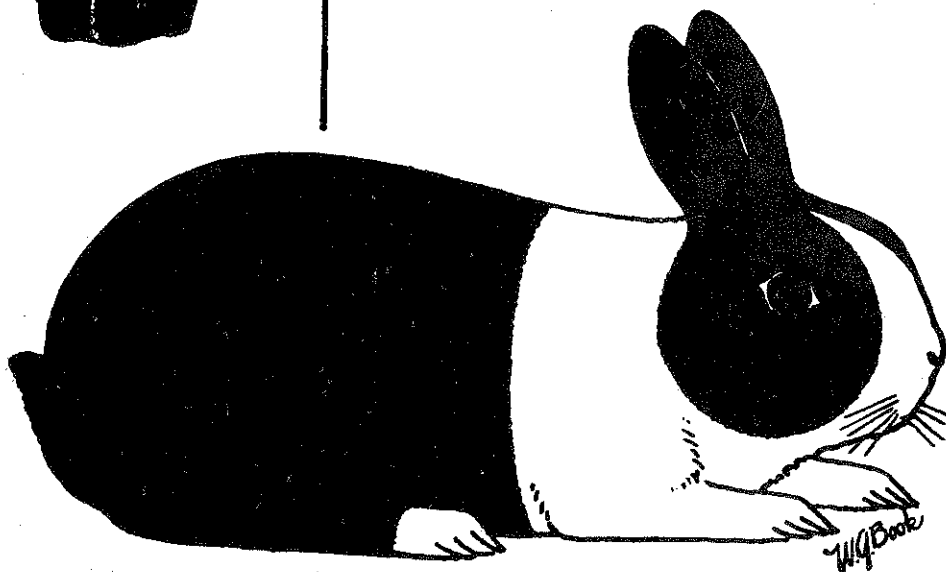

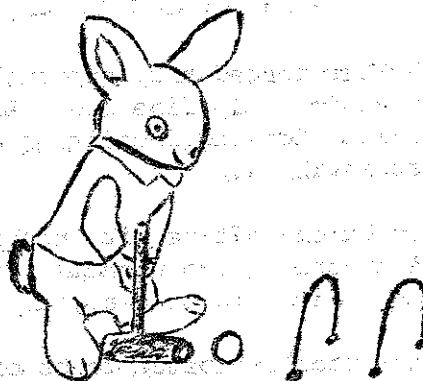

FROM THE SWEEPSTAKES CHAIRMAN

Fellow Dutch Exhibitors,

I hope everyone has enjoyed a prosperous spring, and will have a good summer. It's time for the Fair shows to begin, and I know in our area the Dutch are one of the top breeds at Fairs as well as at local shows. As 1,001 other people have probably already told you, start preparing your rabbitries and rabbits for the hot weather. It will show up in the long run.

My reason for writing is that as the Sweepstake Chairman for the ADRC, I naturally see all of the show reports that come into the Secretary's office. Along with these reports, there should be a list of the specials offered at the show. Sometimes these specials are included. Most of the time they aren't. At any rate, it seems that quite a few of these lists show that the sponsoring clubs are not offering the required \$1.00 for the best of each variety. It is hard for the Secretary's office to do anything about this because she doesn't know what the specials are until the show reports are sent in. Sometimes, not even then. I believe the ADRC members could help out in this case by informing the sponsoring clubs of the required specials if not enough is offered. For anyone not realizing what is called for now by the ADRC,--\$1.00 must be offered for the best of each variety. This applies whenever there are ten or more shown in the breed, per ARBA show rule #18. As long as there are ten shown, there can be no stipulation such as "variety specials paid only if 5 or more shown in the variety." Our Dutch rabbits deserve care, recognition and much more, and the Dutch exhibitors the same. So let's help each other, and the club by seeing that the sponsoring clubs of ADRC sanctioned shows uphold our rules.

WENTON CARLTON says....

I have just returned from Kansas where I attended the National Dutch Show. A very nice time was had by all and the Kansas people put on an excellent show! Those who couldn't attend, missed a fine time and a good show. Thanks Kansas Dutch Club for a good time!

It is that time of the year here in the great south west when the show season has come to an end. The hot weather is just around the corner. We have had a very good year in Dutch in this part of the country. The number shown has been up and the number of breeders has increased as well.

We in Arizona are in the process of starting a Dutch Club. If anyone is interested in joining, dues are \$2.00 and we'll be very happy to have you. The club is to be known as the "Arizona Dutch Club."

Just one more show this year----Flagstaff on May 29-30. Dutch will be judged both days.

"FIRST CLASS MAILING FEE"

For those of you who have raised, or still raise Steel, I salute you!

About a year or two ago someone dear to a lot of us enticed or "nudged" a couple of us to try developing a line of show steel. After looking around I found that one bloodline had good but not excellent type. Another had excellent fur but failed in type. Another had markings but both fair type and fur. Well, wouldn't you know it, I had a couple from three bloodlines intending to inter-breed and through strong culling pick out the best of breed-----Now, three generations later still no Best of Breed but am now coming closer.

I started by using my straight bred black bucks to both gray and steel does. From these six does I got a grand total of 33, of which all were mismarked, with 28 black, 1 steel and 4 gray.

I saved 1 black buck and 1 steel buck and 2 gray does to inter-breed. That was last fall. The two gray does bred back to the black/gray buck has now produced 2 steel youngsters and one (so far) great gray doe with no genetic defects. Oh yes, mixing the original 4 bloodlines produced 6 that had buck teeth out of 33 produced. These six were eliminated on the spot.

It is very easy to identify gray in the nestbox as they have no undercut when born. They honestly look sort of weird or alein when one has bred blacks for so long. The steels apparently cannot be identified in the nest box until they are 5 or 6 days old. At this point the steel ticking starts to show as well as the ears appear to be a little lighter than the comparable blacks at this age. Hopefully in another generation or two, the genetic defects will have been culled out and my line of steel or perhaps steel and gray will emerge.

The final line must be one of congratulations to all you steel breeders who have circumvented to the point at which you're at. Yes, today you may look down and smile, but it is apparent that steel are the most exasperating, frustrating critters to develop!

ARE YOU GUILTY? By: Roger Eich

Spring is by no means a time to relax and neglect your rabbitry. Many times I have the occassion to visit a rabbitry some distance from my home and not always are they Dutch raisers. This happened just a few weeks ago on my way back from the National Dutch Show in Hutchinson, Kansas. The owner said he worked hard trying to do everything right all through the winter months admitting he had more free time to work in the rabbitry and it paid off.

However, once spring was around the corner and the weather began to mellow some, the cool damp weather set in and he neglected a few very important areas in his 77 hole rabbitry.

I related to him that this was a perfect time for animals confined to an improperly ventilated building to have alot of lung problems. The building was well insulated with an exhaust fan located on the ceiling at one end. This fan was regulated by a time clock running ten minutes out of each hour. I noticed some of the bunnies had severe cold conditions and he complained of pneumonia and loosing lots of young with respiratory problems. I was quick to point

out to him two items. First of all there was an excess of manure built up under the cages, even though it was at least 36 inches below the cage an amonia condition was very noticeable. He advised me the barn was cleaned weekly during the winter months because he had all kinds of time then. He agreed it should be cleaned weekly or apply worms.

The second suggestion I gave him was to connect the exhaust fan to a humidistat switch and try to control the humid conditions in the building. He agreed to try this by extending the outlet duct from the roof exhaust fan down to within twelve inches of the floor and also making an alteration on the window inlets so the air would flow upward as it came into the building. This should eliminate any cross draft created by the exhaust fan.

This particular rabbitry is located many miles from my home so unfortunately I have not heard how he is getting along although we did receive a card soon after we arrived home thanking us for the visit and he mentioned making the changes on the ventilating system. Sad,---sad,----very sad that he doesn't have a Dutch on the place, but we're working on him!

NOTES FROM Tom Dietrich

The 1982 National Dutch Show was a well run and very well put together show by the Kansas State Dutch Club. Kansas was an interesting state,--seems like they were trying to burn the state down, but after consultation with Conall Addison, I was advised they were burning off the top grass to insure proper growth for the oncoming plantings.

As chairman of the seller's class committee, we will be making some recommendations we feel will help the seller's class in the future. The seller's class at the '82 National Dutch Show had some excellent animals in it and I think Dianne and Scott Williamson got a corner on that market. So with their own stock mixed with the excellent animals they purchased, I feel they will continue in their winning ways.

It is finally spring time and the litters should be coming a little easier now. My best Dutch are usually born in the fall, but you can still get good animals during the heat months.

A thought I've had about judging---personally I do not feel it is humanly possible to know and be considered an expert on all the breeds of rabbits. I've always thought it would be sensible to license specialty judges.----I know, in my case, I feel I know enough about Dutch to be a very well qualified Dutch judge, but don't really have the interest in the other breeds to be what I look for in a judge---an expert on the breed he is judging. A specialty judge, I feel, would be in great demand at your club shows, etc.

Committee For YOUTH

There is good news and decisions made at Hutchinson by the Committee for Youth. From these actions, there are several logos (mottos) you will be reading throughout this D.R. The Jan/Feb issue of the D.R. listed ten short term goals and six long term goals. Action was taken on the short term goals at Hutchinson and are listed below.

1. Youth sanction fee will be \$5.00. This makes the youth portion self supporting plus a small amount going into the treasury which will be used on trophies, plaques and other unforeseen expenses for the youth. All youth members and sanction fees are recognizable in the treasurer's books.
2. Youth membership fees already approved and indicated on the membership fees in the back of the Dutch Reporter.
3. Youth judging contests. Further study and procedures to be formulated. Help from each district and state will be needed here. It is hoped that judging (rather informative sessions) clinics will be held to help the young to gain knowledge on the Dutch rabbit.
4. Youth news. The chief reporter for the youth is Monica Hardt, P.O. Box 356, Holbrook, Arizona 86025. We need youth reporters from all the Districts as set up by the ARBA. So far, Connie Weber is a reporter from District 8. Her address is 5100 Dueber Ext. S.W., Canton, Ohio 44706.
5. Youth show reports will be published in the Dutch Reporter
6. Youth sweepstakes same as open class and the period of time for these are from National Dutch Show to National Dutch Show. It is very important that the local show secretaries get their reports in as soon as possible. We are going to allow 60 days from the date of the show to get these reports to the Sec'y.-Treas. If they are not in by that time, the points will not count. Sweepstakes points will be kept by: Dick Gehr, 190 N. First Ave., Coal City, IL. 60416
7. The youth sweepstakes results will be made public at the ARBA Convention.
8. A running count of the top twenty sweepstake leaders will be published in each Dutch Reporter.
9. Ribbons will be sent with sanctions and given out by the local club on the day of their show.
10. Champion Certificates---more study needed and procedure to follow. We're thinking of certificates for Supreme Champions and Club Champions.

One long term goal was brought up---Scholarship Awards on National and District levels. Wenton Carlton is working on this as much study and in-put is needed on this idea.

From these actions I felt we made good progress towards getting a good Dutch Youth Club started. There are some other ideas that have been mentioned that will take some time in formulating and lots of co-operation from the youth and adults throughout the country.

In the summer of 1964 is when the hobby of rabbit raising appeared in my life. After going through an explosive year in school, my dad felt that I really needed some type of an outside hobby. The first group of rabbits I had was a real "Heinz" fifty seven mixture. I started out with a white doe, a black doe and a brown doe. My first buck was half Californian. After a few months, I had built my herd up to just about every color of rabbits under the sun.

The first two people to really introduce me to pedigreed rabbits was Carl McNabb and Tom Dawson of Jasper, Tennessee. My first pedigreed rabbit was a Champagne doe purchased from Mr. McNabb. He was very patient and spent alot of time answering all of my questions about showing rabbits. The first show that I attended was the Chattanooga Fair Show of 1965. The fair was held at the Warner Park and myself and Tom Dawson made alot of trips that week to meet and talk to different rabbit breeders.

After getting to know so many of the Chattanooga Rabbit Club members I joined and Bob Griffith started showing me the ropes of showing rabbits. Bob really took me under his wing and instilled the spirit of showing rabbits. Bob was also the first person to introduce me to the amazing Dutch rabbit and I was really hooked. The first show Dutch I had was a cobby Dutch doe that I got from Bob in 1965.

Mickey and Mae Watters have also been very instrumental in helping me build up my Dutch herd. They have been very unselfish in helping me pick out rabbits that would produce a good click. They have given me the encouragement to keep going when I really felt like giving up. Mickey kept telling me to just keep trying and I would get a good show animal. Finally, I hit the jackpot and was able to raise my share of show winners.

Fred Perry of Gadsden, Alabama was very helpful when he gave me a little black buck. The first year I bred to this buck I produced three Grand Champions. This buck is still in my bloodline and his generations are now producing Grand Champions.

The biggest thrill in showing Dutch came in 1980 when I won Best Blue at York, PA. The show was the National Dutch Show and was judged by Scott Williamson and Jack Pugh. It really was a dream come true when I saw my little blue doe sitting up there as the "Best Blue."

DUTCH CLUB MEMBERSHIP POTENTIAL

Several years back when I was appointed Publicity Director for the Eastern Dutch Fanciers, I set a goal of 80 members by 1980, a dramatic increase for the Eastern membership, and a number of our members thought I was crazy. Each year the goal has been changed--it's currently "82 by '82"--and we have had a very substantial increase in membership although we've never quite made the goal. There are currently 76 E.D.R.F.C. members.

The interesting thing about this is that, contrary to the belief of some, the goal is actually conservative. Where are all these prospective members, you ask? Actually there's a simple answer because the prospective list has been published. You simply check the American Dutch roster as published in the March-April issue of the D.R. and list those who aren't in your regional Dutch Club. On the other hand, you can reverse the procedure and check your regional roster for those who don't appear on the A.D.R.C. list giving you a list from which to seek new A.D.R.C. members. In both cases the people involved obviously have some interest in Dutch--a necessary starting point for a sales pitch.

In the case of my roster analysis for 7 Eastern states I found 63 A.D.R.C. members who don't belong to the Eastern Fanciers and 17 Eastern members who aren't in the A.D.R.C. so there's a lot of potential here for both clubs..if the members in the respective states follow up on this. I would suggest that other regional Dutch Clubs could find this exercise useful for the benefit of both their own clubs and the A.D.R.C.

Finally, in the states of N.Y., N.J., PA., MD., VA., and W.VA. there are 63 of you reading this article who aren't members of the Eastern Dutch Fanciers. We'd love to have you as members. We are a dedicated, active bunch of Dutch Fanciers in a program geared to the 1980's with dues (only \$2 a year) still held-over from the 1950's. We think our quarterly newsletter is more than worth the price of the dues alone. Give us a try. Check our ad in this issue and send your \$2. to the Secretary as listed. We guarantee it will be money well spent. (Note: We also welcome memberships from outside the Eastern region for those who want to stay in touch by enjoying our newsletter.)

Ed Note* I found this article to be very interesting and feel that Dan has an excellent idea to boost the membership in all Dutch Clubs. QUESTIONS

I would like to make a suggestion for a future article. Perhaps some breeders that have done some shipping could write an article about how to do this. For example: Does UPS ship rabbits? What is the best way to ship? What arrangements must be made? Who do you make them with? This would be a real help to us that are just getting started. Thank you very much.

Ed: Pat, below you will find an article I asked a breeder here in Illinois to write concerning the shipping of rabbits. I hope it is of some help to you in the future.

ANSWERS

Shipping rabbits is a pain in the neck, but sometimes is the only practical way to move stock from seller to buyer. Air freight seems to be the only way to ship rabbits anymore, as I understand that neither the railroads nor UPS or the US Post Office will handle live rabbits. Hopefully you are close to an airport that can offer you a choice of airlines that give service to your destination, as some airlines just about flatly refuse to handle live rabbits and others will try to find excuses not to take your shipment, and yet others are willing and co-operative.

Always call the airlines first to get information in making shipping arrangements. Do not ever just go to the airport with your shipment and try to make arrangements. That's not the way it works and you would probably come right back home with the shipment. If, when calling the airline, you get someone who gives you a hard time and unsatisfactory answer, try calling back 8 to 16 hours later. You might talk to a more co-operative person and could receive more favorable information.

You will have to reserve space on a particular flight the day before shipment and then have the rabbits there 1 to 2 hours before departure, depending on the individual airline requirements.

You will need health papers filled out by a licensed veterinarian. Most states do not list anything for rabbits, so my vet simply writes, "rabbits appear healthy and show no signs of any known disease". The health papers should also state clearly "Live Rabbits" and also list the Breed, Variety, Sex and age of each animal. Also included must be the name of airports and cities of both origin and destination. The name and legal address of the person receiving the rabbits, as well as your own, must also appear on the health papers.

We use show carriers to ship rabbits because it's easier and faster than to build one, but it is not necessary. You can make a cage of good wire or wood or both that should be acceptable as long as it is comparable to a show carrier in strength and security, and in providing some air circulation. As we purchase show carriers for this purpose, we give our customers the choice of either paying for the cost of the carrier and keeping it, or to return it to us by UPS at their expense.

I would recommend that each rabbit be in a seperate compartment and that you attach some kind of containers for feed and water in each. This is really just for appearance since rabbits will usually not eat or drink during shipment anyway, but we do put a piece of carrot, apple or celery in the feed containers just in case the rabbit wants something.

The airlines have a limit to weight and over-all size of cages, but you may find that you can fasten together 2 or more cages into 1 acceptable unit. I fasten a piece of thin sheet metal or plywood to the top of each unit and write with a wide-tip felt ink marker the name of the airline, flight number, airport and city of destination, and name, mailing address and telephone number of the person receiving the rabbits with instructions to "call on arrival".

You can ship the rabbits and have the buyer pay for the shipping charges upon receipt, but the airlines will insist that you agree, by signature, that you will pay for both the shipping charges going out and then back to you in the event that the buyer does not accept the shipment.

Shipping charges vary with each airlines, but most are in the \$40.00 to \$60.00 range per unit right now. Distance is not a factor, as I have paid the same to ship rabbits 300 miles or 2000 miles. Airlines include some insurance in their shipping fee and have available additional insurance if you so desire.

The airlines I have dealt with, in general, take good care of the rabbits while in their care. I have more confidence in them now than when I first started to ship by air, but I am sure that some day something will go wrong as we are dealing with people who don't know anything about rabbits.

Like I said, shipping rabbits is a pain, but is sometimes necessary.

"Minutes of the 1982 Board of Directors Meeting"

Hutchinson, Kansas

April 16, 1982

The ADRC Board of Directors meeting was called to order by President Scott Williamson at the showroom of the 1982 NDS. All officers were present with the exception of Don Lovejoy, William Geitzenauer & Mickey Watters. Director Eich arrived a few minutes late. Also attending were Al Butler, Wilbur Williamson, Barb Gioielli and Dick Gehr. A motion was made by Jack Wireman that we dispense with the reading of the previous minutes as they were published in the Dutch Reporter. The motion was seconded by Wenton Carlton. Motion carried.

Officer Reports:

Vice-President Wireman reported that it has been a bad winter for breeders but the shows seem to be larger.

Director Dietrich reports that Michigan was in the process of forming a Dutch Club. He also stated that there were few juniors due to the winter.

Director Carlton states that this is the beginning of the warm season which wasn't very good for the rabbits. He reports that there aren't many breeders in his area but more Dutch are being shown. He also states that Arizona and New Mexico are in the process of forming a Dutch Club.

Director Eich says that mail has tripled concerning the rabbit industry in the past year. He states that the Dutch are always the best sellers over Easter and pet stores are usually always sold out.

A report from the East by Barb Gioielli included that the Dutch were always largely represented at shows. There is a normal entry of 100 to 125. She reports that spring bunnies weren't plentiful but the inquiries were up greatly from last year.

A first quarter treasurer's report was given by the Secretary-Treasurer and an audit of the books is to take place on Saturday. Norma Hart reports that memberships seem to be increasing.

A discussion was held on transferring the Life Membership and Contingency Fund accounts to a higher interest account. After discussion on keeping the accounts separate and liquid, Roger Eich made a motion seconded by Jack Wireman that we check into placing these accounts elsewhere. Motion carried by Majority vote.

Jack Wireman gave a short report on the membership committee. He says that the committee is young yet and we need ideas from members so we can start getting some feed back.

Audit Committee reports that they will have their findings at the General Membership meeting.

Al Butler gave a report on the Constitution and By-Laws Committee: A complete Constitution and By-Laws with all of the changes is needed for the new guidebook.

Al Butler presented proposed amendments to the By-Laws: Change Section 3 to read;

The President and Secretary-Treasurer shall each receive the sum of \$50.00 for attendance at each annual, regular or special meeting, providing the meeting is not held in the town in which either resides, in which case there shall be no payment to the resident. In no case shall the payment to either be in excess of the sum of \$100.00 per calendar year.

Add Section 3-A:

The Publicity Chairman shall be paid \$50.00 for each National Dutch Show and ARBA Convention which he/she transports American Dutch Club Publicity items for sale at the Club booth., such funds to be paid from the Publicity Fund. In no case shall the payment be in excess of \$100.00 per calendar year and no funds

shall be paid if the show is held in city where the chairman resides.

A motion was made by Jack Wireman and seconded by Roger Eich that these amendments and additions be presented to those in attendance at the General Membership meeting for a vote to be placed on the final ballot. Motion carried by majority vote.

Wilbur Williamson reported on the youth committee: His committee is to be called "Committee for Youth." Wilbur states that they will move forward. Dick Gehr will take care of the youth sweepstakes and Monica Hardt of Arizona volunteered to be the chief reporter for the youth. Separate youth show reports to be published in the Dutch Reporter. The top 20 leaders in the youth sweepstakes will be published each issue. Ribbons to be awarded for BOB, BOS and the Best of each Variety to winners providing they are ADRC youth members. Sanction fee to be \$5.00. The youth program will be on a 3 year trial basis. There have been 27 new youth members since the first of the year. Director Eich explains that an ADRC membership could be given the buyer of a Dutch rabbit from the seller. The purchase price of the rabbit could include a slight extra fee to help defray the cost. A motion was made by Jack Wireman and seconded by Tom Dietrich that we approve the youth committee proposals. Motion carried unanimously.

Director Dietrich reports that the Seller's Class for the NDS was well advertised. The class will have an immediate payback and will be held at the completion of the judging. The seller's class committee to decide on the guidelines for this event.

Al Butler reported for the Publicity Committee. Sales seem to be going well. New ADRC patches in Black, Blue and Chocolate are now available. A Dutch pin is in the process of being checked out for possible new item.

The Educational Committee reports that a lot needs to be done with youth promotion, and Education. Youth don't seem to understand the guidebook. It was mentioned that it doesn't seem to be conclusive and comprehensible.

A discussion was held on the return of sanction report forms to the ADRC office. These are to be in within 30 days of the completion of the show. No sanction will be issued a club until previous sweepstake report is received. This to be printed in the Dutch Reporter.

Wenton Carlton made a motion seconded by Roger Eich that the new Guidebook be made available for distribution next year.

Dutch Reporter mailing to increase to \$4.00 due to postage costs. Canadian and Foreign memberships to be regular fees plus \$4.00 additional.

Jack Wireman read a bid from the Ohio Dutch Rabbit Club for sponsoring the 1983 National Dutch Show. The bid was considered and a motion was made by Director Eich and seconded by Tom Dietrich that Ohio be awarded the bid for the 1983 NDS to be held in Canton, Ohio. Motion carried.

New Business: A typewriter is needed for the ADRC office for stenciling and editing the Dutch Reporter and also for daily secretary duties. Roger Eich made a motion seconded by Jack Wireman that a maximum allotted fee be available for the purchase of one. Al Butler spoke in behalf of the Publicity Committee with a donation of \$250.00 from the Publicity Fund for the purchase. Motion carried.

The ADRC is initiating a scrapbook on the Dutch Rabbit and overall rabbit production to promote the Dutch Rabbit. This book will be made available to those attending the National Dutch Shows and ARBA Conventions.

There was a discussion on holding some type of membership contest in the future to encourage new members.

Being no further business, a motion was made by Roger Eich and seconded by Jack Wireman that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried

Director Eich also gave a short statement on the transferring of the club's Life Membership and Contingency Fund accounts to a higher paying interest account but remaining liquid.

Wilbur Williamson gave a brief talk on the Youth Committee, and says that it is disturbing that it has taken this long to get a youth program started. Wilbur's goal is to reach 300 youth members in 3 years.

Jack Wireman spoke on behalf of the membership committee. He states that we must support the shows, buy publicity items for awards instead of trophies,--place ADRC memberships up as specials. He states that they hope to have a total of 1000 members by the end of the year.

Al Butler talked on the publicity department. He says that Walt and Anna Cook held a clock raffle at the '82 NDS which brought in \$62.00. He states that sales seem to be going well and they are working on new items.

Barb Gioielli spoke for the Education Committee: She states that there is a lot that needs to be done for the youth. She says that it's tough when the adults don't understand things like breeding for color and genetics and we expect the youth to know. More information is needed.

The standards Committee will do their best to keep the ADRC standards the way the membership wants them. Don Brady took a great part in keeping them the way they are today.

Discussion was had on the new guidebook. It's to be made available by the next NDS. Articles and ads are needed. The old guidebook will be made available for sale through the publicity department.

There was a cash collection taken for the ARBA Convention from the members in attendance at the NDS banquet. \$101.00 was collected and will be divided 50/50 between the open and youth. A cash collection was also taken up from those in attendance for the 1983 NDS. \$75.00 was collected and will be divided the same way. Jack Wireman invited everyone to attend the '83 NDS to be held in Canton, Ohio on May 7th.

Dennis Holcomb states that the ARBA provides funding for the processing of slides and tapes for the promotion of specific breeds.

The proposed changes and addition to the Constitution and By-Laws was read and a motion was made by Rusty Schultz and seconded by Barb Gioielli that they be placed on the final ballot for a majority vote. Motion carried.

There was a discussion on the publicity committee not receiving any money for attendance at the National Dutch Shows and ARBA Conventions. This is an addition to the Constitution and By-Laws, not an amendment. There was a motion by Pat Herman and seconded by R.C. Farrill that it be placed on the final ballot. Motion carried. L. & L. Johnson were recognized for their life membership in the ADRC awarded them at Syracuse. They are well known for their Dutch support.
