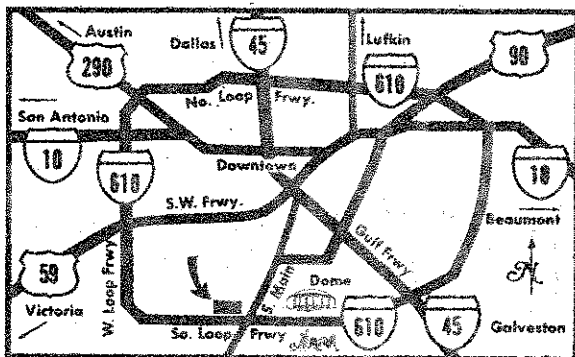
## President's National Report

From the Desk of the Secretary

The 1985 National Dutch Show has now been placed on file under "one of the best!" I am told that the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers were the hosts of a very nice show with the largest total entry to date. My only regret is that I was unable to attend. Dick Gehr did his best to fill me in on the weekend and make me feel as though I had actually been there. However, it just wasn't the same. I now have a room reserved for Houston ---- "IF" all goes well, I hope to see you there!

The Constitution and By-Laws Committee has submitted the proposals that will appear on the final ballot. You will find these printed elsewhere in this issue. I was asked to possibly help define the issue regarding the "Director by District." When you receive your ballot, you will find two (2) options regarding this issue. The first option is how it was presented to the Constitution and By-Laws Committee regarding the addition of three (3) Directors by "District". The Constitution and By-Laws Committee has also been approached regarding the addition of three (3) Directors but "not by District." The Committee felt that if they only presented the addition of Directors to the membership in one form, it would be unfair to those that have stated the desire and need for additional Directors, but do not agree with the district proposal. Only giving the membership one choice, if the Director by District was defeated, we would then stay as we are. Allowing two (2) options, the membership can then best decide which proposal, if either, they would prefer. The Committee felt that the membership should have the same opportunity as they did when voting on the standard proposals. Regardless of how you vote or who you vote for, please VOTE! At the present time, our voting procedure is of a "large" expense to the ADRC.....remember, the ADRC is YOU!! The cost of printing envelopes (ballot, election chairman and regular outside club envelopes), ballots, and the postage incurred in mailing approximately 600+ adds up. Ballots are mailed out twice a year and it can be quite discouraging to see very little response in comparison to the amount of ballots mailed out. Voting is a privilege that should be taken advantage of by each eligible voter!

The '84-'85 sweepstakes is at a close. I've sent Vicki Hertel, ADRC Sweepstakes Chairman, a list of each ADRC sanctioned show held from the close of the '84 NDS through the close of the '85 NDS. Vicki will go through that list to see if there are any outstanding show reports. Those shows not included in the final sweepstakes will be listed in an issue of the Dutch Reporter.

It's time to start making preparations on how to keep those bunnies cool. That hot, humid weather will be upon us before you know it. Always have a fresh supply of cool drinking water available! This, along with proper ventilation, is a must at all times!! If you'd like to share your secrets on "how to keep cool", I'm sure that Dianne would be happy to put them in print. 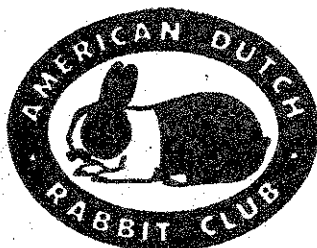

The meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club Board of Directors was called to order at 9:30 P.M. April 26, 1985 by Vice-President Jack Wireman.

Roll Call: Present were Vice-President Wireman, Directors Geitzenauer, Williamson, Carlton and Dietrich. Those absent were, President Williamson, Directors Campbell and Eich, Secretary Hart.

Director Carlton Made a motion, seconded by Director Williamson that the reading of the minutes of the last Board of Directors meeting be dispensed with as they were printed in the Dutch Reporter. All present voting AYE - M.C.

REPORT OF OFFICERS:

Director Williamson reported that he has not attended many shows lately. He has been approached by some of the membership with suggestions for the ADRC. Among these were to increase the number of Directors and more judges at the National Dutch Shows for expediency.

Director Dietrich stated that the number of Dutch in the open shows were up, while youth numbers were down. He had been contacted about a discrepancy in issuing a sanction within a 500 mile radius of the NDS. This problem had been resolved.

Director Carlton reported that the Dutch numbers were up in his area except in California. Director Carlton agreed with Director Williamson regarding more judges for the National Dutch Shows.

Director Geitzenauer reported that members in his area were for more Directors of the ADRC, but not by district. Shows are averaging 80-110 Dutch. Director Geitzenauer also stated that some of the ADRC show rules should be reviewed, and if necessary, changed.

Vice-President Wireman stated that there were more Dutch being shown in his area. He said that the youth numbers were up.

National Dutch Show rule #10 was discussed and Director Carlton made a motion to amend the rule with the following being inserted for the 3rd. sentence; "The ADRC Secretary will contact the 1st and 2nd highest judges on the ballot for NDS judge and inquire as to availability and cost. The ADRC Secretary shall then contact the sponsoring club and verify if the fee is agreeable. The ADRC Secretary shall then notify the judge as to acceptance or not." This motion was seconded by Director Dietrich. All present voting AYE - M.C.

REPORT OF COMMITTEES:

Dick Gehr gave a report on the Constitution and By-Laws Committee.

Upon the arrival of President Williamson, the meeting was turned over to him.

Director Williamson stated that there were 16 youth who applied for the Achievement Contest with 12 completing the applications. A 4-H Agent judged these forms and the results will be given later. Director Williamson and Marti

Dill will hold the youth "Quiz Bowl" at some time during the weekend.

President Williamson appointed Director Dietrich to chair the Audit Committee with two other members of the ADRC during lunch on Saturday.

The Publicity Department report listed \$916.95 in sales since the last report with \$1392.60 in expenditures. At the present time, there is \$71.35 in the checking account, \$614.79 in savings and \$36.10 in petty cash. Publicity Department balance is \$722.24. There was a motion by Director Dietrich and seconded by Director Geitzenauer to accept the Publicity Department's report as read. All present voting AYE - M.C. President Williamson suggested having a Publicity Department distribution west of the Mississippi River. Discussion followed. There was a motion by Vice-President Wireman and seconded by Director Carlton to have Al Butler investigate the cost of having a small catalog of ADRC items made up for distribution by various designated people. All present voting AYE - M.C.

President Williamson stated that Dianne was having some problems with the mimeograph. Cost of repair was estimated at \$165.00. Motion by Director Geitzenauer and seconded by Vice-President Wireman that the mimeograph be fixed at the approximate cost. All present voting AYE - M.C. President Williamson stated that Dianne would like the Board to consider a raise in the Dutch Reporter Editor fee. There was a motion by Director Carlton and seconded by Vice-President Wireman to amend the "step increment" in Dutch Reporter Editor fee to the 2nd year amount. All present voting AYE - M.C.

A bid for the 1986 NDS was submitted by the Iowa Dutch Club. A motion was made by Director Geitzenauer and seconded by Director Dietrich that this bid be accepted. All present voting AYE - M.C.

There was a motion by Director Dietrich and seconded by Director Carlton that the Board of Directors Meeting adjourn and reconvene on Saturday morning. All present voting AYE - M.C.

The ADRC Board of Directors Meeting reconvened at 9:15 A.M. Saturday, April 27, 1985 by President Scott Williamson. Roll Call: Present were President Williamson, Vice-President Wireman, Directors Geitzenauer, Williamson, Carlton and Dietrich. Absent were, Directors Campbell and Eich, Secretary Hart.

The Seller's Class was discussed. There was a motion made by Director Williamson and seconded by Tom Dietrich that the ADRC purchase the Seller's Class trophies for NDS and ARBA Conventions. All present voting AYE - M.C.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

A list of items submitted by Secretary Norma Hart were discussed with proper action being taken where necessary. There was a motion by Director Williamson and seconded by Vice-President Wireman that one half of the money donated to the sponsoring club of the NDS (from the ADRC) be listed as cash specials donated by the ADRC. All present voting AYE - M.C. President Williamson appointed Director Geitzenauer to chair a committee to revise the National Dutch Show rules. There was a motion made by Director Geitzenauer that judges be able to judge as many NDS's in a row as the membership votes for. This motion was seconded by Director Williamson. All present voting AYE - M.C. A motion was made by Director Geitzenauer and seconded by Director Carlton that NDS show sponsors have the authority to hire more than 2 judges at their own

discretion. All present voting AYE - M.C. A motion was made by Director Carlton and seconded by Vice-President Wireman that judges at the 1986 NDS use score cards for the top 5 rabbits in each class. This to be done on a trial basis. All present voting AYE - M.C.

A motion was made by Director Dietrich and seconded by Vice-President Wireman that Don and Nelle Brady be awarded life membership in the ADRC. All present voting AYE - M.C.

A motion by Director Geitzenauer and seconded by Director Dietrich allows all Presidents of the ADRC to be granted a life membership when they leave office. This is to include all past Presidents. All present voting AYE - M.C.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Director Williamson and seconded by Director Carlton. All present voting AYE - M.C.

MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP  
1985 N. D. S. -- YORK, PENNSYLVANIA

The meeting of the General Membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order at 10:00 P.M. April 27, 1985 by President Scott Williamson. Roll Call of officers: President Williamson, Vice-President Wireman, Directors Williamson, Dietrich, Geitzenauer, and Carlton were all present. Absent were Directors Eich and Campbell, and Secretary-Treasurer Hart.

Mr. Williams made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the previous General Meeting as they were printed in the Dutch Reporter. This motion seconded by Wenton Carlton. All present voting Aye. Motion Carried.

Report of Officers - The Treasurer's Report has been printed in the current issue of the Dutch Reporter. All other officers reports can be read in the minutes from the Board of Directors meeting.

Report of Committees - Vice-President Wireman reported that the 1986 National Dutch Show had been awarded to the Iowa Dutch Rabbit Club. Lowell Simonson, representing the Iowa Dutch Rabbit Club stated that the dates of the 1986 NDS would be May 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, at the Fair Grounds in Des Moines, Iowa. More will be appearing on this show at a later date.

The minutes of the Board of Directors meeting were read. There was a motion by Director Williamson, seconded by Vice-President Wireman to accept the minutes as presented. All officers present voting Aye. Motion Carried.

A collection was taken for the 1986 National Dutch Show, which brought in \$160.42. This will be awarded to the Iowa Dutch Rabbit Club.

Al Butler gave a brief report on the Publicity Committee. At the present time, there is about \$3,000.00 of items in inventory, which is all paid for. Al thanked the membership for their support of the Publicity items. There will be some new items coming out for the Publicity Department in the near future, or by the National Convention in Houston.

President Williamson, representing the Standard Committee, stated that there had been some difficulty in getting the standards presented in the ARBA Standard of Perfection the way that our membership voted on them, but the situation had been resolved. The standard will be presented as voted on by the ADRC membership, with the exception of the hock description, which is just a variation in the wording.

Director Dietrich, representing the Audit Committee, reported that the books were in very good shape, up to date, and accurate. The only thing suggested was that the Life Membership Fund might be combined with the Contingency Fund in order to draw more interest. A couple of receipts from the new Dutch Reporter Editor were missing, possibly due to the changing of that particular job.

Director Dietrich also reported on the Seller's Class Committee. He thanked the members of this Committee that were present, Wenton Carlton, Alan Miller, Stan Goeglein, and Lynn Shaw, for the outstanding job they have done in the past couple of years. There were 12 rabbits sold in the Youth seller's class for a total of \$174.50, and the Open seller's class had 26 rabbits sold for a sum of \$1,672.00. This gave us a total of \$1,846.50 taken in from the seller's class, of which 1/2 goes to the donors.

Director Williamson gave a report on the Youth Committee. He thanked the Youth for their participation in the projects, and hoped that the enthusiasm would carry over to next year.

Unfinished Business - None.

New Business - Larry Thompson stated he would like to see a memorial award given in Tom Shufflebotham's name at the 1986 National Dutch Show. There was a motion made by Larry Thompson, seconded by Beth Bachschmid that an award be given, at the 1986 National Dutch Show in honor of Tom Shufflebotham. This award to be a plate on the Best of Breed trophy with Tom's name on it. All present voting Aye. Motion Carried.

Vice-President Wireman asked for a round of applause for the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers Club for the fine Show they put on for us this weekend.

Good & Welfare - Paul Dill asked if it would be possible to get \$1.00 awarded for Best of Varieties in the Youth shows. President Williamson stated that Paul should use the Dutch Reporter as a tool to gain support for this.

Being no further business of the organization, Alan Miller made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Mark Pecaric, all present voting Aye. Motion Carried.

## PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

The Constitution and By-Laws Committee has been at work for the past few months. It is our recommendation that the following changes be considered for the betterment of the ADRC. Some of the items are new, some changes, and some just clarifications. PLEASE read them carefully. If there are any questions regarding them, feel free to contact myself, or one of the members of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. The Committee consists of Dick Gehr (Chairman), Bill Geitzenauer, Beth Bachschmid, Jan Coffelt, Marti Dill, Rock Billups, and Larry Myer. All of these members have done an outstanding job of answering correspondence, devoting long hours to their job, and keeping an open mind when covering all subjects. These changes will appear on the Final Election Ballot, and as this is your club, I hope each member takes the time to review them and VOTE.

### CONSTITUTION

The following changes will be considered as OPTION 1. Due to the complexity of the Director by District proposal, all of the following Articles and sections would have to be changed. PLEASE read them carefully, and remember that they are all included in OPTION 1.....OPTION 2 will appear after OPTION 1.

#### OPTION 1

CHANGE Article V section 1 of the Constitution to read:

The elected officers of this association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, and nine (9) Directors, who shall be elected for a two (2) year term, by and from the membership. The President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and nine (9) Directors shall constitute the Board of Directors. Each of the nine (9) Directors must reside in a different district. Any member, to be eligible for any office, must be an owner and breeder of Dutch rabbits.

CHANGE Article V section 3 of the Constitution to read:

The President and four (4) Directors representing districts 4, 6, 8, and 9 shall be elected biennially on the numerically odd years. The Vice-President and five (5) Directors representing districts 1, 2, 3, 5, and 7 shall be elected biennially on the numerically even years. The Directors representing each district will be elected by a vote of the members living in that district only.

CHANGE Article V section 4 of the Constitution to read:

Vacancies in office shall be filled by appointment by the President, subject to approval by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Board of Directors. If filling the office of Director, a person from the same district the vacancy is in, shall be appointed.

ADD Article V section 5 to the Constitution to read:

Directors shall be elected from the nine (9) districts divided as follows:

- #1 - Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, Alaska, and all Foreign.
- #2 - California, Hawaii, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, and Colorado.
- #3 - North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Missouri.
- #4 - Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Kansas.
- #5 - Illinois and Indiana.
- #6 - Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee, Kentucky, Georgia, Florida, North Carolina, and South Carolina.
- #7 - Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Massachusetts, and New York.
- #8 - Michigan and Ohio.
- #9 - Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, West Virginia, Maryland, and Virginia.

Since the regions of each district are based on membership residing in said district, the regions outlining each district

shall be re-evaluated every ten (10) years.

CHANGE Article VI section 1 of the Constitution to read:

VOTING PROCEDURES - Two (2) nomination ballots and two (2) Ballot envelopes shall be included in each March-April Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of May, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of May. The Election Committee Chairman shall then package the nomination ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible by any member in good standing, providing proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

CHANGE Article VI section 2 of the Constitution to read:

The Secretary-Treasurer shall determine the eligibility of the nominees and ascertain if they will accept the nominations. The two (2) highest who are eligible and have accepted the nomination for each office of President or Vice-President shall be listed as candidates for their respective offices on the final election ballot. There shall not be more than two (2) names on the final election ballot for the offices of President or Vice-President, except in case three (3) or more eligible nominees received the highest number of votes, and the number is identical thus creating a tie (or in case of a tie/ties for second place) and providing further that the three (3) or more accept nominations. There shall not be more than two (2) names on the final election ballot for the office of Director in each district, except in case three (3) or more eligible nominees received the highest number of votes, and the number is identical thus creating a tie (or in case of a tie/ties for second place) and providing further that the three (3) or more accept nominations.

Two (2) final ballots and two (2) Ballot envelopes shall be included in each July-August Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of September, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of September. The Election Committee Chairman shall then package the final ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible to any member in good standing, providing proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

ALL OF THE ABOVE ITEMS WOULD BE NECESSARY TO ACCEPT THE DIRECTOR BY DISTRICT PROPOSAL. IF YOU WOULD WANT THE DIRECTOR BY DISTRICT PROPOSAL ACCEPTED, YOU WOULD VOTE 'YES' TO OPTION #1.

#### OPTION 2

CHANGE Article V section 1 of the Constitution to read:

The elected officers of this association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, and nine (9) Directors, who shall be elected for a two (2) year term, by and from the membership. The President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and nine (9) Directors shall constitute the Board of Directors. Each of the nine (9) Directors must reside in a different State. Any

member, to be eligible for any office, must be an owner and breeder of Dutch rabbits.

CHANGE Article V section 3 of the Constitution to read:

The President and four (4) Directors shall be elected biennially on the numerically odd years. The Vice-President and five (5) Directors shall be elected biennially on the numerically even years.

CHANGE Article VI section 1 of the Constitution to read:

VOTING PROCEDURES - Two (2) nomination ballots and two (2) Ballot envelopes shall be included in each March-April Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of May, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of May. There shall not be more than two (2) names on the final election ballot for the offices of President or Vice-President, except in case three (3) or more eligible nominees received the highest number of votes, and the number is identical thus creating a tie (or in case of a tie/ties for second place) and providing further that the three (3) or more accept nominations. On the numerically odd years, there shall be eight (8) names on the final election ballot for the offices of Director, providing there are eight (8) eligible nominees who have accepted nominations, providing further that each of the eight (8) nominees for offices of Director reside in different States. On the numerically even years, there shall be ten (10) names on the final election ballot for the offices of Director, providing there are ten (10) eligible nominees who have accepted nominations, providing further that each of the ten (10) nominees for offices of Director reside in different States. Should two (2) or more otherwise eligible nominees for Director reside in the same State and should two (2) or more accept the nomination, the one securing the highest number of nomination votes shall become the eligible candidate. Should two (2) or more otherwise eligible nominees for Director reside in the same State and receive the highest number of nomination votes, identical in number, and should these two (2) or more nominees accept nomination, then it shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to break this tie immediately following the acceptance of their nominations.

Two (2) final ballots and two (2) Ballot envelopes shall be included in each July-August Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of September, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of September. The Election Committee Chairman shall then package the final ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible to any member in good standing, providing proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

ALL OF THE ABOVE ITEMS WOULD BE NECESSARY TO ACCEPT NINE (9) DIRECTORS, BUT NOT BY DISTRICTS. IF YOU WANT NINE (9) DIRECTORS, BUT NOT ELECTED BY DISTRICTS, YOU WOULD VOTE 'YES' TO OPTION #2

### OPTION 3

The elected officers of the American Dutch Rabbit Club would remain the same as at the present time. The President, Vice-President, and six (6) Directors.

IF YOU ARE SATISFIED WITH THE ELECTED OFFICERS AS THEY ARE NOW, A PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT, AND SIX (6) DIRECTORS, YOU WOULD VOTE 'YES' TO OPTION #3.

IF YOU VOTED 'NO' TO OPTION #1 AND OPTION #2, AND VOTED 'YES' TO OPTION #3, THEN YOU WOULD VOTE EITHER 'YES' OR 'NO' FOR THE FOLLOWING CHANGES. IF YOU VOTED 'YES' TO OPTION #1 OR OPTION #2, THEN YOU WOULD NOT VOTE ON THE FOLLOWING CHANGES AS THEY ARE INCLUDED IN THE FIRST TWO OPTIONS.

CHANGE Article VI section 1 of the Constitution to read:

VOTING PROCEDURES - Two (2) nomination ballots and two (2) Ballot envelopes shall be included in each March-April Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Should two (2) or more otherwise eligible nominees for Director reside in the same State and receive the highest number of nomination votes, of identical number, and should these two (2) or more accept the nomination, then it shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to break this tie immediately following acceptance of their nominations

Two (2) final ballots and two (2) Ballot envelopes shall be included in each July-August Dutch Reporter mailed. All members with voting privileges shall remove their ballot from the Dutch Reporter, and upon completion of voting, place it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, with the voters name and return address once it in the ballot envelope and seal it. This ballot envelope shall be placed in another envelope addressed to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, with the voters name and return address on the envelope. Upon receipt of the envelopes, the Secretary-Treasurer shall verify the eligibility of the voter. The Secretary-Treasurer shall open and discard the outer

envelopes. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive these ballots until the 15th of May, at which time the polls shall be closed. The ballot envelopes shall then be packaged and sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee, and he/she will assemble the Election Committee, open the ballot envelopes, count the ballots, and certify the results to the Secretary-Treasurer, President, and Dutch Reporter Editor by the 25th of May. The Election Committee Chairman shall then package the nomination ballots and send them to the Secretary-Treasurer of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, and they shall be retained for a period of one (1) year, at which time they may be destroyed. These ballots, while in the hands of the Secretary-Treasurer, shall be accessible by any member in good standing, providing proper arrangements are made with the Secretary-Treasurer.

THE FOLLOWING CHANGES ARE TO THE BY-LAWS, AND HAVE NOTHING TO DO WITH THE FIRST THREE OPTIONS. EITHER VOTE 'YES' OR 'NO' TO EACH OF THE FOLLOWING ITEMS.

#### BY-LAWS

CHANGE Article III section 2A of the By-Laws to read:

An annual allotment of \$500.00 from the General Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Show, with further stipulation that at least 1/2 of the allotment be used for cash specials, and listed as such, from the American Dutch Rabbit Club. Said money to be sent by the Secretary-Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to January 1st preceding the National Dutch Show for that year.

CHANGE Article III section 3 of the By-Laws to read:

The President shall receive the sum of \$50.00 for attendance at each annual, regular, or special meeting, provided that meeting is not held in the town in which he/she resides, in which case there shall be no payment. In no case shall the payment be in excess of the sum of \$100.00 per calendar year. The Secretary-Treasurer shall receive the sum of 20 cents per mile round trip, or round trip coach air fare, whichever is less expensive, for travel expenses to the National Dutch Shows and the A.R.B.A. National Conventions. Should the National Dutch Show or A.R.B.A. National Convention take place within 125 miles radius of the Secretary-Treasurer's home, only the sum of \$50.00 will be paid. In the case that the National Dutch Show or A.R.B.A. National Convention should be held in the town in which the Secretary-Treasurer resides, he/she shall receive no payment for expenses.

CHANGE Article IV section 3 of the By-Laws to read:

The Election Committee shall consist of a Chairman and two other members, none of whom shall reside in the same county as either the President or Secretary-Treasurer. The Election Committee shall be appointed annually by the President, from the membership, with majority approval of the Board of Directors. The Election Committee shall assemble and open the ballots, tabulate the results, and certify these results to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Dutch Reporter Editor within ten (10) days after the closing of the polls. If all three (3) members of the Election Committee are unable to meet to carry out these duties, the President shall be notified immediately, and different Election Committee members appointed, as needed, prior to the opening of the ballots. It is necessary that the signatures of all three (3) members of the Election Committee accompany the results as sent to the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Dutch Reporter Editor. No member of the Election Committee shall be eligible for election to any office. Any member serving on the Election Committee shall not be eligible to serve on this Committee again for a period of three (3) years.
