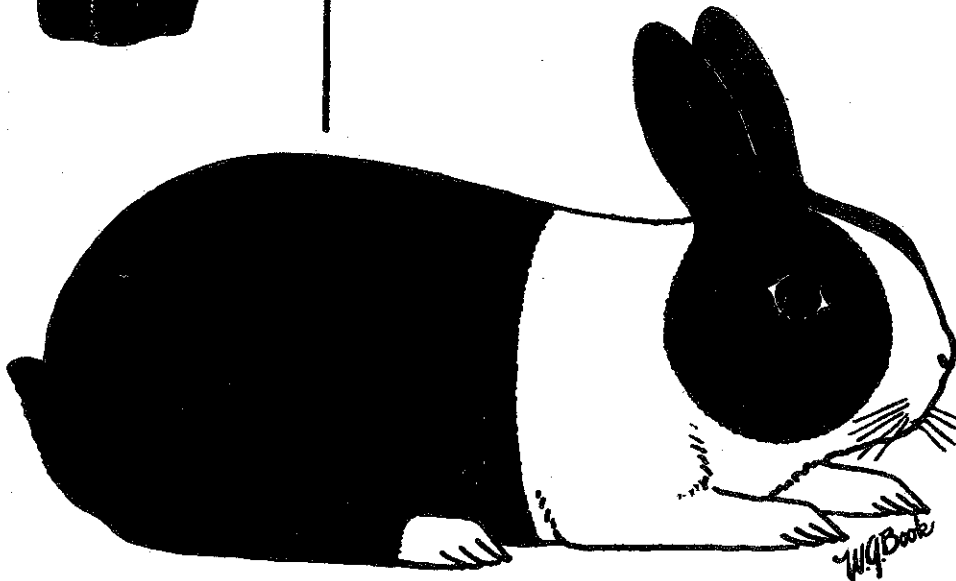

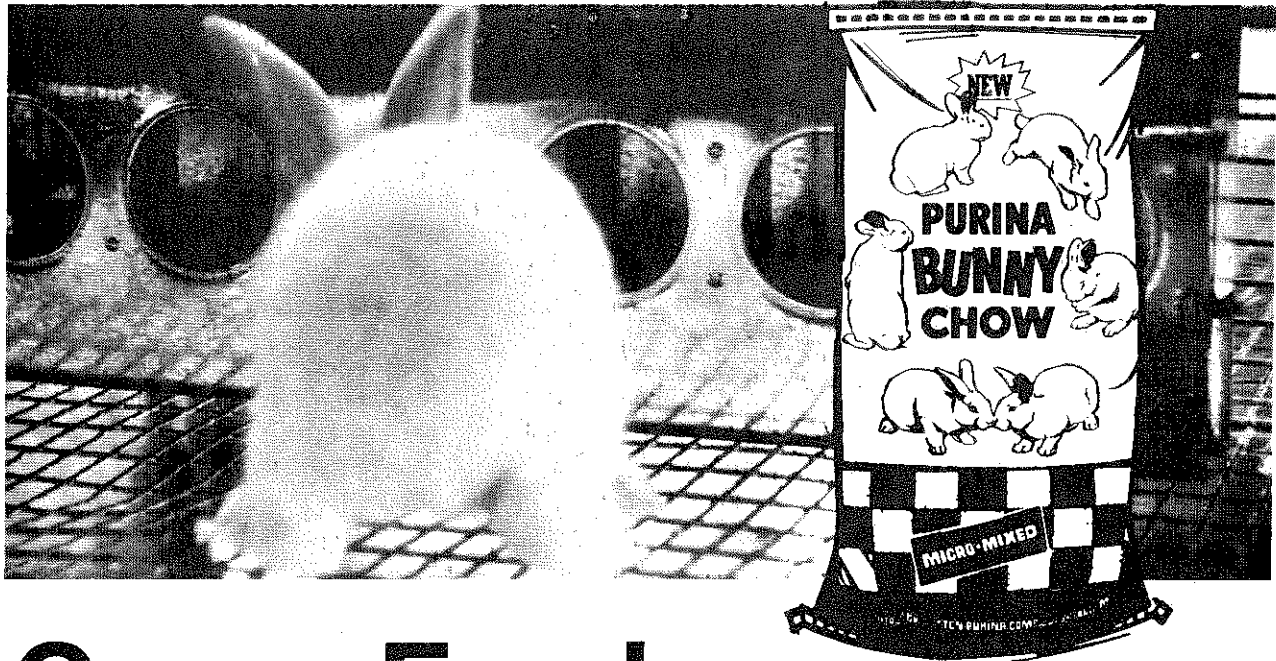

Bob Sprague, well known throughout the West as an outstanding rabbit breeder and ARBA Judge for over a quarter-century, was recently feted at a testimonial dinner where he was presented the coveted Honorary 4 H Life membership. The dinner, held at the La Sierra High School in Sacramento, was attended by nearly 200 well wishers including 4 H members, their parents, members of Bob's family and officials from other rabbit organizations.

In a surprise announcement, a contingent of uniformed 4 Hers, complete with Color Guard, unveiled the newly created "Robert E. Sprague Award" which will be presented annually to a 4 H rabbit exhibitor for outstanding achievement.

Master of Ceremonies Donald E. Matthews, President elect of the Northern California Rabbit Breeders Association presented a biographical sketch of Bob at dinner.

"Bob Sprague, was born in Sacramento," Matthews said, "at the turn of the century - 1900 - which makes it easy for his family to remember that this is his 72nd year in action. Perhaps an unhappy thought for some; but for Bob, with his good health and youthful figure, he can't help feeling good about it."

"Like many Sacramentans, Bob grew up right around home when he was 17 he went to work for the Southern Pacific Railroad and stayed with them as a machinest until he retired in 1966 after more than forty years of service. Incidentally, Bob's family has lived in and around the Sacramento area for six generation. Their first great grandchild was born just a couple of weeks ago."

"However, in 1922, Bob brought an outlander into the family when he married Dagmar Miller from far away Lincoln - located in distant Placer County. Tonight, after 50 years, we honor Bob: I'm sure that everyone will agree we are really honoring them both. Any women that can put up with rabbits right along with kids and grandkids is de deserving of some special notice. So, we salute you, Dagmar, as a women of great patience and understanding.

"And that brings up the subject of this evening's other star - Mr. Rabbit, himself. This furry fellow came upon the scene of the Sprague family around 1930, as an Easter present for daughter June. And like many Easter bunnies, this one was destined for the nearby woods or the animal shelter. However, Father Bob intervened and thereby hangs a "tail".

"From 1931 to 1936, Bob developed his understanding of quality breeding which hit a high point in the sale of one of his bucks for \$60.00. Any time you can swap one buck for sixty bucks, you've got to be one of the worlds greatest salesmen.

After that success, Bob turned his hand to judging. He served two years as a Registrar, and then after passing a complicated set of written and oral examinations he earned his license as an official Rabbit Judge of the American Rabbit Breeders Association, and as many of you know, the ARBA Board of Directors recently honored Bob with a lifetime membership and judging license."

"The Sprague team began it's association with the 4 H program in the 1940's. Way back then, Bob started giving his time as a rabbit judge at Field Days, County and State Fairs. As one of the founders of the Northern California Rabbit Breeders Association they helped sponsor that group's youth program called the Bunny Boosters."

"Well, the rest is history, Bob and Dagmar have donated their time, their money their talents and their love to the world of rabbits; but, more important, to the world of kids - your kids and mine."

## TO ALL RABBIT BREEDERS

I want to take this opportunity to share and convey my thoughts and opinions about two of the nicest people I know and let everyone know how fortunate the Fort Worth Club is to have them as our members and at the present time are serving as President and Secretary of the Southwest Rabbit Breeders Association Club.

It all began back in 1951 when the Jones' joined our Club, then named Southwest Rabbit Breeder Association. They became very active members, participated in all activities, raising and showing good rabbits and at the same time improving their breed as they learned more and more about rabbit raising. They are very honest people and have no secrets about raising rabbits that they won't share with you at any time. This couple will simply go out of their way to help a new or old breeder with all of their problems if they only ask them to.

In 1952 some of the members did not agree, so the club split and Clyde and Doris just belonged to both of them and did not take sides. In 1954, The Rarrant County Rabbit Breeders Association died off, but Clyde and Doris just kept on working in the Southwest Rabbit Breeder Association Club.

They have been superintendent and secretary of the rabbit show at the Fort Worth Fat Stock Show since the Stock Show took over the Rabbit Round-Up.

Clyde was first elected president of our Association in 1955, again in 1956. In 1956 Clyde and Doris placed 10th in the United States in Sweepstakes points on New Zealand Whites. He was president again in 1957. He was a charter member of the Texas Rabbit Breeders Association when it was organized in 1958. In 1959 they worked to get the National Convention to be held in Fort Worth in 1960. They have been superintendent and secretary of a number of the State shows. Clyde was assistant superintendent of the National Convention in 1960. President of Southwest Rabbit Breeders Association Club again in 1960, 1961, 1965 and 1966 and still showing and raising rabbits all the time. Of course, we all know Doris is a big help to Clyde and she deserves the same recognition.

In 1966, Clyde and Doris received the Breeder of the Year Award from the Texas Rabbit Breeders Association. The same year they placed 4th in the nation in Dutch sweepstakes points and in the top 10 for 1967 and 1968.

In 1967, Clyde was appointed a Director of the American Dutch Rabbit Club. In 1968, they were Chairman and Secretary of the Dutch at the National Convention at Pueblo, Colorado.

Doris was President of the Southwest Rabbit Breeder Association in 1970, and really made a good one. We are all very proud of her interest and knowledge of rabbits and just really don't know how to express it other than by awarding a plaque which reads:

MR. AND MRS. SOUTHWEST RABBIT BREEDER ASSOCIATION

Clyde and Doris Jones

This award was given to them at the regular Club meeting, with a reception and picture taking afterwards in their honor, by the Club Members. Letters of congratulations came from many friends who could only be here in thought but wanted to convey their love to them.

Well, to sum this all up I just want to say thanks for letting me share part of their joy in receiving this award and I just wanted everyone in all the Rabbit World to know about it and congratulate these two wonderful and deserving people

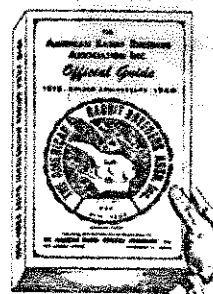
