

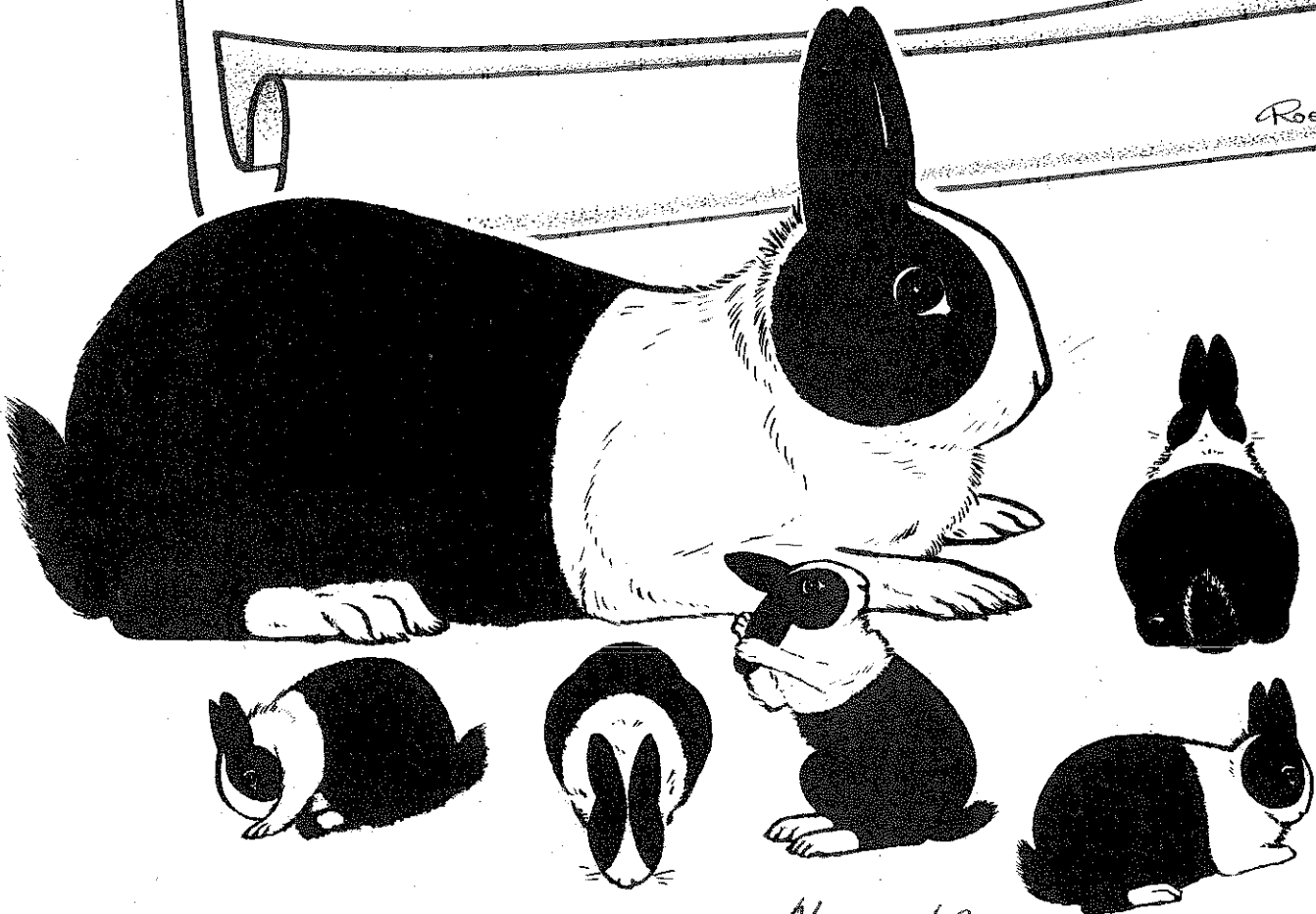

Minutes of Annual Meeting of the ADRC

The annual meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was held at Allentown, Pa. Monday evening Oct. 21, 1946. In the absence of President Gibbons and Vice-President Beaver, Mr. R. J. Bernhardt was appointed chairman of the meeting. On the roll call of officers the following were present, Secretary-Treasurer Souers, Directors, Blyth, Lewis and Bernhardt. Minutes of last annual meeting were read and approved. Treasurer's financial report read as follows; Cash on hand Jan. 1, 1946 \$193.82, Membership fees \$182.00, Membership fees (Comb.) \$3.00, Membership renewals \$137.00, Membership renewals (Comb.) \$3.75, Registration per cent. \$52.30: Expenditures, Office stationary \$48.03, Club ribbons \$55.32, Club charters & printing \$4.75, Zinc etching for charters \$3.35, Office supplies \$4.75, Postage \$49.90, Secretary's commission \$94.51. Total cash on hand and received \$571.87, Expenditures \$260.61, Cash on hand as of Oct. 1, 1946, \$311.26
Motion by Blyth, seconded by Lewis that report be accepted as read, Motion carried.
Election Commissioner's report on the election of club officers was read, motion by Blyth seconded by Griffiths that report be accepted, Motion carried.
Election Commissioner's report of the balloting on the proposed changes in the standard was read, Motion by Lewis, seconded by Dugan that report be accepted, Motion carried.
Chairman Bernhardt appointed a committee consisting of Blyth, Lewis and Souers, to write the discription of color of each of the variety of Dutch, also to write a glossary as it applies to the Dutch rabbit. Motion by Lowit, seconded by Griffiths that this committee be given full power as to the wording used in describing the different colors also in writing of glossary. Motion carried.
Motion made and seconded that a rising vote of thanks be given Mr. Griffiths and Mr. Souers for their work in giving the members the Dutch Reporter, the finest paper in the specialty club field. After a talk by Mr. Lewis in regards to moving the date of the next National Dutch Show up to the month of May so as not to conflict with the A&C&E Convention Show, motion by Blyth, seconded by Lowit that our next National Dutch show be held in the month of May. At the request of Secretary Souers and with the approval of Mr. Lewis, Mr. Blyth and Mr. Lowit this motion was reworded to recomend the month of May as the date for our next National Dutch Show and that the final decision as to the date be left to the meeting of the Dutch Club at Dayton, Ohio. Motion carried. Mr. Charles E. Kellogg of the U. S. Department of Interior gave a very interesting talk. Motion by Lewis, seconded by Lowit to adjourn, Motion carried.

AN APOLOGY -- A RETRACTION

The National Convention was a failure as far as the Dutch were concerned. A failure, that is, as far as arguments about the different sizes or types of Dutch. The big trouble seemed to be that when any of us from St. Louis (Bernhardt, Souers or myself) talked with the Eastern fellows (Lewis, Strickland or Williams) we all agreed on the type Dutch that we liked. As you probably well know, a show without a lot of arguments is really something, brother.

Just after I registered Sunday evening, a man came up and spoke to me and said he had noticed my name when I registered just ahead of him, he was Charlie Lewis. Never having met Charlie before, I wasn't just sure as to what was going to happen because of my remarks concerning the eastern Dutch. I was agreeably surprised to find that he was very happy about the whole thing and thought it had done a lot of good for the Dutch Club. We had quite a long talk but strange as it may seem we didn't have any differences of opinion. I thought to my self, I will wait until we get out to the showroom and look at his Dutch and then see what happens.

When we went out to the showroom he set out a blue Dutch buck and it was almost exactly my idea of how a good Dutch should look. I said, "Charlie, how long are those rabbits ears?" Well, he didn't know for sure so we measured them and they were a short $3\frac{1}{4}$ inches. I don't remember for sure the weight of the buck but I know it was very little, if any, over 4 pounds. I began to feel a little funny about that time because I remembered I was the guy who practically accused him of having long-eared, big Dutch.

Later on I talked to Dan Strickland, another long time Dutch breeder, and he told me he wanted his bucks to run between 3 and 4 pounds and his does very little over 4 pounds. With that statement and what I had seen of Lewis' rabbits, it took all the wind out of my sails. NOW, I wish to retract all of my statements regarding the Eastern or English type Dutch, because I looked, I listened and I saw exactly the kind of Dutch that most of us in this part of the country, either have or are striving for. It looks like I took someone too seriously about the requirements for a good English type Dutch rabbit.

I now wonder who it was that voted down the proposed change in the standard to $3\frac{1}{4}$ inch ears and $4\frac{1}{4}$ pounds for an ideal Dutch.

I was unable to be at that part of the Judges and Registrars conference when Mr. Lewis demonstrated the points to watch for in the Dutch, but from the reports I heard the next day Mr. Lewis did an excellent job. I understand that he was one of the very few that received any applause from the audience. Congratulations, "Charlie", on this contribution to the better understanding of what we think is America's finest show rabbit.

Our Dutch Club meeting, at which "Dick" Bernhardt presided due to the absence of the President and Vice-President, was one of the most, if not the most, orderly and well conducted meetings at the convention. All of our business was taken care of in a short time and it wasn't necessary to have more than one meeting. This was in direct contrast to the other specialty club meetings which I attended. This seemed rather strange to some people because they expected a big "blow-off". All of this goes to show that the Dutch rabbit and The American Dutch Rabbit Club are going forward in a progressive and harmonious manner.

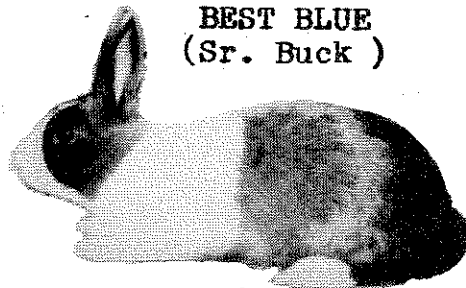

SMALL DUTCH vs. LARGE DUTCH

The past several months I have read the articles by various Dutch breeders but did not enter into the discussion as I felt my views had been expressed by Mr. Beaver.

However, I now feel I would like to write a few words in answer to Mr. Thatcher's article in the October issue of the Reporter. In this article he writes the Ohio breeders with a larger rabbit than the breeders from Indiana and Missouri have the lead in sweepstake points. I do not know how many Indiana breeders Mr. Thatcher is counting in his survey nor do I know how many Ohio breeders he is including. Now as Mr. Thatcher states, not too many of their Ohio rabbits are the small type, however this does mean he considers some of them as the small type. Neither can you say all Indiana Dutch are the same type. I don't think anyone can disagree that both Mr. Beaver and ourselves have the small Dutch. Therefore I challenge Mr. Thatcher to take any one of his Ohio breeders and add their points to his and see how they compare with Mr. Beaver's and ours. You can then see how the small Dutch will stand up in points. In fact Mr. Thatcher I have so much faith in our small Dutch holding his own against greater odds you may pick any two of your breeders and add to your own. That will be three against two, all the odds in your favor.

It would seem according to Mr. Thatcher our sweepstakes have taken the form of small rabbit versus large in the Dutch breed.

Mr. Thatcher, regardless of how either of us place in the sweepstakes, I challenge your personal show record against ours. Your larger Dutch against our smaller ones. You have as you stated shown frequently while we have only shown in seven shows and have a total of 1121 points up to date.

I have, as I said before read all the articles by the various breeders and have formed one idea in my mind. When I started several years ago to breed Dutch, I saw none of the small type Dutch some of us have today. Even Ancel Beaver's Dutch were larger and not the type he now has. His Dutch have changed and we have tried to change ours, but many of the breeders have the same type Dutch they had many years ago. The same type they imported years ago. Now I am placing my neck on the chopping block, but there is however a thing called advancement and improvement. We Americans are known for our ability to improve on whatever we try to do, then why shouldn't we improve our type of Dutch rabbit? To me that seems the whole story, some rabbits - and breeders - have made progress while other are are satisfied with no improvement. Some people even laughed at Henry Ford and said they preferred to go as their father and grandfather had gone, without the horseless carriage, but never-the-less look where Ford is today. Be it rabbits, or anything else the only way to success is through progress. Not satisfied with what we already have, but a willingness to improve.

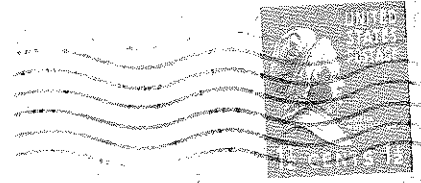
