





INDIANA STATE DUTCH CLUB GOES TO TOWN
ON A TABLE SHOW. PROCEEDS TO GO
TOWARD 1952 NATIONAL DUTCH SHOW TO BE
HELD IN INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA, IN
MARCH 1952.

A one day table show was held at the home of Mrs. Grace M. Craig, Middletown, Indiana, on September 16, 1951. Mr. Lester C. Wells was Judge, Mr. Ancel Beaver was Show Superintendent and Mrs. Craig was Show Secretary.

'Twas a wonderful show with 174 Dutch shown by 24 exhibitors. Rabbits traveled to the show from Detroit, Michigan; Dayton, Eaton and New Paris, all in Ohio; Richmond, Indianapolis, Fort Wayne, Fortville, Muncie, Noblesville, Anderson, Modoc and Middletown, all in Indiana. Rabbits were entered in every Class. Many comments were made as to whether or not this was the National Dutch Show by visitors who came to see these fine Dutch rabbits.

There were 53 Black Dutch, 26 Blue Dutch, 36 Tortoise Dutch, 19 Chocolates, 8 Steels, 11 Grays and 21 A.O.C.'s. There was a class of 19 Black Junior Does and a class of 17 Black Junior Bucks. There were 12 Black A total of 86 Bucks and 88 Does attended

the Show -- 42 Senior Bucks, 44 Junior Bucks, 35 Senior Does and 53 Junior Does.

Tuttle Rabbit Ranch had Best Display in Steels and Chocolates; these rabbits traveled from Michigan. Beaver of Indianapolis had Best Display in Blacks, Blues and Tortoise; also Best Display All Colors, Best Senior Black, Best Senior All Colors, Best Steel, Best Junior All Colors and Best Opposite Sex All Colors. Johnson of Indianapolis had Best Display of Grays. Nitzsche of Fort Wayne had Best Display of A.O.C.'s.

Best Black and Best Opposite Black went to Beaver. Best Blue was Mr. Beaver's; Yocum had Best Opposite Blue. Nitzsche had Best Chocolate and Johnson had Best Opposite. Gaddis had Best Tortoise and Nitzsche had Best Opposite. Beaver had Best Steel and Parker had Best Opposite. Johnson had Best Gray and Parker had Best Opposite. Nitzsche had Best A.O.C. and Beaver had Best Opposite.

A picnic dinner was held and everyone had a wonderful time.

Isn't this a splendid report, Dutch Rabbit Breeders, for a one day table show and, at that, a show which was held out in the country? Too, just think, all proceeds go toward the 1952 National Dutch Show!

More power to such a live-wire bunch!!!

ANOTHER MEMBER SPEAKS:

September 16, 1951

Just finished reading the late Dutch Reporter and, as the last few have quite a lot about changing the standard to a lighter weight, I do not think this a very smart move although I see quite a few nicely marked (Dutch marked) rabbits in the shows. But, to me, a lot is missing in these $3\frac{1}{2}$ lb. supposed-to-be Dutch. They are not Dutch type - cobby and compact, as the Standard calls for - but are more on the Himalayan type (Snaky). Really, I think, this is very bad for the Dutch rabbit as one reads the Standard which says that the ideal weight is $4\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Dutch type body, cobby and compact. Then see the Judge place the $3\frac{1}{2}$ lb. slim and long body to win - because of what I cannot see. Maybe a little better marked.

At least, I want to vote that we stick to our present Standard, as what we want is a Dutch just like our present Standard calls for ... especially the weight.


