Board of Directors Meeting  
April 13, 1956

The meeting of the Board of Directors was called to order at 10:40 P. M. by Pres. George Bayliss, with the following officers and Directors in attendance: Sec'y. M. Grables; V-Pres. G. C. Leisenring; Directors James Blyth, Tom Shufflebotham; Wm. Stedman; E. C. Bickley; absent, Directors J. C. Lowit, and L. E. Settle.

Motion by Mr. Stedman, support by Mr. Leisenring that the new Guide Book be mailed to all members in good standing as of May 1, 1956, First Class Mail. Carried

Motion by Mr. Shufflebotham, support by Mr. Stedman that the Oklahoma State Dutch Specialty Club be awarded the sponsorship of the 1957 National Dutch Rabbit Show. Carried.

Motion by Mr. Leisenring, support by Mr. Shufflebotham that any and all bids for sponsoring the future National Dutch Shows shall be submitted in writing to the A.D.P.C. Secretary, on or before the date of the current National Dutch Show. Carried.

First and last motions to be recommendations to the membership Club meeting scheduled for April 14, 1956:

A discussion on the Dutch Reporter, and methods on raising funds for its support followed. Two members of the Ways and Means Committee were present. Mr. Stedman and Mr. Eldon Clark, the Committee Chairman, Mr. Cyril Lowit was absent, and Mr. Stedman and Mr. Clark explained some methods of raising finances which had been discussed among the committee members.

Meeting adjourned at 12:00 midnight.

Minutes

Membership meeting, April 14, 1956

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 P.M. by Pres. Bayliss; present, Sec'y M. Grables; V-Pres. Leisenring; Directors Blyth, Stedman, Bickley and Shufflebotham. Absent, Directors Lowit, and Settle.

The minutes of the meeting held at Columbus, Ohio, 1955 A.R.B.A. Convention were approved as read.

The Treasurer's report was accepted as read.

Report on Publicity Funds, by Mr. Leisenring, was read by the Secretary, and approved as read.

Mr. Settle, Chmn. of the Guide Book Committee, sent a letter regarding the progress of the Guide Book printing, and delivery date.

Mr. Bickley, Chmn. of the Standards Committee, reported the Committee standing by ready to answer any questions on the Dutch Standards, or fulfill any duties of the committee, should any arise.

Mr. Stedman gave a resume of the work and material collected by the Ways and Means Committee. He called for ideas from the membership on how to raise the Club's funds.

Pres. Bayliss explained the reason why he set up the two new Committees - The Ways and Means Committee were to try to promote methods of increasing the side revenue for the Club's Treasury; the Educational Committee was appointed to further the original purpose of the Dutch Reporter, as well as answer questions pertaining to breeding problems, etc.

Mr. Shufflebotham, Chmn. reported for the Educational Committee. He stated that he had little to report, that he thought there should be more constructive and educational articles in the Dutch Reporter; also that he believed publishing and advertising coming Sweepstake Shows was losing money for the club; that we need articles that will help the breeders - possibly a "question and answer page." Also, he stated that he felt that the Dutch Reporter was the best means of raising Club funds.

Mr. Leisenring gave an estimate on the expense for the 1956 ARBA Convention, for ad and booth.

Motion by Mr. Bickley, supported by Mr. Stedman, that we take a 1/2 page ad in the 1956 ARBA Convention catalog. Carried.

Sec'y. Grables reported the outcome of conversations with the trade magazines owners and managers, and the outcome is that we have agreed to offer the sale of subscriptions for Small Stock Magazine, American Small Stock Farmer and the National Rabbit Kaiser through the Dutch Reporter and our office, with the club receiving certain commissions from the sales.

A general discussion on Ways and Means brought out that some members thought some support should be offered the sponsors for National Dutch Shows, from the various State Dutch Clubs; one suggestion was that each State Dutch Club should hold an annual show with the proceeds going to the National Dutch Show. Others thought this too much expense, and imposition upon the local clubs, (State Clubs). Mr. Harry Stancart stated the Indiana State Dutch Club for seven years had been donating one-half the proceeds of their annual show to the National Dutch Show held each following year.

The Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting held the previous night were read and the recommendations made to the membership were accepted on motion by Mr. Bickley, supported Al Emery.

Mr. Stedman brought up the subject of shortening the duration of the National Dutch Shows with a possibility of cutting these shows to Saturday and Sunday, with judging held on Saturday. Mr. Pickley stated he thought this subject should be brought to the attention of the Board of Directors at the St. Paul meeting for study and it should be brought up before the membership meeting to get the reaction of the members, and exhibitors. Pres. Bayliss requested that the subject be presented at the next meeting of the Board of Directors at St. Paul.

Al Emery rose to point out that there was 100% attendance of the Ohio State Dutch Club Officers at this meeting.

This meeting followed an excellent banquet attended by some 60-75 people. Friends of Mrs. Stancart presented her with a plaque, properly engraved, for her faithful and untiring efforts for work not only at the National Dutch Shows, but for the Club and the Dutch rabbit as well.

The Indiana State Dutch Club, and those affiliated with holding the 1956 National Dutch Show were given a vote of thanks for their kindnesses shown, and for a very good show.

About 40 members attended this Club meeting.

ARBA CONVENTION MEETING OF ADRC, ST. PAUL, MINN.

The membership in attendance at the Dutch Club meeting in St. Paul were unanimous in their decision to instruct the Dutch Standards Committee to rewrite the color description on our present Gray Dutch. The new description is to include the brown factor that is now present in our Grays. The belly color is to remain as at present, white on the surface with brown lap spots and no distinct undercut showing.

The Committee requests that any Dutch Club member who has any ideas to propose relative to the proper wording of this description of the color of these "Brown-Grays" to communicate same to Chmn. of the Dutch Standards Committee, Mr. E. C. Bickley; 1019 Perry St., Sandusky, Ohio.

The proposed name of this present color we now have is BROWN GRAY. We can in no way change the existing Standard except to elaborate and clarify the description on variety. Any and all suggestions and ideas are solicited. Only through the

participation of the membership at large, can your Standards Committee give you Gray breeders what you want.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

VIEWS OF A NEWCOMER

Upon attending the A.R.P.A. Convention and Show at St. Paul I came away feeling a better informed rabbit breeder. However, as it is impossible for everyone to attend these shows and meetings it becomes imperative for some people to seek and obtain information from other sources. In the instance of the Dutch breeder, the Dutch Reporter, our official publication should be one of these sources.

It was explained very pointedly at the Dutch Club meeting by President Geo. Bayliss, the Dutch Reporter was originated as an informative publication, rather than a show report, as it would seem to be at the present time. I personally enjoy it now, but could enjoy it two-fold, if our Dutch Rabbits were observed more, rather than we breeders that own them. Quoting Geo. Bayliss once more, he said, "A controversy that contained constructive criticism would be a welcome over the present policy." So, I'll air a few of my views, as a newcomer, and maybe get something started to insure the continued publication of the Dutch Reporter.

Foremost in my mind is type, as it will determine the entire animal. I do emphatically believe it is much easier to have the ideal type on a 3½ pound Dutch rather than a 5½ pound Dutch. It should be clear however, if it is possible to have "type to burn" on a 5½ pound Dutch, only I think it's harder to get, and harder still to keep.

Along the same line, I think markings will look more like "perfection" on the smaller Dutch. A small drag or run on a small Dutch, will not catch the eye so fast as one of the same proportion on a large rabbit.

Color is a very important factor, and must never be overlooked. I feel straight color breeding will pay off eventually, if the breeder continually picks fine colored Dutch. I do not practice this continually, however.

And now fellow Dutch Breeders, my pet peeve--long-eared Dutch. The Standard of Perfection calls for a "short, steeky, well furred ear." Also in proportion to body, and that is short and cobby--to me this is very clear. The ears are to be short and well rounded. Perhaps this line of thought is dominant because to me they look much better.

I don't claim these ideas are all perfectly correct, but until I get some better ones I'll go along with them. There is always some room for improvement, so if anyone has any ideas conflicting with these, I'll be willing to listen, as will every other Dutch breeder, of this I am certain.

Remember this "You can't beat the Dutch", but only as long as we continue to improve ourselves, our breeding practices, and our Dutch in general. When we fail in any one of these objectives, we will have lost the opportunity of making and keeping our Dutch "The Worlds Number One Rabbit".

It seemed wonderful to have Leona and Oscar back in the show-circle once more and we sincerely hope they are back permanently.

To anyone who is not acquainted with this wonderful couple, they were the foundation builders of our 1st. Michigan shows. Mr. Sennewald was the first President of the Michigan State Rabbit Breeders Ass'n.

Honorable mention also for the Judges, Leisenring, Fortush and Grables for a splendid job, and I do mean well done, I did not hear one disgruntled exhibitor, which is rare even at a small show.

Eldon Clark of Ohio, revived memories of the 1952 National Dutch show at Indianapolis, when Dr. Russum and Ralph Walborn were still with us.

I would also like to mention at this time that about this time the old Michigan State Dutch Club was revived. Mrs. Grables and myself dug out the old moth-eaten banner and displayed it at that 1952 show. Upon our return, by request of the old timers, the club was reorganized, and if I do say so myself, we are rolling behind the Dutch all the way. The size of our Dutch shows proves it, there were 254 Dutch this year at the Michigan State Fair; 285 at the 1955 Mich. State Fair.

I hope this club will have consecutive years of successful shows. It is nice to wind up the show season with such a good turn out. So, Out-of-State Breeders, plan to attend next year. You don't know what you missed!

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

THOSE GRAY DUTCH - AGAIN

The members who were not in attendance at the ARBA Convention in St. Paul, or those of you who have not had an opportunity to talk with any Club members who were there will wonder what Mr. Eickley's Dutch Standards Committee Report is all about. I will try to give you my conception of what happened, and though I must admit I am biased, I shall try to give you a cool description - blow by blow.

If you exhibited Grays at the ARBA Convention and received your remarks cards stating your Gray Dutch were disqualified for undercut showing, and you have seen only "white color on the surface of the belly fur" - put on your strongest specs, and get a good light, and examine for a yellow-tinge on top of the white. I did, and found said faint yellow tinge on top of the white color - except the ONE SENIOR BUCK WHO WAS PASSED. This is getting mighty technical - to disqualification for this

faint yellow tinge. I read enough correspondence on the Gray Dutch Standards as it was passed from Committeeman to Committeeman to KNOW that the reason this clause "disqualify for undercut showing on the surface of the belly color" was inserted in the Gray Dutch color description was to KEEP light colored Steels out of the Gray Classes. (Light colored steels do have a colored belly.) However, this is the Gray Standard, and this was "how" the judge saw them, and placed them accordingly.

Now, for another bearing on the subject, and I am not attempting an apology, however, I hope that I can make myself clear to you without stirring up a fuss, and with a minimum amount of offense to anyone involved.

Judge Guthrie was assigned to judge the Gray Senior Bucks, and junior does; Judge Leisenring was assigned to judge the Gray senior does, and junior bucks. Judge Guthrie disqualified all Grays in both his classes on the grounds that their color did not conform to the color description of the Gray Dutch Standard. Judge Leisenring found none of the rabbits in his two classes had pure white belly color on the surface - (One senior doe in Mr. Leisenring's classes was eliminated for overweight)

So, in round one, we wound up with NO GRAY DUTCH HAVING BEEN PLACED. Tension arose, some of us were really "put-out" - and finally the Dutch Standard Committee huddled, and members of the AREA Standards Committee were drawn into an open discussion on the show room floor with Dutch breeders, judges and sundry rabbit breeders, listening in, and in some cases joining the discussion. When the smoke was cleared away, and it had been pointed out that the only disqualification on the color of the Gray Dutch is the clause: Disqualification for undercut showing on the surface of the belly color - the judges were asked to reconsider the placing of the Grays. Judge Leisenring consented to look them over, and did so, going through the Gray classes he himself had previously judged, and those classed judged by Mr. Guthrie. On this round, Mr. Leisenring found only one Gray Dutch which he considered as having a pure white belly color on the surface of the fur. This was a Senior buck, and this one Gray Dutch was the only Gray Dutch placed at St. Paul, ARBA Convention Show out of a total of 15 Grays.

In the well attended second session of the ADRC meeting, attended by both Mr. Leisenring and Mr. Guthrie, a candid and frank discussion on the Gray Dutch was held. It was pointed out that several years ago an attempt was made to change the color description, and name, to fit our present Gray Dutch, to no avail, as the ARBA Standard Committee at that time would not go along with the ADRC on this subject. They thought then, as several breeders do today, that we should try to get a clearer color on the Grays, and try to breed them to the Standard. Those of us who have bred Grays for even a few years can not see an appreciable amount of better color in the Gray Dutch today over five or six years ago. Mr. Guthrie spoke about his own experience with Grays, and the trials he had made on getting better color, without any success. The concensus was that the brown factor present in the Gray Dutch today is in sufficient amount to warrant the opinion that to breed out the brown factor would entail introducing possibly another breed of rabbits, and that if we cannot lick 'em, join 'em - or re-write the Gray color description to fit the Gray Dutch we now have. In case you may wonder how I feel on the subject, I would have liked to have been given ten years to bring this Gray up to the present Standard. I believe it took that long for the Chinchilla breeders to obtain a color that satisfied them - but I certainly do think we would have had enough rust even in ten years combined with the Dutch markings to give us plenty of headaches, so I will go along, with the majority and say re-write the color description to fit our present Gray Dutch, with reservations. If the new "Brown Gray" is allowed to become as brown as some Gray Dutch I have seen, I wont no part of them. My eye is pleased when I look upon a Gray Dutch with the least amount of brass, or rust, in the color. Opinions on "how much rust" will vary, breeder to breeder, as one member declared in our meeting at St. Paul, he likes them as they are now. I do believe that in certain sections of the country the amount of rust runs heavier than in other parts - or perhaps the breeder allows this to happen. We get some very rusty ones here once in a while, but I do not usually save them for breeders.

DO LET ME POINT OUT to you who exhibit and breed Gray Dutch - keep right on exhibiting and breeding them. The Judges at the ARBA Convention provised that they would

"bend over backwards" in cooperating with the Gray breeders until this thing is cleared up. No more disqualifying on the grounds that the "color on the animal does not conform to the color of the description". You are not likely to meet with any more difficulties here.

Keep on breeding and exhibiting Grays while this new "Brown Gray" description is being written. Remember, you will have the same Gray Dutch then, as you have now. The only difference will be the color description.....re-written to fit the rabbit. I trust the present ARBA Standard Committee will see the light and go along with us this time, and I have every reason to believe that they will do just this. It may be close to a year before this description is completed. You can help by sending your ideas on the subject to Mr. Bickley, as he requests. Just write what you like, and do not like, and this will be a beginning for the Committee. Each of you, as you know, is entitled to your own personal opinion, and entitled to have that opinion printed in the Dutch Reporter. The pages are open for you, if you want to express your views openly for all the Gray breeders to read, and all the Club members to study and make comments upon...they will be gratefully received and duly printed.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

IF I WERE A JUDGE -

If I were a judge I wouldn't blow my fool head off trying to find a white spot so that I could hurry the poor little unsuspecting Dutch off my table. I would read my Dutch Standards very carefully, check the General Disqualifications according to the ARBA Standards, and I would stay within these bounds. IF I had to hesitate even a split second on passing judgement, my judgement would GO IN FAVOR OF THE bunny - for if I even had a doubt, the bunny should get the benefit of the little doubt in my mind.

The Dutch Standards says "to disqualify for DISTINCT spot/spots". My Webster's defines DISTINCT thus: distinguished; marked out; that which may be clearly seen or discerned; clear. Enough? If I know my English, I would not have to blow my fool head off, would I? Besides, I was brought up in the old regime of rabbit raisers, and I was taught that judges should not disqualify for any foreign colored spot that the exhibitor could have picked out via the tweezers methods before he brought Mr. Bunny to the show room. Judges who disqualify for a couple or so white hairs side-by side, called a spot by them, are doing nothing more than increasing the sales of tweezers. They are encouraging the Exhibitor to be dishonest. Boys, back to the Standards. Remember, DISTINCT. If you must blow your fool heads off to see a spot, IT SIMPLY IS NOT A SPOT.

Whether or not I ever get to be a judge, I would never play basket-ball with the Dutch on my judging table. I would learn to pick them up without squeezing the sap out the hides over their backs (unless I wanted to have more white hairs to blow into at a later show), and when finished I would exert myself to the point of walking where I wanted to deposit Mr. Dutch and politely setting him down - I would never toss him to the carrier.

If I were a judge I would not give "Poor" remarks, poor head, poor type, poor color, poor markings, then place this rabbit 3rd. in a class of 3, 4th. in a class of 4, or even 5th. in a class of 5. I would have the unmitigated gall, if I thought this rabbit was poor in every section to say, "poor specimen, unworthy of placement", But I would be careful to be unoffensive, and would give my remarks properly, as "head too narrow, belt back too far, steps too long, etc." - just in case that poor little bunny might be the property of someone who did not know any better, and who might, IF given an opportunity, turn out to be a No. 1 Dutch breeder and booster.

I doubt I will ever be a judge.
