AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB MINUTLS OF MEETING

1957 National Dutch Show, April 13, 1957
 Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

The meeting was called to order by Pres. Bayliss at 8:45 P. M. President Bayliss gave a welcome to those in attendance, and thanks to the Oklahoma State Dutch Specialty Club for sponsoring the 1957 National Dutch Show.

Roll Call of Officers: Present, Pres. Bayliss, Directors Shufflebotham, Settle, and Bickley. Absent, Sec'y Treas. Grables, Directors Blyth, Stedman and Lowit.

Minutes of the previous meeting held at St. Paul, Minn. at the 1956 ARBA Convention were approved as read.

Committee Reports: Standard Committee: Report was given by Chairman E. C. Bickley, who commented on a letter he had received from Don Guthrie regarding the Gray Dutch. Mr. Guthrie had stated that he thought the Gray color on the Gray English rabbit seems to fit the desired color for Gray Dutch. Mr. Bickley stated Mr. Guthrie's letter was the only written comment he had received on the Gray Dutch. That Mr. Guthrie had stated that he thought probably Gray Dutch with white bellies, and Gray Dutch with the colored bellies should be entered in the Gray Dutch class, and the judge should pick the best.

Mr. Shufflebotham commented that he thought it advisable to get opinions from experts on genetics on Gray color to substantiate the fact that Gray Dutch can have, or should have, a colored undercoat. He also thought breeders should work to improve and put color on the undercoat.

Pres. Bayliss clarified the position of the ARBA Standard Committee, regarding the Gray Dutch, or any other variety or breed of rabbits. He stated that a situation such as this could not be stamped out, or worked out overnight, that much time is needed to work out weak points. He further stated the membership should submit ideas and suggestions to Mr. Bickley. That in order to make this, or anything else, a success, ideas should be followed through to the committee.

Mr. Shufflebotham opinioned that it would be impossible to write a standard covering three colors of Grays into one standard. Again, Pres. Bayliss requested that suggestions and comments should go to Mr. Bickley.

Ways and Means Committee: Mr. Lowit, Chairman, absent. Mr. Bayliss asked for a motion to include with the ballots for nomination of officers ballot, a ballot to increase the dues, and provide for Combination Membership

A motion by Mr. Dennis to include with nomination of officers ballot, a ballot for voting for/against increasing the dues and to provide for a Combination (husband-wife) Membership. Support by Mr. Bickley, carried.

Mr. Dennis, Chairman of Dutch for the 1957 ARBA Convention, gave a resume on this coming show, and reported that specials and donations toward the Dutch were being and would continue to be accepted. He also gave thanks to all who made the National Dutch Show a success here in Oklahoma City.

Mr. Bayliss commented on great strides the Dutch Club has made, and pointed out that the Proclamation by the Oklahoma City Mayor of "American Dutch Rabbit Week" an honor long to be remembered and sincerely appreciated by members of the A.D.R.C.

On behalf of the Club, Pres. Bayliss gave thanks to Mr. King, Mr. Brown, Mr. Huitt and to everyone who had a part in this show.

Mr. Bickley made some personal observations regarding the fine entries of Dutch at this show, and stated the quality is comparable with National Dutch Show held in Ohio. He especially appreciated the warm welcome he received, and stated the Ohio State Dutch Club would like to hold the 1958 National Dutch show in honor of "Pop" Sautters, providing no other Dutch Club had bid for it. Also, the Ohio Club would like to select two Ohio judges for the show. Pres. Bayliss advised Mr. Bickley that National Show judges are elected by membership balloting, for both the National Dutch Show and the ARBA Convention, and that the Ohio Club should submit a bid in writing to the ADRC Secretary.

Publicity Director Leisenring's report read and accepted.

Good of the Order: "Seller's Class" discussed by Mr. Shufflebothan, Mr. Dennis, Mr. Brown, Mr. Bickley and Mr. Logan.

A motion by Mr. Bickley that in future National Dutch Shows, sealed bids to be accepted from potential buyers of rabbits in Seller's Class, prior to time of auction start, bids and bidding to start at five dollars (\$5.00). Support by Tom Logan, carried.

Motion to adjourn by Tom Logan. Meeting adjourned at 9:50 P. M.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

Whoops! You caught me in a mistake and I make haste to correct same - in the article I used to fill in last month's issue, and copied religiously from our own ADRC Guide Book, I forgot all about a ruling that had been passed by the ARBA Conv., I believe at Columbus, Ohio, to the effect that Best Opposite of Variety is entitled to a Grand Champion Leg providing there are five or more of the same sex shown in the Variety, by three or more exhibitors. Maybe it is a good thing that I made this error, as some other Show Secretaries seem to have forgotten but it too and this will bring it to more people's attention.

I would like to say that the show reports are coming in with far fewer errors in them than had been happening in the past. The most consistent error at this time being the failure to list the class and color of the winners of Best of Breed and Best Opposite Sex. You can see for yourselves by checking over the published reports in this issue, how often it happens. Another thing that I would like to bring to your attention, is the failure of many clubs to comply with our ADRC rules in providing for and publishing the specials required by our Club. In spite of the fact that I underline the rules pertaining to this in red ink for every show secretary, I still get catalogs that do not contain the statement that "\$1.00 is offered for best specimen of each of the following colors: Black, Blue, Chocolate, Tortoise, Steel-Gray and Gray." A catalog I received just today offers specials only on blacks and blues. By all rights and rules these shows could be disqualified and their sanction fees forfeited. So will you members please help your Show Secretaries do their jobs better by insisting that they at least read our rules?

Even though the minutes of the Little Rock meeting of the ADRC are not available for publication at this time, I think it would be wise to make a statement in regard to a couple of changes that were effected at that meeting. It was decided by the membership present to discontinue the practice of holding two separate Sweepstake Series each year and instead to make any ARBA Sanctioned Show a Dutch Sweepstake Show, regardless of duration, upon payment of the required fee of five dollars (\$5.00) and compliance with all rules. Thus all points accumulated from one National Dutch Show until the next will be counted in one Sweepstake, with appropriate awards being made at the close of the series.

Another ruling (and these are both to go into effect as of Jan. 1, 1958) was that a new rule be added to our Show Rules as follows: (This to be stamped in bright red ink at the top of the report sheet.) NEW RULE - POINTS ON THIS REPORT WILL NOT BE COUNTED IN THIS SWEEPSTAKE SERIES, UNLESS THIS REPORT IS REC'D BY THE SECRETARIES OFFICE WITHIN FORTY-FIVE DAYS OF THE CLOSE OF THIS SHOW. At the end of the required forty-five days the Secretary is to send the show secretary a post card, reminding him of his delinquency and granting an extra fifteen days to comply. If the report is not received by the end of these fifteen days the sanction fee will be forfeited and the points will fail to count.

There is still one show report out on the One-Day Series that closed with the

Little Rock Convention. I am in hopes that I will hear from it in time to make the report in this issue final.

It was sure fine to meet so many good members of the ADRC at Little Rock, and I can't help but feel that with the kind of cooperation we had there, bigger and better things can be accomplished by our fine American Dutch Rabbit Club in the next year.

IS IT A RACKET?

We quite frequently hear the question, "Why are there no more Dutch in the show?" I think we could find the answer if we would study some show catalogs. A large majority of us don't have too much money, and even if we could afford to, we wouldn't care to donate it to swell the treasury of some other club. If we have extra money for donations, we would rather donate it to our own clubs.

The point I wish to bring out is that some of the show sponsoring clubs are planning their shows to a point at which one would have to get a Best of Breed in order to pay expenses, if he were lucky enough to have entered just one rabbit. If he had entered any number, he would be bound to wind up in the hole, especially if he sent them from any great distance. Just how many of us can afford to take the one chance among all of the Dutch exhibitors of making their rabbits pay their way?

I had planned to send some Dutch to a highly advertised show recently but after studying their catalog, decided it was a money making proposition - for the club putting on the show. Their entry fee was a dollar and ten cents (\$1.10) and this is a copy of their premium schedule:

Also on Dutch, they were paying one dollar for best of each color and five dollars for Best of Breed and two dollars and fifty cents for Best Opposite Sex. Now lets do a little figuring - We will take classes of five just as an example. I am sure you will agree that the average class of Dutch is no more than five. Twenty-four classes of five each would be one hundred and twenty rabbits - that, at a dollar and ten cents each is a hundred and thirty two dollars taken in. The pay back according to the above table would be: seventy five cents for 1st and thirty five cents for 2nds. in twenty four classes of twenty six dollars and forty cents. For Best of each Variety there would be another six dollars, Best of Breed, five dollars and Best Opposite sex two dollars and a half. After paying ten percent of the entry fee to the Charles Pine Foundation, or thirteen dollars and twenty cents, this would make a total paid out of the entry fee of fifty-three dollars and ten cents, leaving a profit of seventy eight dollars and ninety cents for the club on Dutch alone!

From the amount of advertising in this show catalog, I would estimate that they had made a profit of at least two hundred dollars on that. I did not check the other

breeds, because Dutch was all that I was interested in, but I presume they would run about the same. Of course the larger breeds would have only six first place rabbits to compete for Best of Breed, whereas Dutch could have twenty-four. The classes should be larger though so it would about even up.

I don't know what others call this but I call it a racket. Some will say that the classes didn't all have five in them which I expect is true, but I know they would have had more if there had been anything like a fair pay-back. A Club should be satisfied to make enough to pay the show expenses. Right now I have sixteen potential first place rabbits, some of them have won best of color and best opposite of color, but I can't show them where they can not at least make their entry fee back when they placed first in a class of five. I just wont show them.

Now I am not saying that all shows are like this, but I do say that the trend seems to be in this direction, and if you other Dutch breeders can't read the hand writing on the wall, let me read it for you. If this trend isn't stopped the same thing is going to happen to us that has happened to many of the small fellows in other lines. We will be frozen out. Most of us raise Dutch because they are the best show rabbits in the world, not to mention the other good qualities they have. Most of us are "little fellows" that can't afford to send his rabbits any great distance to a show with only one chance in a hundred and twenty of paying expenses.

What can we do about it? We can do several things. One is get a resolution passed in the ADRC refusing to sweepstake a show that does not pay back at least seventy-five percent of entry fee in class money. Then turn on a little pressure and get a like resolution passed in the ARBA refusing to sanction a show without this guarantee. Excepting of course, the one day or table shows, which are mostly local club affairs and are for the sole purpose of raising money for the club in order that they may put on a big show.

Then as individuals we can do just as I am doing, keep our rabbits at home when we don't feel the show is offering enough to pay a first place rabbits expenses. We all know YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH, let's not let them beat the Dutch breeders out of their just dues.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

BREEDING TORTOISE DUTCH

The fancier that has selected Dutch as his hobby has one of the most varied color choices of all breeds shown today, with the possible exception of the Rex rabbit. The matter of color is one of my "obsessions" in the selections of Dutch, and it is especially important in the tortoise Dutch, which is perhaps my favorite of the colors.

The production of good tortoise color is only achieved through the most careful and selective breeding; luck enters into the production of markings to some extent but color is only achieved by the most thoughtful selection of breeding stock. It is possible to have an animal that carries correct markings but fails as an exhibition winner simply because it fails in color and type.

By reviewing our standard we find points placed as follows: type, 15; fur 10; color 13; eyes 2; (and since eyes are judged for color, this actually gives us 15 points for color) feet and legs, 2; head 5; ears 2; tail 1 (and since ears, feet, tail and head are judged for type this would give us 25 points on type). This gives us 50 points on color, type and fur, and leaves 50 points for markings. Since type includes the conformation of the head, body, eard, feet and tail; and the points on markings cover the saddle, undercut, blaze, cheeks, neck and stops; you can see the importance of color to a good Dutch as no other factor is rated with so many points. You can see from this that color bears an important place in the make-up of any of the six color varieties of Dutch.

Shadings are very important in the composition of a good tortoise. Bearing in mind that the color standard is only an ideal it is still my belief that the color interpretation is not being followed correctly by most breeders and judges. Color is difficult to describe but let us look at our standard on tortoise - "should be a

bright clean orange color, blending into smoky-blue shading over the rump, carrying well into the haunches. The top color should carry down into the under-color, blending into a dark cream color next to the skin. Tail should match top body color, under tail to match shadings; light tails are permissible, but ver undesirable. The shadings on the head should be darkest at whisker bed, blending into lighter shadings on the jaw, and darkening again at the ea base, blending up the ears to match body color, ears to have lacings to match shadings. Fault: white hairs, smut or smudge throughout the orange color."

It has been my experience that many judges are paying too much attention to the bright orange color of the back, and paying little or no attention to the shadings or tail. Wighout the shadings you do not have the true tortoise color; many tortoise are being placed that resemble the color described in the working standard on gold dutch, which are actually nothing more than tortoise without shadings.

The standard calls for smoky-blue shadings over the rump, to carry well over the haunches. The pattern for the shadings should be similar to the conformation of side markings on an English Spot, and should carry all the way around the lower portion of the rump and tail (that is, the underpart of the tail) should match the shading of the rump. The standard reads; "light tails are permissable, but very undesirable". This is a defect that is being passed by both judges and breeders alike. The shadings should carry down to include the undercut so that the undercut becomes very distinct. Shadings on the head should be as described in the standard. It would be nice to produce a tortoise with ears colored to match the top color of the back and the shadings to be around the ear edge; I have yet to breed or see one like that. In my opinion, a tortoise that carries good shadings and a good colored tail is to be preferred over the one that carries a bright colored back with an "undesirable" light colored tail, and lacking the desired shadings.

The tortoise is a true breeding color and will throw nothing but torts when bred tort to tort. There have been many experiments advocated to produce correct shadings. One is the breeding to blues, taking a blue-fawn from the mating and mating this back to a dark colored tort; or using an out-cross to a black. I have tried them all in my many years of tortoise breeding, and am now convinced that the best results are achieved from tort to tort matings. I prefer taking a dark colored animal, mating it to a light colored one, and discarding all with light colored tails as it is never wise to breed in any undesired feature. I find that it is difficult to pick out the best colored torts until they have attained their adult coat, as the color of torts generally become darker with each succeeding moult. This seems particularly true of the back color. I always keep the youngsters showing the darkest shadings when they come out of the nest box. In the selection of breeders, select first for color and type. Never mate two animals with the same fault in markings as the fault becomes intessified with each generation. It is wise to use either a buck or doe with reasonably good markings; although it is best to use a buck that has very good type and is as well marked as you can get him, as you can then use him on several does. Then pray that Lady Luck will be with you on the markings, and don't get discouraged when she isn't. The perfect dutch has yet to be produced - and it may be you who produces it! It is this hope that makes the breeding of Dutch the challenge it is - and keeps you in Dutch.
