AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB Minutes, Board of Directors Meeting Louisville, Kentucky - October 9, 1961

The meeting of the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order at 11:25 P.M. with the following officers present: Secretary-Treasurer, Jessie Weinhardt, Directors: Tom Shufflebotham, William Stedman, Roger Eich and Don Reid. Absent were: President, George Bayliss, Vice-President, Clinton Dennis and Director, E. C. Bickley.

The first order of business was the selection of a chairman. Bill Stedman was elected by a unanimous vote.

A motion by Roger Eich to recommend to the Constitution and By-Laws Committee that in the future, any member, in order to hold office, must have been a member of the ADRC in good standing for at least four years and that voting privileges should be witheld until the second year of membership. The motion was seconded by Don Reid and after some discussion with regard to the restriction of voting privileges, this portion of the motion was withdrawn and the motion carried.

The question was raised as to whether anything concrete had ever come of the action taken on the recommendation of the Standard Committee with regard to the Gray Standard which had been approved at the Colorado Springs meeting. The secretary stated that she had informed Vern Ashton, Chmn. of the ARBA Standard Committee and he had announced the change in the Oct. issue of Small Stock. It was questioned as to whether ARBA Judges had ever been notified of this change and Don Reid stated that he had never had such notification. The secretary was instructed to learn who was to lead the discussion on Dutch in this Convention's Judge's Conference and bring the matter to his attention so that all judges present would thus learn directly of the change.

At the Colorado meeting the Board of Directors of the ADRC had been instructed by the membership to establish an Editorial Policy for future editors of the Dutch Reporter. The secretary requested that this be discussed. The question was raised as to just exactly what had been meant by the motion at Colorado Springs and after some discussion, Roger Eich was instructed to contact Don Guthrie who made the motion, for clarification and the matter be tabled by the Board until it became clear just how these instructions were to be carried out. This motion was made by Don Reid, seconded by Tom Shufflebotham and was carried.

All material for the Dutch Reporter must be in the hands of the Editor by the 15th of the month preceding issue.

The Chairman requested a discussion as to the satisfaction or dissatisfaction with the presently established dates of the National Dutch Show as per the action of the Board at Hamburg, New York, i.e. Memorial Day week-end. It was the opinion of the Board that this date was not working out as well as had been anticipated and a motion by Don Reid, seconded by Roger Eich, that the National Dutch Show go back to April as of the 1963 dates with any further variation in dates to be at the discretion of the Board. Carried.

The secretary stated that she had been informed that Mr. & Mrs. A. E. "Pop" Sautters would probably not renew their dues this year, due to inability to get about to shows any more, and that it was her feeling that anyone who had served the ADRC and Dutch rabbits as long and faithfully as has "Pop" should not be dropped from the membership files and in some manner should receive recognition for such service. A motion by Don Reid, seconded by Roger Eich to grant an Honorary Life Membership to "Pop" and his wife was carried unanimously.

There was a motion by Don Reid, seconded by Tom Shufflebotham that Bill Stedman be appointed to chair the open meeting of the ADRC on Oct. 10th. was carried.

The instructions from the Colorado meeting with regard to the auditing of the ADRC books was discussed after the secretary stated that the financial report presented at this meeting had not been audited due to the fact that to her knowledge the club had no auditing committee at this time. After some discussion a resolution was prepared for presentation to the Constitution and By-Laws Committee as follows:

Page 12 (of our present Guide Book) Article IV -- Committees, Section 4 -- The Auditing Committee -- be changed to read as follows: "The Auditing Committee shall consist of a chairman and two members, no two of them shall either be officers or reside in the same county as the Secretary-Treasurer. Their duty shall be to make a semi-annual audit of the fiscal period, preceeding the National Dutch Show and the AREA Convention of the Secretary-Treasurer's books and make a report thereon at these meetings. They may recommend, if deemed advisable after examination, that the books be audited by a public accountant." The above committee to be appointed from the membership present at the above meetings. Motion by Don Reid, seconded by J. Weinhardt, carried.

A lengthy discussion of the proposed new Guide Book and Standard was held. It was brought out that instructions had been forwarded to the President from the Harper, Towa meeting, that a committee be appointed to begin work on this immediately and to date no action had been taken. The present supply stands at about 168 copies remaining in the Secretary's office and from Oct. 1, 1960 to Oct. 1, 1961 - 200 copies had been mailed out to new members. It was agreed that immediate action be taken and the present chairman should recommend to the President that such committee should be appointed without further delay. A motion to this effect was made by Don Reid, seconded by Roger Eich and carried.

The above action pointed up the fact that no further work on the revision of the Constitution and By-Laws had been carried out since Colorado Springs and inasmuch as this job must be completed before a new Guide Book could be published, immediate action was dictated. A motion by Roger Eich, seconded by Don Reid instructed the Secretary to prepare two copies (for each member of the Board) of the revised Constitution and By-Laws, along with the changes recommended at Colorado Springs, such copies to be in the hands of the Board, who are the duly appointed members of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, between Nov. 5-15, 1961. The various members of this committee are then to study these drafts, making identical notations and corrections on both copies and mail same -- one to the Chairman of this Committee, George Fayliss and one to the Secretary so they are delivered by Dec. 1, 1961.

A new copy, incorporating any possible further revisions to be made by the Chairman, or in case of his failure to act, the Secretary and returned to the committee members for their final acceptance by Jan. 15, 1962, such final draft to be presented to the membership for their final vote to be tallied no later than March 1, 1962. Carried.

There was a motion by Roger Eich, seconded by Don Reid that inasmuch as no formal action by the Board had ever been taken on the granting of the 1962 National Dutch Show, but the show had been awarded to the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers Club auto-

matically because of the absence of any counter bid, by the Secretary of the ADRC, such action on the part of the Secretary should hereby be given the formal stamp of approval. Carried.

A discussion was held regarding the query by the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers Club as to whether it would be permisseable for them to present a mimeographed catalog for the 1962 National Dutch Show. It was the consensus of opinion that no definite action was necessary on this subject at this time.

A motion to adjourn was made by Tom Shufflebotham, seconded by Don Reid. Meeting adjourned at 12:30 P.M.

The above recommendations of the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club are hereby presented to the members gathered in open meeting for approval or rejection.

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB Minutes, General Meeting Louisville, Kentucky - October 10, 1961

The general membership meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order in the prescribed place in the Kentucky Exposition Bldg. at 11:40 A.M. by acting Chairman, William C. Stedman. A roll call of officers showed the following present: Secretary-Treasurer, Jessie Weinhardt, Board Members, W. C. Stedman, Tom Shufflebotham, Roger Eich and Don Reid. Absent: President, George Bayliss, Vice-President, Clinton Dennis and Board Member, E. C. Bickley.

The minutes of the Colorado Springs meeting were read although they had been published in the Dutch Reporter, it was felt that a re-reading would be in order as much of the business taken care of at that time carried over to this meeting. A motion by J. Russell Hall, seconded by G. C. Sturgis, Sr. that the minutes be accepted as read was carried.

The officers present had no reports to make.

Tom Shufflebotham reporting for the Standards Committee stated that the only question brought before that committee had been the subject of the Gray Standard and had been taken care of at Colorado Springs, hence, nothing further to report.

Mr. Shufflebotham also reported for the Educational Committee of which he is chairman, stating that any questions warranting other than a personal reply had been answered through the Dutch Reporter. He pointed out the continued usefulness of the Publicity folders.

Roger Eich reporting for the Ways and Means Committee, displayed a new type of pedigree book in comparison to the present one which is practically sold out. The new type would have a slightly different measurement while containing all of the information that is on the old one, but is designed to better fit a typewriter and standard file. He stated that requests for bids on printing the new books had been requested. After considerable discussion a motion was made by Merle Emery, seconded by Bill Hobin that the committee be instructed to order pedigree books in the new size (with the printing error on the old one corrected) as soon as the best bid was ascertained. Carried.

The Election Committee had no report to make as the committee was present at the Convention and the ballots were back in Ohio and could not be counted until the committee had returned home.

Mrs. Shufflebotham, reporting for the Publicity Committee, pointed out that a great part of the committee's portion of the dues money is earmarked for fixed expenses such as the advertising in the various magazines, Convention Booth and Convention Catalog advertising, thus leaving very little for re-ordering of the various items carried by the office. She stated that the back patches are entirely gone and no one can locate any information on the source of supply since no correspondence with Ray Grables, who had ordered them seemed to get through. She stated that she had 90 shoulder patches left, in black only.

There was a discussion of the value received for the cost of advertisments in the trade magazines and Don Guthrie suggested that Don Reid explain the Flemish Club's system of coding such ads to determine their usefulness. A motion by J. R. Hall, seconded by Roger Eich that the ad in Small Stock Farmer be discontinued. Mrs. Shufflebotham stated that this ad had another three months to run and it was suggested that the ads be coded and any final decision depend on the results. Carried.

Mrs. Shufflebotham further reported that the financial condition of her committee was bad and that it was very difficult to really accemplish much on such a tight

budget.

It was ordered that the Minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held the previous night be read and the various points be taken for acceptance or rejection. The

Board meeting minutes were read and accepted by the Board.

The first item for discussion was the recommendation for tightening the qualifications for holding office in the ADRC. There was a great deal of discussion on this and it was pointed out that although on occasion a member who barely qualified under the present two year requirement failed to make a good officer it was also true that often a member of long standing did not make an active officer and it was not a good policy to start restricting the rights of members. A motion was made by Pat Emery, seconded by G. C. Sturgis, Sr. that this recommendation of the Board be rejected. Carried.

A discussion as to what type of policy the Board was to set up for the Dutch Reporter was held. Don Guthrie explained how he and Vince Hunter had sat down and discussed such matters when he went into Small Stock -- agreeing that certain types of articles not good for the industry would not be used and that no personal mudslinging would be permitted and that this was the sort of thing he had in mind when he made the motion at Colorado Springs. He felt that no article that was detrimental to the American Dutch Rabbit Club should be allowed. It was felt that any article that the editor questioned the fitness of should be submitted to the Board of Directors but otherwise the editor should have the final decision when not covered by the above recommendations.

A motion by Don Guthrie, seconded by Bob Sprague that the recommendation of the Board to award an Honorary Life Membership to Mr. & Mrs. A. E. Sautters be accepted.

Carried.

The recommendation of the Board with regard to an auditing system for the Secretary-Treasurer's books was accepted on a motion by Al McKeeman, seconded by J. R.

A motion by Al Meier, Jr., seconded by Bob Scott that the Board's recommendation with regard to the Constitution and By-Laws be accepted. Carried.

Don Reid made a motion that the meeting be adjourned for lunch at 12:10 to reconvene at 1:30. Seconded by Bob Scott, carried. * * * * * * * * * * * * *

> AMERICAN DUTCH RAPBIT CLUB Minutes, Second General Meeting Louisville, Kentucky - October 10, 1961

The second meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club reconvened at the prescribed place and was called to order by Chairman, W. C. Stedman at 2:00 P.M., Oct. 10, 1961. The same officers being present at the second meeting as at the first.

A motion by Tom Shufflebotham, seconded by Bill Summers that a parliamentary error

in the minutes of the board be corrected. Carried.

There was a discussion regarding the present vacancy on the Board created by the failure of Jimmy Sinclair to renew his dues. Although there was no motion it was the general feeling that as soon as the ballots in the present election had been tallied and reported an appointment should be made to fill out this unexpired term due to the important work on the Constitution and By-Laws to be taken care of by the Board. It was felt that there should be a full Board to handle this job.

Alan Kacsur, secretary of the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers Club asked for the

floor in order to bring out the fine facilities his club was prepared to offer for the 1962 National Dutch Show to be held in Wilmington, Delaware. He said there would be cooping for at least 500 rabbits with facilities for meeting rooms, fine motels near at hand and an excellant show room.

Referring back to the Colorado Springs Meeting Minutes, Merle Emery asked if anything had ever been done to correct the conflict between the ADRC Youth Department rules and the ARBA Youth Division Rules. He was told that no action had been taken. There was considerable discussion with the Chairman asking Bill Summers how successful the Youth Division had been at Colorado Springs. Bill stated that aside from a few local youngsters the entry was very small. Bill Stedman agreed that this had also been true at Hamburg. Al Emery made a motion, seconded by Don Reid that we discard the present rules for a Youth Division and future National Dutch Show Committees be informed that if they wanted a Youth show it would be held under ARBA rules. Carried.

Al Meier, Jr. asked for the floor and stated that his authority for discarding three ballets in the nomination of officers had been questioned and he wanted to state his case here. He stated that it had been his opinion that the instructions from the Colorado Springs meeting were that the BALLOTS themselves were to be numbered. All members present who had attended the Colorado Springs meeting agreed with him. He stated that under the system used there was no possible method of determining how any one had voted by the numbers on the ballots and that numbering the envelopes themselves would be a complete waste of time as many times he received two or more ballots in a single envelope. He requested a vote of confidence from the membership present for his handling of the nomination ballots and his stated intention to handle the election ballots in exactly the same manner. A motion by Don Reid, seconded by Roger Eich that the membership back Al Meier, Jr. 100% with regard to his handling of the ballots carried.

The secretary raised the question with regard to the failure of the ARBA Conv. Committee to print all of the material submitted by her office with regard to the ADRC's trophies and the fact that Colorado Springs had printed more than she had submitted by publishing the entire list of trophies including those that had been retired and not replaced. Some members felt that these listings should be continued to be published even after the trophies had been retired. Bill Summers and Tom Shufflebotham agreed that they thought these trophies should be replaced after retirement.

Al Meier, Jr. motioned that when these three win trophies had been retired they not be replaced and we accept no more rotating trophies but instead the ADRC offer smaller, one win trophies at each show in the same catagories with continuous listings of the winners. Motion seconded by Floyd Tobias. Carried.

The secretary asked how much was to be spent on such trophies. There was a motion by Bob Scott, seconded by Al Meier, Jr. that the secretary accept three bids for such trophies and accepting the best bid total cost of each trophy, including engraving not to exceed \$10.00 each. Carried.

A motion to adjourn was made by J. R. Hall, seconded by Bob Sprague. Carried. Second meeting adjourned at 3:10 P.M.

YOU CAN'T BEAT THE DUTCH

PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF SNUFFLES

(Ed.'s Note: The following article was secured for publication in the Dutch Reporter, from the author, by J. R. Hall while at the Louisville Convention. Although it has already appeared in several other rabbit publications it is felt that the information is of so much importance that it cannot be repeated too often. JW)

Quite some time ago, I was a referee to many sneezing matches here in my rabbitry. I consulted a local veterinarian. He recommended I vaccinate all stock with One-Shot Lifetime (Distemper Only) Vaccine, the same serum that is used for prevention of distemper in dogs.

This comes in two small bottles, one of liquid, the other of powder from (2 C.C.'s) The liquid is transferred to the powder by the use of a hypodermic syringe and needle. The powder dissolves instantly, and should be used immediately, $\frac{1}{2}$ C.C. per rabbit, injected just under the skin above either hip.

Infected rabbits should be treated first with Penicillin. Two C.C.'s per dose, every three days until all symptoms of the disease virus have disappeared. Then three days (72 hours) after the last shot of Penicillin, vaccinate with the distemper serum. Penicillin should also be injected just under the skin above either hip.

It is not recommended to vaccinate a pregnant doe, or nursing doe. This should be done in a 2 week period, between wearing the young and breeding the doe back again.

I have found it very effective to vaccinate at 8 weeks of age, all stock held back for breeding and show.

So far this has been very effective for me. I thought it worth while passing on down the line.

SECRETARY'S CHIT-CHAT



it was not on color film because, although the head of the rabbit shows up quite well the body is lost in the equal tones of the background. I want to take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Earles for letting us share in her accomplishment.

I would like to comment just briefly on the rabbits, on which Don Guthrie did a supperb job of judging. A few days before the opening of the Convention, the committee. noting that there were to be less than 250 Dutch to be judged, cancelled the services of our second judge, G. A. Burke, as they felt Don could easliy do justice to that number. The quality of the Dutch was unusually good and the class of 32 Black senior bucks really gave Don a work-out. It is interesting to note that each of the first place rabbits in Blacks belonged to Jack Boughton of Chesterland, Ohio. This man seems to have the touch of a genius in his program of selection and breeding. Although he has only been a member of the ADRC for a little over two years, he has managed to rack up the following record: At Syracuse, under Don Guthrie and G. A. Burke, he had 1st. place Black junior buck, Best Black, Best Junior All Colors. At Harper, Iowa he did not have an entry, but at Ft. Worth he had 1st. senior Black doe, Best Opposite Dutch and 1st., 2nd., 3rd. Black junior bucks. At Colorado Springs he had 1st. and 2nd. Black senior bucks, Best Dutch, 1st., 2nd., and 4th. Black senior doe. The judges at Ft. Worth were George Bayliss and Tom Shufflebotham and at Colo. Springs they were Guthre and Shufflebotham. If you are interested enough to check the records you will find that it matters not who is doing the judging, if Boughton has Black Dutch (and sometimes he shows a few good Blue ones) in any show he gets what would seem the linn's share of the first five placements. Our hats should certainly be off to this fine artist in the art of breeding Dutch Rabbits to fit our high standard.

There were lots of other good Dutch at Louisville, with many individuals in all varieties being very outstanding for their color and type. The winning Blues were supperb with Bill Summers little doe having everything it took to win. There were some of the finest dark colored Chocolates there that it has been my pleasure to see for a long time, and I sure would love to own either of the first place juniors. I noticed the most variation in the Tortoise of any of the colors, ranging from a beautiful bright orange over the backs with just enough shading, down to some that were almost shaded all over. This variety showed the poorest type of any, with many being much too lang and rangy — we all, who breed this color need to pay more attention to our type as it is my personal opinion that in our concentration on color our type is slipping. Grays and Steels I will let pass with no comment as my knowledge of these two breeds is too limited to comment sensibly.

Our Dutch Booth was well attended by visitors and those seeking the Publicity Items and to renew their memberships kept Mrs. Shufflebotham and me quite busy the whole time. We were grateful for the services of our former Publicity Director, Russ Hall who volunteered his services as a relief man.

I'm a bit sshamed to admit that I missed the Dutch portion of the Judges Conference I sat on one of those misearable folding chairs through most of the morning session, listening to the fine points on Belgian Hares, Martens, Tans, Flemish, Polish and Meat Classes, but in the afternoon I became involved elsewhere in the building and did not get back in time to hear the discussion of Dutch. Perhaps someone who did happen to hear it would like to write it up for the December Dutch Reporter?

One amusing side-light -- when one of our long time members came up to pay his dues he started to walk away and came back saying he guessed he would pay his new wife's membership, also, commenting, "That's one way to get new members for the Dutch Club -- marry them."

I don't believe I ever saw so many young people in attendance at a Convention. One night about sixteen of them, between the ages of 16-20 conned one of the mothers into going out with them for Pizza. They seemed to have some kind of activity going on all of the time. One of our own young members, Bill Miller of West Liberty, Ind. walked away with the ARBA Clock Trophy for Junior judging. He told me later that it was his feeling that it was his better than average knowledge of Dutch that won for him and he gave plenty of credit to our Educational Chairman, Tom Shufflebotham for coaching him so very thoroughly beforehand. It certainly is wonderful to see these

youngsters taking such an active part as the time is not too far away when they will have to be taking up the reigns and carrying on.

With regard to this, I see in the "Champagne News" that we, as well as the Champagne Club have recently lost a member to the grim reaper. The information as published by Oren Reynolds is as follows:

"Henry Karl Zarges was dead on arrival at Norwalk Hospital Thursday night at 9:00 P.M. after being stricken with a heart attack while driving in France street. He was 47 years old. He was the husband of Mrs. Mary Britton Zarges of 82 Fort Point St., E. Norwalk, Conn. Besides his widow, he leaves his father, Henry J. Zarges of Newton. N. J."

Although I didn't know Mr. Zarges, personally, he had been a member of the ADRC since March of 1958, and I feel sure he will be missed by all of his friends in New England. Our deepest sympathy goes to all of the members of the Zarges family.

Plans were moving fast at the Convention toward an extra fine National Dutch Show to be held in Wilmington, Delaware in May 1962. Glen Sturgis, Sr. was a very busy beaver fulfilling his duties as catalog chairman and approaching practically every Dutch breeder present with his little notebook taking pleges for advertising and specials. There will be much more about that in future issues of the Dutch Reporter.

Thave one correction to make on a show report published last month. Harry Anthony Jr. informs me that in the report of the Terryville Fair, sponsored by the Central Conn. R&CBA, he had given credit for the 1st. place Black Senior buck to the Double R Rabbit Ranch and that win was made by Ted Stefanski. Then somehow or other the placements of the Blue Junior bucks had been omitted from the published report. These were as follows: 1st., 2nd. Wm. A. Schaefer. 3rd., 4th. Double R Rabbit Ranch. The points on the Blues had been counted but the correction on the Black Sr. Bucks made this difference in the totals: Double R Rabbit Ranch 182. Ted Stefanski 95. I appreciate Mr. Anthony's bringing these errors to my attention and I am relieved to note that only half of them were mine.
