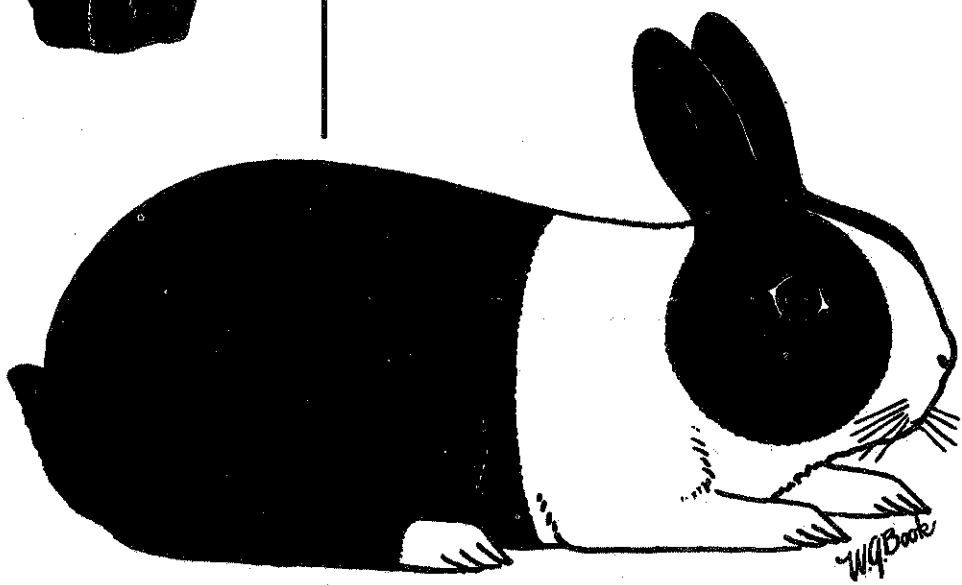

## AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

Sedalia, Missouri - October 7-10, 1963

Minutes - Board of Directors Meeting

The meeting of the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order with Wm. Stedman as Chairman, at 10:30 P.M., Oct. 7th. The following members being present: Secretary-Treasurer, Jessie Weinhardt, Directors, Wm. Stedman, Tom Shufflebotham, Bill Summers, Roger Eich, E. R. Parks and Don Reid. Vice-President elect, Jack Boughton sitting in at request of Chmn. Absent were: George Bayliss, President, and Vice-President, Melvin Emery.

The minutes from the Board meeting held at Louisville, Ky., being the last occasion having a quorum present, were read and approved.

The first matter for discussion was a request by Vern Ashton, Chairman of the Standards Committee of the ARBA, that all specialty clubs should present any changes they would like incorporated into their standards to his committee in time for action before the publication of the new ARBA book of standards. There was considerable discussion with regard to the wording of our present standard in reference to dewlaps. Under "Weight and Condition" the present standard reads: "Eliminations -- prominent dewlap". It was pointed out that there was quite a bit of discrepancy among our judges as to just what constituted a "prominent dewlap", with some judges eliminating one for same and then placing another animal with an even larger dewlap. The question was raised as to whether we should admit that many of our older does are guilty of this fault and remove this elimination, or to admit that the fault can be bred out and change the wording to read: "Disqualify for dewlap." A motion was made by Don Reid, seconded by Bill Summers that the secretary be instructed to write a letter to Mr. Ashton informing him that it was the decision of the Board (in the absence of an ADRC Standards Committee), to recommend that our standard be changed to read, under "Weight and Condition": "Any Dutch to be disqualified for a dewlap." Motion carried. It was also recommended that this letter include a reminder of the ADRC's action with regard to the Gray Standard as per the minutes of the Colorado Springs meeting.

The secretary pointed out that there is a time discrepancy in the dates allowed for return and counting of the ADRC election ballots, which allowed more time than was necessary for the return and counting of the nomination ballots, with not enough time allowed for this office to obtain replies from the candidates and have ballots print-

ed for mailing on the prescribed date. There was a motion by Rover Eich, seconded by Ernie Parks that this be corrected by placing the following on the 1964 nomination ballots, "under Article V, section 1 of our By-Laws be changed to read: A single, commercial imprinted ballot, together with return envelope addressed to Chmn. of the Election Committee, shall be furnished by First Class Mail, to each member in good standing and to those whose dues are not in excess of thirty (30) days delinquent on or before July 1 of each year. Ballots shall be returned in double envelope with the member's names or numbers on the outer envelope. No name, number or identifying mark shall appear on the ballot or inner envelope. The outer envelope shall be removed and destroyed before the inner envelopes are opened. The Chairman of the Election Committee shall receive these ballots until July 21, at which time the polls shall be closed. He shall then assemble his committee, open the envelopes, count the ballots and certify the results to the President and Secretary-Treasurer by Aug. 1. (Proposed changes underlined.) Motion carried.

A letter from President Bayliss was read to the Board containing the following items recommended for action at this meeting.

- No. 1: That all future financial statements submitted for audit shall have all bills showing disbursements, and the current bank statement attached to said financial statement. This was a recommendation of the last auditing committee. It is a natural business procedure and gives protection to both the secretary and Club. The same would apply to the Publicity Director's financial report.

The secretary-treasurer stated that she had received this directive from the last auditing committee and had complied with it for this meeting. It was the decision of the Board that inasmuch as this was standard business procedure, no further action was required.

- No. 2: That the recent passed amendment relative to the apportionment of funds be included in the new Guide Book, and that Mr. Shufflebotham be instructed to obtain copy of the amendment from the Secretary.

The secretary was instructed to furnish copy to Mr. Shufflebotham for inclusion in the new Guide Book.

- No. 3: Inasmuch that Mr. Melvin Emery who has held the office of Vice-President, but who has not raised a finger or assisted in any manner with the administration of the Club, and who has failed and refused to submit his picture for the Guide Book. Would it not be in order to allow Mr. Jack Boughton to submit his picture for the Guide Book, inasmuch that he is un-opposed for the election to the office of Vice-President.

It was the decision of the Board, that due to the indefiniteness of publication date for the new Guide Book, many changes would have to be made and the above recommendation would be taken care of automatically, no official action was required. Mr. Shufflebotham stated that he would here and now request such photo from Mr. Boughton. Mr. Boughton, being present, agreed to comply.

The following letter was read to Board:

Board of Directors

American Dutch Rabbit Club:

Gentlemen:

The Dutch Breeders in New England have felt for sometime that there should be a Local Dutch Specialty Club in New England. We felt that such a group could do a lot to promote further breeding and exhibition of Dutch in the New England area.

We realize that there is a Dutch specialty club here in the East known as the Eastern Dutch Club. However they have few members here in the New England area. New England is set off pretty much by itself, made up of six small States with a total acreage no larger than many of our larger States. We hold some 26 Local shows in New England each year. Most any fancier in New England can reach all of these shows and not have to drive more than 150 miles. Shows held by the Eastern Dutch Club are off the beaten path for New England breeders.

We already have a New England New Zealand Rabbit Breeders Ass'n. here in New England. We hold an all New Zealand show each spring. In addition we have a local sweepstakes as well as other inducements to increase interest and promote the exhibition of

the breed. One of the requirements for membership is that the applicant must be a member in good standing of the American Federation of New Zealand Breeders. We have not only been able to promote New Zealands but have also been of service to the National Association.

We feel that if this local Dutch Specialty Club becomes a reality we can do just as much for Dutch. It would be open only to members in good standing of the American Dutch Rabbit Club or anyone whom wished to join both associations at the same time.

We realize that the application for a Charter would have to be approved by the ARBA Board of Directors. However before asking for a Charter we should have the Blessing of the American Dutch Rabbit Club. Therefore we are asking you Gentlemen of the American Dutch Rabbit Club for your opinion, suggestions and comments before going further.

There was a motion by Bill Summers, seconded by Roger Eich, that the American Dutch Rabbit Club give its blessing to the formation of such a local club with the recommendation that the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers Club be requested to re-write their Constitution to remove the above six states from their jurisdiction. Motion carried 4-2 with E. R. Parks and Don Reid dissenting on the grounds that they are not in favor of such a club being allowed to include more than one state under their constitution.

Motion to adjourn at 1:55 A.M. made by Don Reid, seconded by Bill Summers, Carried.

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB  
Sedalia, Missouri - October 8, 1963  
Minutes - General Meeting

The meeting of the American Dutch Rabbit Club was called to order at the designated place at 11:10 A.M. on Oct. 8, 1963 -- delay from scheduled time being due to failure to complete judging of Dutch on time, by chairman Wm. Stedman. Officers being present: Jessie Weinhardt, Sec'y-Treas., Board Members, Wm. Stedman, Tom Shufflebotham, Bill Summers, Roger Eich, E. R. Parks and Don Reid. Absent, George Bayliss, President and Melvin Emery, Vice-President.

There was a motion by Don Reid, seconded by Jack Boughton that the reading of the minutes of the last meeting be dispensed with as they had been published in the Dutch Reporter.

None of the officers present had any reports to make.

Under Committee Reports, Tom Shufflebotham gave an up-to-date report on the new Guide Book. He stated that he had received and turned over to the printer, \$1,250 for advertising already paid for, while there was still some commercial ads not paid for, as they required copy before payment. He also stated that he had received the new covers which George Bayliss had donated at a cost of \$216.00. He was questioned as to just why there had been such a long delay in getting the Guide Books to the members and went into great detail to explain just how complicated the procedure was for obtaining as nearly perfect as possible color plates for some of the varieties. He pointed out just how harmful it would be to beginners and oldtimers alike, to have these colors presented if they did not show the ideal. Much of this had not been realized by the membership and those present were in agreement that the finished product would be well worth waiting for and patience should be exercised.

Mrs. Shufflebotham reported for the Publicity Committee stating she had received the first payment of percentage from club income as provided in the recent vote by the membership and should soon be able to do some of the things she had been unable to do in recent months, such as placing advertising in the magazines. The secretary asked if it would be possible to include the amount of the Sanction Fee for a Dutch Sweepstake in future ads. A financial report of this committee was given, and a motion to accept same was made by Glenwood Sturgis, Sr., seconded by Albert Campbell, Carried.

An account of the actions of the Board Meeting on the previous evening was given by the secretary and a motion by Chas. Lewis, seconded by Stan Goeglein that the president be instructed to appoint a Standard Committee to work out a Gray Standard. Carried.

A motion by Chas. Lewis, seconded by Bill Summers, that the Board Action on the New England Dutch Specialty Club be approved. This was carried with one vote in opposition by Don Reid on the grounds that such a club would include more than one state which would be in conflict with ANBA.

Albert Campbell spoke for the Eastern Dutch Rabbit Fanciers Club stating that the members of his club present were in agreement that such a new club would create a healthy condition by working for the betterment of Dutch.

The secretary brought up the fact that a recommendation from the meeting at Colorado Springs with regard to setting up an editorial policy for the Dutch Reporter had never been acted upon. Mary Stohrer stated that she felt more advertising would be very helpful. Tom Shufflebotham stated that he felt some of the items published should have been edited out, and that one person should not have so much authority over such an influential tool as the Dutch Reporter. Jack Boughton stated that he felt a committee setting up such policy should be appointed. The secretary stated that she wished to go on record as having requested such action at every meeting since Colorado Springs in 1961. There was a motion by Albert Campbell, seconded by W. R. Griffith that the Board of Directors take action at this Convention establishing such policy as provided by the Colorado Springs meeting. Carried.

The chairman at once called a Board Meeting immediately following the close of this meeting with Don Guthrie and John Griffiths being requested to attend.

Meeting adjourned at 12:15 P.M. on motion by Roger Eich, seconded by Mary Stohrer. Carried.

These recommendations being gone over by himself and John Griffiths as the other member of his committee to be presented back to the Board by Jan. 1, 1964. Mr. Guthrie's conditions were acceptable to the Board and his committee was approved by the Chairman.

Motion by Don Reid, seconded by Rober Eich to adjourn at 12:40 P.M.
