I would also like to thank the Dutch carriers and comment takers for their part in a successful Dutch Show. And, of course, it would be a crime not to appreciate all the work Al and Barb Butler do for the Dutch Club as publicity chairpersons. Al and Barb also act as booth chairpersons for each convention. Walt and Anna Cook, although they no longer raise Dutch, should be commended on being top Dutch supporters. They still love Dutch and the people who raise them. Walt always takes charge of the Dutch raffle at the national convention. He usually succeeds in selling just about everyone in the show room a raffle ticket.

Dutch were very well represented at this year's convention in both numbers and quality. I found the classes to carry considerable depth. We still need to breed more Grays and Steels. So, if you don't have any Grays or Steels, you may want to enjoy the challenge and raise a few. I used a system of scoring each first place rabbit to let each exhibitor of those animals see

how they measured up. A copy of a score card and listing of points each first place Dutch was awarded is listed elsewhere in the reporter. It is always nice to know how close you are to the winners.

Speaking of winners, I would like to congratulate the Billups family from West Virginia on winning Best of Breed with a dandy Tortoise Junior Buck. Mary and Lowell Simonson of Iowa captured Best opposite Dutch with a typey Chocolate Junior Doe. I believe that this is the first time that either family has won these national honors. I am very happy for them! My decision for these awards was close as can be observed by the point spread listed in the Judge's Score Card section of the Dutch Reporter. I would like to congratulate all Dutch exhibitors at the A.R.B.A. Convention for putting forth that extra effort to show the rest of the rabbit fancy that Dutch breeders are WINNERS! I made some new Dutch friends at the convention, finally seeing the faces that go with the names that appear in the reporter. Just to show you how contagious the Dutch fancy is, I even saw a few Checkered Giant breeders buy a few Dutch.

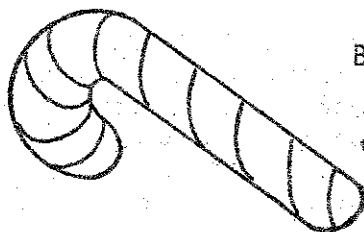
The Dutch Standard Committee has received several comments on the proposed standard changes. We are currently retooling some of the sections before balloting takes place. Your inputs were very well taken and appreciated.

Although we did not experience the high bidding as at the 1983 National Dutch Show, the club did benefit nicely from the sales and several breeders went home with some very nice stock. At the Dutch Club luncheon, Walt Cook passed the hat for specials at the next convention in Orlando, Florida. The collection totalled \$81.00. This money will be divided equally between open and youth. A total of 43 people attended the luncheon which was served at the Antler's Motel. Everyone seemed to enjoy the lunch and had a good time visiting with old and new friends.

Finally, I saved the best new for last. God blessed Dianne and I with a beautiful baby girl on October 15, 1983. Kate Anne Williamson arrived 6 hours after her dad rushed home from a rabbit show in central Michigan. (Actually, I had gotten as far as Constantine before receiving the call that Kate was on her way.) I abbreviated a 5 hour drive to 3 hours and 45 minutes. I should also mention that Kate was born just as the Illini beat the Buckeyes of Ohio State. I think she did that just so Jack Wireman would remember when she was born. Both Dianne and Kate are doing great. Everyone who has seen Kate says she looks like her father but will hopefully have her mother's disposition.

From the desk of the Secretary.....



I understand that the '83 Convention Crew out-did themselves on this event and everything ran quite smoothly. It was one that I would have indeed liked to attend for many reasons.....I would have enjoyed meeting George & Maxine Parmer who have been "terrific" chairpersons and very devoted members.....the many people I know only via mail.....seeing the friends that I have made throughout the past two years along with renewing those friendships that have been treasured for years.....personally congratulating the Billups and Lowell Simonson for their wins.....the magnificent scenery and, of course, being able to personally attend the ADRC General Membership meeting . The minutes from this meeting are not enclosed in this issue as they have not been submitted to me. I'm not sure as to their whereabouts but as soon as I receive them, they will be published.

I was informed that there was a question as to just how the Contingency Fund works. For those of you who are unaware of the above, I will do my best to explain. When the fund was formed, it was decided that \$1.00 from each membership would be transferred into a "Contingency Fund". This \$1.00 is taken off the membership fee before figuring the secretary commission, publicity fund or any other deductions. This fund is to be used for the publication of the ADRC guidebook, new equipment, or any other worthwhile purpose.

The guidebook ad money that I have received, has been placed in the general fund. You can easily total this amount by checking the financial statements in the past Dutch Reporters since the start of my term of office or by adding those ads listed elsewhere in this issue. Any time the contingency fund does not have the money needed to publish the guidebook, (or make any other needed purchase coming from this account), the additional fees needed is taken from the general fund account. To the best of my knowledge, and going by the savings passbook for this account which I did receive, the contingency fund opened on March 28, 1980 with \$500.00. This \$500.00 was the contingency monies earned from memberships in 1979. (The 1979 funding was found in the Jan/Feb issue of the D.R. under the financial statement). When the account was closed, January 7, 1982, I was issued a check in the amount of \$1677.91. This amount included \$79.91 from interest earned during the duration of the account. From these figures, the actual total of the contingency funds for the three year period, (79-80-81), was \$1598.00 (interest excluded). It was from these figures that I assumed I was safe in believing that only monies transferred to this particular account was the \$1.00 from each membership for which the fund was formed. Following is a comparison of this fund for the previous three year period and that of the fund now at the present time, (January/82 through 11/83).....

79/80/81 Contingency Fund

The contingency fund was opened with the original \$1677.91 and the balance as of 11/8/83 is \$3264.15. This balance includes \$36.44 that was transferred from the general fund account on 1/20/83 in order to open a Money Market Account with the Contingency Fund. (We needed a balance of \$2500.00 at the time of opening this account and needed the \$36.44 in order to meet that requirement). It also included the total amount of interest earned during the 22 month period in the amount of \$292.80.

The above is only for the record and to let our membership know that the only monies transferred to this account are those contingency funds acquired through the \$1.00 per membership, just what the fund states. I hope that I have been able to answer "how the contingency fund works" satisfactorily. If anyone has any other questions regarding funding procedures, please feel free to write this office at any time. I will explain any procedure to the best of my ability and will accomodate by giving exact figures, but only for the period of my office. We are here to serve you! For those of you who would like to see the account of the financial status of this organization to date, (rather than by quarter), ...total amount available in ADRC funds is:

General Fund:	\$4394.55
Contingency Fund:	3264.15
Life Membership Account:	<u>564.91</u>
Total Funds Available:	\$8223.61

We're almost at the end of a two year term for me and I must say that in all honesty, "it hasn't been easy"! For the New Year, I am asking that each Director submit an article for publication in each issue of the Dutch Reporter. This is only six times a year and the membership that supports us for office deserves to hear some input. There are very few people anywhere that have excess time left in any given day, but it is our job to make time and support those that support us! This is really our only source of communication, ....let's use it!!

The new ADRC membership list will appear in the March/April issue of the D.R. Be certain to check your D.R. label and your present membership card for your expiration date. If your membership is not current when typing begins, you will not be included. If we are through your state when your renewal arrives, (and your present membership has lapsed), you will be omitted. Renew early, especially at this time!

Elsewhere in this issue, you will find a complete list of those who purchased guidebook ads. An asterisk denotes those that were received directly by this office. Some ads have no lay-out for them. Please submit any changes you may have, new address, phone numbers and etc. to me no later than January 15, 1984. At this time, work on the guidebook will begin so that it can be taken to the printers and be ready for membership distribution as early in 1984 as possible. I realize that we are all eager for this new addition which will include a much needed updated Constitution and By-Laws, new Seller's Class rules and any voted changes or additions to the Dutch Standard. In order to accomplish this, we must have everyones"s cooperation, so please abide by the deadline set.

So far this year, I have issued 539 open sanctions and 154 youth - totaling 693 in all....and the year's not over yet. To date, we have 106 H/W memberships...437 single memberships....and 269 youth. Combining the H/W as one membership, it gives us a total of 812 members in the ADRC. From these figures, you can get an approximate idea of how many Dutch Reporters go out at each mailing date. This doesn't include the extra copies that are made to allow for those who do not receive theirs... or receive only a portion of it. New York was a problem when the Sept/Oct issues were sent. Many New York members only received their back cover! It would seem to me to be rather odd that the back covers can be torn completely away from this many magazines. It would almost make you wonder if there wasn't someone in the Postal Departments along the way that had theirsself a real "field day". Another part of the mailing system that works just a little too odd is the fact that we can have a few

Secretary, con't.....

Dutch Reporters going to the same town and one person receives their's while the others wait an additional week. We have some members who reside over 500 miles from this office and receive their copies two weeks before those who live 50 miles away! All Dutch Reporters are mailed at the same time. If you don't receive your copy or only have a portion of it delivered, please contact me and another will be sent. Also, contact your Postal Department to see if there is something that can be done from your location pertaining to the lost or mutilated D.R. Our Postmaster is checking into the problem from this end. Third class mail is not forwarded so if you have moved, notify this office of your new address as D.R.'s. are mailed to the current address on file.

Because I receive many show reports daily, only those that have 150 or more Dutch shown will be printed in length. Three quarters of my day is spent on typing, filing, processing, etc., and if I use anymore of the remaining time, my family is going to trade me in.....I don't want that!!

President Williamson submitted "38" excellent photos of the winning Dutch, the breeders, the ADRC banquet luncheon, the trophies and the sights from the '83 ARBA Convention. It would take many additional sheets of paper and one huge amount of ink in order to publish them all. I can only include approximately 3 photos per one sheet side, (without cutting them down,....and they're not mine!!) and along with the ink needed, the sheets would be extremely heavy and extremely hard to run through the machine to do the reverse side, not to mention the fortune in mailing expense. In order to give each member a feeling of "Colorado" and the "1983 ARBA Convention", I'm going to see if I can have them reduced on a local copier and publish all of them in the next issue of the D.R. Only a couple will appear in this issue.....just enough to "wet your whistle" and give you something to look forward to.

All of the paybacks from the Convention, along with that due the owners of the Dutch entered in the Seller's Class, have been made. If you haven't received yours, please contact me immediately!

I've tried my best to keep this office running as I feel it should...I hope that I have been able to keep the membership satisfied with this work and hope to continue in this position for awhile longer. If you have any complaints or suggestions, always feel free to write me or any member of the Board. We are always open for suggestions that may make for a more efficient and effective run organization.

By the time you read this, the Convention will be history and those white flakes will be with many of us. This I can do without, (the snow).

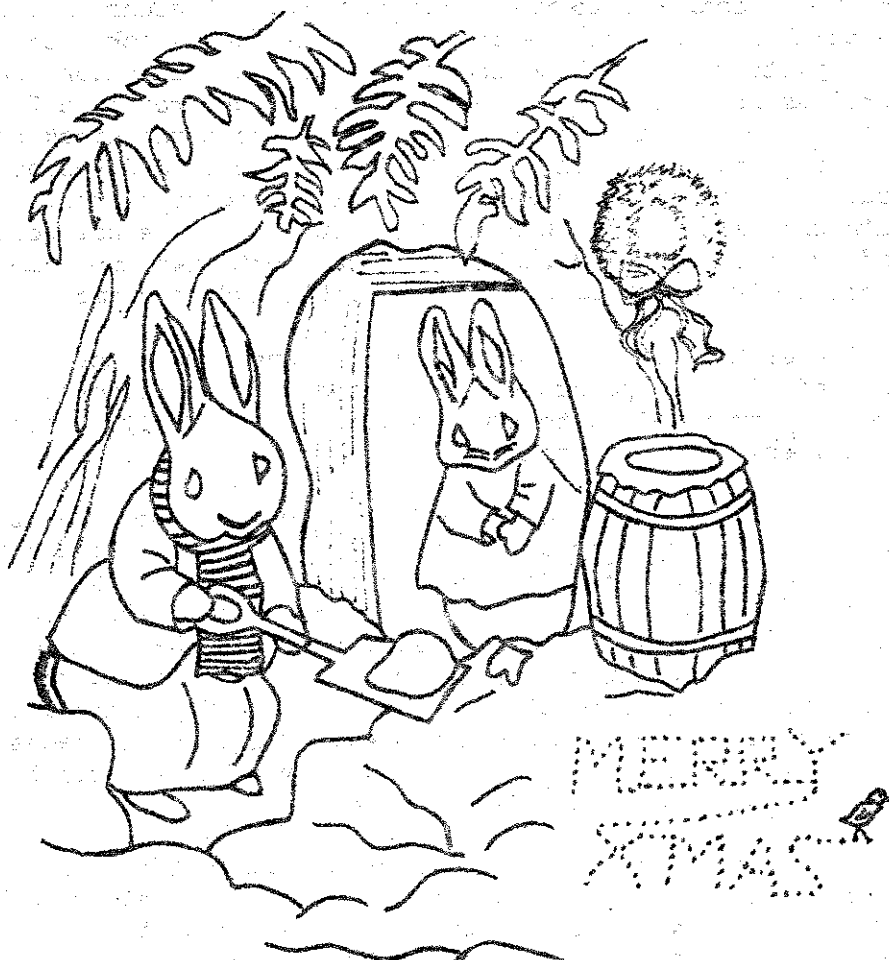

WHICH PATH TO TAKE

As the last raindrop fell outside, I was aware it happens all the time that little we can do will change the inevitability of it.

Received another letter today from a "newer" adult breeder of Dutch (2½ yrs.) who was in a quandry as to what path to take. It seems that although this person could breed Dutch, the amount of fine show stock being produced was not in any proportion to the breedings. Occasionally a junior would win, but rarely a senior. Am not talking of B.O.B. or B.O.S. but rather a first place! When asked to advise on this I had to go back to where the stock came from, the previous lines owner and the intent of that owner to develop Dutch to our Standard. Some raise Dutch indiscriminately producing meat Dutch and are satisfied with that situation. Others raise Dutch as pets not really caring for a Standard but are satisfied that they have pretty two tone rabbits produced that can occasionally be placed on the show table and sometime win, but rarely.

Others plan each mating for generation to generation, heavily culling what they feel are undesireable points and have usually great success on the show table. They are very critical as to type and markings, rarely keeping more than two out of each litter, sometimes nothing!

The point of this is that to succeed in Dutch breeding, something must be put in that calls for generations of heavy culling and heart rendering decisions. Know what you purchase has been "spoon fed" show breeding stock. It is not necessary to pay that \$100.00 for stock unless you can afford it. You can pick up the culls for \$20.00 - \$30.00 and know if the person that you're purchasing them from has worked diligently, the genes are not far behind those culls. They can be easily surfaced in a couple of generations, if you are diligently culling. Inspect your stock one by one critically. Eliminate if necessary where a major disqualification exists. Have an outsider who knows Dutch look them over and ask for honest opinions, no holds barred.

Remember that all Dutch have the genes to produce the ideal Dutch. Yes, we all like to take the easiest path, but it is not easy unless we know what we are doing. Know where your stock comes from and inspect the owners stock to see what is happening in their breeding program.

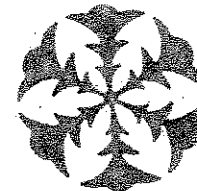

So, the path to take is very naturally on your own shoulders. You should have knowledge of what is the desired output when selecting stock or culling stock. As a man once said, the ideal Dutch is a fantasy existing in a world of fantasy".

We all try to solve the unsolveable, sometimes succeeding, other times not. But we do keep trying as we are not quitters!

Here's to the Dutch breeder-----a person who gives a darn!



YOUR MICHIGAN DIRECTOR.....Tom Dietrich

The 1983 ARBA Convention is over now....I didn't get a chance to attend but did send an entry. Air frieght sure has gone up this last year. Congratulations to all the exhibitors and especially to the Billups Boys and Lowell Simonson for winning BOB and BOS respectively.

Congratualtions to our new Director, Bill Campbell, who I feel will be a valuable addition to the ADRC Board. He has served on the Seller's Class Committee with myself, Lynn Shaw and Stan Goeglein and we all hold him in high esteem.

The wintry weather is starting to arrive in Michigan, getting down in the teens. Sure is nice having a wood stove kicking out the heat.

A few recent letters in the Dutch Reporter seemed to be questioning the value of placing type at the top of the list when raising Dutch. In showing any show animal breed, you strive for a certain body type. Without this certain body type, you won't know what you are looking for in trying to raise that perfect specimen. Dutch markings have been placed on different animals and other rabbit breeds, but unless they are on that cobby little guy we know as a Dutch, they don't belong in my rabbitry. The Billups Boys and Lowell Simonson have animals with that good Dutch type and they won BOB and BOS at the recent Convention. Place type at the top of the criteria you use for culling your show animals and it should pay off in the long run.

Other letters to the Reporter question the difference in judging from show to show on a given weekend hard to answer -- Judges are human, they all see things differently but they are judging on the same Standard and should be close to the same. A couple of instances in my rabbit raising career almost had me climbing the walls. In the spring of 1980, I showed a black senior doe at a local show--she was 7th. out of 7. I was ready to quit showing rabbits! This doe, to me, was the ultimate Dutch.I knew I couldn't raise anything any better in my eyes. Well, two weeks later, the black doe, probably a little worse in condition, but to me still the ultimate, won the National Dutch Show in York, Pennsylvania with over 400 Dutch shown. At another show, I had a blue senior doe who showed 6th. out of 6 with the judges comment, "only thing she has going for her is a good coat of fur". A week later, she won the Ohio State Dutch Club and Ohio State Rabbit Breeders show on the same weekend. So, don't give up -- not all judges are Dutch judges and each show only has one BOB and if you have good Dutch, after awhile, you should start taking your share.

It seems to be that everywhere I've ever shown, someone with a breed other than Dutch will approach me and proceed to convince me that the breed they raise is more difficult to interpret than the Dutch. I realize that it's difficult to make everyone happy, and sometimes we face the same judge two weeks in a row, but if, for example, you go to twelve shows, under ten different judges, you'll be more likely to improve your herd than if you went to twelve shows under six different judges. Those four new opinions can more often than not be quite valuable to you.

Remember, there are some very good judges out there. If we all take the chance and let the judges do the job they were trained to do we just might find them to be valuable opinions.

#### VITAMIN C & SHOW ETIQUETTE

Hopefully everyone is having good luck with their breedings for spring, but if some bucks still aren't producing well due to the harsh summer, try Vitamin C on them. In a study done over 20 years ago, when bucks that were not breeding well were given Vitamin C, they bred well and had a high production rate. Spinach and kale are high in Vitamin C, much higher than lettuce. When feeding these greens, be sure and have plenty of hay available to the rabbit. (Often rabbits do not get Vitamin C from their feed because C has a very short potency life; as short as six months from date of manufacture depending on conditions.)

Why is it that occasionally exhibitors smoke at the judging table? This bothers other exhibitors that are sensitive to cigarette smoke, and I'm sure rabbits aren't overjoyed when ashes are accidentally sprinkled on them - their owners aren't. It would be so much nicer if smokers would smoke before their breed, away from the judging table.

ROSY or CLOUDED FUTURES

Now that everybody has had a look at our proposed Standard changes, I feel the partial function of Directors must be to both listen and report the members feelings. Some of the members are A.R.B.A. Judges and represent, in the findings, their view also. It comes to pass that the general consensus thought that; #1] Juniors at no more than 4 pounds would invite too many less than 6 month old Dutch being placed in the senior class, illegally, but necessary. Also felt that those who raise Dutch for both meat and show would be discriminated against in that they tend to raise stock to about 5# rather than "toys". Net result: a decrease in shown Dutch as they, the 4½# 5 month old Juniors, do not have the development to show against true seniors. Possible discrimination as well as driving breeders to unlawful acts. #2] blue-gray eyes on blue Dutch: we here in the East (at least) have a large majority with their blue Dutch having nearly an eye color similar to black probably because they have been bred to black for a long period of time. Don't know what my friend in Texas or California have in their blue eye color but it is not so in the East. Result: if changed, blue Dutch to die out on the Eastern show tables. Long term result - all blue to become lilac or pale blue in 5 to 6 generations due to recessive color genes. Those that have bred blue to blue over a long period of time see this happen. #3] the gray Standard change must be because most gray are brown now and if not changed would result in at least 75% gray being disqualified as wrong color. They let them go past the show tables for so many years that breeders paid no attention to the color. Now we must pay for it! A gray (brown) is still a nice animal but watch out for the steels that need the gray to hold color. More and more steel will be brown-steel. Attempt to control this, but, how is a good question!

Hoard any light gray Dutch you may have. Your steel color will make it worth the effort!

Have heard much about some of the other changes but it seems to be stated as both good and bad, no majority either way.

You, as Dutch breeders, have a lot to think about in determining the future generations of your Dutch and your children's Dutch. Don't just check off boxes on a ballot. If you don't know or understand why you are checking a point, don't mark it at all. If you don't know, look it up or ask questions. Remember, it is not only my club or Scotties, but it is "ours" and "yours"!

The following letter was received by this office:

Dear Norma Hart,

I was an exhibitor at a local ARBA youth show where I took Best of Variety.

I was surprised to see an adult in flagrant violation of ARBA rules, taking his rabbits to and from the judging table. He claimed they were his daughter's rabbits but prior to the judging his wife told me, in friendly conversation, that she was showing the same rabbits the next day as they belonged to her.

When I informed the show superintendent, he seemed oblivious of the rules. In Section 60 & 62 of the Official Show Rules of the ARBA, it prohibits adults from showing and handling rabbits at youth shows. Also, Section 49 indicates that the entry to be disqualified, etc.

I was told that if I wanted to make a complaint, it would cost me \$25.00, otherwise nothing would be done. Where do they expect me, at 15 years, to have \$25.00?

I raise my own rabbits without parental help or supervision and when I go to a youth show I expect to compete against youth with their own rabbits. Don't these adults have any pride that they have to try to beat the ARBA youth in a youth show?

This is a problem that needs to be solved by the ADRC in conjunction with the ARBA.

I'm also sorry to report that I think this is my last year that I will continue showing in youth because of the above. Therefore, I will show open next year where there are better trophies, ribbons, etc., and youth are treated fairly. I'm also going to discontinue encouraging other youth to show in ARBA youth shows as many youth feel the same way as I do.

Let me first start by stating that the following is my personal opinion: I have been fortunate to have been able to attend most of the shows in my immediate area and have witnessed the above on several occasions. It is clearly against the rules for any adult to handle the youth's rabbits but this rule is being broken much too often. An adult showman belongs at the open show tables unless he/she is only observing the youth judging.

If the youth is unable to attend the show, his/her rabbits definitely should not be shown by any adult! Again, in my opinion, if this should happen, I feel that the show officials should automatically ask the adult to refrain from showing the rabbits in the youth division and if the request is not adhered to, the entry should be disqualified. After all, the rules are very clear!!

The above is beginning to discourage many youth exhibitors and as Therese stated, most youth do not have the required fee needed for a protest.

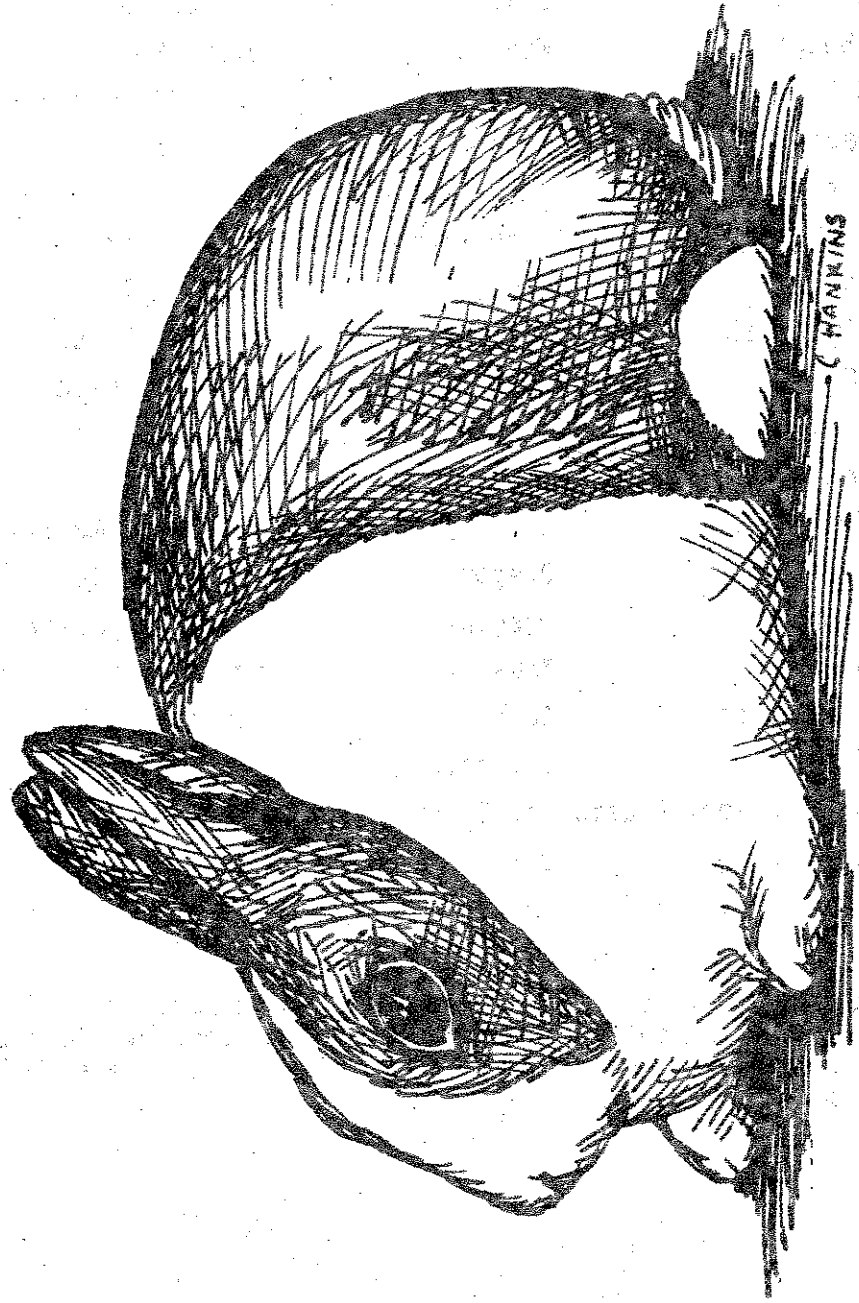

## THINK TORTS

I would like to appeal to those of you out there raising Torts, regarding the proposed revision to the wording of the description in the standards. Since raising Torts, it has seemed to me that in order to obtain a dark undertail color, one usually ends up with a bit darker top color on the rabbit. In lightening the top color, in order to achieve the sought after bright clean orange color over the back of the rabbit, the shadings have a tendency to lighten up causing the underside of the tail to become lighter. In the past, light tails have been permissible, but very undesirable, and some judges have used that description to heavily fault the Torts. In listing "underside of tail light in color" under faults, I believe this would hurt the Torts that are a little lighter in color as it would draw more attention to this feature. After all, how much of the color of a Dutch is concentrated on the bottom of the tail? In all actuality, for the top color to be "bright clean orange", the rabbit would have to be the color of a pumpkin or an orange, and I really haven't seen that many Torts come close to this. Those that have, seemed to have lighter shadings, subsequently causing a lighter underside to the tail. There must be some feasible way of wording the standard so as to describe the desired color, but not draw unnecessary attention to minor faults. Please consider this and let the Chairman of the Standards Committee know your thoughts on the matter. Without some input from the breeders, the decision will be left in the hands of the Committee Chairman.

## VENT DISEASE

BY DR. T. E. REED

This is a very common venereal disease in rabbits that is caused by the spirocete organism Treponema cuniculi. This disease is also known as rabbit syphilis. This is a very common venereal disease of rabbits that produces the signs where the external genitals of both the male and female will become inflamed . . . . ., red with small blisters and scabs that later become infected and produce a copious amount of "pus type" material. In the advanced stages of this disease, the rabbit may have scabs about the nose and mouth due to the organism infecting the oral area due to the coprophagic habits of the rabbit. Also, in the later stages, this disease will diminish the libido in males and will often cause failure of the female to conceive and an over all depression in the conception rate in the herd.

The latent type of infection with the Treponema cuniculi has also been incriminated in abortions in rabbits between the twelfth and the twenty-sixth day of the gestation period.

Vent Disease is very common in rabbits and is very easily treated; due to the fact that the spirocete organism is very sensitive to the antibiotic penicillin.

Treatment can consist of topical application of penicillin ointment to the external genitals on a daily basis for three days or it can be treated with the perental injection of Penicillin G. A common source of the topical ointment to treat this condition can be purchased from the local farm stores that handles medication for the treatment of mastitis in dairy cattle. The infusion tubes that are injected into the udder of the dairy cattle for mastitis is an economical source for the topical penicillin ointment. This ointment should be massaged into the genitals daily for three consecutive days and then there should be a five day waiting period before the does are mated.

Perental injection of 200,000 international units of Penicillin G per ten pounds of body weight is a very common treatment for this disease. To insure that one eliminates the infective agent from the body completely, one should treat the animals for three consecutive days with 200,000 international units of Penicillin G for ten pounds of body weight and then wait five days prior to mating the animals.

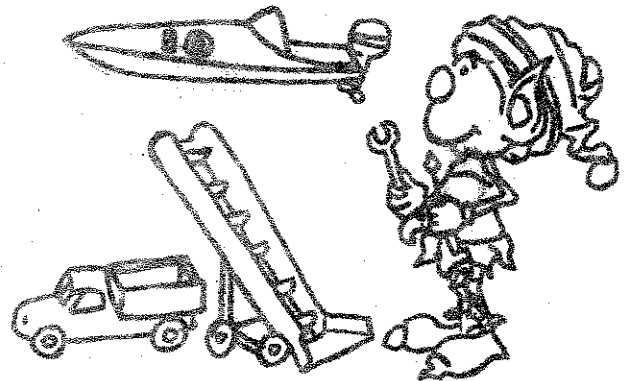
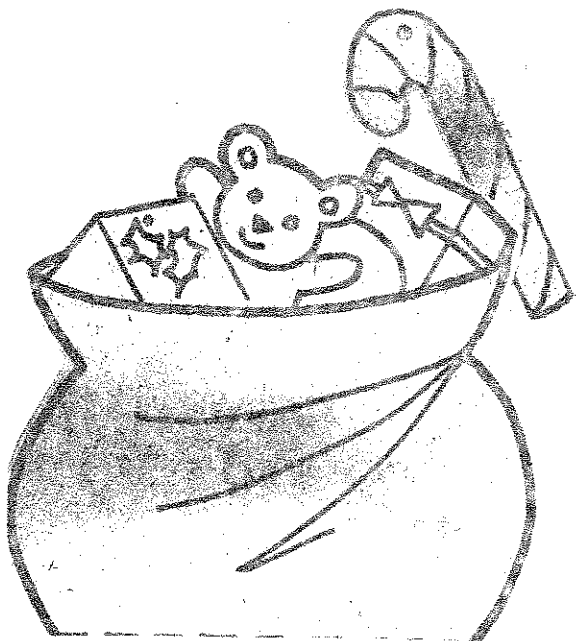
The most common way of communicating this disease is through the mating process. Vent Disease is very, very similar to human syphilis but it is not in any way related to human syphilis.

Treatment of this disease, regardless of how simple it may seem, has caused considerable problems among many rabbit breeders and Dutch breeders in particular. Many breeders treat Vent Disease with "Combiotic" or other penicillin/streptomycin injectibles. The streptomycin in "Combiotic" is very detrimental and toxic to the bacterial organism in the digestive tract of the rabbit. Many excellent animals have been killed due to the treatment rather than the disease. The streptomycin acts in a fashion to sterilize the gastrointestinal tract and interferes with the common digestive practice in rabbits. The bacterial digestion is totally interfered with and the gastrointestinal acidity base balance is misconstrued.

It is very unfortunate that young, novice individuals in the rabbit industry have been informed to treat the Vent Disease with such medication as "Combiotic" or antibiotics containing streptomycin. Penicillin G can be purchased in injectible form without the combination of streptomycin. Some individuals can use "Combiotic" for long periods of time without having a streptomycin toxicity problem; however, sooner or later the streptomycin toxicity will cause the individual problems.

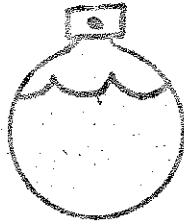

## ELECTION BALLOT

### PROPOSED CHANGES AND/OR REVISIONS TO THE ADRC BY-LAWS:

[Editor\*] For your records, below is a copy of the proposed changes and/or revisions to the ADRC Constitution and By-Laws and the number of votes each received.

ARTICLE I - DUES - The membership dues shall be seven dollars (\$7.00) per year payable in advance with a combination membership being provided for husband and wife at nine dollars (\$9.00) per year, expiring with the same date. One dollar (\$1.00) of each yearly membership fee is to be placed into a separate account called the "Guidebook/Contingency Fund" and the provisions of Article III, Section 1 and 2 of the By-Laws shall not apply to these monies. A single paid life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred forty dollars (\$140.00), payable in advance. A husband/wife life membership may be purchased for the sum of one hundred eighty dollars (\$180.00), payable in advance. All deductions from paid life memberships are excluded. After membership has expired, the member may renew within a period of sixty (60) days; otherwise, upon sending in membership fees, the member will be given a new membership unless they specifically request that their membership be dated back more than sixty (60) days to the original expiration date in order that they may keep their original membership number. Any member having been delinquent sixty (60) days or more, whether requesting old membership number or not, shall be deprived of all sweepstake points accumulated prior to the expiration date.

ARTICLE III - Section 2 - The dues shall be further divided with 12½% to be allotted for the ADRC Publicity Department. These monies are to be placed in a separate account retained by the Secretary/Treasurer. Any portion of these monies may be transferred to the Publicity Department, or to any ADRC purpose, upon approval of a majority vote of the Board of Directors. The remaining 62½% shall go to the General Fund. All percentage payments are to be paid on a monthly basis.

ARTICLE III - Section 2A - An annual allotment of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) from the General Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Show, with further stipulation that at least one half (½) of the allotment be used for specials.
