AMENDMENTS AND/OR RESOLUTIONS TO THE CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS  
TO APPEAR ON THE 1986 ADRC ELECTION BALLOT

\* CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE VI, .....ADD Section 2A:

No one (1) person can run for more than one (1) office at any one (1) election.

\* BY-LAWS

Change ARTICLE 111, Section 2A to read:

An annual allotment of \$500.00 (five-hundred dollars) from the General Fund shall be awarded to the sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show, with further stipulation that the American Dutch Rabbit Club receive recognition for this allotment. Said money to be sent by the Secretary-Treasurer to the sponsors on or as near to January 1st. preceding the National Dutch Rabbit Show for that year. Show sponsors must have all National Dutch Rabbit Show judges secured before any ADRC allocation is made.

\* BY-LAWS

Change ARTICLE 111, Section 3A to read:

The Publicity Chairman shall be paid \$100.00 (one-hundred dollars) for each annual National Dutch Rabbit Show and American Rabbit Breeders Association, Inc. Convention which he/she transports American Dutch Rabbit Club, Inc. publicity items for sale at the Club booth; such funds to be paid from the Publicity Fund.

AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

Minutes of the General Membership, 1985 ARBA Convention, Houston Texas

President Scott Williamson called a meeting of the General Membership to order at 10:15 AM, October 29, 1985 with 5 officers answering roll. Those present were:

President, Scott Williamson  
Vice-President, Jack Wireman  
Directors, Wenton Carlton & Roger Eich  
Secretary-Treasurer, Norma Hart

A motion was entertained to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting as they were published in the Dutch Reporter. A motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to accept them as printed was made by Al Butler and seconded by Mark Pecaric. M.C.

The Treasurers' report was read by Secretary Hart. A motion to accept the Treasurers' report as read was made by Wenton Carlton and seconded by Mickey Farrill. M.C. President Williamson noted that the cost of the new guidebook is outstanding and must be taken from these funds upon completion.

Officer Reports: None

President Williamson reported on the status of the guidebook. He informed the membership that due to his work schedule and various other duties, he was unable to complete this task. He stated that Marti Dill of Michigan offered to take over the responsibility and have it ready for distribution as soon as possible. The new edition of the guidebook should be ready for mailing by mid-December. President Williamson extended both his and the clubs' appreciation to Marti for her efforts.

Report of Committees: Lowell Sissonson gave a brief report on the 1986 National Dutch Show. The dates are May 2-4, 1986 at the state fairgrounds in Des Moines, Iowa. The senior judge is Scott Williamson, junior judge is Gary Brinn and Wenton Carlton has agreed to judge the youth. The headquarters motel will be the Ramada Inn. Lowell stated that there will be more information listed in the Dutch Reporter. Specials should be made payable to the Iowa State Dutch Rabbit Club and sent to Eric Mixdorf. Catalog ads are to be sent to Roger Eich. Lowell reminded those in attendance that if you were unable to show at the '85 NDS, please remember to request a show catalog.

Al Butler gave a report on the Publicity Department. Al stated that all ads, booth payments, etc. are paid for through this department. He remarked that some of the Publicity items available would make excellent specials at local shows. The Publicity Department has inventory of approximately \$420.00, all of which is paid for. Mickey Farrill made a motion to accept the Publicity Department report seconded by Mark Pecaric. M.C.

President Williamson gave a financial report of the Dutch Reporter account. Income since the last D.R. financial report was \$1563.01 with expenses of \$1558.88. The Dutch Reporter account has a surplus of \$4.13. Larry Hyer made a motion seconded by Jack Wise that we accept the Dutch Reporter financial report as given. M.C.

Director Eich gave his audit committee report. The audit committee found the books to be complete, current and balanced. The audit committee consisted of Roger Eich, Mike Stinehelfer and Larry Hyer. George Farmer made a motion that we accept the audit committees' report. The motion was seconded by Katie Mead. M.C.

Vice-President Wireman gave a report of the National Dutch Show rules as updated. (Amendments to NDS Rules). It was stated that many of the judges are booked well in advance and it was felt that the ADRC should hold a "double" year election to amend the present system. Discussion was held in regards to listing the top five judges from the final election ballot. The show sponsors of the National Dutch Show must select the senior judge from this list starting from the top. If the show sponsors are unable to attain one of the top five as their senior judge, then it is up to the sponsors to make other arrangements. They must select their senior judge and first junior judge from the current ADRC membership. The show sponsors may request a membership list of current ADRC judges if needed. A motion was made by Roger Eich and seconded by Jack Wise that the National Dutch Show



rules be accepted as read with amendments, to take effect at the 1987 National Dutch Show, M.C.

President Williamson expressed appreciation to the Publicity Department and the Show Committee for their outstanding efforts for the promotion of the Dutch and the ADRC.

Wenton Carlton commented that the quality of the Dutch shown was very good with there being some excellent blacks and blues. He also stated that it was one of the best groups of grays shown at any ARBA Convention. Best of Breed honors went to Dale Zentner of Iowa with an outstanding blue senior doe, while Jack Wise of Texas took Best Opposite Sex with a black junior buck.

President Williamson expressed appreciation to our ADRC sweepstake chairperson, Vicki Hertel. He stated that there was much work involved with no pay.

As of January 1, 1986, Marti Dill of Michigan will be the new ADRC Youth Chairperson. It was noted that the ADRC has a very good youth membership with many youth Dutch being shown!

Jack Wireman stated that we should keep trying to recruit new members. He noted that it would be a good idea to carry ADRC applications with you at all times. If you wish application forms, contact the Secretary's office or the Publicity Department. An excellent way to promote the ADRC and increase the membership would be to offer an American Dutch Rabbit Club membership as an award for Dutch specials, along with publicity items, at local shows. When selling a Dutch, include the membership fee in with the cost of the rabbit.

The Sellers' Class will be held at approximately 3:00 PM at the showroom. Wenton Carlton and Scott Williamson will assist in the sale.

\* AMENDMENTS AND/OR RESOLUTIONS TO THE ADRC CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS:

(1) Mickey Farrill suggested that the Publicity Department receive more money for their attendance at National Dutch Shows and ARBA Conventions. Mickey Farrill made a motion, seconded by Katie Mead that it appear on the next ballot that the Publicity Department receive \$100.00 for attendance at annual National Dutch Shows and ARBA Conventions regardless of where the show is held, M.C.

(2) Mickey Farrill commented on one person running for two offices. George Mead suggested that he saw no reason why any one person could not run for two offices as they could only accept appointment to one. However, President Williamson clarified this by Roberts Rules of Order. If only one ballot is issued, one person cannot run for two offices on this ballot. If more than one ballot is issued, any one person could run for different offices as long as the offices are listed on separate ballots. Mickey Farrill made a motion, seconded by Al Butler that it appear on the next ballot that "no one (1) person can run for more than one (1) office at any one election". M.C.

\* The above listed amendments and/or resolutions are to be printed in the next Dutch Reporter and are to appear on the next ADRC election ballot.

Allen Barr asked about compiling information on the history of the Dutch Club. He volunteered to poll long standing members in regards to happenings and history. Allen will work along with Jack Wireman, who is presently the club historian.

President Williamson reminded those present that a complete and up to date copy of the Constitution and By-Laws is listed in the September/October issue of the Dutch Reporter. At this time, Lowell Simonsen commented on the fine print of the show reports in the D.R. President Williamson noted that because of the many show reports received, the cost of paper, ink and postage would be quite high if they were to appear full sized. President Williamson commented that those who wished full size print should write to Dianne Williamson, D.R. Editor, with their request.

Vicki Hertel, Sweepstake Chairperson, noted that many show sponsors are not adhering to the sweepstake rules. Tear sheets do not accompany most of the report forms, report forms are incomplete and arriving well over the thirty (30) day limit. She suggests that the ADRC either change the rules or make the show sponsors go by the present ones. She stated that if we have rules - we should follow them. President Williamson suggested that a Dutch club member showing at a Dutch sanctioned show offer to fill out the paperwork to make certain that it is done properly and completely.

Vicki noted that there was much expense involved in the sweepstakes' job. A motion was made by Jack Wireman and seconded by Maxine Parmer that we provide the sweepstake chairperson with a sweepstakes expense line for postage, envelopes, typewriter ribbons, etc. M.C. President Williamson noted that the sweepstake chairperson currently has the ADRC typewriter. (Note\* The sweepstake chairperson has been reimbursed for all expenses incurred with this position since January 1985, as bills have been presented.) Vicki also suggested that the ADRC, at sometime in the future, possibly consider a monthly salary for the sweepstake chairperson due to the hours spent.

George Parmer noted that the 1987 ARBA Convention will be held in Portland, Oregon, and extended a warm invitation to attend!

Being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Mickey Farrilli and seconded by Maxine Parmer, M.C.

## AMERICAN DUTCH RABBIT CLUB

### National Dutch Show Rules

Rule 1 - A National Dutch Rabbit Show, which shall be sponsored by a group of Dutch Rabbit Breeders who are members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club, or by a State Dutch Rabbit Club shall be held once a year. This show is to be held during the month of April, unless decreed otherwise by the Executive Board of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Rule 2 - Bids for the sponsorship of the National Dutch Show must be presented to the National Dutch Show Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the current Board of Directors' meeting at the National Dutch Show. This bid may be submitted no more than two years in advance of the desired show.

Rule 3 - When there are two or more groups or clubs bidding for the show, the decision as to the winning bidder shall be vested in the Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club.

Rule 4 - The sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show shall be responsible for all obligations connected with the show, and under no circumstances shall the American Dutch Rabbit Club be held responsible for any obligations.

Rule 5 - The National Dutch Rabbit Show shall be a Dutch Rabbit Sweepstake Show, and the sponsors shall comply with the Sweepstake Show Rules, as well as these rules.

Rule 6 - The Secretary of each National Dutch rabbit Show shall mail a copy of the National Dutch Show Catalog to each exhibitor of the previous National Dutch Rabbit Show, those members requesting a catalog, and all American Dutch Rabbit Club Officers.

Rule 7 - Exhibits shall be coveed in wire coops and arranged in such a manner as to protect the animals from injury at all times, and provisions for food, water and adequate care must be made.

Rule 8 - Sponsors of the National Dutch rabbit Show shall make a financial report of the show to the Executive Board of the American Dutch rabbit Club within thirty (30) days from the date of the show. Any profits derived from the show shall become the property of the sponsors.

Rule 9 - Allocation of funds from the American Dutch Rabbit Club to the sponsors of the National Dutch Show: "Refer to Section 3, Article 2A of the American Dutch Rabbit Club By-Laws.

Rule 10- When hiring the senior Judge, the sponsoring club shall be required to reimburse this Judge by no less than \$100.00 for their services. Any other Judge/s hired shall receive \$75.00 minimum for their services.

Rule 11- There shall be at least two (2) open show Judges unless less than 150 Dutch are entered. At the sponsoring clubs' discretion, one senior Judge shall be hired with less than 150 Dutch being entered. In any case, the senior Judge shall be chosen by balloting of the entire American Dutch Rabbit Clubs' voting membership.

Rule 12- The American Dutch Rabbit Club Secretary shall notify the sponsors of the National Dutch Rabbit Show of the membership' Judge/s selection immediately following the results of the final election ballot. The show sponsors of the National Dutch Show must select their senior Judge from a list of the top five Judges from the final election ballot starting from the top. If the show sponsors are unable to attain one of the top five as their senior Judge, then it is up to the show sponsors to make other arrangements. They must select their senior and first Junior Judge from the current ADRC membership. The show sponsors may request a membership list of current ADRC Judges if needed. The sponsoring club must have Judges secured before any American Dutch Rabbit Club allocation is made. A.D.R.C. allocation funds are to be made on or as near to January 1st, preceding the National Dutch Rabbit Show for that year. Judges must be secured at that time.

Rule 13- The senior Judge and the first Junior Judge must be members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club. In the event that a third Judge is necessary, it is preferred that he/she also be a member of the A.D.R.C.

Rule 14- The judging assignment of the senior Judge shall be as follows: senior bucks and junior does in black, chocolate and steel; senior does and Junior bucks in blue, tortoise and gray. The junior Judge will be responsible for all other classes. The fur class will be judged by the senior Judge except when variety fur placement is required. In the event that variety fur placement is called for, the Judge placing the senior buck class of that variety shall judge that varieties' fur class. The senior Judge has final placement for overall fur.

Should three open Judges be necessary, the judging assignments shall be: the senior Judge will judge black senior bucks and junior does, blue Junior bucks, chocolate senior does, tortoise senior bucks and Junior does, steel Junior bucks, and gray senior does. The first Junior Judge will be responsible for: black senior does, blue senior bucks and junior does, chocolate Junior bucks, tortoise senior does, steel senior bucks and Junior does, and gray Junior bucks. The second Junior Judge will judge: black Junior bucks, blue senior does, chocolate senior bucks and Junior does, tortoise Junior bucks, steel senior does, and gray senior bucks and Junior does.

The Sellers Class Judge is up to the discretion of the show officials.

Rule 15- A meeting of the general membership of the American Dutch Rabbit Club will be held during the National Dutch Rabbit Show.

Rule 16- The American Dutch rabbit Club shall furnish a trophy for the first place winner of the Sellers Class at both the National Dutch Rabbit Shows and A.R.E.A. Conventions.

Rule 17- Ballots shall be issued to all current youth members of the American Dutch Rabbit Club at the same time general election ballots are issued to all current adult members of the A.D.R.C. Youth ballots will be issued only for the sole purpose of nominating and electing a youth Judge for the annual National Dutch Rabbit Show.

Rule 18- Where applicable, all show rules will apply to both open and youth divisions.

Rule 19- These rules are under the supervision of, and subject to change at any time, by a majority vote of the current Board of Directors of the American Dutch Rabbit Club."

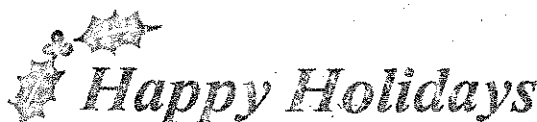

SO YOU THINK YOU KNOW IT ALL!

Having recently judged a 4-H quiz bowl (Buccaneers) and observing the faces of the adult rabbit breeders present, I wondered if it would be best to expand everyone's knowledge.

Did you know that:

Animals are divided into two groups based on eating habits - Carnivores (vegetable/meat eaters) and Herbivores (vegetarians)

Vegetable seed has a higher protein content than cereal grain.

Minerals are required by rabbits mainly for bone development.

The one most important factor in a rabbit's diet is water.

There are two basic nutritional differences between Legume Hay (Alfalfa) and Grass Hay (Clover/Timothy) which is that legume hay is 4-5 times higher in protein than the grass hays.

A "Lapin" is French for rabbit.

A purebred rabbit has a pedigree of three generations and must be in all three generations one breed. No, they do not have to be registered.

Type on a Dutch means the overall conformation and balance which includes the entire animal from the nose tip to the tail tip.

The five profile groups of rabbits are: Fully arched, semi arched, short coupled, commercial and snakey.

There are 40 recognized sanctioned breeds of rabbits in the A.R.B.A.

The only breed of rabbit not being raised for its pelt is the Angora.

There are basically two types of fur texture elasticity which are: Flyback (New Zealand, Dutch, and most commercial breeds) and Roll Back (Dwarfs, Lops)

How many teeth a rabbit has . . . would you believe 28! (Three sets of incisors, five sets of pre-molars and six sets of molars)

A teutonic legend has it that the Easter bunny was once a bird changed into its present form by a goddess. In appreciation for this change the rabbit laid colored eggs for the Spring festival of the goddess.

The Island of Porto Santa (Portugal) had rabbits multiplying so quickly it had to be abandoned.

The three earliest breeds developed exclusively in the U.S. are New Zealand, Californian and Palomino. The Dutch were developed in Europe - time unknown.

There are five age groups of rabbits: Kit (infant in nest), Prejunior (under three months), Junior (three to six months), Intermediate (six to eight months in three class breeds), and Senior (six months or older in two class breeds, eight months or older in three class breeds.)

Mites cause ear canker - eliminated by adding sweet oil or mineral oil .

Weepy eye is a bacterial infection of the eye. (Conjunctivitis)

Vent disease is caused by a spiral shaped bacteria and is highly contagious to rabbits.

Ringworm affects the nose, ears, legs and paws generally.

The disease probably present when Dutch rabbits refuse food, sit in a hunched position and grind their teeth is mucoidenteritis.

The disease whereby a rabbit has a heavy thick white discharge from the nose is snuffles, curable by injecting penicillin with streptomycin.

A rabbit with malocclusion (buckteeth) should be eliminated, never used as a breeder. Another name is wolf teeth.

A diseased Dutch which is listless, pot-bellied, thin, not eating and diarrheahied probably has coccidiosis, treatable with sulfa based medicine like Sulmet.

Inbreeding is the breeding of mother and son, father with daughter or brother and sister.

Linebreeding is the breeding of less closely related Dutch such as cousins, aunts with nephew, uncle and neices.

Outcrossing is the breeding of unrelated Dutch.

Crossbreeding is the breeding of two different breeds using pedigree rabbits.

Buckteeth are from recessive genes (5-7 different per animal) and mating buck toothed Dutch and normal toothed animal would produce three normal kits and one buck toothed kit ratio.

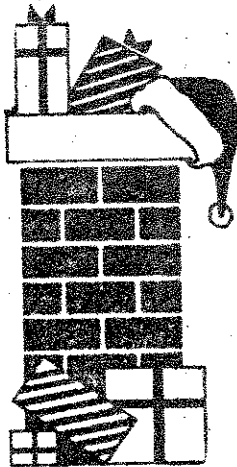
A buck subject to heat of over 85° for 4-5 days can become sterile for two to three months.

The five ways to mate rabbits are: Natural, Restrained, Forced, Limited Colony and Artificial insemination.

At the time of a rabbit becoming a senior it can be registered.

If you knew all of these, you are better than the average Dutch breeder and deserve a pat on the back.

TO BE COBBY IN TYPE, COMPACT IN FORM AND LIMB. GOOD DUTCH TYPE CONSISTS OF A NICELY ROUNDED BACK, BEGINNING ALMOST IMMEDIATELY BEHIND THE HEAD AND PROGRESSING OVER THE SHOULDERS, LOIN AND RUMP TO TAIL.
